



Springing to Life! By Erin Oleksiuk, District Technician, Coke County SWCD


We may be in for an early spring in Coke county. Ranchers have reported grass greening up in pastures and residents are beginning to notice iris, bluebonnets, and hyacinth blooming in flowerbeds. It doesn't matter if you are a county bumpkin or a city mouse, plant knowledge is important.

Our native plants can provide excellent forage and habitat for livestock and wildlife. Some vegetation may not be edible by larger animals but provide seeds to birds. There are plants that are an excellent food source for deer, antelope, sheep, and goats but are ignored by cattle. Others are poisonous to livestock but palatable by deer at certain times of the year. Some plants seem so prickly and thorny that they must serve no purpose, but most vegetation will serve some animals in some way. For example, Tasajillo are spiny plants that no one wants to run across but birds will eat the small, red tunas and it can provide hiding cover for quail.

Knowing what is growing on your property is important for many reasons; aggressive vegetation will take over an area or poisonous plants being dangerous around pets and children. Maximilian sunflowers and whitebrush are both very aggressive. Even though the Maximilian boasts a pretty, yellow flower and the whitebrush is very fragrant, they can take over an area quickly. Locoweed, jimson weed, and floxglove plants are poisonous to both humans and livestock and are readily found in our area.

Some natives prefer certain soil types, giving us clues to what else might be able to thrive in that area, aiding landowners in reseeding and planting.

Not only will plant identification give you greater insight to the plants around you but it is also a fun hobby to enjoy. George Clendenin, local rangeland management specialist, published a new book titled, Common Rangeland Plants of West Central Texas. This book should be a staple for all landowners; filled with excellent photographs, descriptions, livestock and

president, said. "Farmers are moving equipment to the field and ranchers are hauling livestock to different pastures."

Farm equipment moves slower than other vehicles on the road, which is why John Ross urges motorists to drive safely.

Due to the size of farm equipment and the narrowness of many rural roads, tractors, combines, plows and planters often have difficulty moving to the side or shoulder of the road.

"Drivers should use caution when coming around a sharp turn or topping a steep hill because they can come upon slow moving vehicles like farm equipment," John Ross said. "Farmers and ranchers should also do their part to share the roadways."

Data from the Texas Department of Transportation (TxDOT) shows accidents involving farm equipment on rural roads has slightly increased from 197 accidents in 2011 to 233 in 2015.







The Dragon's Not Gone, Just Asleep.

By Mark Sides, RLVFD Smoke on the wind this morning generated a lot of phone calls and questions. North winds brought smoke from fires near Amarillo as far as the Concho Valley and Permian Basin. Two fires in the Panhandle have consumed approximately 125,000 acres, and are still active.

This is just a reminder that Wildcat, Dos Amigos, and Whitehat became household names in Coke County during 2011. Wildcat, Rockhouse, Deaton-Cole, Possum Kingdom and others made national headlines.

Above average temperatures, large amounts of dry fuels, low relative humidity, and strong winds could again set the stage where a careless spark, a lightning strike, or an arcing power line become the opening number in a Texas Firestorm.

Robert Lee, Bronte and outlying communities are no different from other rural Texas where rangeland, towns pastures, and CRP may be near or immediately adjacent to homes and businesses.

These are a few simple items that will reduce the chances of your home going up in smoke:

1) Routinely clean gutters, especially in the fall. Keep your yard clean of leaves, limbs, and dead grass.

2) Remove tree limbs that extend over the eaves of the roof or within 10-15 feet of the chimney

3) Keep your grass mowed to a 4" height or less, and if possible, well watered during periods of extreme drought. Prune tree branches at least 10 feet from the ground.

4) Landscape using deciduous trees and shrubs such as oaks, agarito, eastern redbud, desert willow, and sages. Avoid junipers, pines, and other evergreens unless they are planted 100 feet or further from the house.

5) Make sure your house number and street number are clearly posted to provide firefighters easy identification.

6) Maintain at least 30 feet of open space between your home and the surrounding brush line or CRP field.

connected at all times and long enough to reach around the house.

9) Store firewood at least 15 to 30 feet away from the house. 10) Maintain roads and entrances to provide easy access and adequate turnaround space for emergency equipment.

11) Exercise extreme caution and keep a reliable, pressurized water source handy when doing any outdoor burning or welding.

12) Don't allow tall grass and debris to accumulate against your house or under your porch or deck.

These items alone may not guarantee that your home will survive, but they will give your home and responding firefighters a fighting chance.

City of Bronte to

The City of Bronte, in conjunction with the Texas Communities Group, LLC, will begin placing FOR SALE signs on available Trust Property within the City of Bronte in the coming days. This project is a part of the clean-up effort spearheaded by the City of Bronte and the participating entities.

Trust properties are lots and tracts of land which have been foreclosed upon to collect a tax lien due the local governmental entities, the City of Bronte, Coke County, Bronte ISD, East Coke County Hospital District and Coke County Underground Water Conservation District. These properties were put up for auction and went unsold at the tax sale. The properties are then "struck-off" to the entities.

The placement of the signs on available property will identify the properties available for purchase. There will also be catalogs disbursed within the community.

Anyone over 18 years old can submit a bid for a property. However, a successful bidder **CANNOT** owe delinquent taxes on other property in the county, owe an unpaid fine or fee to the city and/or county, and/or own other property in the city/ county that is subject to existing penalties for codes enforcement.

Bids may be placed online at www.texascg.com or www.brontetexas.org or you can simply go to Bronte City Hall and submit a bid, which is the price you would consider paying for the property you wish to buy. Should you meet the requirements listed above and your bid is sufficient and accepted by all entities, the property will be deeded to you upon receipt of the payment of your bid amount and fees to cover the cost of the deed and recording fees, which are minimal.
