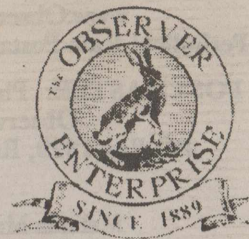

Filing period continues for 2018 Primary Election

The filing period for the March 6, 2018, primary election began November 11, 2017, and will continue through December 11, 2017. Offices up for election include County Judge, currently held by Roy Blair; County Treasurer, currently held by Hal Spain; Justice of the Peace, currently held by Jackie Walker; County/District Clerk, currently held by Mary Grim; Commissioner Precincts 2, currently held by Paul Williams; and Commissioner Precinct 4, currently held by Joe Sefcik.

As of Monday evening, only a few candidates had filed for a place on the ballot. Russell Johnson filed for Justice of the Peace, as well as Jackie Walker. Johnson is currently serving as a deputy with the Coke County Sheriff's Office. Monica Reyes has filed for County/District

Clerk. Reyes is currently a deputy in the Clerk's Office. Three men have filed for Commissioner Precinct 2, Henry Chisholm, Robert Feil, and incumbent Paul Williams. Chisholm is a retired law enforcement officer and Feil previously served as Commissioner Precinct 2 in years past.

Project Fair and Livestock Show set for January 18-20

The Coke County Project Fair and Livestock Show will be held January 18 through January 20, 2018, in Robert Lee. There are several contests scheduled for the Project Fair, as well as new contests this year. The project categories include:

Photography - Photos must be 8x10 (mounted if desired but

not required). Two entries per category allowed. Entry card must be filled out and attached to the back of each photo. All entries must be original photography of the person entering.

Art - Any size and categories will be determined by entries.

Re-Purpose Project (Trash to Treasure) - At least 50% should be from repurposed materials.

Lego/Model Crafts - Includes models made from Legos, model airplanes and the like.

Crafts - Includes paper crafts, wood crafts, and decorative items. The possibilities are endless!

Quilting/Sewing/Knitting - Includes quilts, knitted scarves, anything that was sewn, knitted, or crocheted.

Canning - Can include products such as jellies, jams, salsa, or canned vegetable or fruit.

Kids Korner - For exhibitors who are in pre-school through 2nd grade. Can include any of the categories or anything made by the exhibitor.

There is also a Pies, Cookies, and Cakes Contest. All pies must be in a disposable pie pan to attach to the entry form, along with the recipe. Exhibitors may also submit one dozen cookies on a disposable plate. The recipe must be attached to the entry form. Cakes must be in/on a disposable pan/plate. The pies and cakes will be used as desserts during the Buyer's BBQ.

Gibbs

Jerry Gibbs, 82, of Robert Lee, Texas died at home on November 29, 2017.

Jerry was born March 17, 1935, to G.G. and Lillie Grace Gibbs in Snowmac, Oklahoma, the youngest of eight children. Stricken with polio at the age of eight, Jerry actively participated in school sports where he was able, even becoming a Golden Gloves boxer in high school and college. He graduated from Andrews High School and pursued his graduate and Master's degrees at North Texas State University in Denton, Texas, where he met Mary Elizabeth (Liz) Phillips. They were married December 30, 1955, and began a life together sharing a love of horses, children, wildlife and education.

Jerry began his teaching career at Corpus Christi, and then taught at Huckabee, Buffalo Gap, Garden City, Coahoma and Robert Lee. While Jerry and Liz made new homes and new friends in several communities, they chose to raise their sons, Mitchell and Kyle, in Robert Lee where Jerry devoted himself as an educator, helping hundreds of children learn, dream, and aspire.

Jerry served as high school principal and then superintendent of schools for 20 years at Robert Lee ISD before retiring in 1992. Following his retirement, Jerry developed an interest in photography, and traveled frequently to Yellowstone National Park and to Alaska to enjoy and photograph elk, bear, and landscapes. He never lost the spirit of an outdoorsman and hunter, but found many beautiful expressions of that

passion in his photography. In 2001, Jerry lost his wife and partner, Liz, to her battle with cancer. He was fortunate a few years later to find a new friend, companion and wife in Yvonne Devoll and in recent years, a special caregiver in his son, Kyle. Both of whom remained by his side throughout his illness.

Jerry is survived by two sons, Mitchell Gibbs of Round Rock, Kyle Gibbs of Robert Lee, Skylar Caddell of Round Rock and a loving niece, Marsha Turpin of Bloomfield, New Mexico.

