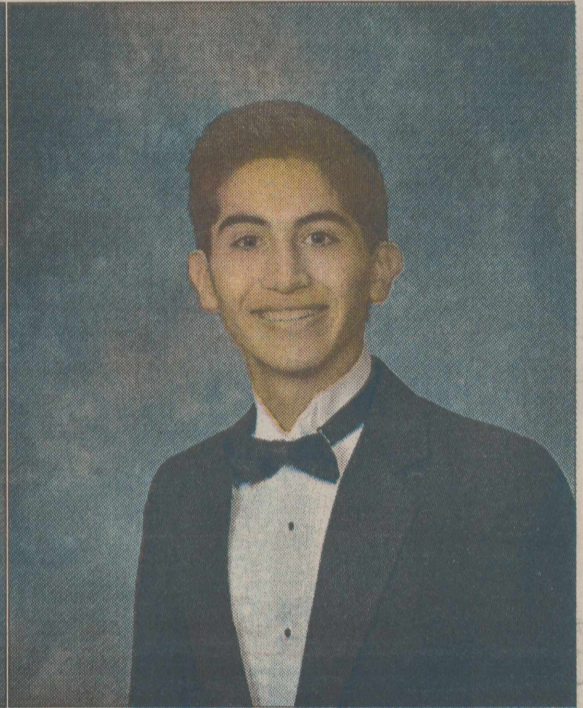
Saluting the Robert Lee High School Class of 2018

Results are in for Saturday's local entity elections

Voters went to the polls Saturday, May 5, 2018, in three entity elections, - the City of Robert Lee, the City of Bronte and Bronte Independent School District.

Allison Crenshaw will be the new mayor in Robert Lee with 97 votes. Incumbent Leroy Casey received 48 votes and Shell Williams received 64 votes. Only two candidates were on the ballot for the two council member seats. Brandi Brosh

received 165 votes and Billy Williams received 95 votes. Ricky Green was elected to the two year unexpired term with 101 votes to Nora Broadbent's 46 and Casey Scruggs' 47 votes.

Buzz Gohman was elected as the new mayor of Bronte with 104 votes. He will be joined by new council members Lee Wommack with 82 votes and Steve Hines with 81 votes. Donna Hall received 48 votes.

Eight candidates were on the ballot for three seats on the Bronte ISD Board of Trustees. Blake Braswell retained his seat

with 124 votes and Ashley Braswell received 110 votes to retain her seat on the Board. They will be joined by Terry Queen with 82 votes. David McWright (I) received 77 votes. Other challengers included Walt Smith with 76, Chris Jernigan with 51, TJ McCullough with 37 and Bill Torres with 29 votes.

In the era of digital writing, some say you should never "time stamp" your writing. That is, you should never reference a specific date, so that the article always seems fresh and not outdated in a perpetually - available digital world. For the most part, I try to follow that maxim, but today, I'll make an exception. As some (but maybe not all) readers know, I've spent the last several months campaigning for the office of Mayor of the City of Stamford. And this past Saturday, May 5, 2018, the voters of Stamford made their decision and selected me to serve as their next mayor.

Over the past 6 months, this weekly essay has touched on many things important for city government and elected leadership within the community. I made the deliberate decision to not specifically reference my mayoral campaign for two reasons. First, that was not the intent of starting this writing. Second, the goal of these essays is about more than just the mayor's office in Stamford. My goal is, in some small way, to help

encourage, shape, and inspire the thoughts and vision amongst others like myself who are passionate about their rural communities, whether in Stamford or beyond. It's been exciting and humbling to hear from folks young and old who enjoy reading what I have to say.

Moving forward, I intend to take a similar approach. As I move from the role of city councilman to mayor, you may see my writing take focus on deliberate action items that can improve our rural communities, but ultimately, the vision remains the same. Several friends have congratulated me and pointed out that now the real work begins. They're absolutely correct. Ideas are only worthwhile if they're put to action. Otherwise, they're just words on a page (or a screen).

I want to leave you with a quote from my friend, Otis Cooper. Otis is a Stamford native who has spent his career working and living in the city, but is soon moving back to his beloved hometown. Otis has been a great friend and supporter of my mayoral campaign and on Sunday afternoon, he sent me a text message that said something very poignant: "Finally, Tomorrow has as much value as Yesterday in Stamford."

To those of us who love our rural communities, young and old, we all have great memories and value in our Yesterdays. It can become easy to cling to those memories in lieu of taking action for the future. However, future prosperity in our communities depends on how well we manage for our

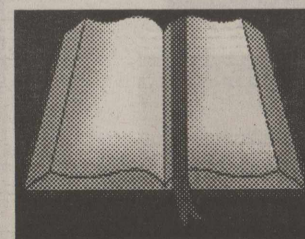

Letter from the Publisher

Dear Readers,

It has been my honor to be a part of bringing you Coke County's news for almost 30 years. Our editor, Morgan McCutchen Brigham, began as a typist and clerk when she was just 12. After college and several years in the Human Resource Department at First Financial's corporate headquarters in Abilene, Morgan returned to the OE at the end of 2016. Both of us are completely dedicated and feel a huge responsibility with owning the "oldest business in Coke County".

