For the family of U.S. Army Cpl. David Lawrence Catlin, there was finally clo sure last week as the family laid to rest Catlin in his being missing in action for being missing
over 60 years.
This past Saturday, family and friends held a private ceremony in Lockney to honor Catlin whose body was recently returned from North Korea.
