## Drug bust leads to 28 arrests; 16 still wanted

 For the past several months the Big Spring Police Department Narcotics Division has conducted investigations into the distribution of Marijuana, Crack Cocaine, Powder Cocaine, Methamphetamine, Heroin and other illicit drugs within the City of Big Spring and Howard County. On the 29th of May 2019 with the assistance of the Howard County Sheriff's Office, The Department of Homeland Security, ATF, DEA and Department of Public Safety, the Big Spring Police Department Narcotics Division attempted to



serve approximately 100 arrest warrants on 42 individuals.

## A review: The Bold and the Powerful

Our society glamorizes death and violence. We can see the evidence of this in our pop culture. Our movies, books, music, and art reflects a culture that has grown desensitized to violence. And in particular, violence against women. When artist Kim Lord opens her new exhibit, which she calls “Still Lives”, it shows images of her portraying herself as famous murdered women. Some of the women she portrays in her exhibit are the Black Dahlia, Chandra Levy, and Nicole Brown Simpson.

As the opening night of the exhibit begins, Maggie Richter doesn't know if it will be enough to pull the Rocque Museum out of debt. The crowds pour in as everyone is delightedly shocked by Kim Lord's art. The only thing missing? Kim Lord herself.

Suspicion immediately falls on Kim Lord's boyfriend, Greg Shaw Ferguson - who just happens to be Maggie's ex.

As Maggie begins her own in-

vestigation on the disappearance of Kim Lord, she begins to suspect all of the people closest to her. Unsure of who to trust, she tries to work out the mystery alone.

There are a lot of people in the gallery world who would want Kim Lord dead. The question becomes: what would they do to keep Maggie from finding out the truth and exposing them?

The novel, *Still Lives*, is a thought provoking read that will have the reader on the edge of their seat. From the meticulous description of the art exhibit, to the portrayal of the people in Maggie's world, Maria Hummel has written a fantastic novel that makes a great summer read.

What I love about this story is that Hummel has used her gift of storytelling to create a mystery that both entertains us and challenges us.

