Floyd County... Where are your Hospital District Tax dollars going?

Floyd County is very fortunate to have two hospital districts. Lockney Hospital District geographically represents $25 \%$ of the county and Caprock Hospital District in Floydada represents 75\%. The biggest difference between the two districts is that only Lockney has an operating hospital providing medical and emergency care in Floyd county. Both districts run clinics in four physicians and a physician's assistant. The Silverton four physicians and a physicans assistant. The Silverton
clini, under the umbrella of the Lockney Hospital District, has a physician and a family nurse practitioner that staff the local clinic. The clinic in Floydada is staffed by the West Texas Phyician Group, which is not affliated with any hospital.
The only hospital in the Caprock Hospital District closed its doors in 1992. Since then, the Lockney Hospital District has provided $95 \%$ of the healthcare in Floyd County while the Caprock Hospital District has provided only a clinic. The Caprock Hospital District
operates an excellent EMS service, but its cost is only a small portion of their budget, according to financial reports for the year ending September 30, 2018. The Floydada EMS team works closely with the Lockney volunteer EMS service and the WJ. Mangold Memorial Hospital Emergency Department and staff:
According to the 2018 year ending financial reports,
the Caprock Hospital District amassed $\$ 244,000$ in the Caprock Hospital District amassed $\$ 244,000$ in net profit after all expenses. The operating funds upon which the profit was made were contributed mostly by tax dollars of citizens in their district. At their January
meeting, the board elected to buy an additional certif cate of deposit (CD) with the $\$ 244,000$, making a total of $\$ 900,638.93$ held in CDs. Tax payers have the right to know how revenues are utilized. Are those revenues being used to benefit the local hospital and/or DRAW INTEREST ON CDs?
Since Caprock has closed its hospital, the complexities of running a hospital have changed drastically. The changes required by federal and state governments add-
ed to the tremendous reduction ed to the tremendous reduction in revenue by patients,
insurance companies, and Medicaid and Medicare.

As I sit, writing at my computer, $I$ am hearing thunder and raindro outside $m y$ window--I love spring.
My garden has been through extreme cold and rising hot temperature since the last time I reported. That cold front just about got all of my pepper plants and some of my tomatoes that I had just gotten into the ground At the last minute, I gathered a bunch of straw and tucked it around thos plants and replaced their tubs and buckets in order for them to "weather the storm" so to say
We lost some leaves on each of the plants, but we've still got fruit (grape-sized tomatoes) and our peppers are sprouting out new leaves to
take the place of those that froze off. Only time will tell, but, all-in-all, these new plants are showing their dedication
Whese new plants are showing their dedication!
With this hot, sunny weather, Terry and I have been busy planting our corn. First, we got the Indian corn in the ground-we had less of it to plant. After shoveling most of our load of dirt into our garden beds, we got some of our Sweet Corm planted and watered. With the sprinkler doing its best, I moved inside our fenced garden and planted peas and, on what will become our grape-arbor-oasis, I planted clover. The bees will be so happy with us this year and will delightfilly spend hours upon hour pollinating every flower bloom they find
stalks the ester afternoon, our Indian corn had pushed up a few bab stalks, the peas were sprouting and pushing through the dirt, and where ing and spreading their leaves.
As Ive stated before, when volunteer plants start coming up, it's time begin planting in earnest! Ive got my box of seeds ready. Terry and I made great progress on all of our beds this past week. Lastly, this rain will be the final step toward a lush, productive garden that will provide so much bounty for our family and friends.
On a side note, I did get some more Kale harvested and in the freeze I came into about a $\frac{1}{2}$ / bushel of cherry tomatoes this past week, so I slice them into halves, sprinkled olive oil on the batch, salted and peppered find, and stuck them in a 200 -degree oven for eight hours YUMII Roastfind, and stuck them in a 200 -degree oven for eight hours. YUM!! Roast ing! With some added oil poured into the jars, these fruits will be usable for several months straight out of the refiggerator. Happy gardening, yall!
