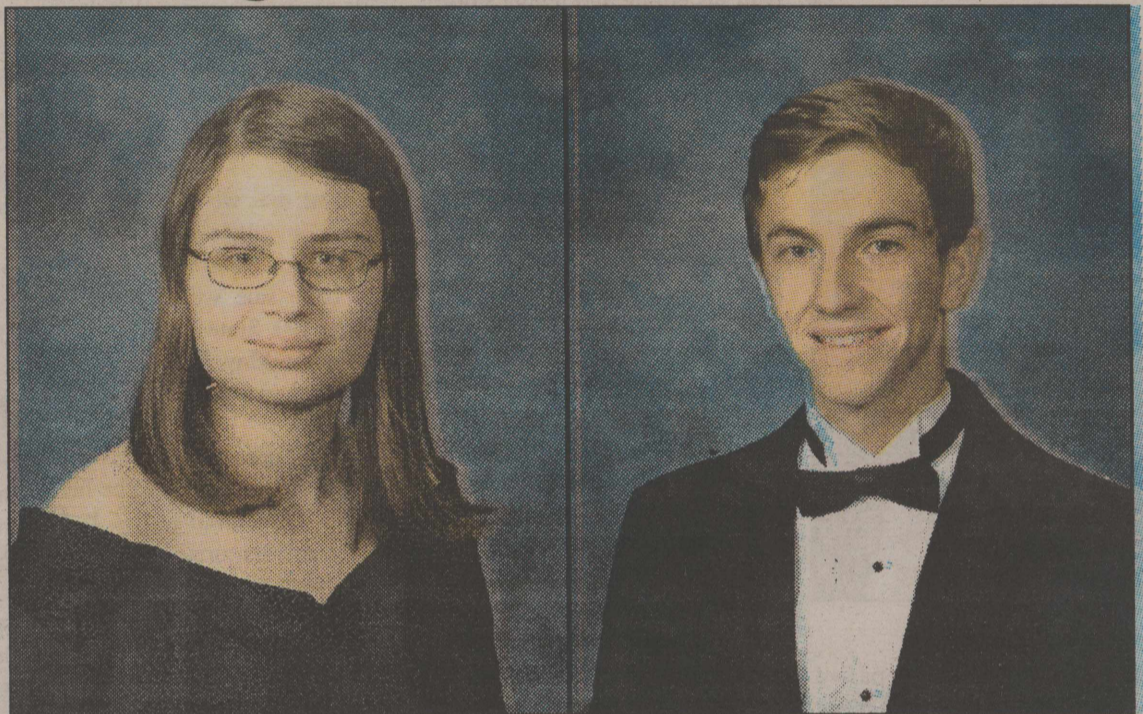

Benny was born on May 28, 1929, to Marshall and Winnie Ann Rogers in Breckenridge, Texas. His childhood was spent in the oil field camps of West Texas - Denver City, Hobbs and Wink.

Local support grows for Red River landowners battling feds

Coke County farmers and ranchers are cheering a recent admission by the federal Bureau of Land Management (BLM) that it incorrectly conducted surveys used to claim private property along the Red River.

"No landowner should have to go through this," John Ross Copeland, Coke County Farm Bureau president, said. "After decades of working the land, paying taxes on it and building lives there, the federal government stepped in and said it was theirs. It's not right."

Two years ago, BLM claimed some 90,000 acres along a 116 mile stretch south of the Red River. The claim made was made thanks to a previous landowner lawsuit that gave BLM contested land between the Texas and Oklahoma border.

Following the announcement, eight landowners, three counties, a county sheriff, the state of Texas and the General Land Office filed suit against BLM and the federal government.

During the discovery phase of the trial, BLM admitted mistakes in accounting for movement of the Red River over time into consideration.

"We're thankful BLM finally admitted an error that the landowners have contested all

along," John Ross said. "Their fight for the land that is rightfully theirs is not over. We support their suit and hope one day the cloud over their private property is lifted."

The landowners are represented by the Texas Public Policy Foundation's Center for the American Future.

Their lawsuit is expected to go to trial this summer in Wichita Falls.