This new digital world has seen the decline of print publications across our nation and we have not been unaffected by these changes - both positively and negatively. On the negative side, this business once was able to employ several people. Now, there is just Morgan and me and we must have another source of income as there are fewer businesses in our county to support a local newspaper.

One of the positive changes is that instead of people dropping by our office, we now receive email. This is the best way to receive items, because now the production of the newspaper is no longer cut, wax, and physically lay in copy on an actual page to be taken to a special camera. That process is now all done digitally.

Personally, I have fought the

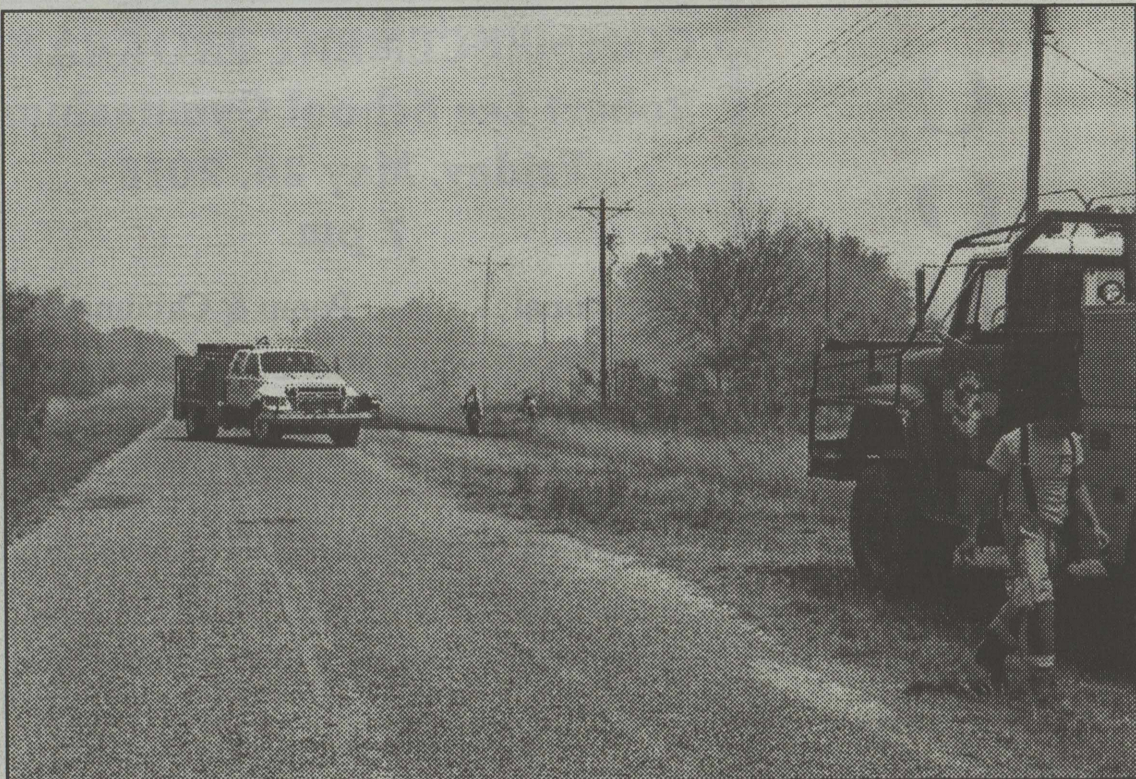
changes and only made a change when breakdowns in old equipment forced new upgrades. The benefit of these upgrades has allowed us to produce the newspaper anywhere we had our laptop computers. Also a couple of years ago, you may have noticed your address labels were different from years past. This change came when the old mailing system finally died and couldn't be repaired. With the new system, we are now mobile with preparing the newspaper to be mailed out.

In 1989, the OE had offices in both Bronte and Robert Lee. The Bronte office was closed years ago and went to a drop box system. The Bronte drop box is at Shirley's. Two years ago, I began tracking our "in the door" traffic in Robert Lee. This showed that most weeks there were only one or two customers coming to the office.

With all of this being said and the price of fuel, it really isn't cost effective to keep the office in Robert Lee open more than a couple of mornings per week. We are now open on Wednesday and Thursday mornings from 9:30 am until 12 noon. There is a drop box for our customers at Floyd C. Pettit Insurance.

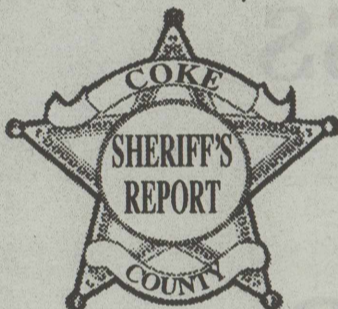
With the many changes over the years, it is our sincere hope that you, our reader, is enjoying this publication and will enjoy it for many more years to come.