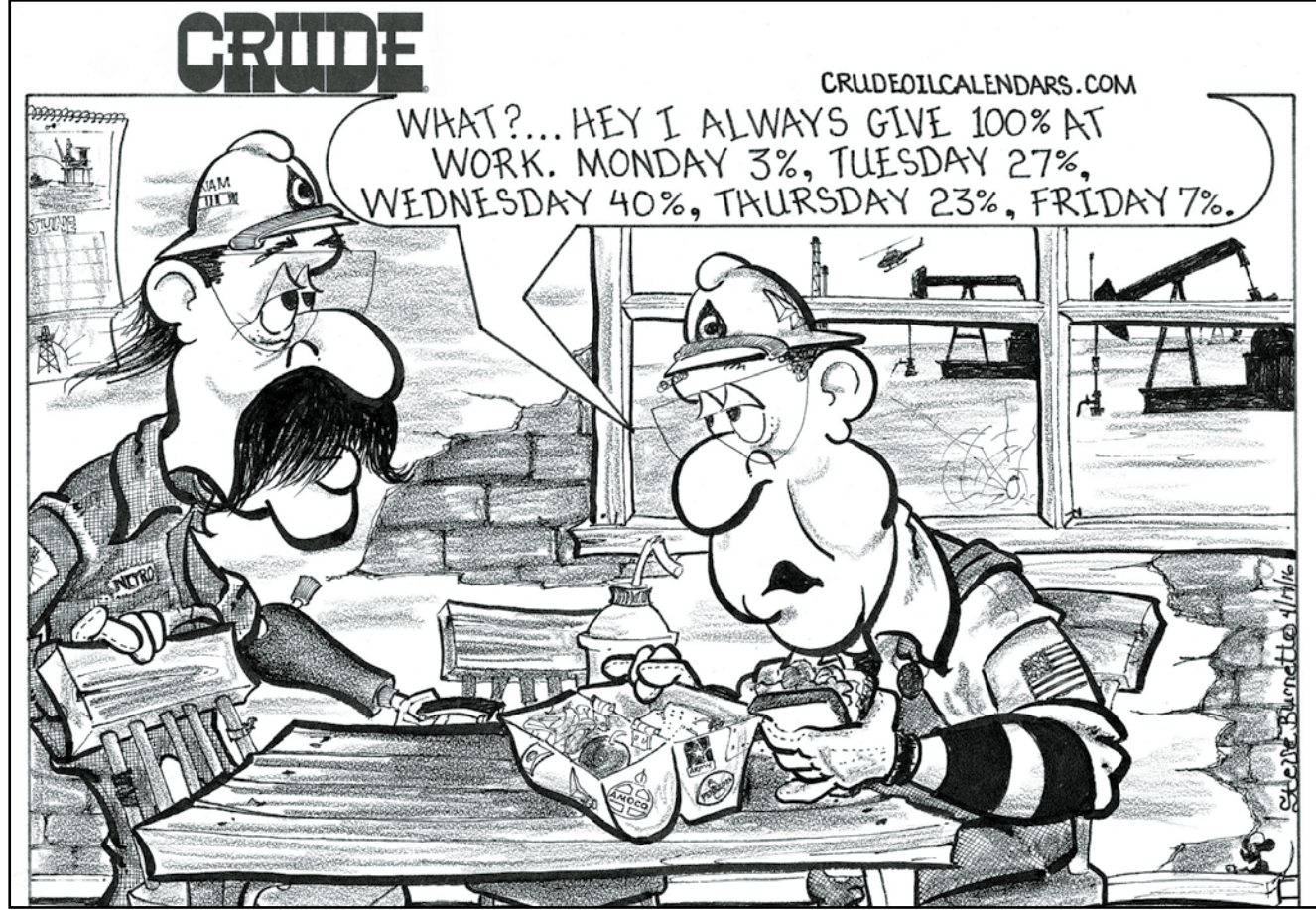

## Could we survive as they did?

Lost for 17 days in a Hawaiian jungle, all alone in only a tank top and capri yoga pants, I'm not sure what I would do. Would I work past my fractured leg, blistered wounds and terror to survive? Would I eat mystery fruit and moths and sleep in the mud or a wild boar's den? Would I do the things Amanda Eller did, or would I go crazy after two weeks and throw my emaciated body into a ravine?

A less plausible scenario for me would be doing what Nebraska farmer Kurt Kaser did. Having gotten his leg caught in a farm machine's rotating steel blade (foot already gone), would I have had the guts to take out my pocketknife and cut the leg off? Would I have had the brute strength to then crawl about 200 feet to a phone to call for help? Or would I have stayed there alone on that day, screaming for help as I bled to death?

Both stories fascinate because they center on regular people who were not out looking for adventure. A 35-year-old physical therapist and yoga instructor, Eller thought she would be taking a short walk on a trail in Maui's Makawao Forest Reserve, a path she had taken before. She didn't even bother to take her bottle of water. Kaser, 63, was just moving grain between bins on his farm

outside the town of Pender.

Kaser is someone to look up to for advice. His lesson, he said, was, "Take time and think — and don't get in such a hurry." That's something we might consider the next time we rush absent-mindedly down a perilous flight of stairs.

But the bigger lesson from Kaser is not the easily learned one: the importance of staying calm in the face of catastrophe and carefully doing what must be done. "He was his own 911, his own pre-hospital, his own surgeon," a surgeon at the Bryan Trauma Center in Lincoln said about Kaser. "He saved his own life," he added, "and he made it very easy for us." All the doctors had to do, really, was clean up the amputation.

Well, everyone is being modest here.

There are other lessons. Stay focused on the present. On this, Eller's yoga practice must have helped. She later called her trial a "spiritual journey" to stay alive.

A few other practical pointers: Don't go out alone without your cellphone. Both Eller and Kaser did that. Also, it helps to maintain physical strength. Eller was obviously in good shape through exercise, and Kaser through farm work.

As we've seen, Kaser's feat of self-preservation was basically

a one-man effort. Eller, on the other hand, survived not only through her own perseverance but also through that of her rescuers. Amazingly, they were volunteers.

The Maui fire rescue squad had stopped the search upon reaching its 72-hour limit on missing-person work — although it helped support the volunteers who took over. (One would be hard-pressed to blame anyone who stopped looking after more than a week.)

Even the experienced search-team members faced dangers in this very difficult terrain. They need machetes to cut through the dense forest. A wild boar attacked at least one of them. But the army of volunteers kept looking.

Recognizing that her happy ending was a group effort, Eller said, "This was all about us coming together for a greater purpose of community and love, and appreciation for life."