Visitation was held on Friday, December 1, 2017, at the funeral home with family present from 5 pm until 7 pm to receive visitors. Funeral services were held on Saturday, December 2, 2017, at the First Baptist Church in Robert Lee at 2 pm with longtime peer and friend William Hood officiating. Co-officiants were Ronnie Ruff and Clyde Dukes. Interment immediately followed at Robert Lee Cemetery. Pallbearers included JP Skipworth, Korey Pitcock, Bill

Burns, Aaron Hood, Matt Reid, and Lynn Gully. Honorary pallbearers included Jack Woodley, George White, and Kenneth Chandler.

For their support during these final days, Mitchell and Kyle share a special gratitude to Hospice of San Angelo for serving as a source of strength and guidance.

The family especially appreciates the outpouring of love expressed to Jerry over many years, in which he found great comfort.

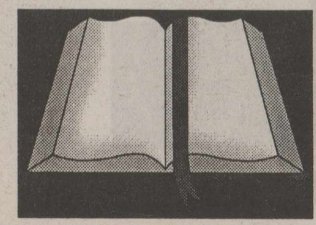

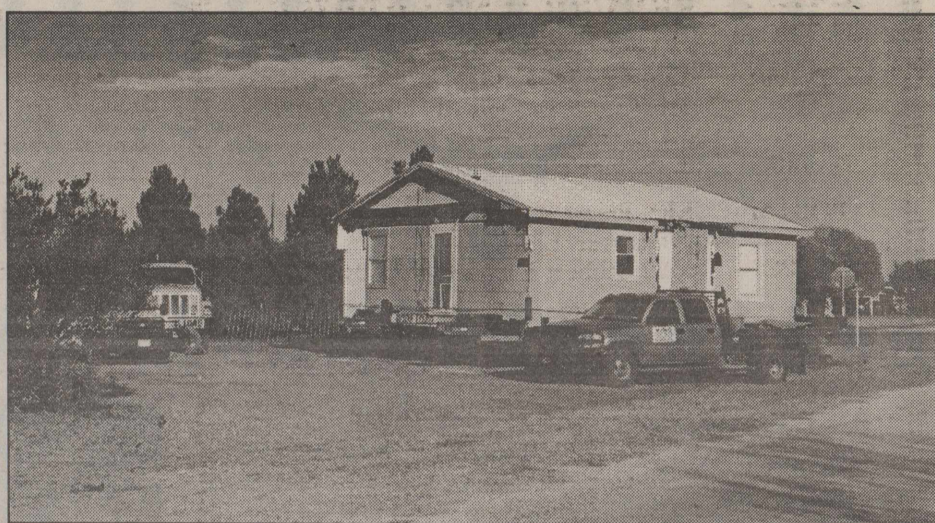
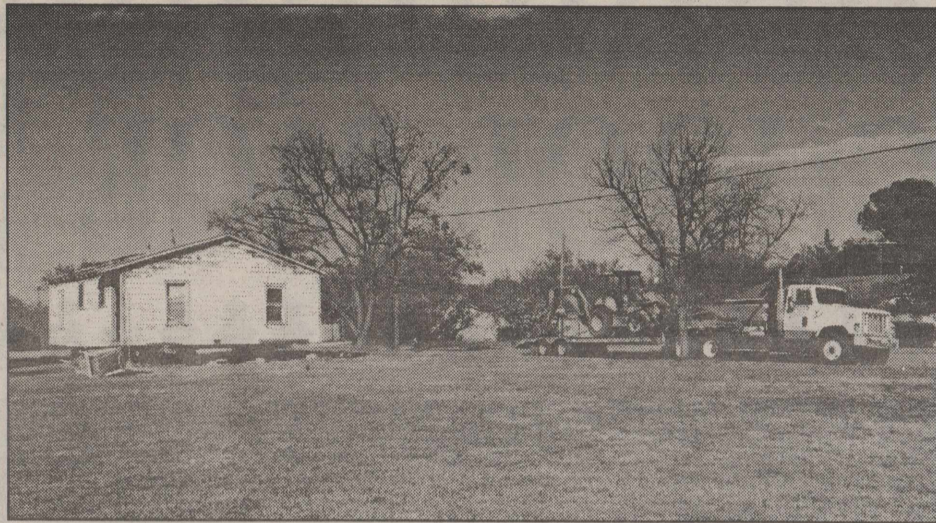

Special Meeting

The Board of Directors of the West Coke County Hospital District met in called session November 3, 2017. President Pat Stephens called the meeting to order at 2 pm and declared a quorum was present.

Board members present were Sarah Green, Patsy Cason, Pat Carwile, Roger Alexander, WCCHD Administrator, and Chris Martin, RLCC Interim, were also present at the meeting.

The invocation was given by Pat Stephens.

