Homecoming festivities slated for both Coke County schools



now in effect

It's time to put down your phones and drive, Texas. As of September 1, it is illegal to read or send text messages, post on Facebook or update Twitter while behind the wheel of a moving vehicle.

"This law was put in place to save lives," John Ross Copeland, Coke County Farm Bureau president, said. "A study from Texas A&M University shows 90 lives a year could be saved by this law."

Drivers caught texting while a vehicle is in motion are subject to fines of up to \$100.

"Sometimes drivers forget we're operating thousand-pound

machines that have the ability to hurt not only us, but others," John Ross Copeland said. "It's our responsibility as drivers to ensure we follow this law for the safety of everyone."

The bill, dubbed the Alex Brown Memorial Act, was signed into law by Texas Gov. Greg Abbott June 6.

The bill was named for a 17year-old high school student who died in a car wreck while texting.

Under the new law, drivers are not allowed to read, write or send electronic messages while operating a moving vehicle. Texting, posting to social media and using applications like WhatsApp prohibited are through the law.

Drivers are still allowed to make and receive calls unless prohibited by a municipality. Use of Bluetooth or other hands-free devices is allowed and encouraged.

Use of a phone's navigation system and music application are allowed. Reporting accidents and other obstructions through the Waze app is permitted through the law.

Ag leases to be covered in workshops

scheduled across the state by the Texas A&M AgriLife Extension Service.

The free programs are funded by the Southern Extension Risk Management Education Center, said Tiffany Dowell Lashmet, AgriLife Extension agricultural law specialist in Amarillo.

"Last year, 100 percent of participants said they would recommend these programs to a friend, so we decided to offer them in more locations," Lashmet said.

The schedule will be:



Each workshop will address the legal risks associated with agricultural leases, Lashmet said. The goal is to educate landowners and producers on the importance of utilizing written leases as a risk management tool. Joining Lashmet on the

program will be AgriLife Extension economists from around the state.





work to develop a WOTUS definition that protects water quality without asserting federal regulatory power over areas that only sometimes hold water. Environmental activist groups, however, are working to preserve the rule.




