Mini-bronc riding returns to the rodeo Registration has begun, 10 slots open nightly

Mini bronc riding is returning, for the fifth year, to the Big Spring Cowboy Reunion and Rodeo. This year, the rodeo will take place June 20-22. Registration is open for those 12 and younger.

"Mini bronc riding is an opportunity for these kids – boys and girls – to participate in a once in a lifetime experience," Shannon Crenshaw, Big Spring Cowboy Reunion and Rodeo Board Member, said.

This year, the horses are being provided by Lonesome Dove Rodeo from Goldwaite, Texas. Horses will be selected according to the age, size and

experience of the child registered.

"We do have some youth who come back each year and have experience riding. Those kids will get a horse that bucks a little more than the others," he said. "We also have those kids who are doing this

for the first time and we are going to make sure they get a horse that isn't going to buck too much. This is a fun experience, but we also have safety at the top of mind, as well."

Registration can be done for one night or all three nights, with \$50 per night. With the registration fee, safety gear is provided and admission for one adult is included.

Big Spring Foundation supporting community \$345,000 granted to area agencies, local students

The Big Spring Area Community Foundation recently awarded \$345,000 in grants, scholarships and agency funds. For 2019, there were 20 scholarships and 15 grants, and four agency funds, provided throughout Howard County and surrounding communities.

"Once a year, in May, funds are dispersed throughout the community and it is only through the generosity of so many community members that this is made possible. From the donors to the board members who volunteer their time and all the agencies who provided services to this community," Greg Henry, Foundation Executive Director, said.

According to Henry, the Foundation was created in February 2001 and has been providing support to the Big Spring community through funding in education, community development, arts

and culture, health and human service and other charitable purposes designated by donors. The board of trustees is comprised of volunteers.

"These men and women have graciously given of their time and energy to build the Foundation into what it is today. They have

set the bar high while paving the way for the Foundation to continue to grow and benefit

Legislature act may lead to schedule change for commissioners

A new act approved by the State Legislature, and effective May 31, was the focus of Wednesday's Howard County Commissioner's Court meeting.

The new act could have implications for how often – and when – the commissioners will meet, starting in September.

"The legislature has signed an agreement effective immediately," said County Judge Kathryn Wiseman. "It says, 'Whereas Senate Bill 354, the 86th Legislative Session, effective May 31 of 2019, provides that County funds previously budgeted for salaries, and authorized office expenses, may be dispersed as payment for a salary or reaching office expenses; Whereas the Commissioners' Court of Howard County wish-

es to implement the provisions of this act; Now, and hereby as follows:"

Wiseman explained that the agreement will allow County Treasurer Sharon Adams to handle the routine task of approving payroll for county employees, without direct approval of the commissioners.

"For a while, we were meeting sometimes four times a month so that we could approve our regular business and then approve payroll," Wiseman said. "Also, (County Auditor) Jackie (Olson) had invoices that had to be paid, and they were at odd times. At first we were meeting sometimes four times a month, just about every week. Then, we fixed our schedule so we were meeting right before payroll, every two weeks. This will allow us, next year, to go back to our regular schedule of every second and fourth Monday, if we so choose,

starting in September."

The commissioners unanimously approved the measure.

In other business, the commissioners unanimously voted to file an extension on the disaster declaration recently signed by Judge Wiseman.

"I signed a declaration of local state of disaster because of the state of the flooding on the roads," she said. "I signed that on the sixth day of June, 2019."


Howard County Emergency Management Coordinator Terry Chamness was on hand to explain the extension process.

"Once you did the original disaster declaration, it's good for seven days. Of course the roads aren't going to be fixed in seven days, so we're requesting the State's help with whatever they can give us to

Big Spring," Henry said.

He continued, "The Foundation has a two-fold purpose; providing an avenue for people with philanthropic desires to make a lasting difference in Big Spring now and in the future, and through the awarding of those funds, provides support to non-profit organizations who meet a specific need beneficial to the community."

help us out with this flooding and the road repair," he said. "We're asking for \$825,000. We shoot high, and if we don't need all of it, that's fine. We need to extend it for 90 more days. Hopefully that will get everything done. If not, we can come back and extend it again."

The commissioners also:

- Approved a contract in which Tom Green County will provide forensic mobile phone analysis for Howard County.

- Tabled action on County rental properties and subdivision rules.
- Approved consideration of "active shooter" insurance for the County.
- Approved invoices, purchase requests, and budget amendments.
- Approved personnel considerations, the treasurer's monthly report, the monthly payroll report, and the updated investment policy.
- Accepted a refund check in the amount of \$7,822.98 from Edward Risk.
- Approved the county clerk's monthly report.

