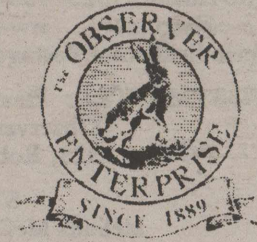

## Robert Lee City Council posts February minutes

The Robert Lee City Council met in regular session on February 16, 2017, with Mayor Leroy Casey presiding. Members present were Roger Alexander, Shauna Grantham, Janie Munoz, Joe Longoria and Toni Rainwater.

The meeting started at 6 pm with a quorum present. City staff present included Kay Torres, City Secretary, and Linda Barrera. The sign in sheet is on file.

The Pledge of Allegiance was recited and an Invocation given.

Open Forum: Renee Smith, ACO, stated she had received a donation of pet beds for the shelter. Councilmember Alexander questioned why the Red Canyon Gun Club Lease was not on this agenda. Councilmember Rainwater questioned that the minutes were not being sent to the newspaper.

A. Consent Agenda (Items A 1-5)

Motion to approve Consent Agenda Items 1-5 was made by Councilmember Alexander. Motion was seconded by Councilmember Rainwater. Motion carried.

B. Regular Business:

Agenda Item 6: Fire Marshall Motion made by Councilmember Rainwater to remove Mark Sides from the Fire Marshall position and to approve appointment of Tom Fletcher. Motion was seconded by Councilmember Grantham. Mr. Fletcher was introduced

and answered questions. Mr. Fletcher requested in lieu of the \$40.00 monthly compensation that the City provide him a pair of fire boots. Following discussion, Councilmember Rainwater moved to amend her previous motion to include the purchase in lieu of compensation a pair of fire boots not to exceed an amount of \$400.00 at which time of Mr. Fletcher's resignation the boots are to be returned to the City. The amended motion was seconded by Councilmember Grantham. Motion carried.

Agenda Item 7: May 6, 2017 Election Order & Resolution Motion made by Councilmember Munoz approve an election order and resolution calling for a General Election and a Special Election to be held on May 6, 2017 to fill three regular term council members and an unexpired term created by a vacancy. Motion was seconded by Councilmember Longoria. Motion carried.

Agenda Item 8: Rate Analysis Water rate analysis was reviewed and discussed. Councilmember Alexander expressed his thoughts on the

water rates. The water rate study performed by Steven Mindt with the Texas Rural Water Association looked at the infrastructure and placed a dollar amount on the original cost, and projected replacement cost for budget expenses. The projection was to budget Agenda \$103,000 for the CIP (capital infrastructure). Currently the City collects about \$62,000 from the debt service and the capital improvement infrastructure fund. Also discussed was changing the rate structure to charge by meter size and have a tiered system for billing water based on consumption. Currently the water rate is base rate of \$50.00 plus \$3.82 per thousand gallons from the first gallon and the same thereafter. The following questions were considered and analyzed. What should the expense budget be? What should the meter charge be? What should the per thousand gallon charge be for water? What should be the rate charged to Coke County Water Supply Corporation? This discussion will continue at the March council meeting.

Agenda Item 9: Present and future water plans

Mayor Casey stated that The Observer/Enterprise plans to run articles with the help of Mayor Casey regarding the City's endeavors to find alternate water resources. Update was given regarding the Automated Meter Reading project.

Agenda Item 10: Water operator vacancy

Mayor Casey reported that John Tamez resigned and a job posting has been advertised for in The Observer/Enterprise.

Agenda Item 11: Utility Billing Clerk vacancy

City Secretary reported that Brenda Martinez had tendered her resignation effective March 31st. A job posting has been advertised for in The Observer/Enterprise.

Agenda Item 12: Budget

Review & Amendment(s)

Councilmember Grantham moved for approval of Ordinance #1272; budget amendment. Motion was seconded by Councilmember Longoria. City Secretary presented Ordinance #1272 establishing amendments to the current fiscal year budget. Motion carried.