Needless to say, she came from a very different cultural landscape than the Nebraska farmer. But both worlds made people strong in body and determination. Their stories must lead many of us to ask, Could we survive as they did?

# Dodgers rally for 4 in 9th against Díaz to defeat Mets 9-8

LOS ANGELES (AP) — Trailing by three against an All-Star closer, Cody Bellinger and the Los Angeles Dodgers weren't fazed one bit.

Bellinger hit a tying double and came around with the winning run as the Dodgers scored four times off Edwin Díaz in the ninth inning to rally past the New York Mets 9-8 on Wednesday night.

"One through nine we are really good. We were just going up and down the lineup," Bellinger said. "Down three against Díaz is never easy, but once we hit the home runs it was just a matter of getting guys on base."

Joc Pederson and Max Muncy opened the bottom of the ninth with consecutive homers off Díaz (1-3), who was pitching for the fourth time in five days. Justin Turner followed with a double and scored on Bellinger's double to right-center.

"Díaz is a good closer but we match up well," Muncy said. "He is a fastball pitcher and this team likes to hit fastballs. We got a couple things going and we went from there."

Corey Seager was intentionally walked and Matt Beaty hit a roller toward second base. Mets shortstop Amed Rosario was slow to field the ball and late trying for a force at second, allowing Bellinger to beat the play on an infield single that loaded the bases.

Alex Verdugo's sacrifice fly to left field easily scored Bellinger.

"Joc, Muncy, Seager, those guys did the hard stuff by hitting home runs and getting on base. My job with the bases loaded and no outs was to get the guy in," said Verdugo, who got his first career walk-off RBI.

Díaz, who blew his second save in 15 chances, had allowed only one run over 9 1/3 innings in his last 10 appearances.

After giving up four runs and five hits in one-third of an inning, he called it "easily the worst game of my career."

"The whole time I'm thinking he is going to get out of it and it didn't happen," Mets manager Mickey Callaway said. "We were in great position and couldn't get it done. I haven't seen many teams, though, that can do this consistently from top to bottom."

Scott Alexander (3-1) worked a hitless inning for the win.

Rookie slugger Pete Alonso hit a pair of two-run homers to back starter Noah Syndergaard, and the Mets built an 8-3 lead in the seventh following back-to-back homers by Rosario and Dominic Smith. But they squandered an excellent chance to add more, and New York's shaky bullpen gave up six runs while managing only seven outs the rest of the way.

Turner had a two-out RBI single in the seventh off Robert Gsellman, and Seager homered leading off the eighth against Jeury Familia to cut it to 8-5.

Seager, Turner and Beaty each had three hits for the NL-leading Dodgers, who have won 11 of 14.

New York missed a chance to move back over .500 for the first time since

May 2. Alonso's third multi-homer game gave him 19 homers this year, matching the major league rookie mark for most before June 1. Mark McGwire hit 19 for Oakland in the first two months of the 1987 season.

Alonso has gone deep 10 times in May, setting a franchise rookie record for any month. Adeiny Hechavarria drove in two runs for New York, and Smith had three hits. Syndergaard threw a season-high 116 pitches, allowing three runs and seven hits in six innings.

Dodgers starter Walker Buehler permitted five runs and seven hits in five innings. Turner and Verdugo each knocked in two runs.

**RECORD BOOK**  
Alonso has already tied Ike Davis (2010) and Ron Swoboda (1965) for second-most home runs by a Mets rookie. The franchise mark is 26 by Darryl Strawberry in 1983.

**ENDURANCE MAN**  
It was the fifth time in Syndergaard's career he threw 115 or more pitches. His career high is 118 against Colorado in 2015. Syndergaard has thrown at least 100 pitches in eight starts this season, tied for second in the NL behind Washington ace Max Scherzer (10).

**WEB GEM**  
Mets center fielder Carlos Gomez prevented Seager from getting a triple in the fifth with a great throw to third baseman Todd Frazier.

Gomez wasn't able to catch Seager's long fly as it hit the wall, but he quickly recovered and fired to Frazier, who picked the ball deftly on one tough hop to tag out Seager.

Mets: LF-INF Jeff McNeil (hamstring) is doing some running, taking grounders and taking swings in the batting cage in New York. ... RHP Seth Lugo (right shoulder tendinitis) threw 26 pitches in a bullpen session. It is possible he could be activated during this weekend's series in Arizona.