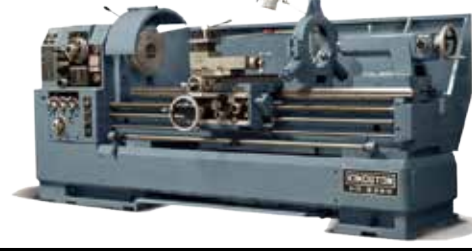

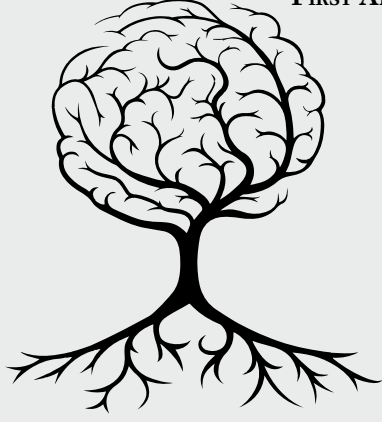

Their wedding takes place near sunset and is everything Mayara could have wished for. Except for the spirit storm that comes in from the ocean. The storm threatens to destroy her entire village until she stops it. Using the power she's kept hidden most of her life, Mayara sends the spirits away and saves her village before any more can be lost. The cost of exposing her powers is that Mayara's life is now forfeit to the crown.

The islands of Renthia need to be protected from the spirits who will destroy them and their inhabitants. Every woman who has the power to control the spirits is given two choices: renounce her name and family, her voice and her identity and become a Silent One; or go to Akena Island for testing. In order to pass the test, Mayara need only survive on the island for one month. The only problem is that very few women have survived the testing. Mayara's own sister was killed on the island a few years ago, leaving a gaping hole in her family - one her mother still hasn't healed from.

With the help of Roe and Palia - two women who are both fighting for something bigger than themselves, Mayara might stand a chance of surviving the island. If only the Silent Ones weren't so intent on killing them off.

Queen Asana has spent most of her reign keeping the ancient spirits of the deepest blue from waking and destroying all of Belene. She's also spent most of her reign trying to find her family after they were kidnapped from the great families of Belene. The only thing she knows for certain is that her husband was murdered when she got close to finding them.

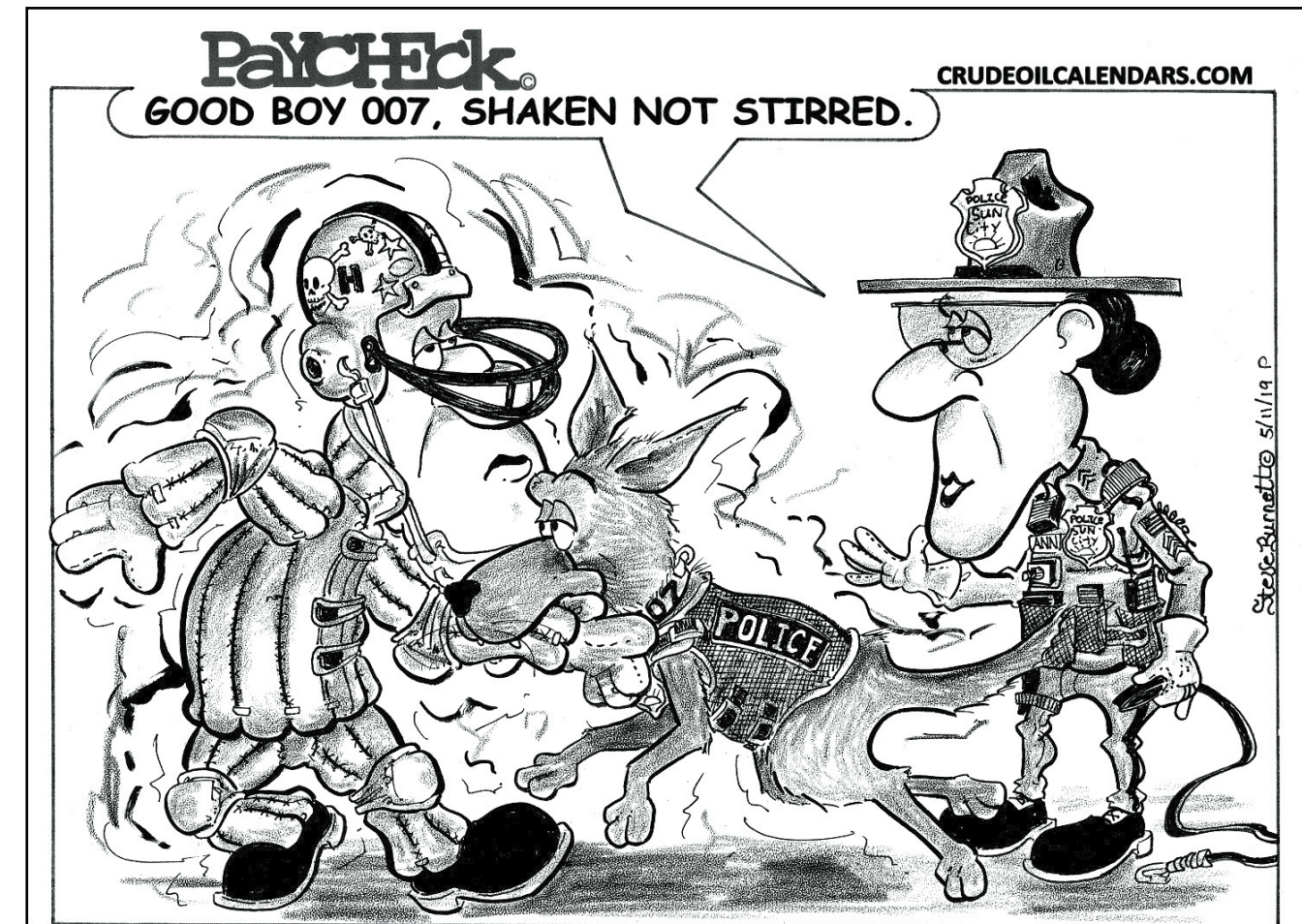
With the help of a poisoner, Garanah, she begins making her own moves to uncover the loca-

