BSISD Art Club host Open Art Studio

Creativity will be flowing during the upcoming Open Art Studio, hosted by the Big Spring High School Art Club set for Saturday, Jan. 25 from 10 a.m. to Noon.

“Kids who sign up will be exposed to several art materials including chalk and oil pastels, acrylic and watercolor paint,” Andrea Phinney, Art Teacher at BSISD, said. “In addition to the different art mediums, students will have an opportunity to try their hand at brace-

let making and weaving and collage.”

The class is open to those between the ages of 7 and 10 years of age, according to Phinney. The money raised from this fundraiser will benefit an upcoming art trip to Oklahoma City in the summer.

“The money raised will benefit the students by exposing them to art in a bigger city. Oklahoma City is a great arts and culture destination that will open their world to new educational and adventurous experiences,” Phinney said.

In addition to planning for the summer trip to Oklahoma, there is an upcoming VASE (Visual Arts Scholastic Event) coming up in February, where the students will have an opportunity to earn awards and earn a trip to state.

The class will be held in the art classroom, at Big Spring High School. The classroom is located in the vocational building and for those who may not know where the room is located there will be signs throughout the building leading the way.

“While this session is only for those 7 to 10 years of age, we are planning more open studio sessions in the coming future,” she said. “The upcoming classes will be for younger kids.”

Texas Master Naturalist Training opportunity

Are you curious about the natural beauty of West Texas? Would you like to learn about the natural vegetation and birds in our area? Then the Llano Estacado Chapter of Texas Master Naturalists (LETMN), based in Midland and which includes Big Spring, is ready to accept a new class trainees this month. Anyone with curiosity about nature can train to be a certified Texas Master Naturalist. The statewide Texas Master Naturalist program has over 11,000 volunteers who enjoy learning and interacting with others who love nature.

According to Susan Mays with the Sibley Nature Center in Midland, the only qualification to be a trainee is the willingness to learn and volunteer.

Mays states, “To achieve certifica-

tion, trainees complete 40 hours of instruction including classroom and field studies on varied topics such as mammals, water resources, reptiles, insects, ecology, geology and habitats. Trainees are required to volunteer 40 hours per year in activities such as butterfly gardening, dove banding, teaching children about dragonflies, or participating on a bird count team. Finally, trainees are required to complete eight hours of advanced training which includes activities like webinars, conferences, or Brown Bag talks at the Sibley Nature Center.”

West Texas has plenty of nature to observe and learn about. According to their Facebook page, the mission of LETMN is “to encourage citizens of the region to explore their natural surroundings, to identify the most common plants and animals in their environment, and to learn the natural

and human history of their region."

The LETMN partners with the Sibley Nature Center and I-20 Wildlife Preserve for volunteer and teaching opportunities. These are two very special natural places in our area.

The registration fee covers the full year of training, LETMN dues, and the Texas Master Naturalists comprehensive textbook. The first class will meet at Sibley Nature Center, located at 1307 E. Wadley Ave., Midland, Texas, on Saturday, Jan. 25, from 9 a.m. to 3 p.m. The group will meet one to two Saturdays a month throughout the Spring and early Sum-

plete training.

May adds, "People tend to think of our area of West Texas as flat and featureless with limited diversity of plants and animals, but it's really surprising how diverse our area really is. 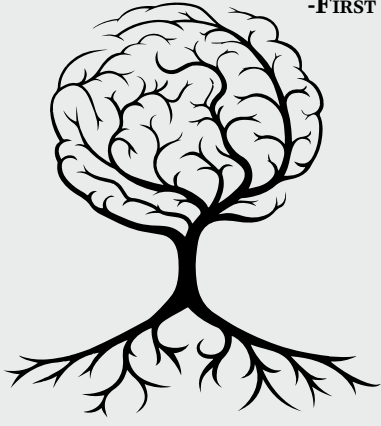

The main grade level focus was on the junior and senior level students who are the forefront of making those all important decisions looming on the horizon about their future career pathways and choices.

