Store Damaged! At approximately 6:15 Friday evening, January 5, 2018, an 18 year old man entered Bronte Supermarket on Main Street in Downtown Bronte. When asked to exit the store for spitting on the floor, he ran to the back and began throwing wine bottles at the glass doors of a refrigerated display case. Store employees evacuated customers and called law enforcement. Coke County Sheriff's Deputy Russell Johnson was the first officer on the scene, and with back up provided by Commissioner Precinct 2 Paul Williams, was able to stop the suspect's rampage with the use of a non-lethal weapon. Williams was contacted for assistance by customers while working in his office across the street from the store. Damage estimates may run as high as \$40,000 in lost and damaged merchandise and equipment. Following transport to San Angelo by the East Coke County Ambulance, the suspect remains hospitalized with injuries believed to have been caused prior to his outburst. Chief Deputy Brandon Neal is shown surveying the damage. The store remained closed from the time of the incident until 3 pm the next day. Other than lingering anxiety of store employees, the doors of the refrigerated unit and the lack of some display cases, everything seems back to normal.






