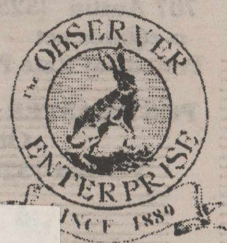

Coach's Closet slated for March 28

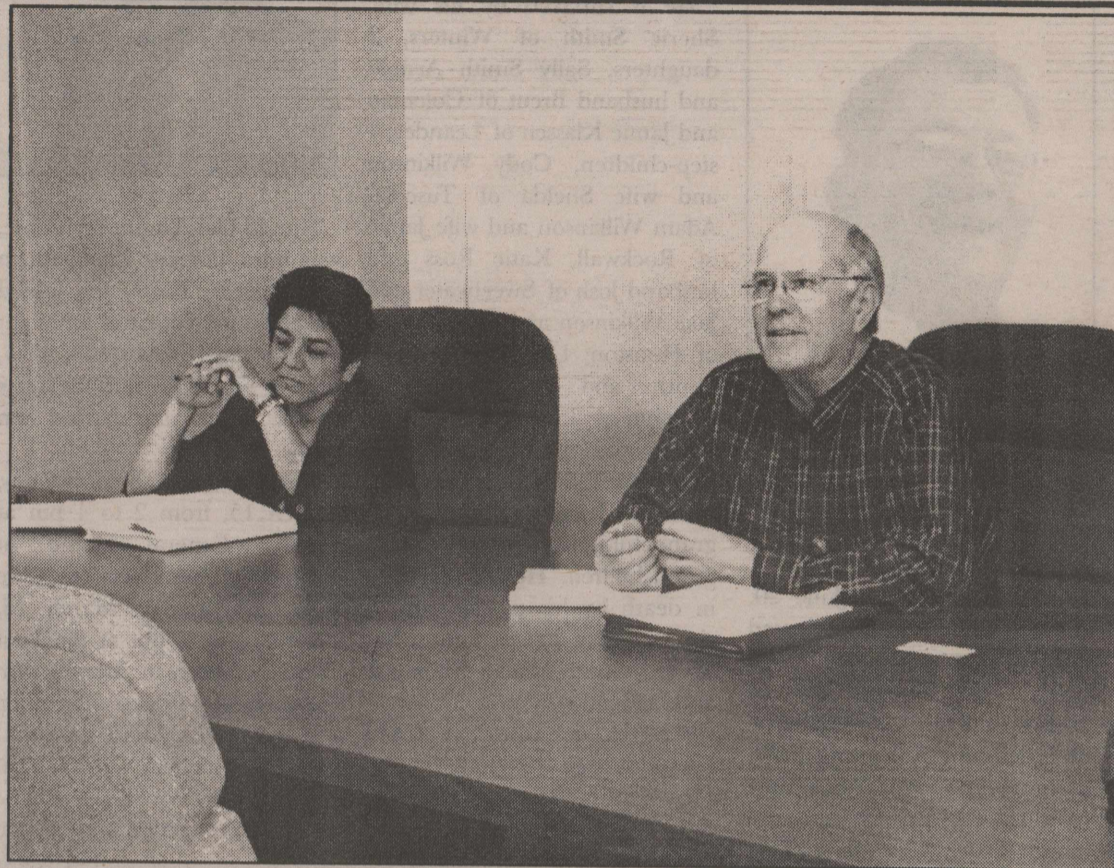
Robert Lee Baptist Church Women's Ministry Team is encouraging anyone and everyone to shop for free at the first "Coach's Closet" clothing event!

TxDOT Representatives Attend Meeting! Thomas R. Johnston, San Angelo District Director of Operations, and Angie Ortegon, San Angelo District Transportation Operations Engineer, representing Texas Department of Transportation, came to Bronte City Hall Tuesday, March 10, 2015, to meet with city officials and citizens regarding traffic concerns on Highway 277 in and near Bronte. They stressed that the public's safety is of paramount concern to the organization, but the standards and regulations are set statewide. They also were unable to include fatality accidents occurring in years past with those from the last three years to determine risk statistics. They also do not include TxDOT's replacement of mailboxes and property damaged by accidents in their statistics. The representatives promised to look at the issues and possibly make recommendations to the governing board in Austin. One citizen in attendance suggested the community might need to begin a fundraising project to light the "Bronte" sign on the north edge of town. This sign is provided by Bronte Economic Development and the Bronte Lions Club and currently serves to alert daytime drivers that they are quickly approaching a town. If lighted, nighttime drivers would also be aware they are about to enter Bronte.

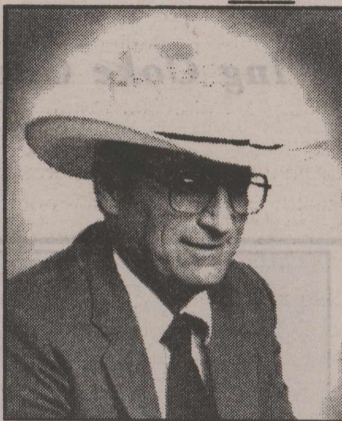

West Coke County Hospital Board meeting discussed

The Board of Directors of the West Coke County Hospital District met in regular session February 24, 2015. President Mary Bessent called the meeting to order at 9:30 and declared a quorum was present. Other Board members present were Sarah Green, Pat Stephens, Dessie Kendall, and Pat Carwile. Jessica Cason, Administrator, and Janie Munoz, BOM, were also present at the meeting. There were no visitors. The invocation was given by Mary Bessent. Minutes from the previous meeting were approved, and absent Board members were excused.