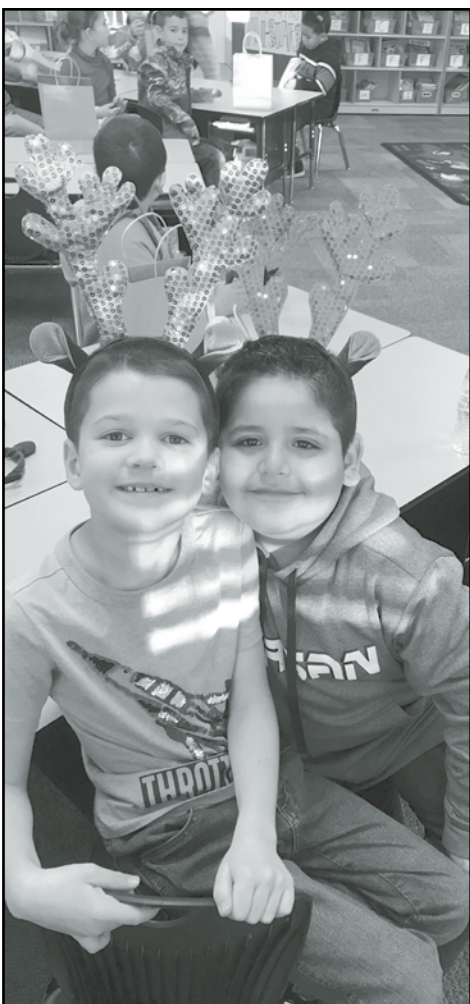

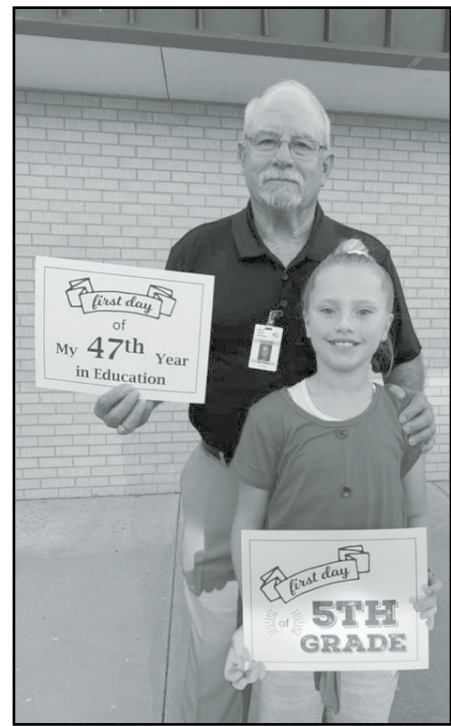

Big Spring turns Titan Blue in support of Steer legend Ryan Tannehill

Following the 2006 season, Big Spring Steers starting quarterback Ryan Tannehill was the 630th-ranked player in his recruiting class. He was moved to wide receiver in his redshirt freshman season at Texas A&M after finishing third in a starting quarterback position battle behind two players who combined to start one game in the National Football League. He was the third quarterback drafted in the first round in the 2012 NFL Draft by the Miami Dolphins and was traded away after seven seasons and over 20,000 passing yards.

What do all of those things have in common? None of them matter to the current Tennessee Titans' starting quarterback, his courteous and humble parents, or the Big Spring community. "I think he knows having these small-town roots is very beneficial where you have the support you have from our community," Tannehill's mother Cheryl said.

Tannehill passed for over 5,000 yards in his senior season at Big Spring High School. The local legend went on to break the Texas A&M school record for passing yards in a game and season. He also finished one touchdown short of a tie for career passing touchdowns in only 20 games as the starter. In a loaded first round that included first overall pick Andrew Luck and Heisman-winner Robert Griffin III, Tannehill is the only starting quarterback remaining of the trio. In an NFL playoffs that featured two other of his draft class, Kirk Cousins and Russell Wilson, the former Steer is the last one standing.

The Tennessee Titans began the 2019 season 2-4 behind the second overall pick and former Heisman Trophy-winner Marcus Mariota. After the less-than-impressive start to the season, Titans' head coach Mike Vrabel knew he needed to make a move to kickstart an offense that was averaging only 16.3 points per game through that six-game stretch.

