



For the maintenance and support of the general (General government Fund), \$0.460000 on each \$100.00 valuation of property.

The tax rate adopted will increase total taxes 4.34% in the City of Robert Lee.

SECTION 2. That taxes levied under this ordinance shall be due October 1, 2017 and if not paid on or before January 31, 2018, shall immediately become delinquent.

SECTION 3. The Assessor is hereby authorized to assess and collect such taxes employing the above tax rates.

This ordinance was passed on the 14th day of September, 2017, at a regular meeting of the City Council of the City of Robert Lee, their being a quorum present, 4 ayes, 0 nays.