Dodgers: A limping Turner, hit by a pitch in four straight games earlier this month, reached for the back of his right knee in the dugout after scoring in the ninth inning. Roberts has been trying to rest Turner at every opportunity and said he thought about taking him out after the seventh if the Dodgers had not scored to get within four.

# What's in a name? You say French Open; I say Roland Garros

PARIS (AP) — Serena Williams and Roger Federer would love to win the French Open again, of course. They'd also be thrilled to win Roland Garros. And they might not know it, but they are doing their best to win it what used to be officially the Championnats Internationaux de France, too.

What's in a name? Things get complicated when it comes to deciding what to call the clay-court Grand Slam tournament being contested now on the southwestern edge of Paris.

English-speakers tend to say "French Open," even though that's not used by the event itself. Most of the rest of the world refers to "Roland Garros," the tournament facility named after a World War I fighter pilot.

Williams, an American with an apartment in Paris, and Federer, who is Swiss, are comfortable speaking English and French, so they say both versions. But what hardly ever is uttered — by Williams, Federer or anyone else — is the event's original name, which translates to "International Championships of France."

That French phrase is etched on the silver trophies that will be handed to the singles champions on June 8-9. A green board showing a bracket with each day's results in white chalk says "Internationaux de France 2019."

During interviews with several players and coaches, though, nobody seems to know that name.

"Yo," said Denis Shapovalov, a Canadian ranked in the top 25, "I've never even heard that."

Maybe that's why the French Tennis Federation, which operates the tournament, wants the world to use "Roland Garros" — or, more precisely, "Roland-Garros," owing to the country's style of hyphenating places named after people. It asked media outlets, including The Associated Press, to use "Roland-Garros," rather than "French Open."

It's "Roland Garros" that's stamped on the tennis balls and court walls. It's festooned on hats, shirts and other items sold in merchandise boutiques.

The term "French Open" derives from when Grand Slam tennis tournaments became "open" to professionals in 1968 — as in "U.S. Open" or "Australian Open" — but it is not found on-site in Paris. Oddly enough, the English version of the tournament's online store does hawk what it calls a "vial of French Open clay" for \$22 or 20 euros (the French version calls it "terre battue Roland-Garros").

"The organizers clearly want everyone to refer to the tournament as 'Roland-Garros,'" federation spokesman Nicolas Beaudelin said, "because this is ... where the tournament is played."

Think of it as akin to referring to the Masters golf tournament as "Augusta National."

Most sporting events go by one name. The Super Bowl is the Super Bowl. The World Series is, well, the World Series. The NBA Finals are just that. Same for the Final Four. There are exceptions, to be sure, but not many. The folks who run Wimbledon ("The Championships") and golf's British Open ("The Open Championship") have a hard time getting the globe to adopt their preferred monikers.

Tennis is an international sport: 42 countries were represented in the 2019 men's draw in Paris, 35 in the women's. English is generally the lingua franca on tour, but the lone Grand Slam tournament held where that's not the primary language is proud of the distinction.

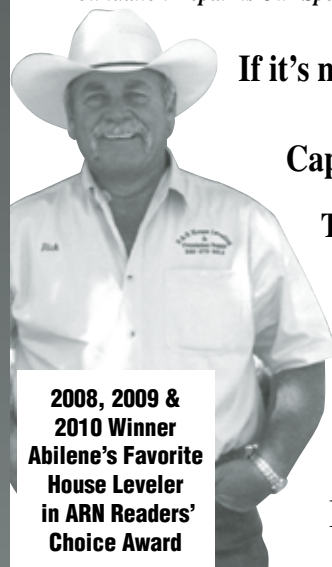

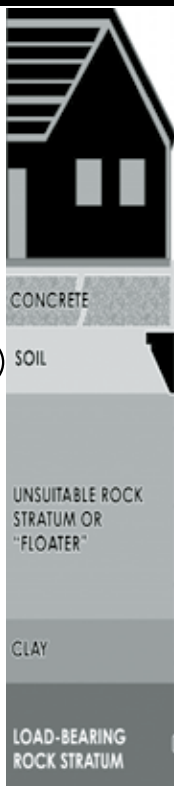

# Contract Bridge

The practice of counting your losers in a suit contract is not always the best way to assess your prospects. The general rule is for declarer to count his winners when he plays a notrump contract, and his losers in a suit contract. But exceptional situations arise where declarer is better advised to reverse the usual procedure.