The one item of business on the agenda was an interview with Houston McGuire for the position of RLCC

Administrator. Houston accepted the position, and officially began his duties on November 19, 2017. The Board is very pleased to have Houston and welcomes him to his new position at the facility

Regular Meeting

The Board of Directors of the West Coke County Hospital District met in regular session November 28, 2017. President Pat Stephens called the meeting to order at 9:35 am and declared a quorum was present.

Board members present were Sarah Green, Pat Carwile, and Noel Tinkler. Roger Alexander, WCCHD Administrator, Houston McGuire, RLCC Administrator, Chris Martin, Consultant, Janie Munoz, BOM, and Becca McGuire, DON, were also present at the meeting.

The invocation was given by Roger Alexander.

There were no visitors.

The minutes from the previous meeting were approved.

There are 32 residents in the Care Center as of the meeting date. In the staffing update, there is an open position for a van driver. Accounts receivable were discussed in depth. Roger

is working to bring the financials up to date. The audit has been postponed until after the first of the year.

Chris Martin, the previous RLCC Interim, has been hired as consultant for the Care Center. The Board is very pleased to have Chris continue to serve in this capacity.

Work will begin to repair and update the call lights on the west side of the facility in the next week or so.

Houston McGuire, Administrator, gave an update on the status of the QIPP program, which is a quality improvement program sponsored by the state, and also he gave the DSO report.

Discussion concerning the senior meals was tabled.

Houston is researching a change in companies for payroll and time clock, which should save the facility time and money. He also secured a contract with Best Med Pharmacy in Brownwood which will go into effect in the near future.

Some very positive work is being done in marketing, which should result in increased census.

Houston is also researching some potential revenue

opportunities which will be very beneficial to the facility and the community.

The employee Christmas party will be held December 18, at which time longevity bonuses will be handed out.

Future agenda items were discussed, and the next regular meeting will be December 28. The public is invited and encouraged to attend.

The December calendar is a busy one. It began with a Christmas Sing Along Monday afternoon, and on Wednesday, the residents went to San Angelo to have dinner and see the lights at Fort Concho. On December 12 at 3:30 pm, the monthly birthday party will be sponsored by the Spanish Club and Head Start. The birthday ladies this month are Marilyn White, Janis Fowler, and Marie Dowling. On December 16 at 3 pm, residents will enjoy a movie entitled 'The Christmas Story'. At 10:30 am on December 18, some community families will be at the facility providing Christmas gifts for the residents, and on the December 19 at 2:30 pm, the

residents will have their Christmas party, with entertainment being provided by Ellen, from the San Angelo Symphony. The following Saturday, the residents will enjoy a movie entitled 'The Grinch that Stole Christmas'. On Christmas Day, the movie entitled 'Jesus of Nazareth' will be shown. At the New Year's party on December 29 at 3:30 pm, Dr. Rocha, a violinist with the San Angelo Symphony will be entertaining the residents and guests.

2017 ag census arrives this month

Farmers and ranchers in Texas and across the nation will receive the 2017 Census of Agriculture this month.

Farmers and ranchers can mail in their completed census form or respond online via the web questionnaire. Officials said the U.S. Department of Agriculture's (USDA) National Agricultural Statistics Service (NASS) has extensively revised the online questionnaire to make it more convenient.

The census will be mailed in several phases through December. Farm operations of all sizes that produced and sold, or normally would have sold, \$1,000 or more of agricultural product in 2017 are included in the census. The census is the only source of uniform, comprehensive and impartial agricultural data for every state and county in the nation.

"The Census of Agriculture is USDA's largest data collection endeavor, providing some of the most widely used statistics in the industry," U.S. Secretary of Agriculture Sonny Perdue said. "Collected in service to American agriculture since 1840, the census gives every producer the opportunity to be represented so that informed decisions can support their efforts to provide the world with food, fuel, feed, and fiber. Every response matters."

An estimated 400,000-500,000 farmers and ranchers received an email from NASS in November promoting the improved web application.

New time-saving features of the online questionnaire include automatically calculating totals, skipping sections that do not pertain to the operation and providing drop-down menus of frequent responses.

The census website will be updated with new information through the census response

deadline of February 5, 2018.

Revisions and additions to the 2017 census aim to capture a more detailed account of the industry. Farmers will see a new question about military veteran status, expanded questions about food marketing practices and questions about on-farm decision-making to better capture the roles and contributions of beginning farmers, women farmers and others involved in running the business.

Conducted once every five years, the census is a complete count of all U.S. farms, ranches and those who operate them. It is the only source of uniform, comprehensive and impartial agriculture data for every state and county in the country.