"Just felt like now was the time," Vrabel said to ESPN following his decision to make Tannehill the starter following his fill-in performance against the Buffalo Bills in Week 6. "Sitting at that game, sitting where I was, made the decision during the game and then just was able to think about it, evaluate it, and move forward and make a decision to try to spark the offense, to try to do something to get us going, to score some points and to help us

win." Tannehill has answered the call. "One thing his dad has always said is 'You may not have that position right now, so you need to work hard so that if you get an opportunity, you can be successful at it,'" Cheryl Tannehill said. "I think that's just his mindset is 'I want to be ready when I get the opportunity.'"

Tim Tannehill, Ryan's father, added, "He takes care of his body, he stays committed to what his goals are and works through those issues. He stays positive and that's worked out for him."

Since taking over the starting job, the Titans have gone 9-3 while averaging 29.3 points per game. Tannehill led the NFL in multiple categories such as passer rating (117.5), yards per attempt (9.6) and yards per completion (13.6) while passing for 22 touchdowns and only six interceptions. Tennessee seems to collectively be playing with more confidence and swagger than they had been with Mario-

ta under center and are participating in their first AFC Championship Game in exactly 17 years.

"Over the past three weeks, name a better team," NFL Network analyst Nate Burleson said following the Titans 28-12 dismantling of the No. 1-seed Baltimore Ravens last Saturday night.

Chances are you cannot. Current Oklahoma State defensive analyst Bill Clay was in charge of recruiting Fort Worth and West Texas during his time as safeties coach at Texas A&M from 2006-07. On one trip to watch the Big Spring Steers play, a certain tall, versatile player and his athletic family stood out to the recruiter with a college coaching resume that goes as far back as the Apollo 11 moon landing.

"When I was out in West Texas looking for prospects, he was one of the first guys I went to," Clay said. "He fit the physical profile that I was looking for and that we were looking for at A&M. He was a big, tall kid that could run. And then when I went to the high school and met his dad and saw his mom, who were both athletic-looking people, I thought I struck gold right then. When I saw both parents and I saw him, looking at him face-to-face, I saw what a great family they are. And what a great kid he was."

Clay's move to take a chance on a small-town quarterback seems to have paid off for everyone involved.

Tannehill has been a "diamond in the rough" and has continued to progress at every level he has played at. He is currently one win away from being just the third different AFC quarterback to start a Super Bowl since 2014 (Tom Brady and Peyton Manning).

"You always want your kid to be successful in whatever endeavor they go into," Tim Tannehill said. "As a high school quarterback, you're just thinking that he may be able to compete at the college level. Just through his size, his abilities, his skills, his mentality, his work ethic. And then that came to fruition in his junior year. And then in through his junior year and senior year there at A&M, he started having some success. He was starting to get some publicity and then he started getting some interest from some of the media. That kind of prompted him to be drafted as high as he was there (8th overall) in the 2012 NFL Draft... We were just hoping that he was successful in whatever he decided to do and everything just came to fruition." See **TANNEHILL**, Page 16

Doncic gets another triple-double as Mavs edge Kings 127-123

SACRAMENTO, Calif. (AP) — On a night when Luka Doncic set a career high for assists, one of his early passes wound up in the stands.

All he could do was watch it and chuckle as he ran back down the court.

"It was a bad pass," Doncic said of his cross-court throw. "I was laughing. He was open. I should have hit him. That was a very bad pass."

Doncic had 25 points, 15 rebounds and 17 assists for his NBA-leading 12th triple-double, and the Mavericks held off a late run to beat the Sacramento Kings 127-123 on Wednesday.

Seth Curry scored 21 points off the bench as Dallas won its third straight despite the absence of Kristaps Porzingis, who missed his ninth consecutive game. Dwight Powell added 17 points and nine rebounds, and Tim Hardaway Jr. scored 18.

"This has been a hard day for us to play, difficult matchups," Dallas coach Rick Carlisle said. "Our starters, our bench, everybody contributed in a big way."

Playing the second half of a back-to-back following a 27-point win over Golden State, the Mavericks scored 71 points in the first half and handed the Kings their third straight loss.

Doncic sparked Dallas with a big third quarter when he had 11 points and six rebounds. He also made a cross-court pass similar to the one he airmailed earlier in the game.

That helped the Mavs stretch a four-point lead to 108-93. Doncic finished with his 20th career triple-double despite going 0 for 5 from beyond the arc.

