Fort Chadbourne Gold Star Families Memorial Monument

Groundbreaking set for May 12

On Friday, May 12, 2017, at 10:30 am, the Fort Chadbourne Foundation will be breaking ground on a Gold Star Families Memorial Monument to be erected at Fort Chadbourne later this year. WWII Medal of Honor recipient Hershel "Woody" Williams will be on hand to help with the groundbreaking.

The purpose of the Gold Star Families Memorial Monument is to honor Gold Star Families, preserve the memory of the fallen, and stand as a stark reminder that Freedom is not free. This stunning black granite monument features two sides. One side bears the words: Gold Families Memorial Monument, a tribute to Gold Star Mothers, Fathers, and Relatives who have sacrificed a Loved One for our Freedom. The other side tells a story through the four granite panels: Homeland, Family, Patriot, and Sacrifice. The scenes on each panel are a reflection of Gold Star Families and their fallen Heroes. At the center of this tribute is the most distinct feature of the monument, the 6'6" cut out of a saluting soldier representing the Loved One who paid the ultimate sacrifice in the name of Freedom.

The Hershel Woody Williams

Medal of Honor Foundation was established a few years ago to work with other foundations and communities to place these monuments all across the United Fort Chadbourne wanted to be a part of such an honorable tribute and this will be the first one placed in the West Texas area. Once the monument is completed, a dedication will be held. It is tentatively set for this fall. A 2' replica of the monument is on display at Fort Chadbourne. 



Citizens of Bronte,




