LISD Board Approves Final LHS Building Plans

School District board of trustees gave final approval to design plans for the new Lockney High School building during their regular last monthly meeting Thursday, January 14. The construction company, Lee Lewis Construction, may now start the bidding process, select the best bids, and start construction on the new building. Construction could begin by the time school is out in May of this year and be completed before the start of school in September, 2011. It was earlier hoped that the new building could be ready to move into by spring break of 2011, but planning delays have pushed the completion date back.

The trustees toured the newly-renovatedLHS science labs which were damaged in the fire that destroyed the high school building. First day of classes in the "new" labs was January 11, a year to the day after the fire which gutted the high school building in 2009. The LHS media center (library), which was also damaged in the fire, is still being repaired and may be ready to move into in about three to four weeks. The school board approved the financial audit report from Bolinger, Segars, Gilbert and Moss of Lubbock. The auditors reported no findings of misappropriation of funds. or questionable business practices. According to the report, LISD is "in good financial standing." The board also okayed a resolution to enter into an inter-local agreement with Education Service Center Region 4 for a transportation audit. Auditors will review the school district's

transportation allotments from the State Foundation School Program going back to the year 2001 to ensure that the district receives the maximum amount to which it is entitled. LISD will receive 80 percent and the Education Service Center is to retain 20 percent of any savings found.

Board members discussed continuing efforts to build a new softball field in partnership with the City Of Lockney.

The trustees completed Superintendent Phil Cotham's annual evaluation and extended the superintendent's three-year contract by one year.

Cotham reported that he is getting pricing for repairing or closing in the windows in the old gymnasium.

Campus administrators reported current enrollments of 260 at elementary school, 129 at junior high, and 156 at high school.

Board members also heard a presentation by Claire Samman, junior high science teacher.

The LISD board members received certificates of recognition from the Texas Association of School Boards for School Board Recognition Month.

Present at the meeting were board members Rene Guerrero, Lonny Hooten, Jimmy Kemp, Mike Lass, Robbie Long and John Quebe, school principals Jean Anne Williams and Todd Hallmark, athletic director Malcom Moerbe, superintendent Cotham, Brent Weckar and Kirk Hughlett of Lee Lewis Construction, and Steve Aufill of BGR Architects.

Next regular school board meeting will be Thursday, February18.

City Of Lockney To Apply For Swimming Pool Grant



During the regular monthly meeting Thursday, January 14, the Lockney City Council passed a resolution to apply for an Outdoor Recreation Grant from the Texas Parks and Wildlife Department to be used for renovation of the Lockney swimming pool.

Efforts by the Friends of the Lockney Swimming Pool organization to raise money for repairs to the pool have been successful and, according to City Secretary Charlotte Hooten, the city is "very close" to having the \$50,000 required for the matching-funds grant.









The cotton market awaited Tuesday's release of USDA's monthly supply/demand report, but the resulting lack of interesting data drove cotton futures on the Intercontinental Exchange to touch the lowest levels in eight weeks.

Analysts said the biggest surprise was the lack of surprise in USDA's January report. Cotton futures pushed lower in early dealings and added to those losses after the release of the data. The department only marginally refigured its outlook for the cotton market, notably by lowering its U.S. cotton production figure and tightening the estimate for available domestic and world supplies. USDA's 2009/10 U.S. cotton estimate included slight decreases in U.S. production and ending stocks compared with last month. Production was lowered by 191,000 bales as reductions in the Southeast, Delta, and Southwest states were partially offset by increases in the Far West.

producers now are expected with Turkey and Vietnam to produce 330,000 bales, a rounding out the list of top 10,000 bale reduction from three buyers. There were no USDA's December report, while the January estimate of 4.9 million bales in Texas was a 100,000 bale decrease from last month's data.

Additionally, domestic mill use and U.S. exports were unchanged while the ending stocks forecast was needs to average only 188,411 reduced to 4.3 million bales bales per week to meet the or 30 percent of total use. World 2009/10 cotton estimates were virtually unchanged from last month. Increases in production for China and Brazil were offset by decreases for India, the United States, Australia, and others. Actual export shipments of 181,200 bales were primarily to China, Turkey, Vietnam, and Mexico. The figure was up 81 percent from the previous week and 57 percent from the four-week average.
