for rain in moderation, remember the fellow Texans and Americans that suffered devastation of life and property from the severe weather in our prayers also.
The Great State of Texas is just 18 short days from the end of Regular Session of the 86th Legislature. Bills are moving at break-
neck speed and 254 Counties are caught in the balance. There are several bills that could be beneficial to the citizens of Floyd County and several that are not. As the Legislators work to address, what they refer to as the big 3 , the budget, school finance and tax-payer relief, County officials statewide are hoping that a Special Session is not needed. I'm not sure how much "tax relie" the citizens will receive if the State continues to control the appraisal process, but I am sure that it will not be as
much as the tax-payer will be told they are receiving.
receiving. This month I am going to highlight the of fice of County Tax Assessor-Collector. What is a Tax Assessor-Collector? The Tax Asses-sor-Collector calculates property tax rates for the County, collects taxes for the County (and sometimes for other taxing entities) and collects various other fees for the State and County. What does a Tax Assessor-Collector do in Texas? The Tax Assessor-Collector in the County, (2) Collects property taxes for
the County, (3) May collect taxes for citie schools and other local taxing entities, (4) Processes motor vehicle title transfers. (5) Issues motor vehicle registrations and licenses, (6) May process boat titles and registrations, (7) Register voters and may conduct elections,
and (8) Collects various other fees for the State and County.
The Floyd County Tax Assessor-Collector is Ms. Delia Suarez. Ms. Suarez was appointed to the Office on December 28,2005 by the Commissioners Court. Ms. Suarez then ran for the unexpired term which ended December 31, 2008. Ms. Suarez took office for her first full term on January 1, 2009 and is cur rently serving her 3rd full term.
The Floyd County Tax Assessor-Collector doesn't have to worry about calculating tax rates and collecting taxes because of the Floyd
County Central Appraisal District. The Floyd County Central Appraisal District.
County Tax Assessor-Collector has all the other duties described above and a few more She is required to receive continuing education each year on the operation of the office of Tax Assessor-Collector. She also must receive continuing education in the operation of elections, the registration of voters and stay current on the requirements and changes in procedure of registering and titling vehicles.
