debt that finances the district's facilities, declines in values of the M \& O (Maintenance \& Operations Fund) which provides funds for maintenance and operations within the District, are due, largely, to a curtailment of wind energy transmission due to insufficient transmission capacities on the South Plains and Texas Panhandle.
Trevino recommended that the Board Trevino recommended that the Board
propose an increase in the I \& $S$ rate to propose an increase in the I \& S rate to
0.455 and an increase in M \& O rate to 0.455 and an increase in $M \& O$ rate to
1.17 for an overall tax rate of 1.625 for the 2018-2019 school year. The vote to approve the proposed rates was unanimous in favor. A Public Hearing to discuss the proposed tax rate and proposed budget was set for August 28, 2018, at 6:30 in the FISD Board chambers.
The Board scheduled the next meeting for August 28, 2018 at 7:00 p.m.

Texas Landowners Subsidize Pipelines and Powerlines

electric transmission capac ity ensures our lights stay on and our homes stay cool during the hottest months of the year. Pipelines car-
rying oil and gas supply ying oil and gas supply petroleum-based products, Texas economy. Thexas economy.
The however, a darker side to this pipeline and transmission line development. Every year more Texas landowners find themselves in the path of pipeline and transmission line projects.
Most of these companies have the these companies domain and can condemn by force the land they want. They are common carriers, meaning their pipeline or transmission lines are available for use by other companies, even though they profit from the projects. Unfortunately, landowners facing the threat of eminent domain stand lit-
tle chance of being treated justly or being paid a fair price for what is taken from price for
them.

incentives for landowners to take less than they're owed and accept inadequate terms and conditions.
We also know the energy sector has teams of attorneys ready on retainer to counter any efforts by landowners to seek a better deal.

intend to fight once again to reform eminent domain laws in Texas. The lessons calvanized our resolve and galvanized our resolve and proach the issues and those who seek to block progress. One fundamental component is to require that common carriers make an adequate offer to the landowner at the outset of nepotiations. If a landowner is presented with a fair offer,
he or she is more likely to he or she is more likely to
be a willing seller, thus sparing both parties from timeconsuming and expensive
itigation.

Millions of barrels of oil and gas flow through the common carrier pipelines that exist today, but produc-
tion far exceeds the capacity of these existing pipelines, especially in the Permian Basin. As an attorney based Basin. As an attorney based
in San Angelo, I have had clients tell me of initial offers that are a pittance compared to the value of the millions of dollars' worth of product that will flow through the pipelines.
It's time that comp It's time that companies with the power of eminent
domain begin treating landowners more like a partner and less like a commodity. We need to ask why the pipeline and transmission line industries are being carried on the backs of private property owners. To create the kind of change that is necessary to protect landowners from
abusive eminent domain processes, we must educate processes, we must educate realities we face when that right-of-way agent comes knocking.
Lawmakers will face intense pressure to keep the eminent domain laws as they are. We need to show how the eminent domain process works and where he abuses lie:

The exemption also does not apply to sales of special clothing or footwear that the manufacletic activity or protective use and that is not normally worn except when used for the athletic activity or protective use for which the manufacturer designed the article. For example, golf cleats and football pads are primarily designed for athletic activity or protective use and are not normally worn except for those purposes, they do not qualify for the suits and swimsuits, however, are suits and swimsuits, however, are
commonly worn for purposes other than athletic activity and thus qualify for the exemption.

The sales tax holiday exemption does not extend to rental of
clothing or footwear; clothing or footwear; nor does it apply to ateration (including embroidery) or cleaning services performed on clothes and shoes
Additionally, tax is due on sales of accessories, including jewelry, handbags, purses, briefcases, luggage, umbrellas, wa
and similar items.
Backpacks priced under $\$ 100$ sold for use by elementary and secondary students are exempt
