Robert Lee VFD receives grant for rescue tools

The use of rescue stabilization struts creates a safer emergency scene and helps save lives. Robert Lee Volunteer Fire Department recently received a \$10,200 grant from Texas A&M Forest Service to help enhance their rescue capabilities with the purchase of rescue struts.

"We are glad to have tools that will help us to be of greater assistance to the public. The tools can be used for auto stabilization and extrication, structural shoring and trench stabilization," said Fire Chief Ross Torres.

Stabilization is an important aspect for many rescue situations. It helps protect the rescuers and the victims from the shifting weight of unstable hazards. In the case of automobile extrications, the use of stabilization devices can improve scene safety.

"Safety is very important for the firefighter as well as the person involved in the accident," Torres said.

Highways 208 and 277 are the main thoroughfares that create the most demand for Robert Lee VFD's need for rescue tools. They get a number of calls for auto accidents.

"People drive too fast and don't pay close enough attention when passing other vehicles. We are glad to have the tools that

will help us to be of greater assistance to the public." Torres states.

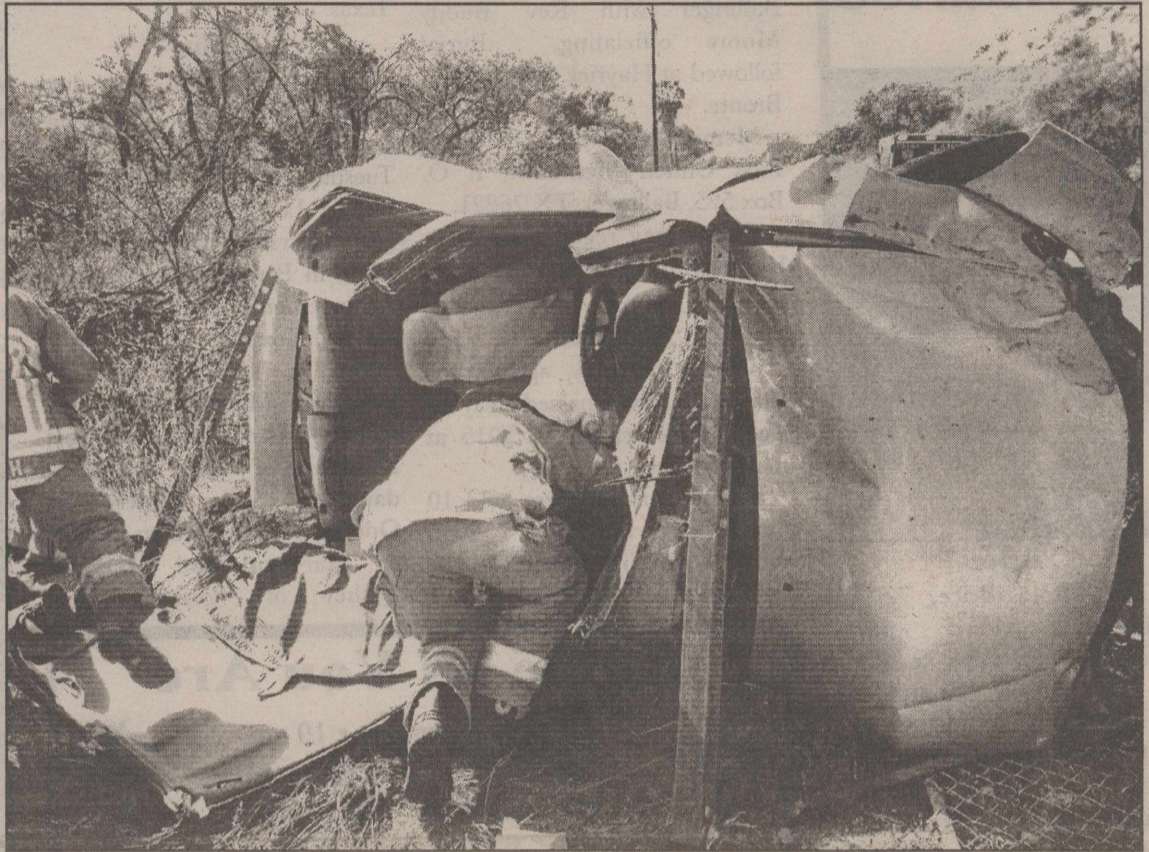
Since 1947, the Robert Lee VFD has provided a valuable service to the community and surrounding area. The service continues today as the department strives for safe operations on emergency scenes and participates in specialized training to enhance their skills.