The Deepest Blue by Sarah Beth Durst is a touching and inspiring novel. It delves into the lengths that people will go in order to protect those that they love. Cowboys' Prescott clicks quickly with new QB coach Kitna

FRISCO, Texas — Dak Prescott's new quarterback coach with the Dallas Cowboys has far more NFL starts and touchdown passes than either of his predecessors.

Oh, and Jon Kitna easily has the most interceptions as well.

"It's just the fact that I can tell them, 'I've already paid that cost for you. You don't even need to look at the route when you get this coverage. I've already done that. I threw that pick. So go somewhere else,'" Kitna said. "I think there's some respect for that."

Experience aside, Kitna clicked quickly with Prescott by appealing to his desire to build on his first playoff victory, which came two years after the unheralded fourth-round pick became the NFL Offensive Rookie of the Year in what began as a fill-in role for the injured Tony Romo.

And by building, that means from the ground up with Prescott's technical skills. The two-time Pro Bowler who has started his entire career noticed the attention to footwork and other details of the mechanics of throwing from his third position coach in four seasons.

"He kind of said it best," Prescott said of Kitna, who made 124 starts with 169 TDs and 165 interceptions. "Every other position has gotten more technical over the years whereas the quarterback position has kind of faded away from that."

"It's just good to get back to the basics, getting better at the drops, getting better at how you're basing everything you want to do when you throw the

ball."

The late Wade Wilson, who made 69 starts in the 1980s and '90s, was Prescott's QB coach his first two years, replaced last year when Kellen Moore went straight from being Prescott's backup to his new position coach.

The promotion of Moore, who appeared in just three games over six seasons, to offensive coordinator created the opening for Kitna.

The 46-year-old has plenty of background with the Cowboys, having started nine games in 2010 when Romo was injured. Dallas had to bring him in as an emergency backup for the final week of the 2013 season when Romo was hurt again. He didn't have to play.

Kitna went back to his job as a high school coach in Washington state, then was hired at a Dallas-area school. Kitna was around some of the first two years of Prescott's career when he would bring his Waxahachie staff to Cowboys practice.

But Kitna had to get in the same QB room to get the job.

"He's a rare individual," Kitna said. "From a physical standpoint, the mental standpoint, the experience standpoint, the leadership, on down the line. I don't think you even want to even try to put limits on what that would be, what his best is."

Kitna says Prescott sometimes challenges him as much as vice versa, in part because Kitna is new to some parts of the Dallas offense despite his long history with coach Jason Garrett, who joined the Cowboys as offensive coordinator 12 years ago.

The other part is Prescott pushing Kitna to keep pushing his new under-

study. "He comes out every day wondering, asking the whys," Kitna said. "Why am I doing this? Why are we doing this drill? What do you want me to do this for? Because he wants to know why it connects and how it's going to help him become an elite player in this league for a long time."