In the census count, there are currently 31 residents in the facility, as of the meeting date.

In the staffing update, there are currently open positions for ADON, CNAs, and PRN CNAs. Jessica informed the Board that the facility rating increased from 3 stars to 4 stars, gradually moving up to the top rating of 5 stars. The Board is very pleased. Jessica is also doing some enhanced marketing and advertising of the facility, as well as numerous community projects.

Accounts Receivable/Collections were discussed. There have been some challenges with the Matrix bookkeeping system at the

facility, therefore other options are currently being explored. The financial statements were discussed and accepted.

Under Capital Improvements, the Board was informed that State regulations require a whirlpool tub after the most recent renovations, so prices are being obtained for equipment and installation.

Regarding building maintenance, the repairs to dryers in the laundry have been completed, and the disaster plan is in the process of being updated.

There were no new candidates seeking a seat on the Board of Directors, so the election was canceled. The Board voted to accept the Auditor's report completed in November of 2014.

Future agenda items were discussed, and the date of the next Board meeting will be March 31, 2015. The public is invited and encouraged to attend.

Taking a look at the facility calendar for March, there will be lots of good things taking place. Ellen, from the San Angelo Symphony, will be entertaining the residents and guests with her guitar on March 11 at 2:30. Then on March 14, Laryssa, also from the Symphony, will be playing her harps. The singing group "Because He Lives" will be entertaining on March 17, at 6 pm, at the St. Patrick's Day Party. I hope all attendees are wearing green, so nobody will get pinched! The monthly birthday party, sponsored by the Baptist Co-Ed Class, will be held March 19th, at 3:30. The honored birthday celebrants will be Billie Dunn and Tommy Hood. Health News

The month of March is National Colorectal Awareness month. It is a great time to promote awareness of colorectal health and cancer prevention. The Prevent Cancer Foundation provides the following information about colorectal cancer risk factors, prevention tactics and early detection.

Colorectal cancer affects the colon or rectum. It's as common in women as it is in men. In fact, this year alone, over 136,830 people will be diagnosed with colorectal cancer and an estimated 50,310 will die from the disease. Although, with certain types of screening, this cancer can be prevented through the removal of polyps (grape-like growths on the wall of the intestine) before they become cancerous. Several screening tests detect colorectal cancer early, when it can be more easily and successfully treated.

Risk factors for colorectal cancer include:

- Age 50 and older
- Smokers
- Overweight or obese individuals, especially those who carry fat around their waists
- Little or no physical activity
- Drinking alcohol in excess, especially men
- Eating a lot of red meat (such as beef, pork or lamb) or processed meat (such as bacon, sausage, hot dogs or cold cuts)
- Personal or family history of colorectal cancer or benign (not cancerous) colorectal polyps
- History of inflammatory bowel disease, such as ulcerative colitis or Crohn's disease
- Family history of inherited colorectal cancer or inherited

colorectal problems

Colorectal cancer prevention tactics:

- Be physically active for at least 30 minutes, at least five days a week.

- Maintain a healthy weight.

- Don't smoke. If you do smoke, quit.

- If you drink alcohol, have no more than one drink a day if you're a woman or two drinks a day if you're a man.

- Eat fruits, vegetables and whole grains to help you get and stay healthy. Eat less red meat and discontinue processed meat.

The best time to get screened is before symptoms appear. This is called early detection, which can be life saving. It is recommended that individuals with an average risk for colorectal cancer start getting screened at age 50. Individuals at higher risk may need to start regular screening at an earlier age and should be screened more often. For individuals older than 75 years of age, ask your doctor for a recommended screening schedule.

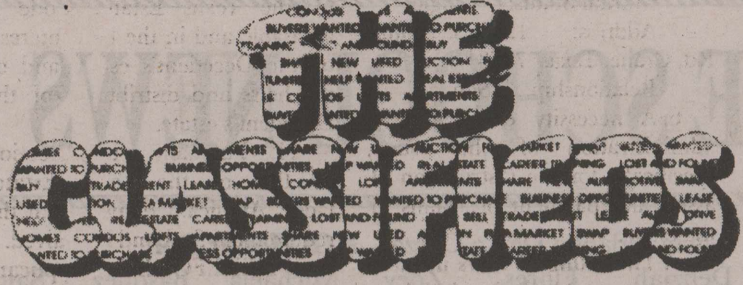

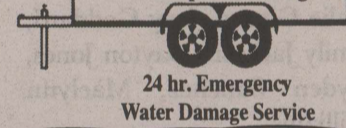

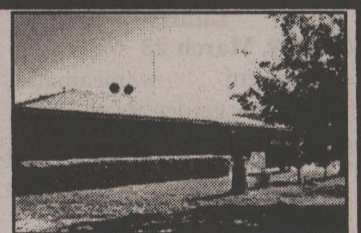