"Texas Farm Bureau has played an integral role in these landowners' fight for their property," John Ross said. "Their viral video brought the issue to light and encouraged others to join in to protect private property rights across Texas."

Farm Bureau is still working on a legislative solution like the Red River Gradient Boundary Survey Act, which is sponsored by Congressman Mac Thornberry and Senator John Cornyn. The legislation, which passed the House earlier this year, establishes a fair process for conducting land surveys along the Red River.

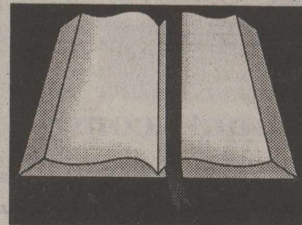

Coke County Commissioners met in regular session on April 11, 2017, at the courthouse in Robert Lee. Those in attendance included County Judge Roy Blair, Commissioner Precinct #1 Donald Robertson, Commissioner Precinct #2 Paul Williams, Commissioner Precinct #3 Marshall Millican, Precinct #4 Joe Sefcik, and Mary Grim, Clerk.

The meeting opened with the pledge to the flag and prayer was offered by Judge Blair

Judge Blair announced the presence of a quorum.

Commissioner Robertson made a motion to approve the minutes for March 28, 2017, as corrected. The motion was seconded by Commissioner Williams. The motion carried.

The Treasurer's Report was presented by Treasurer Hal Spain. He reported on sick leave and depositories. Commissioner Williams made a motion to approve the Treasurer's Report. The motion was seconded by Commissioner Sefcik. The motion carried.

Extension Agents Morgan Runyon and Kandice Everitt presented their reports.

Sheriff Wayne McCutchen presented his report.

The Tax Collector's Report was presented by Deputy Randi Hardesty.

County/District Clerk Mary Grim presented her report.

Constable Precinct #1 Marty Boyd presented his report.

Justice of the Peace Jackie Walker presented her report.

The DR report was not available.

The Trapper's Report was not available.

No action was taken on the burn ban.

The Court received a request

from Mobilitie to construct a cell tower off Rocky Point Rd. Commissioner Williams moved to approve Mobilitie's request 27 feet from center of roadway, Coke County be listed additional insured, and only on County owned property. The motion was seconded by Commissioner Robertson. The motion carried.

Extension Agent Morgan Runyon addressed the Court about using some Courthouse land for a study of perennial plans and a demonstration of water collection. They would need about 900 feet. Commissioner Sefcik made a motion to allow them to use the northeast corner. The motion was seconded by Commissioner Millican. The motion carried.

Commissioner Williams made a motion to approve the bond for Tax A/C Deputy Paul Pineda. The motion was seconded by Commissioner Millican. The motion carried.

Commissioner Williams reported on the water well at Bronte Park. SB 5 is adverse to Coke County and is supported by Senator Perry, sick leave policy, and that next Thursday is a work day at the park and is asking for help from the west side.

Judge Blair reported that he will be going to Austin next Thursday.

Auditor Vallery Johnson reported that she will be handing out worksheets for budget.


There were no private road work requests, therefore no action was taken.

Commissioner Robertson made a motion to pay the 3 registers of bills. The motion was seconded by Commissioner

City Council Meeting! Numerous members of the public were in attendance at the Robert Lee City Council meeting held Monday, May 8, 2017. The week prior to Monday's meeting, two petitions were circulated throughout town offering different viewpoints on the sea containers placed near the intersection of Highway 208 and Austin Street. Leta Caston, owner of This 'N That Shop and Caston Company, LLC, owns the lots and containers in dispute. Before purchasing the containers, she made calls to determine that no Robert Lee City Ordinance would be violated. At Monday's council meeting, it was stated that Robert Lee currently had no ordinances regulating sea containers. Noel Tinkler (pictured above) presented a petition opposing the placement of the containers in such a prominent position at the intersection of two highways. Several citizens addressed the council on both sides of the issue. Mrs. Caston stated that she would like to have an occasional flea market at the location. She mentioned that the day prior to the meeting, the location was used for a benefit lunch for Toni Rainwater's medical fund. She further stated she would welcome all local organizations to take advantage of the location for their fundraisers. The city council voted that Mrs. Caston would have to get a business license in order to operate a business from the containers. The business license requirement was a result of Ordinance 1249 dated September 8, 2014. Several ordinances were passed at the 2014 meeting, but #1249 was not one of those published in the local newspaper of record. The ordinance is now online and available to the public at ObserverEnterprise.com under the "Contracts" tab.