Agenda Item 13: Pre-authorization purchase of a pre-owned vehicle

Councilmember Munoz moved to consider the approval of a purchase of a pre-owned 3/4 ton pickup and an amendment to the budget for said purchase. Motion was seconded by Councilmember Grantham. Mayor Casey reported that he has been looking for a replacement of Unit 1 vehicle and would like authorization to make a discretionary purchase if located. Councilmember Alexander moved to authorize Mayor Casey to purchase a 3/4 ton pickup with a spending limit of no more than \$25,000 to replace Unit 1 and approval of a budget amendment for said purchase. Motion was seconded by Councilmember Munoz. Motion carried.

C. Reports: Mayor Report:

1. Mayor and Councilmember Alexander attended a lunch sponsored by Texas Tribune with Representative Darby on January 19th.

2. Mayor attended a meeting with CRMWD, TWDB & Region F on February 2nd

3. Reported of an authorization that UCRA obtained.

City Secretary Report:

1. Reported of attendance at the Texas Municipal Clerk's Election Law Seminar on January 24-27 in Frisco TX.

2. Candidate filing period January 18 - February 17 for the May 6, 2017 General Election.

3. City Hall will be closed February 20th for President's Day.

Water Superintendent Report:

1. Reported ongoing projects. Will be relocating 13 water meters.

2. Water plant maintenance & activity.

3. Sewer plant maintenance & activity.

D. Request for future Agenda items: Continue analysis of current water rate structure. Red Canyon Gun Club Lease.

There being no further business the meeting adjourned at 8:47 p.m.