If all four hands of today's deal

are examined, it would appear that South must lose three trump tricks, a club trick and either one or two spade tricks. Nevertheless, with proper play, declarer can bring in 10 tricks!

South ruffs the opening diamond lead and cashes the ace of trump, disclosing the foul trump distribution. Prospects look bleak indeed, but declarer sets out to do the best he can with the limited resources he has.

A club to the queen is followed by a diamond ruff, a club to the ace and another diamond ruff. Declarer then crosses to the ace of spades and ruffs dummy's last diamond before cashing the spade king.

South has made no extraordinary plays, but his mission is already accomplished. He has won the ace of hearts, the A-K of spades and A-Q of clubs, and has also ruffed all four of dummy's diamonds to bring him to nine tricks. The king of hearts still in his hand constitutes trick No. 10.

After South takes the first 10 tricks, he still has two losing spades and a losing club. West has the high cards to win them all, but East is forced to trump them with his Q-J-10 of hearts. The defenders' six apparent tricks are thus telescoped to just three.

Bridge is sometimes a very strange game.

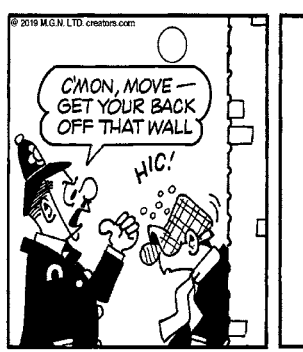

**Today in History**  
Today is Thursday, May 30, the 150th day of 2019. There are 215 days left in the year.  
Today's Highlight in History: On May 30, 1911, the first Indy 500 took place at the Indianapolis Motor Speedway; the winner was Ray Harroun, who drove a Marmon Wasp for more than 6 1/2 hours at an average speed of 74.6 mph and collected a prize of \$10,000.  
On this date:  
In 1381, the Peasants' Revolt against economic injustice erupted in England during the reign of King Richard II; the king and his men, initially caught off-guard, were able to crush the rebellion several weeks later.  
In 1431, Joan of Arc, condemned as a heretic, was burned at the stake in Rouen (roo-AHN'), France.  
In 1883, 12 people were trampled to death in a stampede sparked by a rumor that the recently opened Brooklyn Bridge was in danger of collapsing.  
In 1922, the Lincoln Memorial in Washington, D.C., was dedicated in a ceremony attended by President Warren G. Harding, Chief Justice William Howard Taft and Robert Todd Lincoln.  
In 1935, Babe Ruth played in his last major league baseball game for the Boston Braves, leaving after the first inning of the first game of a double-header against the Philadelphia Phillies, who won both games (Ruth announced his retirement three days later).  
In 1937, ten people were killed when police fired on steelworkers demonstrating near the Republic Steel plant in South Chicago.  
In 1943, during World War II, American troops secured the Aleutian island of Attu from Japanese forces.  
In 1958, unidentified American service members killed in World War II and the Korean War were interred in the Tomb of the Unknowns at Arlington National Cemetery.  
In 1989, student protesters in Beijing erected a "Goddess of Democracy" statue in Tiananmen Square (the statue was destroyed in the Chinese government's crackdown).  
In 1994, Mormon Church president Ezra Taft Benson died in Salt Lake City at age

94.  
In 1996, Britain's Prince Andrew and the former Sarah Ferguson were granted an uncontested decree ending their 10-year marriage.  
In 2008, diplomats from 111 nations meeting in Dublin, Ireland, formally adopted a landmark treaty banning cluster bombs. (The United States and other leading cluster bomb makers — Russia, China, Israel, India and Pakistan — boycotted the talks.)  
Ten years ago: Britain's Prince Harry raised money for an AIDS charity by playing in a polo match on Governors Island in New York Harbor. Internet sensation Susan Boyle placed second on "Britain's Got Talent," with dance troupe Diversity taking the top prize.  
Five years ago: Beset by growing evidence of patient delays and cover-ups, embattled Veterans Affairs Secretary Eric Shinseki resigned from President Barack Obama's Cabinet, taking the blame for what he decied as a "lack of integrity" in the sprawling health care system for the nation's military veterans.  
One year ago: Harvey Weinstein was indicted in New York on rape and criminal sex act charges, furthering the first criminal case stemming from sexual misconduct allegations against the former movie mogul. Russian journalist Arkady Babchenko stunned colleagues by appearing at a news conference in Kiev less than a day after police in the Ukrainian capital said he'd been assassinated; authorities said his death was staged to foil a plot on his life by Moscow's security services. A senior House Republican, Trey Gowdy, said there was no evidence that the FBI planted a "spy" on Donald Trump's 2016 campaign, as Trump had alleged. Reality TV star Kim Kardashian West visited the White House to appeal to Trump on behalf of a woman serving a life sentence for drug offenses. (Days later, Trump granted clemency for

Alice Marie Johnson, freeing her from prison.) Gaza's Hamas rulers said they had agreed to a cease-fire with Israel to end the largest flare-up of violence between the two sides since a 2014 war.