"Obviously, not as good as I can play. I have to practice those 3s," Doncic said. "They were doubling me every time, and I like it. Basketball is five players so somebody's going to be open if they double me."

Doncic joined Jason Kidd as the only Dallas players to have at least 25 points, 15 rebounds and 15 assists in one game.

"These numbers are just crazy," Carlisle said as he looked at the stat sheet. "It's hard to fathom. They're trapping him all over the court every time

down. He's both beating the traps and playing beautifully out of the traps."

De'Aaron Fox had 27 points and 12 assists for Sacramento. Harrison Barnes and Buddy Hield scored 25 apiece.

Sacramento beat Dallas 110-106 in December without Fox or Marvin Bagley III. Both were in the lineup this time, but the outcome was vastly different.

"We got stops but we let them come up with the 50-50 ball," Kings coach Luke Walton said. "It should be pretty clear until we can get out there and play that hard, at that pace and still keep a defensive mindset, there's going to be a lot of ups and downs."

The Kings trailed by 16 early in the fourth but made a big run to get to 126-123 following a 3-pointer by Barnes. Curry, who moments earlier missed one of two free throws, made one of two again. Fox then missed a 3 to end the game.

Doncic nearly had a double-double before halftime but it was Curry who gave Dallas its biggest lift in the first half. Curry made four 3s, three on wide-open looks, and scored 16 points in 14 minutes to help the Mavs to a 71-67 lead.

PORZINGIS PROGRESSING

Porzingis didn't sound too frustrated after being a late scratch from the lineup. He felt some pain in his right knee during pregame warmups. "I worked out yesterday, not a full workout but a solid workout, 35-45 minutes. Felt good," Porzingis said. "Then today I kind of felt it a little bit more. Started warming up, started doing some stuff and felt it more and more. They made the decision for me to take some more time."

The Mavericks have a day off

before playing Portland, and Carlisle said the team will assess Porzingis' situation then.

TIP-INS

Mavericks: Former Kings player Justin Jackson made a buzzer-beating 3 to end the third quarter. ... Over his last three games, Powell is shooting 83.3% (25 of 30).

Kings: Fox was whistled for a technical after being hit with an offensive foul in the third quarter. ... Bagley started at center for the first time this season. Part of that is a result of Richaun Holmes being out with a right shoulder injury. Holmes missed his fourth straight game and will be re-evaluated in two to three weeks. Bagley had 12 points and seven rebounds. ... Bogdan Bogdanovic (right ankle soreness) did not play.

Contract Bridge

With a little bit of luck

The bidding:
South West North East
1 NT Pass 3 NT
Opening lead — three of diamonds.

There are times when declarer cannot afford to develop all his potential tricks, the usual reason being that by the time the winners are established, the defenders will already have collected enough tricks to defeat him. In these cases, declarer may have to search for a quicker way to gain the additional trick (or tricks) he needs.

For example, take this deal where declarer starts with six top tricks — three spades, two diamonds and a club — and so needs three more to make three notrump. He wins the

opening diamond lead with the king and tries the club finesse, hoping West has the king.

But East takes the club ten with the king and returns a diamond to the ace. South wins and, with only eight tricks in view, must try to find another one.

If South had all the time he needed, he could drive out the A-K of hearts and score his ninth trick in that suit. But that obviously won't work on this occasion, since the opponents will collect two diamond tricks to add to the A-K of hearts and club king for down one.

There is only one genuine chance for nine tricks, and that lies in the hope that West was dealt the jack of spades. If so, dummy's ten can be converted into a trick by taking a finesse against the jack.

So at trick four, declarer leads the spade four and, when West follows low, plays dummy's ten. After it wins, South cashes three more spades and three clubs to make the contract.

It is true that the unusual first-round spade finesse might lose to East, in which case South would go down an extra trick.

But considering that declarer is investing only 50 points while trying to gain 400 (roughly the value of a nonvulnerable game at rubber bridge), this minuscule loss is clearly worth the risk.