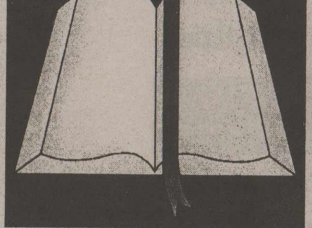

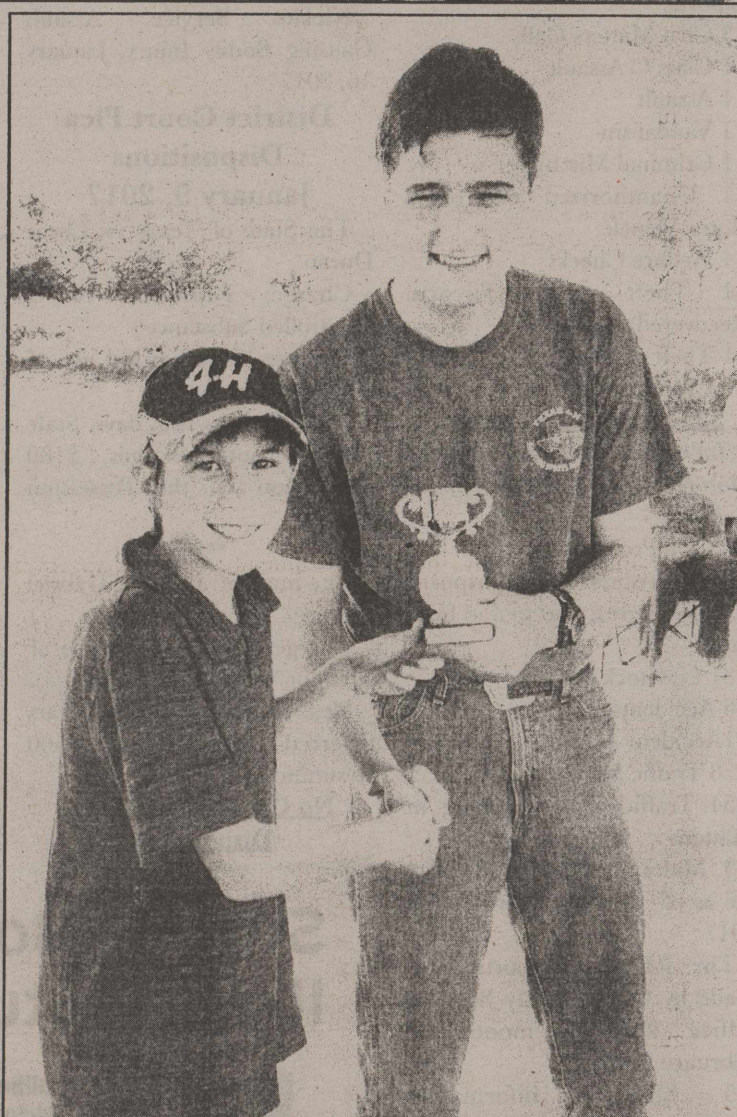

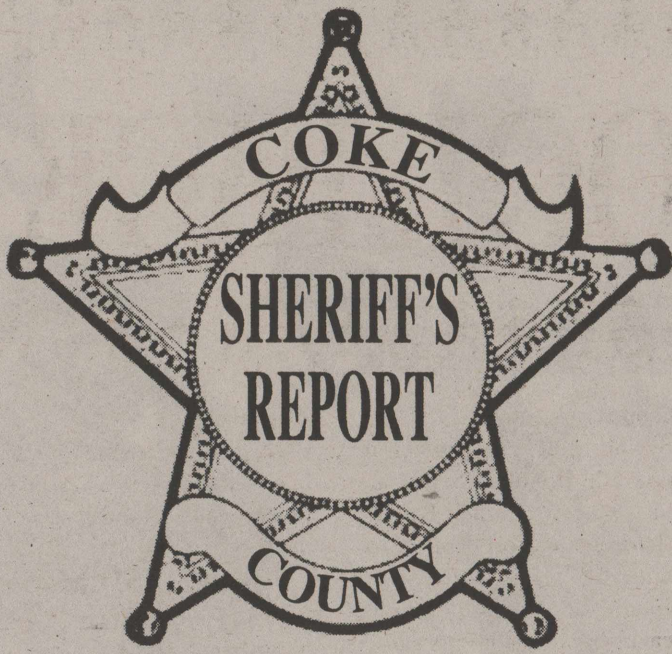

Nearly half a million acres of the Texas Panhandle burned. Homes, barns and fences burned. Some lost livestock. Others lost their lives.

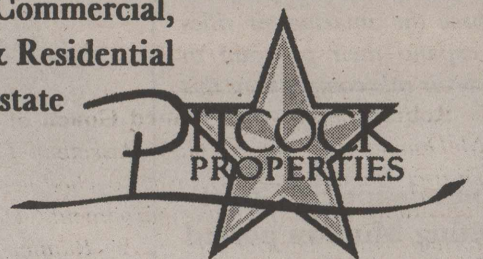
Now that the fires are out, farmers, ranchers and landowners are working to rebuild. But they need help.

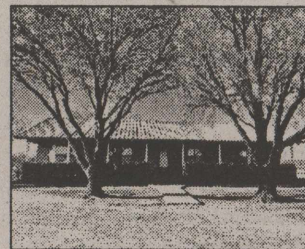
Following the fires, farmers and ranchers from across Texas and neighboring states trucked hay and other donations to the Panhandle. As of March 13, hay