# Santana's 3 hits, 5 RBIs power Indians past Red Sox 14-9

BOSTON (AP) — Carlos Santana homered and hit Cleveland's first triple of the season, Greg Allen added a pair of three-baggers and the Indians pounded out a season-high 18 hits in a 14-9 win over the Boston Red Sox on Wednesday night.

Santana, who finished a single shy of the cycle, was 3 for 4 with five RBIs as Cleveland matched its season best for runs.

Jose Ramirez had two doubles and two RBIs. Allen and Kevin Plawewski also drove in two runs apiece for the Indians, who won two of three against the World Series champions in Boston.

The Indians, shut out over the first seven innings Tuesday night before rallying with seven runs over the last two for a 7-5 win, scored at least once in each of the first seven innings Wednesday.

Mookie Betts, Jackie Bradley Jr., Andrew Benintendi and Xander Bogaerts homered for Boston. The Red Sox scored three in the eighth, two on Bogaerts' 10th home run of the season, to pull to 14-9 and loaded the bases with one out in the ninth before the Indians called on Brad Hand to close it out for his 15th save.

Shane Bieber (4-2) got the win despite allowing six runs and eight hits in five innings. He struck out six.

Ryan Weber (1-1) took the loss.

DODGERS 9, METS 8  
LOS ANGELES (AP) — Cody Bellinger hit a tying double in the ninth inning and Los Angeles scored four runs off All-Star closer Edwin Díaz to rally past New York.

Joc Pederson and Max Muncy opened the bottom of the ninth with consecutive homers off Díaz (1-3), who was pitching for the fourth time in five days. Justin Turner doubled and scored on Bellinger's double.

With the bases loaded and still nobody out, Alex Verdugo's sacrifice fly easily scored Bellinger with the winning run.

Pete Alonso hit a pair of two-run homers to back starter Noah Syndergaard, and the Mets built an 8-3 lead in the seventh following back-to-back homers by Amed Rosario and Dominic Smith. But they squandered an excellent chance to add more, and New York's shaky bullpen gave up six runs while managing only seven outs the rest of the way.

Scott Alexander (3-1) worked a hitless inning for the win. Corey Seager homered and had three hits for the NL-leading Dodgers, who have won 11 of 14. Turner and Matt Beaty also got three hits apiece.

With 19 homers, Alonso matched the major league rookie mark for most before June 1 set by Mark McGwire in 1987.

PHILLIES 11, CARDINALS 4  
PHILADELPHIA (AP) — Bryce Harper hit his 10th homer, his 200th career double and drove in four before fouling a ball off his foot and exiting in the fifth inning, and Philadelphia beat St. Louis.

The hot-hitting Harper drove a two-run homer in the third and followed an inning later with a two-run hustle double. He had three hits when he left the game with the Phillies ahead by 10 runs.

Aaron Nola (6-0) struck out eight over seven innings. Scott Kingery and Maikel Franco hit back-to-back homers in the fifth, and Andrew McCutchen hit a two-run shot two batters later to blow the game open.

Matt Weiters homered for St. Louis. Genesis Cabrera took the loss, working 3 2/3 innings, allowing five hits, five runs (three earned) and two walks while striking out five.

ANGELS 12, ATHLETICS 7, 11 INNINGS  
OAKLAND, Calif. (AP) — Gold Glove first baseman Matt Olson made a rare throwing error in the 11th inning to allow the go-ahead run to score and Los Angeles beat Oakland and sent the Athletics to their second straight loss after a 10-game winning streak.

Mike Trout was rested a day after fouling a ball off the top of his right foot.

Noé Ramírez (2-0) retired six batters to win. César Puello had three hits, including his first career home run, and drove in four runs.