Volunteer firefighters operate 85 percent of the fire departments in Texas. This year TFS will pass approximately \$24.3 million along to VFDs across the state. The grants aid in purchasing equipment and obtaining vital firefighter training, giving them greater capabilities to protect life and property in their communities.

"I think it is great that TFS offers grants to volunteer fire departments. We have received training to enhance our skills, bunker gear, wildland gear and much needed equipment to help improve our capabilities," says Torres.

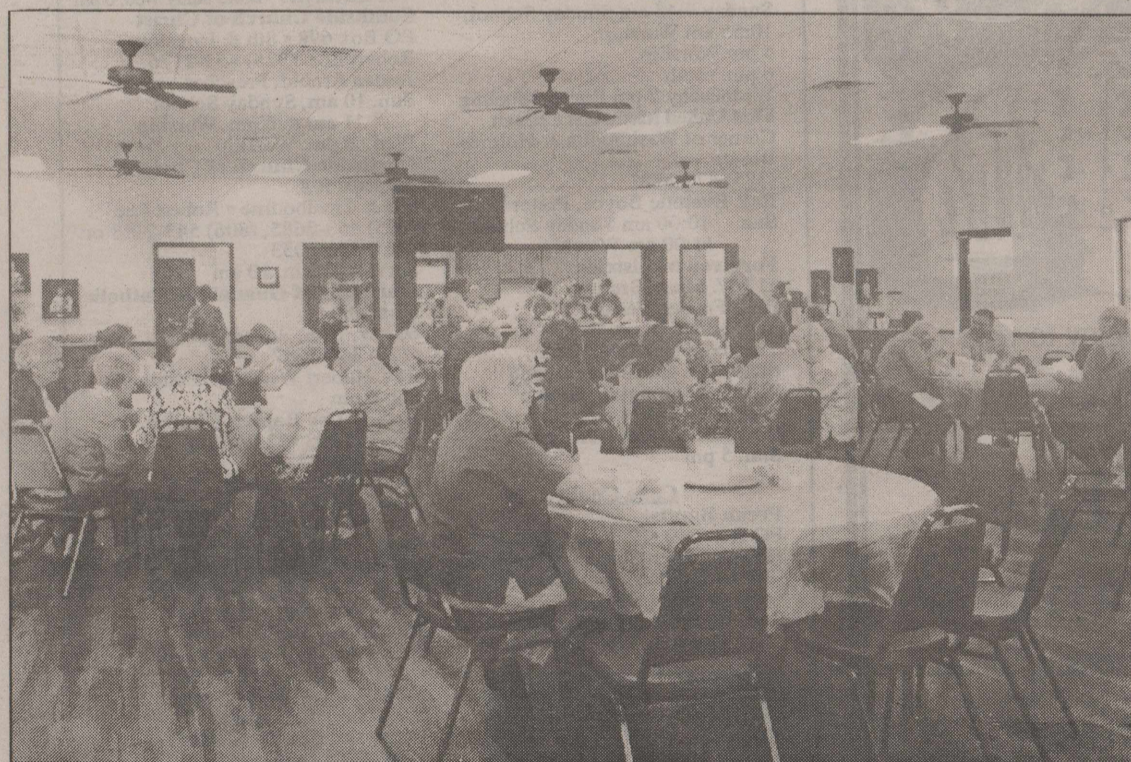
Thanksgiving service set for November 22