While many of the questions for Prescott these days revolve around when he will get a contract that figures to make him the highest-paid player in club history, he tries to deflect with talk by saying his focus is on the locker room and the meeting rooms.

A big part of the success that put Prescott in position for a big contract was his leadership trait. Dallas coaches noticed in visits with Prescott before his draft, and teammates saw it even before Romo went down with a back injury during the 2016 preseason.

Garrett had seen that before as well — when Kitna was a backup in the Dallas locker room.

"What's most impressive to me about each of those players, coaches," Garrett said. "They just have a really infectious spirit about them that's contagious. I think it's good to have a new voice for Dak."

Prescott is listening. "I'm feel like I'm getting better at everything, from footwork to being able to throw in every platform," he said, "no matter if somebody's in my face and I have to throw it now or being able to move and escape and get the ball out."

Kitna has a few ideas about where not to throw it, too.

Betts' bases-loaded walk gives Red Sox 4-3 win over Rangers

BOSTON — Mookie Betts watched patiently as four straight pitches missed the strike zone, and the Red Sox averted disaster.

Betts drew a bases-loaded walk from reliever Jesse Chavez in the ninth, giving the Red Sox a 4-3 win over the Texas Rangers on Wednesday and halting Boston's three-game skid.

"I was pretty confident knowing the situation that he had to kind of come to me at that point. He was in trouble," Betts said. "Obviously, it's kind of tough because of how huge we didn't want to let them back in the game right there."

Boston rallied against Chavez (2-1) in the ninth after allowing the Rangers to tie it in the eighth on an unearned run.

Andrew Benintendi hit a triple and two doubles, driving in two runs for the Red Sox as they avoided falling below .500 for the first time in more than a month.

Christian Vázquez, whose throwing error in the eighth put the tying run on third, led off the ninth with a ground-rule double to center. Jackie Bradley Jr. followed with a single and the Rangers walked Michael Chavis to load the bases for Betts, who fouled off the first pitch he saw from Chavez. The next four pitches were balls, and Marco Hernández, who pinch-ran for Vázquez, trotted home.

"I was just missing by a little bit. I think I was trying to be too fine in that situation where I don't know why I should," said Chavez, whose scoreless streak of 22 2/3 innings came to an end. "Just let them put the ball on the ground and let the defense do the work. Today was a day when I wasn't able to do it in a situation when we needed it, for sure."

The start of the game was moved up three hours to 4:05 p.m. to avoid overlapping with Game 7 of the Stanley Cup Final between the Boston Bruins and St. Louis Blues. Chants of "We want the Cup!" rang out from the

stands throughout the game.

Matt Barnes (3-1) pitched a scoreless ninth. Starter Rick Porcello was in position for the win until Texas tied it in the eighth.

Brandon Workman hit Shin-Soo Choo with a pitch and went to third when Vázquez fielded a bunt by Delino DeShields and threw wildly. Elvis Andrus tied it with a sacrifice fly to right.

The hits with two outs in the first, taking a 2-0 lead on Hunter Pence's double to center, then went without a baserunner until the sixth. Porcello retired 13 straight batters before Andrus' two-out double in the sixth.

Porcello allowed two runs on five hits in 6 2/3 innings.

"This was a game I think everybody knew we needed to win," Benintendi said. "Rick went out there and after that first inning, threw the ball really well and gave us a shot to win. Yeah, this is a big win so hopefully we can build off it."

Benintendi, ejected Tuesday night for shouting at umpire Angel Hernandez about a called strike, doubled and scored in the first. He hit an RBI triple in the third, tying it at 2-2, and drove in a run with a double in the fifth.

Starter Lance Lynn worked six innings for the Rangers, allowing three runs on six hits. He walked one and struck out eight.

WINNING

The Red Sox, who only a few days before were trying to climb five games above .500, improved to 35-34. Boston hasn't had a losing record since May 7, when it beat Baltimore to move to 19-19.

The World Series champion Red Sox haven't been more than four games above .500 so far this season.

"I've been saying the goal is to get to five over," manager Alex Cora said. "We need to get there, and I say sooner rather than later and it's getting, like, later. But we've still got time to do that."

Moustakas hits 2-run HR in 14th as Brewers beat Astros 6-3

HOUSTON — On a night when the Milwaukee Brewers struck out again and again, piling up a season-high 24 Ks against the Houston Astros, one big swing by Mike Moustakas made all those whiffs way easier to swallow.

Moustakas hit a two-run homer during Milwaukee's three-run 14th inning, and the Brewers struck out 15 times against Houston ace Justin Verlander before rallying for a 6-3 victory over the Astros on Wednesday.