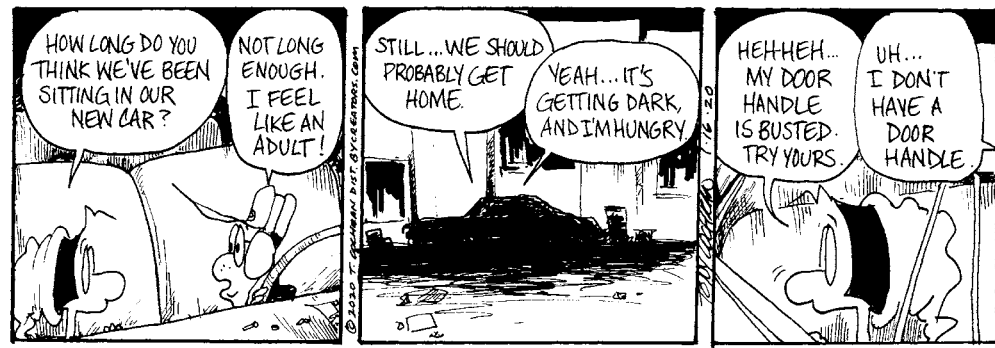

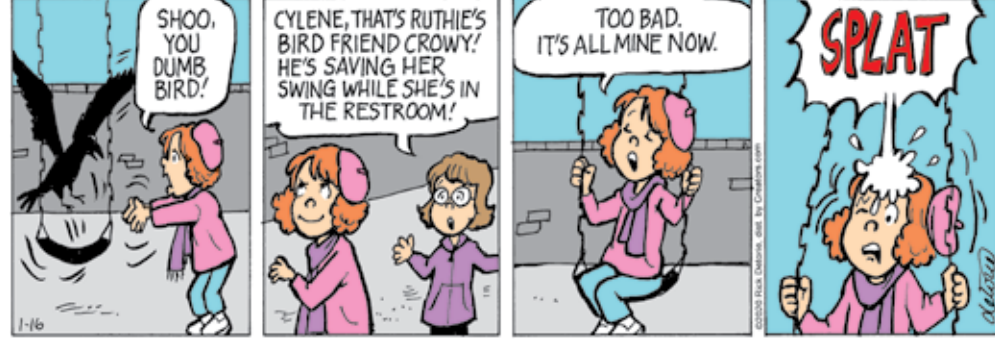

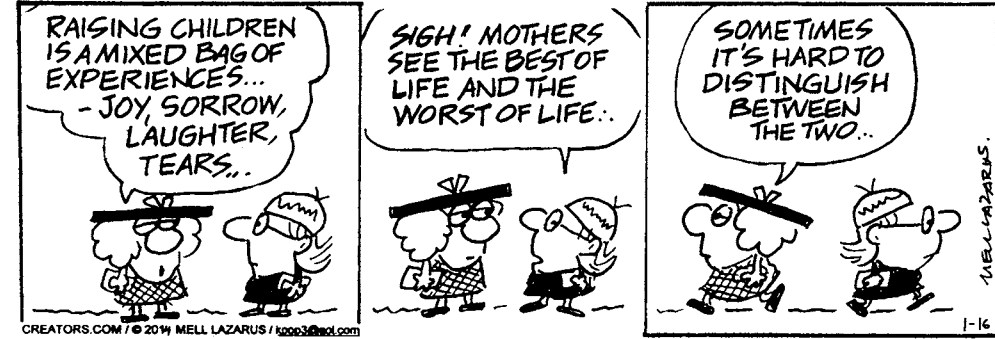

This Date In History

Today in History

Today is Thursday, Jan. 16, the 16th day of 2020. There are 350 days left in the year.

Today's Highlight in History: On Jan. 16, 1991, the White House announced the start of Operation Desert Storm to drive Iraqi forces out of Kuwait. (Allied forces prevailed on Feb. 28, 1991.)

