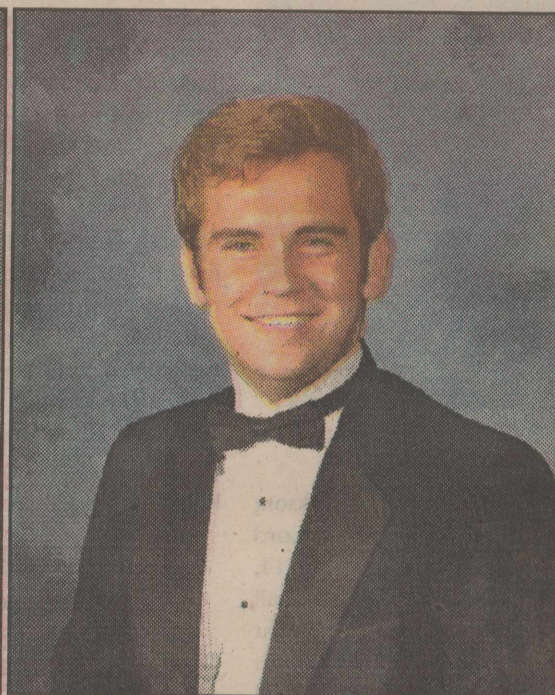
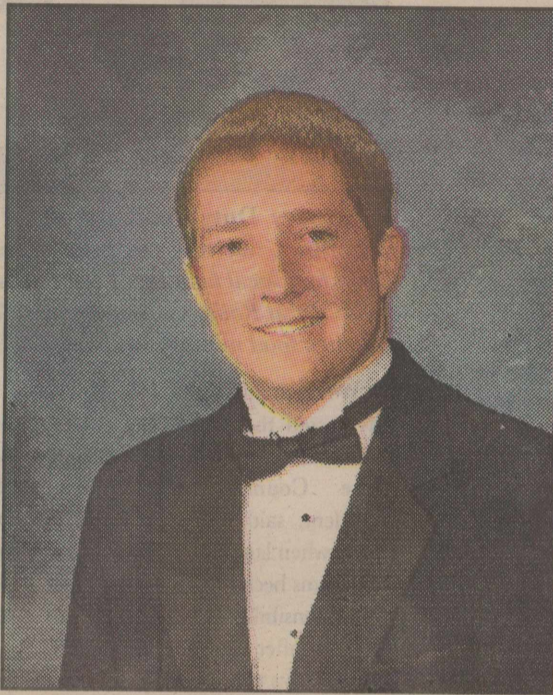

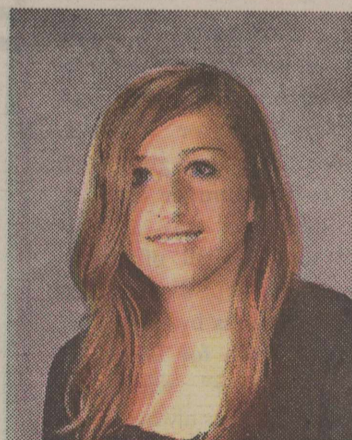
Fun Day set for Bronte Park on June 13

 One step closer to death tax repeal**

After years of being penalized for the loss of a loved one, Texas farmers and ranchers are finally one step closer to killing the "death tax" once and for all.

"We're thankful the U.S. House has passed the Death Tax Repeal Act of 2015," John Ross Copeland, Coke County Farm Bureau president, said. "It adds insult to injury when landowners have to pay large sums because they've inherited the responsibility of running a farm or ranch after someone has passed. We need this tax reform."

In 2003, Congress raised the estate tax exemption to \$5 million and indexed it for inflation.

"It sounds like a lot of money, but with land values on the rise, it's easy for some estates to hit that ceiling," John Ross Copeland said. "Many landowners' assets are tied up in the land. Having to come up with the taxes could create a real hardship for many and force closure of the family

business." The bill will now move to the Senate for consideration.

"Let's stop penalizing families for their loss," John Ross Copeland said. "To protect Texas farms, ranches and landowners, we need a full repeal of the death tax."

