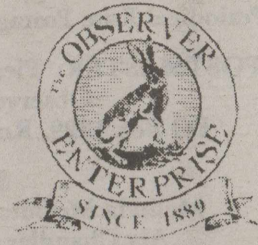

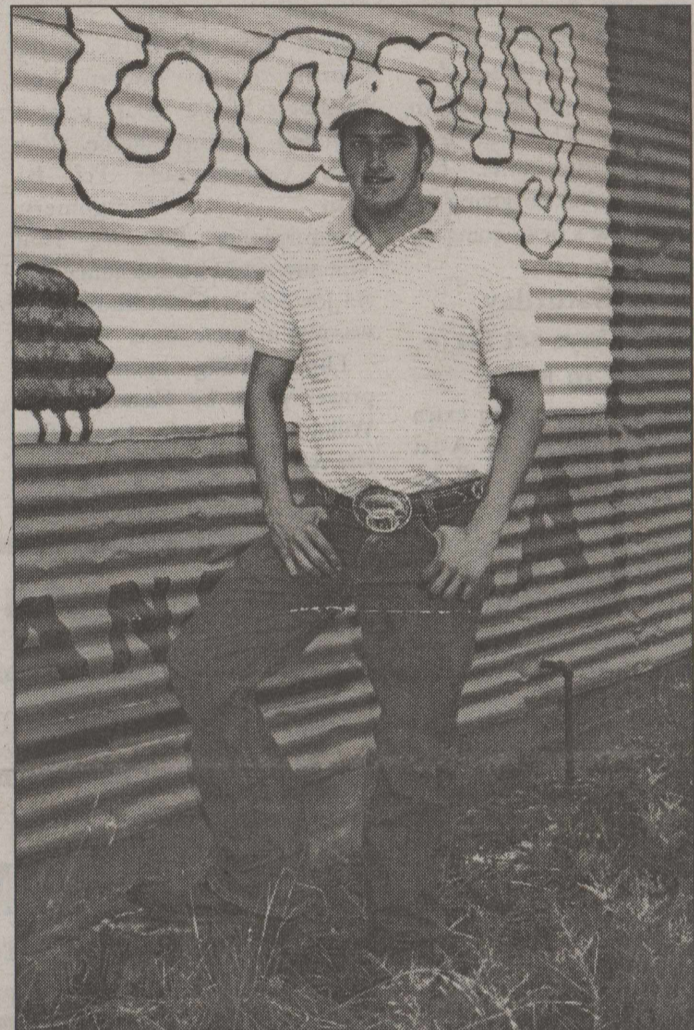
9th Annual Clay Antilley Invitation Tournament set for Saturday

Members of the court present included County Judge, Roy Blair, Commissioner, Pct. #1 Troy Montgomery, Commissioner Pct. #2 Paul Williams and Commissioner Pct. #4 Joe Sefcik. Clerk Mary Grim was also in attendance.

The meeting opened with prayer given by Commissioner Williams and pledge to the flag was recited.

Judge Blair announced the

presence of a quorum.

Commissioner Williams made a motion to approve the minutes for May 10 and May 17. The motion was seconded by Commissioner Montgomery. Motion carried.

No action taken on the burn ban

Commissioner Montgomery made a motion to approve the bond for Randi Hardesty Tax A/C. Deputy. The motion was seconded by Commissioner Sefcik. Motion carried.

Commissioner Sefcik made a motion to approve the line items as presented: Constable-From Communications #2 to Equipment Expense #2. Road & Bridge #1-from New Equipment to Equipment parts/repair. Commissioner Williams seconded the motion. Motion carried.

Commissioner Montgomery made to bring up \$557,681.68 from reserves for construction work for the CETRZ Road Project. The motion was seconded by Comm. Sefcik. Motion carried.

Comm. Williams made a motion to bring up \$145,670.42 for the 20% matching funds for the CETRZ Road Project. The motion was seconded by Comm. Montgomery. Motion carried.

Comm. Williams made a motion to award the bid to C&C Services base bid as recommended. The motion was seconded by Comm. Montgomery. Motion carried.

Comm. Williams reported on Bronte Park and Appraisal District. He also asked that Shane Kelton be put on the next agenda to discuss the AG Barn.

Comm. Montgomery requested that the inter-local agreement be put on the agenda.

