
1st Quarter East Coke County Ambulance Service Report

Bronte Volunteer Fire Department announces vision for their future with plans of new station

Over the last year, many hours were spent discussing what the future would look like for the City of Bronte and how the Fire Department would fit into that future. Pictured above is the Fire Station that resulted from those discussions! We see this as the facility our community will need to meet it's future needs. In fact, the plan is to have an operable facility within the next

Right after completing our FEMA grant for the purchase of structural firefighting uniforms, we started working on our next priority, a new fire station. We knew this effort would take several years to fund and complete, so now was the time to get started. So, for a little more than a year, we've been working on identifying our future needs and translating that into the initial design you now see.

This will bring all our current vehicles and equipment into a single facility and allow us to increase our fleet by one vehicle, when needed. The administrative area will provide an area to conduct classroom training, offices, kitchen, and bathrooms with showers to meet routine needs. It will also provide the capability to support emergency needs, such as we experienced during the Wildcat Fire, or other natural disaster.

Now we're taking the next step, raising the funds! During this initial planning period, we were able to begin building the matching funds needed to apply for grants and have just over \$70,000. This is a solid start, but we estimate that the fund will need to have at least another \$30,000 before applying for grants. When you're talking about grants for a facility the Grantors want to see that their funds combined with ours can make it happen. So, we will continue to put the monies received from our regular fundraisers and donations into the building fund, as we plan additional fundraising efforts.

We appreciate all support and contributions! Together, we will make this new Fire Station a reality for our wonderful community.

Fort Chadbourne Attends Medal of Honor Tribute

By Ann Pate This past weekend, Lana Richards and Ann Pate attended the Medal of Honor Host City Program in Gainesville, TX. They were invited to attend and display the Fort Chadbourne Medal of Honor Collection at several of the functions. When first asked they were hesitant, because it meant disassembling a major display, but Ann Pate said "Once we understood the magnitude of what the city of Gainesville does for our recipients, and the number of Medal of Honor recipients that were attending, we knew we couldn't say no to such an honorable request. "

Gainesville started the Medal of Honor project over 10 years ago, and it has grown into one of the largest events to honor our nation's heroes. recipients are treated to four days in the city with banquets, fish fries, parades, including lunches with active military and first responders. They visit schools, have autograph and book signing events, and give back to the city that has shown them the great respect they deserve. Gainesville has planted trees for each new attendee each year, and built a Medal of Honor park with bricks laid by war with each recipient's name. A large black granite memorial with an eagle stands over the park, and has the living recipients names carved in the

stone who have been a part of the Gainesville project. The day Lana and Ann visited the park, Medal of Honor recipient Bob O'Malley and his wife Barbara, who designed the park, were there. He pointed out his name on the granite piece and said with a smile, it was nice to be able to read his name there, because it meant he was still

The men ranged from WWII. 91 year old Hershel "Woody" Williams, to one of our newest recipients, Clint Ramesha, who received his medal from the war with Afghanistan. Others were Korea recipients Hiroshi Miyramura and Duane Dewey, and Vietnam veterans Gary Wetzel, Bennie Adkins, Melvin Morris, Don Ballard, Bob O'Malley, Clarence Sasser, Robert Patterson, Michael Fitzmaurice, Hal Fritz, James Taylor, Kenneth Stumpf and Allen Lynch.

participate in something this upstanding. The entire city of Gainesville, its residents, volunteers, and the directors that put so much work into this project should be very proud for what they have achieved, and be thanked for the patriotism they show our military. It is very humbling to see a community do what this city has done.

If you haven't visited the Fort Chadbourne museum and seen their Medal of Honor display, please do so. It too has a wall listing all 3,491 recipients by war, along with a short video that explains much of the history of the Medal. It honors six Medal of Honor recipients that were stationed at Fort Chadbourne in the 1850's, along with a sword belonging to Peter Boehm who had the sword with him at Fort Chadbourne when he was stationed there in 1867. There is also a Henry rifle that belonged to Medal of Honor recipient Alonso P. Weber, but the most amazing of



the collection is the Medals themselves. They consist of medals from the 1800's to the ones they issue today. One very special medal is the Navy Tiffany Cross, the rarest of the medals because they ceased to issue that in the 1940's. An original medal from the Purge of 1917 belonging to James Gould is also on display.

Although, Fort Chadbourne would like to honor other request to display these medals at events, it would be impossible to do so. This was a rare event, and one Fort Chadbourne is proud to say they were able to contribute to in honoring our nations Medal of Honor recipients and all our Veterans. God Bless them all

Despite sticker changes, farm trailers, trucks require attention

Two steps, one sticker. New legislation has reduced the number of stickers Texans are required to have on their vehicles. But it hasn't cut down on drivers' responsibility.

"We're still required to both inspect and register vehicles,"said John Ross Copeland, Coke County Farm Bureau president. "Farm trucks and trailers are no different. It's important that Coke County farmers and ranchers still follow through with the steps they completed prior to the change in legislation."

Farm trailers with a gross vehicle weight under 4,000 pounds need neither registration nor inspection.

Farm trailers between 4,000 and 34,000 pounds do not need inspection and can be registered with a farm tag provided that trailer is used exclusively to haul commodities, supplies and items related to farming.

"The rules haven't changed," John Ross Copeland said. "But it's important with this sticker changeover that we not forget to inspect and register farm vehicles and trailers that need it."

Drivers caught without proper inspection or registration could face a traffic citation for the infraction.


