


Water – Our Area's Most Important Resource

[Editor's Note: This is the second article in a series documenting the water situation in Robert Lee and Coke County. Current Robert Lee Mayor Leroy Casey has been generous with his time and providing the information necessary for this series.]

The water pipeline connecting the citizens of Robert Lee to the Bronte water plant 'was completed in the spring of 2012. At the time of completion, Robert Lee was a mere six weeks away from totally running out of drinkable water.

Since this time, Robert Lee city officials have continued to search for other sources of water and deal with decades old problems to the city's infrastructure caused by the Lake Spence water.

Just before the switch was made to the pipeline, TDS levels (total dissolved solids) in the Lake Spence water were measuring 29,000 ppm (parts per million). The levels in the Spence water this year are at 18,000 ppm. Texas Commission on Environmental Quality (TCEQ) standards are from between 500 ppm to 800 ppm. With these high levels, Robert Lee's elderly water plant could not clean the water from Lake Spence. In order to meet requirements using any Lake Spence water running through the Robert Lee water plant, the Bronte to their customers. percentages of good water to Robert Lee did retain the license Lake Spence water was 90% for its water plant that is now good water to 10% Lake Spence water. City officials were forced to consider the costs of all involved. Although partial funding was offered by the Texas Water Development Board to upgrade the water plant, city officials determined it five wells drilled, only one well



was not cost effective to attempt to continue using the Robert Lee water plant and with the 90-10 ratio it would be easier to provide treated water from "temporarily" shut down. Under the leadership of former Mayor John Jacobs, the city first began to explore on the Counts property off FM 2034 on the divide between Robert Lee and Water Valley. Of the

could be considered good quality. In order to move forward, quantity needed to be at least 100 gallons per minute (GPM). It also needed to recover quickly to be sustainable as a source of city water. Unfortunately this well couldn't recover in a timely fashion. Exploration next moved to the Judy May family property adjoining the Counts property. One well was drilled providing good water at a rate of 20-30 gpm. Another well provided water at 15 gpm. Another was a

dry hole. Altogether eight holes were drilled on the divide with 1 good well and 1 marginal well producing a 12% success rate. This exploration cost the City of Robert Lee approximately \$195,000 plus interest on loans Upper obtained from the Colorado River Authority (UCRA) and Texas Water Development Board (TWDB). With the seating of current Robert Lee Mayor Leroy Casey, a 29 shot seismic survey was conducted on the divide. This survey revealed one possible well similar to those already found and two of lesser quantities. The survey cost approximately \$5,000. Mayor Casey put together the cost of pads, fencing and roads for the wells already drilled and those found with the seismic survey. He estimated the cost of just this part of the infrastructure on these four wells to be over \$1,500,000. This is not accounting for the cost of. completion with pumps, casing, tanks and a pipeline. With the high cost of completion, this field on the divide was abandoned.



A Property Tax Message to Governor Abbott and the Legislature

message was sent to Texas Governor Greg Abbott and the Texas State Legislature on July 5, 2017.]

Let's discuss property taxes. Although Texas ranks 46th in trying their best to provide total state and local taxation, we depend heavily upon property taxes to support our public education system and local services. In recent years, the state has reduced its share of public education funding from 45% to 38%, compelling higher school property taxes. With S.B.1, the state budget for the next two years, the legislature required, and the Governor approved, a 7.04% school property tax increase for 2017 and a 6.77% school property tax increase for 2018. These school tax increases will be imposed through higher appraisals with no hearings or roll back elections.

School property taxes already account for 56% of the property tax burden. During the special session, the Governor and the legislature should address these mandated school property tax increases. Relief from these escalating school property taxes should be the highest priority.

Instead, some will ignore this serious problem and attempt to blame county and city officials for property tax increases. County property taxes account for approximately 16% of the burden. It would require a 40% increase in county property taxes to equal the amount of increased school property taxes imposed by the legislature and the Governor. Nonetheless, revenue caps upon counties will be offered as the fake solution.

Of course, revenue caps do nothing to reduce the costs of local governments. Most county expenditures are mandated by the state legislature for indigent defense, indigent health care, jails, courts, and other state responsibilities. Property taxes are the only means available to fund these state mandates. While the House of Representatives approved a constitutional proposed amendment to stop future legislative unfunded mandates, the Senate ignored this common-sense measure and continued to pass additional mandates. Ending unfunded mandates should be the first step toward reducing the county tax burden. Governor Abbott and the state legislature should stop using smoke screens and diversions like local revenue caps and address the real causes of property tax increases. Fund the state responsibility for public education and end the unfunded mandates on local government. 