There being no private road work requests, no action was taken.

Comm. Williams made a motion to pay the bills. The motion was seconded by Comm. Sefcik. Motion carried.

Judge Blair adjourned the meeting at 9:35 A.M.

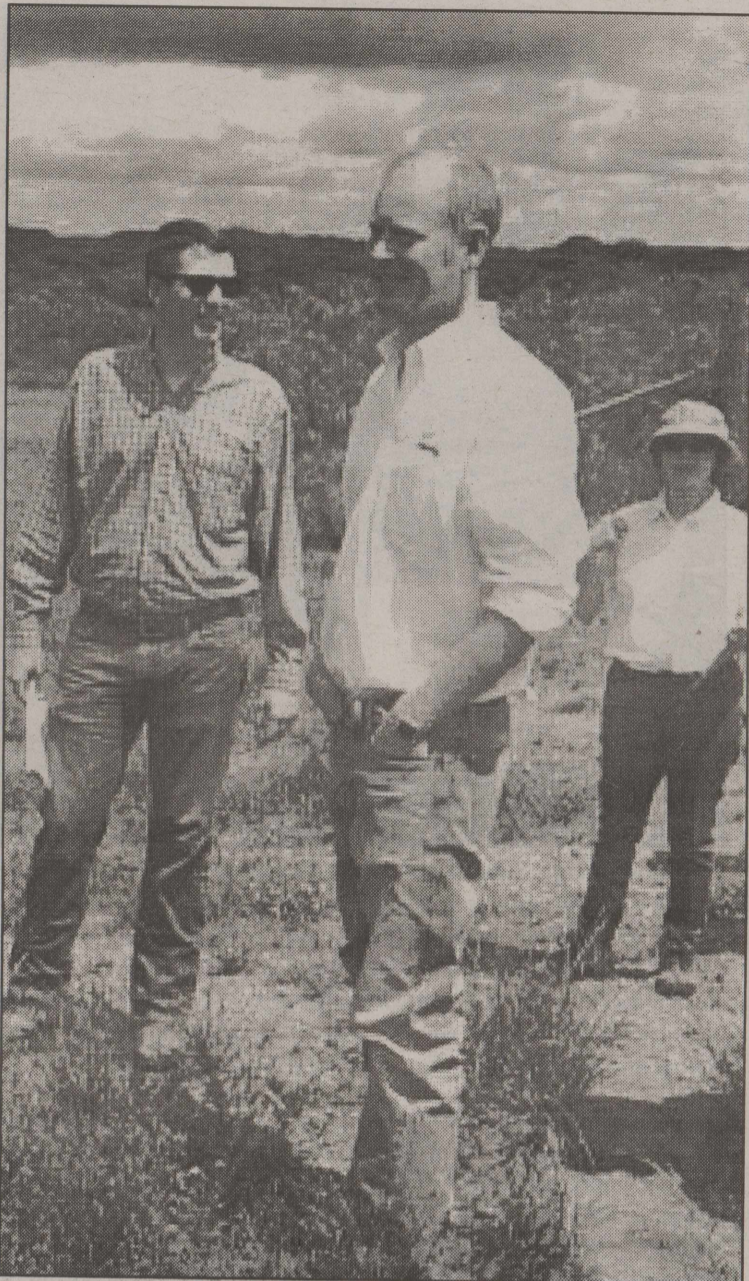

Officials visit

Coke County dams

Bronte is located where the Middle, East, and West Kickapoo creeks converge. In 1953, Bronte received 10 inches in rainfall resulting in the flooding of the town and the

surrounding countryside. The August 28, 1953, edition of the Bronte Enterprise reported that 18 families qualified for Red Cross Assistance, one person was injured, 100 homes were damaged, and 30 other buildings received water damage from the flood waters. Estimated damage was \$75,000-\$100,000. This included roads,

bridges, railroad tracks, miles and miles of farm terraces, property lining creeks and the Colorado River and loss of livestock. If the same amount of damage occurred today it would cost \$1 million to restore Bronte.

The flooding led to the founding

of the Kickapoo Creek Water Control and Improvement District and the building of six flood control structures in east Coke County. Today the district, along with assistance from the Coke County Soil and Water Conservation District and NRCS, work to maintain the

structures and request grants for maintenance and repairs.