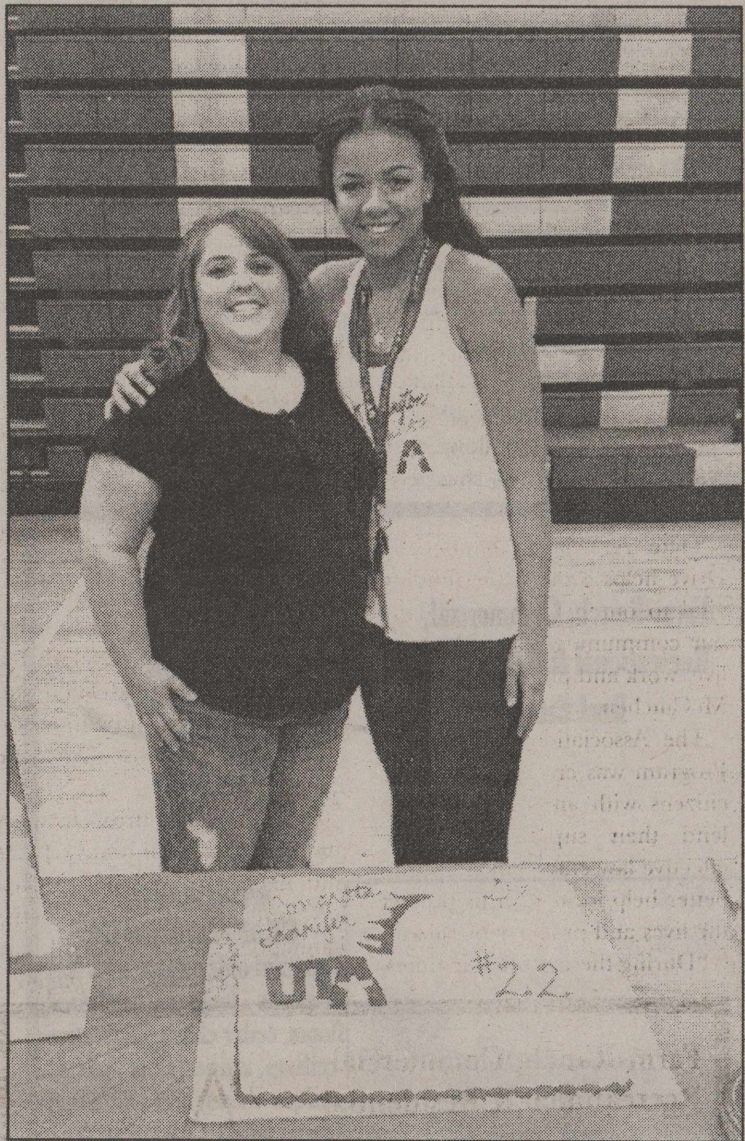
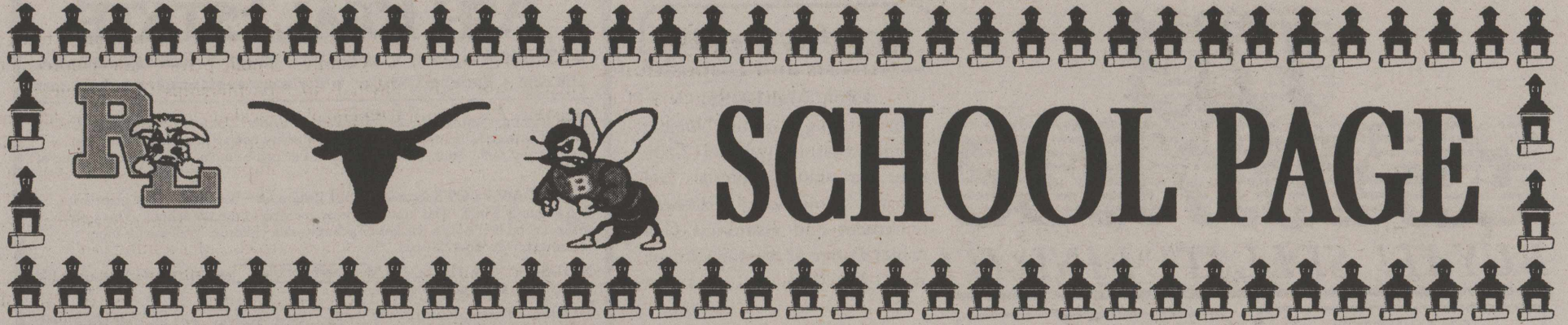

**NOTICE OF RATE CHANGE REQUEST**

Oncor Electric Delivery Company LLC ("Oncor") publishes this notice that on March 17, 2017, Oncor filed with the Public Utility Commission of Texas ("Commission") its Petition and Statement of Intent to Change Rates, a copy of which is kept at Oncor's office at 1616 Woodall Rogers Freeway, Dallas, Texas 75202. This notice is being published pursuant to Commission Procedural Rule 22.51(a)(1).