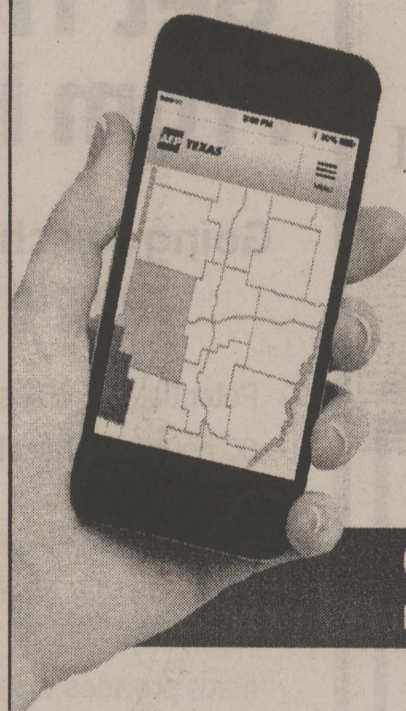
Outage alerts

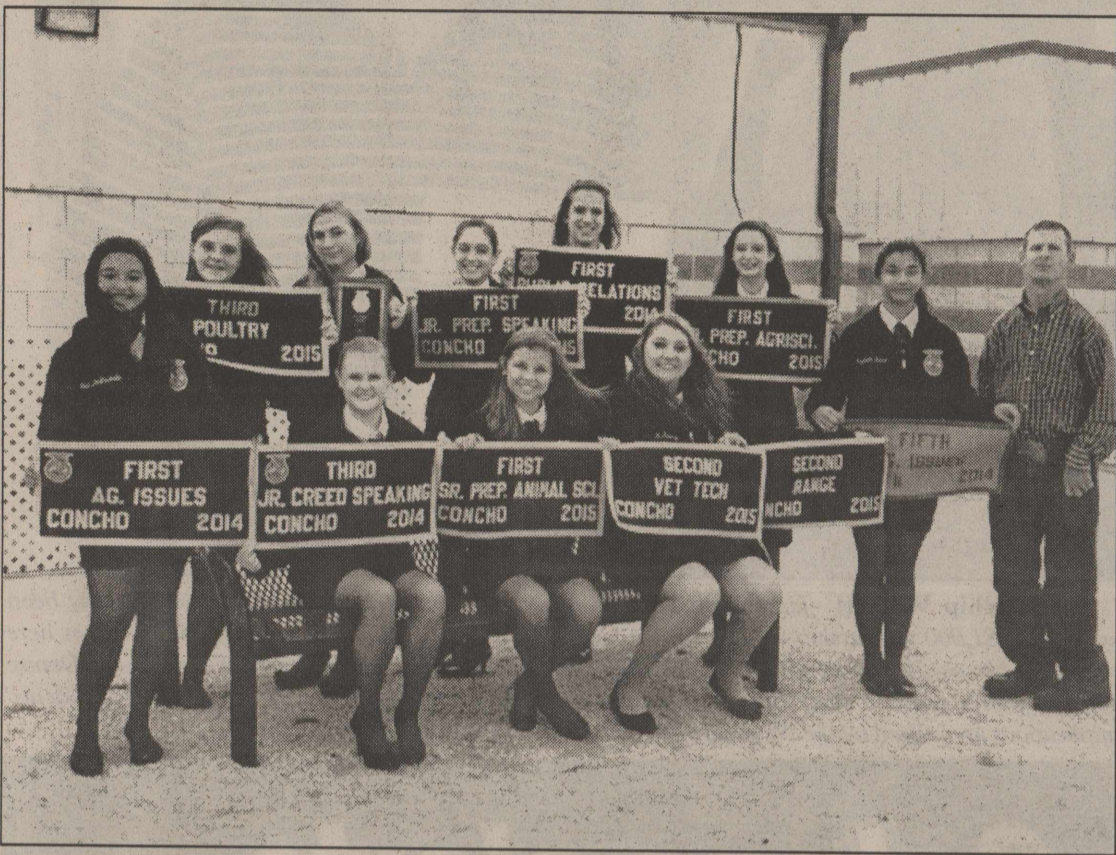
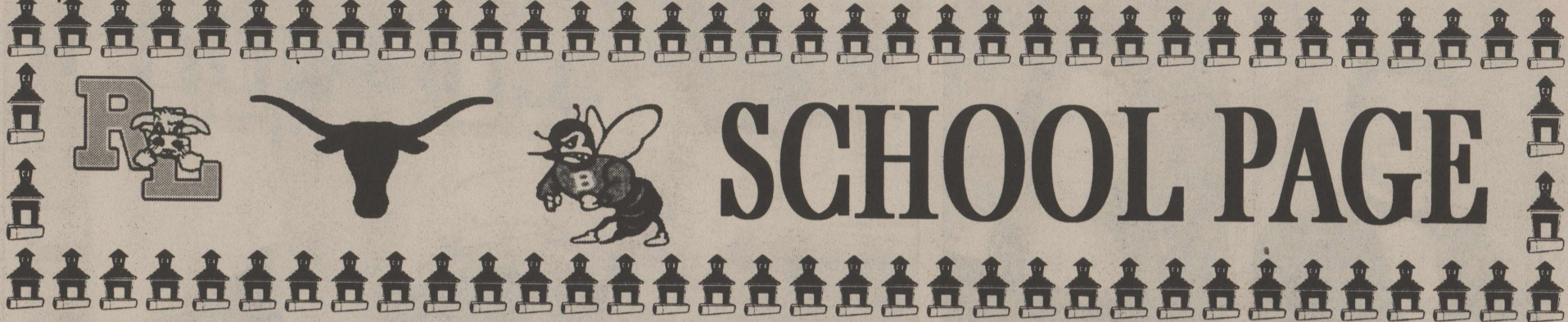

Mr. Rowdy Akins, Bronte ISD Agriculture Science Teacher, was very proud when he saw smiles on 10 Bronte FFA members last Wednesday when they attended the Concho FFA District Banquet in Grape Creek, Texas. Bronte FFA was recognized at the banquet and received 10 banners. The banquet was the highlight of the year for FFA, spotlighting the hard work of FFA members in numerous areas which reflect classroom instruction in basic technical, leadership,

interpersonal and teamwork skills. Bronte FFA competed in 19 speaking and judging contests throughout the year and represented the Ag Department, school and community very well.

Leadership Development Events focus on creating situations for members to demonstrate their abilities in public speaking, decision making, communication and their knowledge of agriculture and the FFA organization. Team and individual events are used to reinforce what is taught in agricultural science classrooms. All LDE (fall events) have elimination rounds at the

district and area before the state level competition. In November the Bronte FFA competed in 9 LDE events at the district level.