Christian Yelich started the 14th with a single against rookie Cionel Perez (1-1) for Milwaukee's first hit since the ninth. After Ryan Braun lined out, Moustakas hit a drive to right for his 21st homer.

"Obviously, 24 punchouts isn't what we were looking for, but ... we got a W so we turned a negative into a positive and found a way to win against a great ballclub over there," Moustakas said.

Jesús Aguilar added a pinch-hit RBI single as Milwaukee won for the fifth time in six games. Ryan Braun, Yasmani Grandal and Eric Thames also went deep for the Brewers, and Adrian Houser (2-1) pitched two scoreless innings for the victory.

"I bet you there's not too many times a team struck out 24 times and won the game," Yelich said. "All those weird baseball things happen and that's another example of it. Honestly, it's just a really good win and a hard-fought win."

Verlander set a career high for Ks while allowing three runs in seven innings. The 2011 AL Cy Young Award winner led the way as Houston set a franchise record for strikeouts, surpassing its previous record of 23 during a 15-inning game on May 31, 2003, against the Chicago Cubs.

"It would feel a lot better if we won,"

Verlander said. "Yeah, cool, great, but we didn't win the baseball game."

Houston had a 3-2 lead before Thames connected in the seventh inning for Milwaukee's third homer off Verlander. It was Thames' ninth of the season.

Each team had late chances to go in front.

Jake Marisnick singled off Houser with one out in the 13th. Marisnick stole second base, but Houser retired Josh Reddick and Alex Bregman to end the threat.

Pinch hitter Myles Straw walked leading off the Houston 10th, but was caught trying to steal second base. He was initially called safe, but the Brewers challenged the call and it was overturned. Josh Hader walked Tyler White, but Marisnick grounded into a double play to end the inning.

"Hitting is hard. They throw some pretty good arms at us," Astros manager AJ Hinch said. "They're a good team, and yes, it doesn't feel good when you go quietly like that."

Singles by Yelich and Moustakas left runners at first and third with one out in the ninth. But Roberto Osuna struck out Grandal and Thames to escape the jam.

Verlander surrendered solo drives to Braun in the first and Grandal in the second before settling into a groove. He retired 17 of 18 after Grandal's 15th homer, with Milwaukee's only bather coming on a double by Thames to start the fifth.

Verlander, who had fanned 14 four times in his career, struck out eight of his last 10 batters, including the side in the sixth.

Milwaukee's Brandon Woodruff also yielded three runs and four hits in seven innings.

The Brewers led 2-0 before the Astros scored three times in the fourth. Robinson Chirinos singled in Yuli Gurriel before Tony Kemp doubled in two runs.

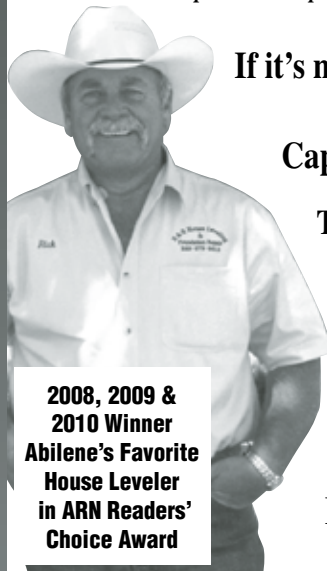

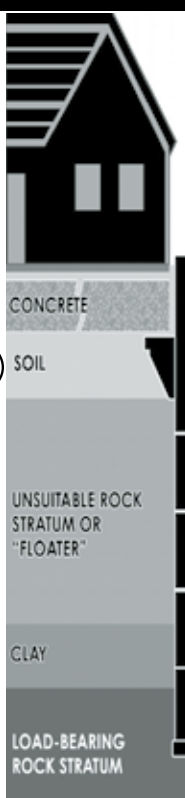

Companies Clueless on Need for Bereavement Time

Dear Annie: My daughter was 14 weeks pregnant when the baby died. The nurse midwives, who were wonderful, sent her home to have the miscarriage and told her it could take up to two weeks to "be complete."

I was surprised and extremely saddened by how she was treated by her supervisor at work. She is a professional engineer, and when she called her supervisor to explain why she would not be coming into work, she was told she could have three sick days, but after that, she would need to take vacation time. REALLY? And this was another woman. After my daughter and I discussed the situation, she applied, and was approved, for benefits from the Family and Medical Leave Act, but the mental damage had been done. To all of us, this was a child. My daughter had known she was pregnant for more than three months, and, as a mother, was devastated when her baby died.