Puello was hit by a pitch from Lou Trivino (2-1) leading off the 11th and moved to second on a wild pitch. After Brian Goodwin walked, Luis Rengifo attempted to sacrifice both runners over. Olson attempted to field the bunt barehanded and bobbled the ball briefly before his throw to first sailed wide and into foul territory near the Angels bullpen.

Tommy LaStella singled three times and Jared Walsh had two hits and an RBI for the Angels. Shohei Ohtani singled, walked twice and scored once.

Olson, Mark Canha and Marcus Semien homered for Oakland.

PIRATES 7, REDS 2

CINCINNATI (AP) — Josh Bell tied Pittsburgh's record with his 12th homer in May, and the Pirates stopped Derek Dietrich's home run spree in beating Cincinnati for a split of the teams' four-game series.

Bell's three-run homer tied Jason Bay's mark from May 2006. His 23rd extra-base hit in May left him one shy of Paul Waner's club record for any month. He had three hits, raising his average to .345 with 18 homers overall.

Colin Moran also had a three-run shot off Anthony DeSclafani (2-3), who has given up seven homers in his last three starts.

Left-hander Steven Brault (2-1) fanned Dietrich twice during his latest shutdown performance against the Reds. Brault is 4-0 career against Cincinnati with a 1.03 ERA and a scoreless streak of 19 2/3 innings. Brault allowed three singles and struck out five in 5 1/3 innings of his third start.

YANKEES 7, PADRES 0

NEW YORK (AP) — DJ LeMahieu and Luke Voit jolted rookie Chris Paddack with instant home runs, James Paxton pitched four hitless innings in his return from the injured list and New York beat San Diego.

Gio Urshela also connected off Paddack, Gleyber Torres hit a late homer and Voit added his first big league triple as the Yankees won their eighth straight series.

San Diego didn't get a hit until the sixth when Wil Myers' blooper bounced out of LeMahieu's glove as he drifted out from second base.

Paddack (4-3) was pulled after five innings trailing 4-0.

Jonathan Holder (4-2) worked two innings and earned the win as the Yankees used five pitchers to complete the four-hitter.

NATIONALS 14, BRAVES 4

ATLANTA (AP) — Anibal Sánchez allowed one

hit in six scoreless innings, Howie Kendrick hit a three-run double and Washington withstood a grand slam by rookie Austin Riley to beat Atlanta.

Sánchez (1-6) returned to Atlanta, where he thrived in 2018, to earn his first win of the season. He was perfect through 5 1/3 innings and allowed one hit and one walk with seven strikeouts.

Juan Soto and Matt Adams homered for Washington, which swept the two-game series and ended Atlanta's streak of five straight series victories. The Nationals have won five of six.

Kevin Gausman (2-4) gave up eight runs, matching his career high, on eight hits and two walks while recording only three outs.

CUBS 2, ASTROS 1

HOUSTON (AP) — Kyle Hendricks pitched eight strong innings, Kyle Schwarber homered for the second straight game and Kris Bryant added a solo shot in his return to the lineup to help Chicago avoid a sweep with a win over Houston.

The game included a scary and jarring moment when a young fan was hit by a foul line drive off the bat of Albert Almora Jr. in the fourth inning. The Astros did not provide an immediate update on the girl's condition, though a photo taken by The Associated Press appeared to show her conscious and crying as she was quickly whisked away and nearby fans looked on.

Almora, the Cubs' center fielder, and other players from both teams were visibly shaken up by the scene.

Hendricks (5-4) allowed four hits and one run with seven strikeouts for his fourth straight win. Steve Cishek worked a perfect ninth for his fifth save.

Wade Miley (5-3) worked seven innings, allowing six hits and two earned runs with nine strikeouts.

ROCKIES 5, DIAMONDBACKS 4

DENVER (AP) — Jeff Hoffman pitched five solid innings and beat out a bunt single to drive in a key run as Colorado topped Arizona.

Brendan Rodgers had a two-run single and Trevor Story added three hits for the Rockies, who won their season-high fourth in a row at home and clinched a series win in the four-game set.

Carson Kelly homered and singled to drive in two runs for the Diamondbacks. Adam Jones also went deep and rookie Kevin Cron doubled twice and scored a run.

Hoffman (1-1) allowed three runs and seven hits, helping the Rockies get back to .500 at 27-27. He struck out six and walked two.

Scott Oberg, filling in for injured closer Wade Davis, got three outs for his third career save and first since 2016.
