The City of Bronte has three council positions up for election. These are two year terms currently held by council members Martin Lee, George Tomes and Misti Bedford. On the ballot for these positions are Stormy Vaughn, David Bedford, Rodriguez, Orlando DeLaGarza, and Paul Knight. Early voting will be held at City Hall from 8 am to 5 pm Mondays, Tuesdays, Wednesdays, and Thursday and Friday, 7 am to 7 pm.

Bronte ISD will hold an election for two members of the Board of Trustees. These are three year terms currently held by John Seales and Jodie Arrott. Jodie Arrott and John Seales will be joined on the ballot by Margaret Charlesworth and Kinley Pritchard. The early voting will be held in the Superintendent's office from 8 am to 4 pm each day.







Through cooperation with city Former Robert Lee mayors the city of Robert Lee was given Region F, the Texas Water Development Board, and the Department Agriculture to obtain funding for this project. Robert Lee's engineer, James Busby, delivered the applications in person to each agency in order to expedite the grant process.

The funding required volunteer participation for 4.5 miles of the pipeline from the community members in Robert Lee. The citizens of Robert Lee stepped up to the plate and in true Texas open heart tradition, Bronte community members also donated their time and labor to the pipeline construction. In addition to local companies, Vermeer provided a giant ditching machine for the project.


Due to the generous donations of time, expertise, equipment and labor, the pipeline was completed a good deal ahead of schedule. This was fortunate. At the time the pipeline construction was completed, Robert Lee was only six weeks from being totally out of water.