As the grandmother, I also called my office to explain the situation -- that I would be staying with my daughter, and I was told by my supervisor that she would put me down for vacation/sick time, and, if need be, for me to call back and she would change it to bereavement. Again, REALLY? When I called back several days later to say the baby had come and we were planning a funeral and burial, my time off was changed. But again, why did it take two phone calls and a second extended explanation?

What is wrong with people? Shouldn't we both just have been told how sorry they were and what, if any, paperwork would need

to be filled out? How can the death of a baby be a vacation? -- Surprised and Saddened Grandmother

Dear Grandmother: I am so sorry for the loss of your grandchild. I can feel how much you and your daughter loved this baby. You are 100 percent correct that her employer and your supervisor should have been much more sensitive to both of you. Try not to allow their insensitivities to further your pain. case he would lead his higher card), and considering the bidding, it seems likely that declarer is the one with the singleton heart. Consequently, you should assume your side will not score any heart tricks.

South next plays two rounds of trump and leads the ten of clubs, which you win with the king. It is now obvious that you have no more tricks coming in spades, hearts or clubs, so the only hope remaining is to score three diamond tricks.

This will not be difficult to do if your partner has three or four diamonds to the queen. In that case, all you'd have to do is to play the A-K and another diamond and let your partner take the setting trick.

However, you should also allow for the possibility that partner might have the jack of diamonds instead of the queen. In that case, you still have a chance to stop the contract, but you would destroy it if you first cashed the A-K.

The play that offers by far the best chance is to return the two of diamonds after taking the king of clubs. South would then have to consider the possibility that you started with the A-J-2 or K-J-2 of diamonds rather than the A-K-2, and might elect to play low from his hand rather than put up the queen. If he does that, of course, he goes down one. The low diamond return therefore offers the best chance to beat the contract.

It is a fundamental principle of defense to assume that every contract can be defeated. Though this might be impossible in many deals because declarer has you completely out-gunned, quite often the declarer's advantage is marginal, and the outcome depends on how well each side deploys its forces.

Let's say you're East defending against four spades in today's hand. West leads the heart deuce, which dummy wins with the ace. You make a mental note that your partner is not leading from a doubleton (in which

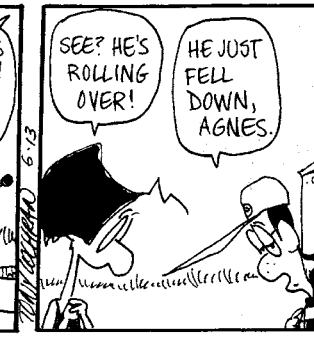
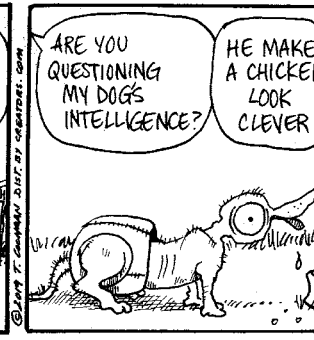

This Date In History

Today in History
Today is Thursday, June 13, the 164th day of 2019. There are 201 days left in the year.
Today's Highlight in History: On June 13, 1966, the Supreme Court ruled in *Miranda v. Arizona* that criminal suspects had to be informed of their constitutional right to consult with an attorney and to remain silent.
On this date:
In 1842, Queen Victoria became the first British monarch to ride on a train, traveling from Slough Railway Station to Paddington in 25 minutes.
In 1927, aviation hero Charles Lindbergh was honored with a ticker-tape parade in New York City.
In 1935, James Braddock claimed the title of world heavyweight boxing champion from Max Baer in a 15-round fight in Queens, New York. "Becky Sharp," the first movie photographed in "three-strip" Technicolor, opened in New York.
In 1942, a four-man Nazi sabotage team arrived on Long Island, New York, three days before a second four-man team landed in Florida. (All eight men were arrested after two members of the first group defected.) President Franklin D. Roosevelt created the Office of Strategic Services and the Office of War Information.
In 1967, President Lyndon B. Johnson nominated Solicitor-General Thurgood Marshall to become the first black justice on the U.S. Supreme Court.
In 1977, James Earl Ray, the convicted assassin of civil rights leader Martin Luther King Jr., was recaptured following his escape three days earlier from a Tennessee prison.
In 1978, the movie musical "Grease," starring John Travolta and Olivia Newton-John, had its world premiere in New York.
In 1983, the U.S. space probe Pioneer 10, launched in 1972, became the first spacecraft to leave the solar system as it crossed the orbit of Neptune.
In 1993, Canada's Progressive Conservative Party chose Defense Minister Kim Campbell to succeed Brian Mulroney (muhl-ROO'-nee) as prime minister; she was the first woman to hold the post. Astronaut Donald K. "Deke" Slayton died in League City, Texas, at age 69.
In 1997, a jury voted unanimously to give Timothy