Oncor's rate filing, based on the system-wide financial results for a 12-month test year ending on December 31, 2016, adjusted for known and measurable changes, supports a net increase in transmission and distribution rates of approximately \$317 million over adjusted test-year revenues, or approximately a 7.5% increase over adjusted test-year revenues of \$4,214.2 million. Test-year revenues have been adjusted to normalize billing units, to remove the revenues associated with Oncor's Energy Efficiency Cost Recovery Factor, and to increase test-year revenues to reflect Transmission Cost of Service ("TCOS") and Transmission Cost Recovery Factor ("TCRF") adjustments. TCOS revenue was adjusted to include the September 15, 2016 interim update rates at 2016 Option 2 ERCOT 4CP. TCRF revenue was adjusted to equal the March 1, 2017 TCRF revenue requirement reflected on Line 2, Attachment A of Oncor's petition filed and approved in Docket No. 46616. If approved, the increased rates will be charged to Oncor's direct customers, all retail electric providers ("REPs"), in those portions of Oncor's service area under the original jurisdiction of the Commission. Each such REP is potentially affected by the proposed change. Depending on the REPs' actions, the end-use customer classes of such REPs are potentially affected by the proposed change. In addition, the result could be a change in Oncor's transmission cost of service rates, which would impact all load serving entities in the Electric Reliability Council of Texas. Oncor has requested an April 21, 2017 effective date for its proposed rate change.

Persons who wish to intervene in or comment upon these proceedings, in Docket No. 46957, Application of Oncor Electric Delivery Company LLC for Authority to Change Rates, should notify the Commission as soon as possible, as an intervention deadline will be imposed. **Fire Season Tips**

By Mark Sides, RLVFD

Above average temperatures, large amounts of dry fuels, low relative humidity, and strong winds could again set the stage where a careless spark, a lightning strike, or an arcing power line become the opening number in a Texas Firestorm.

Robert Lee, Bronte and outlying communities are no different from other rural Texas towns where rangeland, pastures, and CRP may be near or immediately adjacent to homes and businesses.

These are a few simple items that will reduce the chances of your home going up in smoke:

1) Routinely clean gutters, especially in the fall. Keep your yard clean of leaves, limbs, and dead grass.

2) Remove tree limbs that extend over the eaves of the roof or within 10-15 feet of the chimney

3) Keep your grass mowed to

a 4" height or less, and if possible, well watered during periods of extreme drought. Prune tree branches at least 10 feet from the ground.

4) Landscape using deciduous trees and shrubs such as oaks, agarito, eastern redbud, desert willow, and sages. Avoid junipers, pines, and other evergreens unless they are planted 100 feet or further from the house.

5) Make sure your house number and street number are clearly posted to provide firefighters easy identification.

6) Maintain at least 30 feet of open space between your home and the surrounding brush line or CRP field.

7) Avoid concentrations of shrubbery or ornamental grasses up against the house.

8) Have garden hoses connected at all times and long enough to reach around the house.

9) Store firewood at least 15 to 30 feet away from the house.

10) Maintain roads and entrances to provide easy access and adequate turnaround space for emergency equipment.

11) Exercise extreme caution and keep a reliable, pressurized water source handy when doing any outdoor burning or welding.

12) Don't allow tall grass and debris to accumulate against your house or under your porch or deck.

\*These items alone may not guarantee that your home will survive, but they will give your home and responding firefighters a fighting chance.

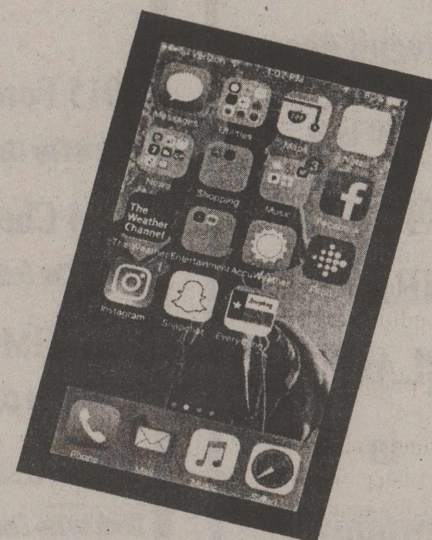