On this date: In 1547, Ivan IV of Russia (popularly known as "Ivan the Terrible") was crowned Czar. In 1865, Union Maj. Gen. William T. Sherman decreed that 400,000 acres of land in the South would be divided into 40-acre lots and given to former slaves. (The order, later revoked by President Andrew Johnson, is believed to have inspired the expression, "Forty acres and a mule.") In 1912, a day before reaching the South Pole, British explorer Robert Scott and his expedition found evidence that Roald Amundsen of Norway and his team had gotten there ahead of them. In 1920, Prohibition began in the United States as the 18th Amendment to the U.S. Constitution took effect, one year to the day after its ratification. (It was later repealed by the 21st Amendment.) In 1969, two manned Soviet Soyuz spacecrafts became the first vehicles to dock in space and transfer personnel. In 1978, NASA named 35 candidates to fly on the space shuttle, including Sally K. Ride, who became America's first woman in space, and Guion S. Bluford Jr., who became America's first black astronaut in space. In 1987, Hu Yaobang resigned as head of China's Communist Party, declaring he'd made mistakes in dealing with student turmoil and intellectual challenges to the system. In 1989, three days of rioting began in Miami when a police officer fatally shot Clement Lloyd, a black motorcyclist, causing a crash that also claimed the life of Lloyd's passenger, Allan Blanchard. (The officer, William Lozano, was convicted of manslaughter, but then was acquitted in a retrial.) In 1992, officials of the government of El Salvador and rebel leaders signed a pact in Mexico City ending 12 years of civil war that had left at least 75,000 people dead. In 2003, the space shuttle Columbia blasted off for what

turned out to be its last flight; on board was Israel's first astronaut, Ilan Ramon (ee-LAHN' rah-MOHN'). (The mission ended in tragedy on Feb. 1, when the shuttle broke up during its return descent, killing all seven crew members.) In 2004, pop star Michael Jackson pleaded not guilty to child molestation charges during a court appearance in Santa Maria, Calif.; the judge scolded Jackson for being 21 minutes late. (Jackson was eventually acquitted.) In 2007, Sen. Barack Obama, D-Ill., launched his successful bid for the White House. Ten years ago: As precious water and food began reaching parched and hungry earthquake survivors on the streets of Haiti's ruined capital Port-au-Prince, U.S. Secretary of State Hillary Rodham Clinton met with Haitian President Rene Preval (reh-NAY' preh-VAHL) and promised that U.S. quake relief efforts would be closely coordinated with local officials. Glen W. Bell Jr., 86, founder of the Taco Bell chain, died in Rancho Santa Fe, California. Five years ago: Anti-terrorism raids across Europe netted dozens of suspects as authorities rushed to thwart more attacks by people with links to Mideast Islamic extremists. The NCAA agreed to restore 112 football wins it had stripped from Penn State and Joe Paterno in the Jerry Sandusky child-molestation scandal and to reinstate the venerated late coach as the winningest in major college football history. One year ago: As she battled to keep Brexit on track, British Prime Minister Theresa May survived a no-confidence vote in Parliament. House Speaker Nancy Pelosi asked President Donald Trump to postpone his scheduled Jan. 29 State of the Union speech, citing concerns about whether the partially-shuttered government could provide adequate security; Republicans said the move was a ploy to deny Trump the stage. (Trump delivered the speech a week later than scheduled.) A suicide bombing claimed by Islamic State militants killed at least 16 people in northern

Syria, including two U.S. service members and two American civilians.

In the Tennessee Titans' only Super Bowl appearance, they fell one-yard short to the "Greatest Show on Turf" St. Louis Rams. Those Rams were led by a first-year starting quarterback and future Hall of Famer in Kurt Warner who was fresh off being named NFL MVP. Warner was known for his rocket arm, ability to improvise, and his great weapons at wide receiver. The Titans were led by a strong rushing attack with Eddie George, young wide receivers, and a quarterback in Steve McNair who was known for getting the job done.

Super Bowl XXXIV and this weekend's AFC Championship Game have eerily similar offensive styles.

Patrick Mahomes is an MVP-winning quarterback in his second full season as a starter. The Texas Tech alum has an arsenal of game-breaking wide receivers who can take the top off of the defense on

any given play.

This season, Tannehill has become a play-action specialist with extreme accuracy and poise in the pocket. His receiving corps is filled with young receivers, led by rookie A.J. Brown, who are precise route runners with reliable hands. Derrick Henry has been a tremendous workhorse for their offense and their scheme that they're in, and Ryan is a part of that scheme. Whatever plays he can make, and benefit their team, then that's what he's going to do."

When the game kicks off on Sunday afternoon in Kansas City, the entire community of Big Spring will be behind their former Steer star quarterback.

In the midst of a storybook season, Tannehill and the Titans will need to put together one more impressive all-around team performance to take their place in Super Bowl LIII.

With Tannehill leading the charge this time around, do not expect the Titans to fall one-yard short.
