and collection charges in addition to the amount originally billed to the City.

Crenshaw also discussed how sales tax payments collected water/sewer/trash customers had not been made to the Texas Comptroller's office. A representative of the Comptroller's office came to Robert Lee's City Hall in February demanding payment. Crenshaw stated later that officials from the City of Robert Lee failed to attend a court hearing where the Comptroller wanted to revoke the city's sales tax permit. Fortunately, the permit was not revoked but the bank accounts of the City of Robert Lee were frozen for several days and approximately \$7,500, an estimated amount required to satisfy the outstanding balance owed by the city at that time, was removed by the Comptroller's office. In April, the Comptroller's office withheld the sales tax rebate the city should have received. This amount, approximately \$15,000, is the city's portion of the sales tax collected on everything sold in Robert Lee. Crenshaw believes the Comptroller will continue to withhold the city's rebate checks until all delinquent reports have been filed and payments made. She also pointed out that this affected not only the City of Robert Lee, but also the 4a and 4b Economic Development funds.



Commissioners Court finds that

IS HEREBY ORDERED by the Commissioners Court of Coke County that outdoor burning is restricted in the unincorporated area of the county for 90 days from the date of adoption of this Order, unless the restrictions are terminated earlier based on a determination made by the Texas Forest Service or this Court. This Order is adopted pursuant to Local Government Code 352.081, and other applicable statutes. This Order does not prohibit outdoor burning activities related to public health and safety that are authorized by the Texas Natural

BE IT ALSO ORDERED THAT the purpose of this order is the mitigation of the hazard posed by wildfires by curtailing the practice of outdoor burning, with the exception of barbecuing in an enclosed fire box with water hose or fire retardant accessible at all times and someone attending the fire at all times, and materials used outdoors in activities such as welding and any other activity that could result in a fire. 

School children in Robert Lee learned the lifesaving message of Eddie Eagle GunSafe® Program. Accidental deaths with firearms have been decreasing for decades and are now at an alltime low among the U.S. population. Gun accident prevention programs are widely considered to be a major reason for the decline. Studies from the National Center for Health Statistics indicate approximately

an 80 percent drop in fatal firearm accidents among children in the Eddie Eagle age range since the nationwide Eddie Eagle Program launch.

The program was created by past NRA President Marion P. Hammer, in consultation with child psychologists, elementary school teachers, and law enforcement officers. Now in its 30th year the program has reached over 31 million children nationwide. It has been endorsed by The National Association recognized by the Association of American Educators. It is a recipient of The American Legion's National Education Award, and has been praised by a host of national and community organizations, governors and state legislatures for its effectiveness.

"The Eddie Eagle GunSafe Program continues to receive outstanding feedback from program users and parents", said Eric Lipp, National Manager of the Community Outreach Department.

"I am tremendously happy to be able to say that Eddie Eagle has now reached over 31 the National Rifle Association's million children with it's life saving message."