The Coke County SWCD board sent a letter of invitation to Texas State Senator Charles Perry and State Representative Drew Darby to visit the dams to see for themselves the town,

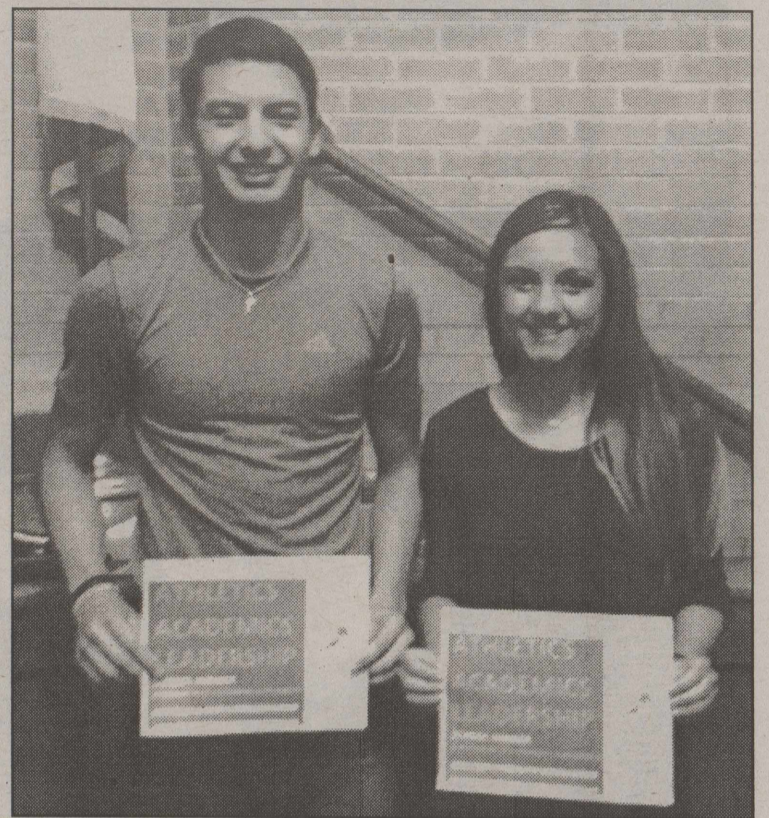

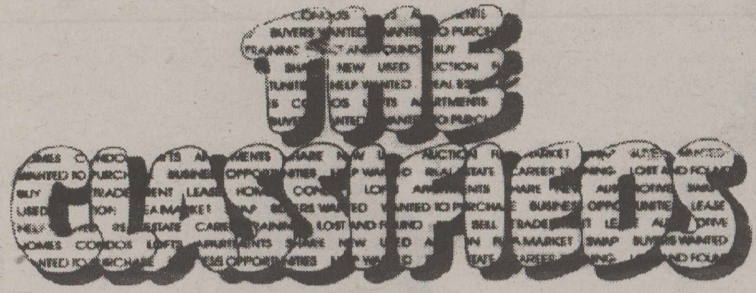

Protect your family from Mosquito-borne disease

The recent rains have been a huge blessing to Coke County but not everything that comes after is a blessing. The puddles that have formed and the various containers that have filled with water are great breeding grounds for that pesky mosquito. The Aedes aegypti mosquito has been identified as the primary vector for transmission of Zika, dengue, chikungunya, and West Nile. The Zika virus has had a large spotlight in the media recently and for good reason. Zika virus is the cause of the increased cases of microcephaly. Microcephaly is a condition affecting unborn children where the baby's head is much smaller than expected due to the underdevelopment of the baby's brain. So far there have not been any confirmed cases of Zika caused by mosquito populations in the state of Texas. Those that have been infected by the bite of an infected mosquito have either traveled to an area with Zika carrying mosquitos or their

partner has. Zika is very serious and experts are unsure what the future holds for the Zika virus in the US. Please consider these tips to help protect yourself and your family from mosquito borne diseases:

1. Dress in long, loose-fitting, light colored pants and shirts
2. Drain any standing water from containers, tires, gutters, etc. around the home.
3. Use mosquito dunks in standing water that cannot be drained. (A mosquito dunk is a

small, brown donut-looking object that floats on water and slowly dissolves, releasing a bacterium that kills mosquito larvae.

4. Reduce outdoor activity during dusk and dawn. I understand with long days and