Coke County Farm Bureau pushes for eminent domain reform

The Texas Legislature is debating proposed changes in the states' eminent domain process.

"For too long, entities and companies with eminent domain authority have been allowed to offer landowners below-market-value for their land," John Ross Copeland, Coke County Farm Bureau president, said. "If the landowner wants what is fair, he'll have to pay a lawyer and sue for what is right. It's unfair, and it's time for that to change."

Fairness and transparency in eminent domain proceedings are two of the goals of the Texas Farm Bureau (TFB) and its members this legislative session.

TFB President Russell Boening recently testified in support of several bills that would help landowners.

HB 2684 by Rep. DeWayne Burns, outlines requirements to

make the eminent domain process more fair.

TFB also supports HB 2694 by Rep. Kyle Kacal, which would encourage those with eminent domain authority to make fair

offers by providing a disincentive for lowball offers.

Other bills, like HB 3687, outline project information and property rights protections through the eminent domain

process.

"Eminent domain use is on the rise as Texas' population grows," John Ross said. "These bills will help ensure landowners receive a fair price for their land when it is

taken and that the process is more transparent."

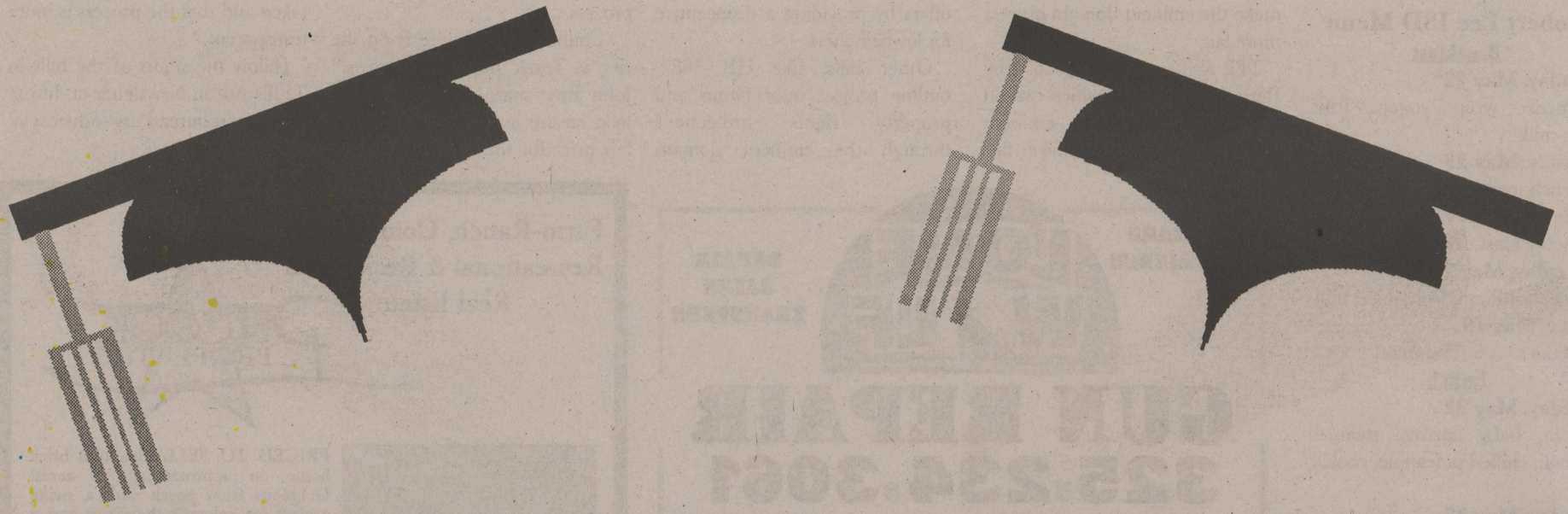
