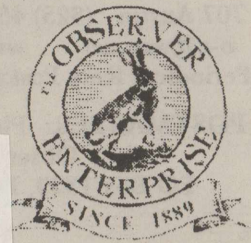

Brisket plates will be sold beginning at 5 pm. A live auction begins at 6:30 pm, followed by a dance.

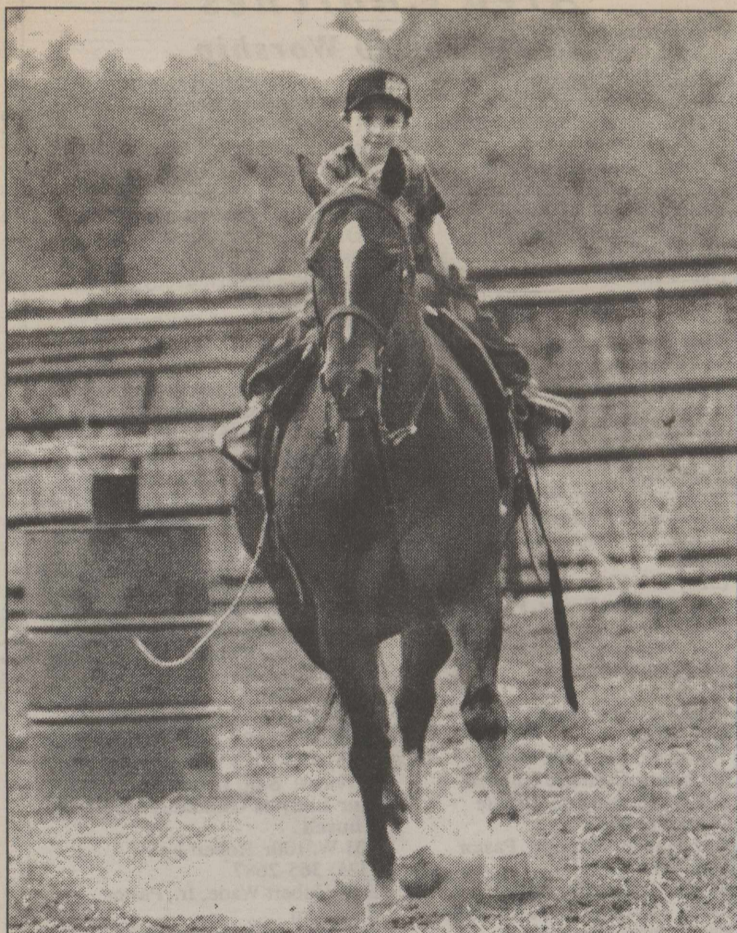

Swine Validation deadline nears

It is once again that time of year to order swine validation tags for FFA and 4-H members planning on exhibiting swine projects at the Coke County Show and the major stock shows.

Any barrow must have a state validation tag to be eligible to enter Fort Worth, San Angelo, San Antonio, Houston, or Austin stock shows. Also, any gilt must have a state validation tag to be able to participate in the CTBR Stars of Texas gilt show at the San Angelo Stock show.

To place your tag order, contact your Agriscience teacher or the Coke County Extension office. The tag order is due by Thursday, September 22, 2016, to the swine validation chairman. Swine validation will be held in November and will be set by the county stock show board of directors.

The Board of Directors of the West Coke County Hospital District met for a Budget Hearing August 30, 2016. President Pat Stephens called the meeting to order at 9:30 am and declared a quorum was present. Board members present were Sarah Green, Patsy Cason, Pat Carwile and Noel Tinkler. John Rainbolt, Administrator, and Janie Munoz, BOM, were also present at the meeting. The invocation was given by Patsy Cason. There were not visitors for the budget hearing, so the Board went into regular session at 10:05 am. Minutes from the previous meeting were approved, and one absent member was excused from that meeting.

Floyd and Jan Pettitt met with the Board to share some changes in employee insurance for the coming year.

The census count shows there are currently 32 residents in the facility, as of the meeting date.

In the staffing update, it was reported that the facility is fully staffed, with an on-going need for prn nurses and CNA's.

The Business Office Consultant, Della Alexander, gave a report to the Board concerning the resolution of some filing issues in the account receivable.

The financial statements were discussed and accepted as presented.

There are no capital projects pending.

The Board voted to keep the tax rate the same as in past years.

The Board also voted to cancel the contract with the EMS due to legal concerns.

The Administrator gave his report.
