THE FLOYD COUNTY HISTORICAL MUSEUM MEMORIES 1979
D.T. SCOTT FAMILY

On August 29, 1902, the D. T. Scott Family drove into Steydenens County, Texas. We Stephens County, Texas. We wad been on the way about a wagons. The family included ather, Thomas Scott, age 44 mother, Mary Emma Wan Samuel Price, age 13: Bessie Samuel Price, age 13; Bessie
Lincen, age 10; Blanche Ray age 4 ; and $31 / 2$ month old baby boy, David Thomas Jr. A boyhood friend of $m y$ father, Lovic P. Taffinder and amily, had earlier moved near Floydada. He wrote to my father telling of this great land of promise; cheap productive land, good water, found better health. Also he fold him that school teachers were needed.
My father and mother were anxious to settle down on a farm home and believed that this might be opportunity knocking at their door. Papa and Price made a prospecting trip a few weeks earlier, liked with the school board members. He signed a contract bers. He ingigned a contract Floydada's three-teacher fac ulty for the 1902-03 term. He rented a three-room house from Mr. Taffinder, returned
home, and we were soon on our way.
In Janu In January, 1903, a terrible siege of whooping-cough beDavid, took it and with it had pneumonia. He was one of several who did not recover. The little grave was another tie that held us more securely to the raw, bleak country. orn- James Zant and Lonnie Hal who today reside in the Harmony Community. Zant was born September 29, 1904 and Lonnie Hal was born December 21,1907 . They and I are the only original family members now living. On May 5, 1904, my parents became owners of 160 acres of land in what later became the Harmony Com-
munity. The price was $\$ 3.00$ per acre. Even so, it was not easy to pay for. Papa gave E. C. Fullingim twelve notes of $\$ 40.00$ each bearing $8 \%$ interest. The first few years were hard living. The country produced more than local markets could consume. After the coming of the rail1910, living March, came more comfortable, for came more comfortable, for we could then sell what we raised. One of the greatest had plenty of coal to heat our homes and did not have to depend on cow chips, ear
corn, maize heads or fence corn, maize My parents spent the re-
mainder of their lives mainder of their lives on this quarter section. Papa
lived till September 25,1925 , and Mama till November 25,1930 . They both loved pretty growing things and sought to emulate the fruits,
crops, vegetables and crops, vegetables and flow-
ers of Papa's native Coryell ers of Papa's native Coryell
County, Texas, and Mama's native state of Georgia. in the future of this country He often declared that the day would come when families would make a good living on forty acres of land in this day of soaring inflation, of hurried and harried living, this idea sounds like an impossible dream. But history
has a way of changing livhas a way of changing liv-
ing conditions, customs, and ing conditions, customs, and
circumstances with the years. circumstances with the years.
With God as our helper it would e great to see every child own his own calf, pig or lamb; to see athletic programs that would include all who wanted to participate; to be able to gather fruit, vegetables, beautiful flowers, the result of our own labor.

could participate. Let's quit striving for bigger things and get them down to our town size and need.

## Pumpkins are, in fact, a healthy fruit

Despite the abundance of pumpkin pies and pumpkin spice in seemingly everything his time of year, pumpkins are, in fact, a source of beta carotene, a water-soluble form of vitamin A, and a good source of vitamin C, explains Jenna Anding, Ph.D. professor and associate department head for the Department of Nutrition and Food Sciences and Texas A\&M AgriLife Extension Service specialist.

Pumpkins are fruits, not veggie "Botanically, anything that starts from a flower is considered a fruit," said Joe 'Mascultural sciences and AgriLife Extension vegetable specialist, Overton. "So tomato, pumpkin, cucumber, strawberry, etc., are all fruits. However, how they are commonly described as is different."

Pumpkin makes a good substitute Pumpkins are mostly water. So used in
the right way, they can be a good substi-
tute for higher-calorie ingredients like butter and other fats.

Pumpkin pie vs. pecan pie As the holidays approach, the debate over which pie to choose is tough, but if a healthier choice may sway your decision, here's a breakdown from AgriLife Extension.
If yo If you swap and eat a slice of pumpkin pie instead of pecan pie, you automatically
save 170 calories and 33 save 170 calories and 33 grams of added
sugar. Pecan pie has 500 calories per slice, or $1 / 8$ of the pie, and 61 grams of sugar. Pumpkin pie of the same size slice has 330 calories and 29 grams of sugar. Pumpkin is also $90 \%$ of your daily value for vitamin A and $15 \%$ of your daily value for calcium.

New online, interactive atlas gives comprehensive view of Texas quail decline

| The Texas A\&M Natural Resources Institute, or NRI, has recently published the Texas Quail Atlas, a free online resource and the newest "story map" to be developed by the institute. <br> The online atlas was developed as a collaborative effort of the Reversing the Decline of Quail in Texas Initiative and the NRI Geospatial Analysis Team. <br> "This interactive resource tells the story of the four species of Texas quail using maps and historical data to examine how and why quail populations in Texas have changed over time," said Jim Cathey, Ph.D., associate director of the institute. "It will help provide answers for landowners, quail enthusiasts, hunters and other observers as to what has happened to quail populations throughout the state in recent decades." <br> Texas is home to four species of quail: northern bobwhite, scaled quail, Gambel's quail and Montezuma quail. <br> "Many Texans consider these birds to be iconic state species and fondly recall hunting them, watching them or just listening to their songs," Cathey said. <br> He said the new atlas provides a wealth of information for anyone looking to learn more about the history of Texas quail and why the conservation of these species is so critical. It is the second in a series of quail story maps, after Habitat Requirements of Texas Quail. |