McVeigh the death penalty for his role in the Oklahoma City bombing. The Chicago Bulls captured their fifth professional basketball championship in seven years with a 90-to-86 victory over the Utah Jazz in game six.
In 2005, a jury in Santa Maria, California, acquitted Michael Jackson of molesting a 13-year-old cancer survivor at his Neverland ranch. The Supreme Court warned prosecutors to use care in striking minorities from juries, siding with black murder defendants in Texas and California who contended their juries had been unfairly stacked with whites.
In 2008, Tim Russert, moderator of NBC's "Meet the Press," died suddenly while preparing for his weekly broadcast; he was 58. R. Kelly was acquitted of all charges in his child pornography trial in Chicago, ending a six-year ordeal for the R&B superstar.
Ten years ago: Opponents of Mahmoud Ahmadinejad (ah-muh-DEE'-neh-zahd) clashed with police in the heart of Tehran after the Iranian president claimed a re-election victory. Hundreds gathered at a sprawling hillside cemetery in Los Angeles to attend a funeral for David Carradine, more than a week after the 72-year-old actor was found hanging in a Bangkok hotel room.
Five years ago: The Internal Revenue Service told Congress it had lost a trove of emails to and from Lois Lerner, a central figure in the agency's tea party controversy, sparking outrage from congressional investigators. The Los Angeles Kings won the Stanley Cup for the second time in three years with a 3-2 victory over the New York Rangers in Game 5. Hall of Fame football coach Chuck Noll, 82, died in Sewickley, Pennsylvania.
One year ago: President Donald Trump declared that his summit with Kim Jong Un had ended any nuclear threat from North Korea, though the meeting had produced no details on how or when weapons might be eliminated or reduced. On the eve of the

start of the World Cup in Russia, FIFA voters chose to award the 2026 World Cup to North America.

NASHVILLE, Tenn. (AP) — Nobody with the Titans will ever wear Eddie George's No. 27 nor the No. 9 of the late Steve McNair again, players who helped the franchise through its difficult relocation from Houston to Tennessee to its lone Super Bowl berth.

Controlling owner Amy Adams Strunk announced Wednesday that the franchise will retire both numbers Sept. 15 at their home opener against the Indianapolis Colts.

"This is a big moment for me personally because I love these guys, and I know my dad loved these guys and he will be so happy and proud that we were honoring them today," Strunk said of her late father, Bud Adams, who founded the franchise in 1960.

The Titans say this will be the first time an NFL team has retired either a No. 9 or 27, giving the league 153 numbers that have been retired. McNair and George will join six other former Titans and Oilers whose numbers have been retired, including Warren Moon, Earl Campbell, Mike Munchak, Bruce Matthews and Elvin Bethea — all members of the Pro Football Hall of Fame.

"I couldn't imagine having a day like this where my jersey (is) retired by myself," George said. "It has to be with Steve. ... It's totally appropriate to have us go in together."

Mechelle McNair, his widow, was not able to attend Wednesday's news conference. Team announcer Mike Keith read a statement she sent.

"Steve would be truly honored to know that he was held in such high esteem by you," Mechelle McNair wrote. "Retiring his jersey is a really

big deal for us. It is a tangible reminder for me and the boys to know that No. 9 will forever be held in the highest regard in the Titans nation."

BASEBALL

KANSAS CITY, Mo. (AP) — Bobby Witt Jr. has spent his much of his short life around the major leagues. For the first time Wednesday, he was the star attraction at the ballpark.

The son of retired pitcher Bobby Witt was introduced as the highest-profile new member of the Royals' farm system. Witt, who turns 19 on Friday, was the second-overall pick in last week's draft.

"It's a blessing for me to be a part of this organization," Witt said. "They really respect their players and their staff. I was really impressed with the respect they had for me."

Witt has been compared favorably to some of the top shortstop prospects in recent history, including Alex Rodriguez. He said he looks forward to trying to live up to that lofty billing.

"That motivated me," Witt said. "You can write all that stuff down on paper, but until I perform the way they did, I'll never be satisfied. I've got to go out there and play my game. Maybe one day I'll be there."

The Royals have not announced where Witt will make his professional debut.