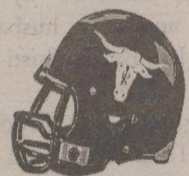

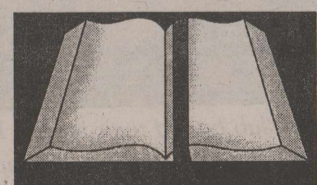

**Tax relief offered
for drought-driven
livestock sales**

Farmers and ranchers in Coke County who were forced to sell livestock because of drought have been granted more time to replace livestock and defer tax on any gains from the forced sales, said John Ross Copeland, Coke County Farm Bureau president.

The one-year extension of the replacement period applies to sales of draft animals, breeding livestock or dairy animals.

"The deferment for purchasing replacement animals is normally four years," John

Ross said. "But during an extended drought like Coke County farmers and ranchers have endured, the Internal Revenue Service (IRS) can extend the replacement period."

Coke County has a replacement period for livestock that was scheduled to expire the end of 2014. This extension impacts drought sales that occurred in 2010. But previous drought-related extensions are also affected, which means the replacement periods for some drought sales before 2010 are also impacted.

Additional extensions will be granted if severe drought conditions persist. Most Texas counties are included.

A report from the International Agency for Research on Cancer (IARC) that claims red and processed meats cause cancer is a bunch of bull, according to Coke County Farm Bureau President John Ross Copeland.

"Science does not support the IARC's claim," John Ross said. "Scientists on IARC's panel who studied the issue for seven days could not come to an agreement on whether or not there's solid evidence that red meat causes cancer. And yet, they issued a

report saying it's probable."

IARC, which is an arm of the World Health Organization, classified processed meats like ham and bacon as carcinogenic to humans.

Red meat was classified as probably carcinogenic to humans.

"Scientists have been studying cancer and its causes for years," John Ross said. "Genetics,

environment and lifestyle choices all play a role in whether or not this complex disease develops in a person or not. Science simply does not support (Continued on Page 7)

Coke County farmers pleased by stay for EPA rule

The U.S. Sixth Circuit Court of Appeals has put a temporary halt to the Environmental Protection Agency's (EPA) implementation of its Waters of the U.S., or WOTUS, rule.

The decision was greeted by farm groups and landowners across the nation with cautious optimism.

"WOTUS affects everyone. It affects what we do and how we do it," said John Ross Copeland, Coke County Farm Bureau president. "We all want clean water. But this is about control. The EPA is reaching for more power and stepping on Texas landowners to get it."

The temporary stay puts the EPA's and Corps of Engineers' enforcement of WOTUS on hold until the legal system determines jurisdiction in the lawsuits filed against WOTUS in District and Appellate courts.

Texas Farm Bureau, Matagorda County Farm Bureau and the American Farm Bureau Federation are among the entities who have filed suits challenging the rule.

Under the proposed rule, the EPA gains control over bodies of water and areas that only sometimes hold water. With that control, they can require permits for everyday work that is done in these areas.

"It allows EPA to decide, essentially, who farms and how they do it," John Ross said.

It is unclear how long the court's temporary stay will remain in effect.

The final rule became effective Aug. 28, expanding the scope of the federal government's jurisdiction over waters under the Clean Water Act.

support IARC's claim that meat causes colorectal cancer."

In the past, IARC has studied sunlight, odd sleeping hours due to shift work and eating pickled vegetables as other possible causes for cancer.

IARC is set to meet in 2016 to study the effects of coffee.

"I urge our community to do its research and look past all the 'shock and wow' reports," John Ross said. "IARC's classification system is antiquated and clouds the facts."

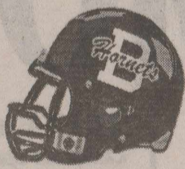
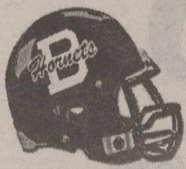