"He's our kind of guy," general manager Dayton Moore said. "(He fits) our city, our fans. I can't say enough about his family and how he was raised. The way Bobby handles questions speaks for itself. The thing I've admired about him for a while is, while he's the guy everyone gravitates to, he treats everybody else like they're the first-rounder. That's a great quality to have."

Witt is the highest selection by the Royals since they took Luke Hochevar with the No. 1 overall pick in 2006. He received the highest signing bonus in club history.

NBA

MEMPHIS, Tenn. (AP) — Taylor Jenkins feels confident that Memphis' new front office will give him enough time to turn around the Grizzlies.

The 34-year-old Jenkins said Wednesday at a news conference that he learned a lot about the Grizzlies during the interview process and the front office's vision.

"We know there's going to be ups and downs," Jenkins said. "We're going to have our successes. We're going to have our mistakes. We want to be perfect, but we know it's going to take a team to do that, and that's what made me excited about this opportunity and there was no concern whatsoever."

It's the first NBA head coaching job for Jenkins, who was Mike Budenholzer's assistant in Milwaukee this season and was with him in Atlanta for five seasons. Jenkins started in the NBA as an intern with the San Antonio front office before going into coaching with the Spurs' G League team, coaching the Toros for one season.

While Memphis did not disclose terms of Jenkins' contract when announcing his hiring, Zachary Z. Kleiman, the Grizzlies' new executive vice president of basketball operations, said the Grizzlies know they won't get where they want overnight. He said the organization wants Jenkins as its partner while rebuilding the franchise.

"The organization has made a significant commitment to Taylor, a

long-term commitment, and we're collectively vested in making sure we get to that sustainable, special place we're building toward over time," Kleiman said.

ESPORTS

Immortals Gaming Company has acquired Infinite Esports in what is believed to be the competitive video gaming industry's first \$100 million deal.

IGC announced the agreement Wednesday, expanding its stable of esports teams by purchasing the parent company for OpTic Gaming. OpTic's franchises include teams in the League of Legends Championship Series (LCS) and Overwatch League.

It's a move back into League of Legends for IGC, which lost its top-level pro club when publisher Riot Games moved to a franchising model in 2018. The LCS team will retain the OpTic name until rebranding to Immortals in 2020.

CEO Ari Segal told The Associated Press it felt like a "welcome homecoming" for IGC to be back in the LCS fold.

"That's how it feels," Segal said. "That's how the community has responded. That's how our management team and our board has responded."

IGC already owns an Overwatch franchise, the Los Angeles Valiant. The company says it will manage OpTic's Houston Outlaws on an interim basis, with oversight from the Overwatch League, while trying to sell the franchise to another party.

IGC will also take over OpTic's Call of Duty World League team, but says it will divest its Counterstrike: Global Offensive team. IGC purchased Brazilian CS:GO club MIBR last year.

LEADING OFF: Lester vs Kershaw, MLB goes to Omaha

ACES UP

Veteran left-handers Jon Lester and Clayton Kershaw square off when the Chicago Cubs visit the Los Angeles Dodgers for the opener of a four-game series. Lester is looking for his third straight victory for Chicago. He allowed four runs in the first Saturday night against St. Louis, but managed to go six innings in a 9-4 win. Kershaw is 0-1 in two June starts for the NL West leaders, but the three-time Cy Young Award winner has allowed just two earned runs in 14 innings this month.

YOU AGAIN

Pirates right-hander Joe Musgrove (4-6, 4.40 ERA) starts for the second time in a four-game series at Atlanta after getting ejected in the first inning Monday following a confrontation with Braves third baseman Josh Donaldson. The fracas began when Musgrove grazed Donaldson's jersey with a pitch. As Donaldson began walking to first base, he exchanged glares with Musgrove and took a few steps toward the mound. Donaldson shoved Elias Díaz when the Pittsburgh catcher intervened, drawing a one-game suspension. Donaldson appealed and can keep playing until

his case is heard. On the mound for Atlanta will be Julio Teheran (4-3, 3.03), who is 2-0 with a 0.70 ERA in his last seven starts. The first-place Braves have won six in a row, while last-place Pittsburgh has dropped six straight.

BACK TO SCHOOL

Two days before the College World Series begins in Omaha, Nebraska, Major League Baseball comes to town for the first time to mark the occasion with a special regular-season game. The Tigers and Royals play at the home of Kansas City's top farm

club, which doubles as the site for the CWS every June. Matthew Boyd (5-4) is scheduled to start for Detroit against Homer Bailey (4-6). Boyd's last appearance at TD Ameritrade Park was in 2013, when he pitched a four-hit shutout to help Oregon State beat Indiana 1-0 in a College World Series elimination game.
