Driver License Offices to reopen by appointment only, limited services, additional safety measures

AUSTIN – On Tuesday, May 26, at the direction of Governor Greg Abbott, the Texas Department of Public Safety (DPS) will begin reopening driver license (DL) offices by appointment only and with limited services. The reopening of DL offices will happen in a phased approach, in order to allow DPS to keep customers and our staff as safe as possible, while also adhering to new safety guidelines and social distancing practices in place due to COVID-19. Appointment availability will be rolled out in phases, with the first phase of appointments becoming available on Friday, May 22, at 1 p.m.

Services available by appointment only

A new appointment solution, which has been in the works for several months, will take effect in DL offices as they reopen. The appointment solution allows customers to book appointments for a specific day and time up to six months in advance. DPS is moving to appointments only as part of our efforts to provide additional convenience and reduce the time Texans spend waiting in line at DL offices.

Within the new online appointment system, customers can walk through the available appointment options, schedule appointments on a specific date and time, receive appointment confirmations, set up a reminder, and reschedule or cancel an existing appointment. Once customers schedule their appointment, they'll receive a confirmation email to bring with them to their appointment. Upon arrival at the DL office, customers can check-in with their smart device or by using the kiosk inside the office. Due to social distancing requirements related to COVID-19, we are asking that customers wait in their car after checking in. Customers will receive a text message when it's time to come inside to complete their transaction.

be limited to customers with appointments only who are seeking a first-time Texas DL, commercial driver license (CDL), learner license or identification (ID) card, as well as those who need to take a driving test. These will be the ONLY services available at DL offices during these initial phases of reopening.

Phase 1: Offices in DPS' Northwest and West Texas regions will reopen with limited services beginning May 26, 2020. Customers can begin scheduling appointments in these two regions on May 22 at 1 p.m.

Phase 2: Offices in DPS' South and Central Texas regions will reopen with limited services beginning May 29, 2020. Customers can begin scheduling appointments in these two regions on May 26 at 1 p.m.

Phase 3: Offices in DPS' North and Southeast Texas regions will reopen with limited services beginning June 3, 2020. Customers can begin scheduling appointments in these two regions on May 29 at 1 p.m.

Phase 4 will allow customers to schedule an appointment for all DL office transactions anywhere in the state and is expected to begin midsummer. DPS will announce details on this phase at a later date. become As appointments available throughout the phased reopening plan, customers will be able to book appointments through DPS' website at www. dps.texas.gov/DriverLicense/.

test will be required to wear face masks or facial coverings.

Every person (staff members and customers) will be screened for symptoms prior to coming into a DL office; this includes having their temperature checked.

Customers may be asked to reschedule their appointment if they do not pass the safety screening.

Only actual customers will be allowed into DL offices. This will help limit capacity and ensure everyone can maintain a safe social distance. Exceptions include: persons needing ADA accommodations; elderly persons; parents with small children; and parents and legal guardians needed to complete a transaction.

DPS staff will sanitize workstations and equipment between each customer transaction.

Eye examinations will no longer require physical contact with an eye testing machine.

Customers must pay with a credit card, check or money order. NO CASH PAYMENTS.

Extension remains in place for expired cards

As a reminder, the extension of the expiration of Texas DL/ CDL/ID/Election Identification Certificate (EIC) cards remains in effect. This means that all DL/CDL/ID/EIC Texas cards that expired on or after March 13, 2020, fall under the period that encompasses the State of Disaster Declaration related to COVID-19 and will remain valid for 60 days after which time DPS issues public notice that the extension period has been lifted and all normal operations have resumed. As of this release, that 60-day period has not begun. Due to the extension still being active, appointments for renewals will not be available until



Remembrance.

"West Texas VA Health Care System has events planned for our Community Living Center and Domiciliary Veterans and will pause at 3 p.m. for the National Moment of Remembrance," Cave said. "We ask that our community pause with us in spirit and thank them for their support for our Veterans. As soon as conditions allow, and we can safely do so, we certainly will welcome our community partners to join us in person as we continue to serve our West Texas Veterans."

The VA will now turn its attention towards Veterans' Day in November.

Area cemeteries, while not hosting specific events, will be open according to Mayor Shannon Thomason. Both Mt. Olive and Trinity Memorial will be accessible to the public.

Currently, 20 people at one time may gather at a cemetery in Texas, as long as they remain six feet apart, do not hug or shake hands. Masks continue to be encouraged both inside and outside in any group setting.

"The Governor's order allows for cemeteries to be open, as long as visitors continue to practice social distancing guidelines," Thomason said. "Therefore, I encourage people to get out and honor those who made the ultimate sacrifice for our Country."

City and County offices, as well as the Big Spring Herald office are closed in observance of Memorial Day. Business will re-open on Tuesday.

speaking of loving and needing and working and dying and walking the dogs. This village belongs to the people who live in it, to the land and to the land's past. It also belongs to Dead Papa Toothwort, a mythical figure local schoolchildren used to draw as green and leafy, choked by tendrils growing out of his mouth, who awakens after a glorious nap. He is listening to this twentyfirst-century village, to its symphony of talk: drunken confessions, gossip traded on the street corner, fretful conversations in living rooms. He is also listening, intently, for a mischievous, ethereal boy whose parents have recently made the village their home, Lanny. Lany, will draw in readers with its anarchic energy, its bewitching tapestry of fabulism and domestic drama.

At the height of the Cold War, two secretaries are pulled out of the typing pool at the CIA and were given the assignment of a lifetime in "The Secrets We Kept" (FPRE L) By Lara Prescott. Their mission: to smuggle Doctor Zhivago out of the USSR, where no one dare publish it, and help Pasternak's magnum opus make its way into print around the world. Glamorous and sophisticated Sally Forrester is a seasoned spy who has honed her gift for deceit all over the world, using her magnetism and charm to pry secrets out of powerful men. Irina is a complete novice, and under Sally's tutelage quickly learns how to blend in, make drops, and invisibly ferry classified documents. The Secrets We Kept combines a legendary literary love story--the decades-long affair between Pasternak and his mistress and muse, Olga Ivinskaya, who was sent to the Gulag and inspired Zhivago's heroine, Lara--with a narrative about two women empowered to lead lives of extraordinary intrigue and risk.

Kin Stewart is an everyday family man: working in IT, trying to keep the spark in his marriage, struggling to connect with his teenage daughter, Miranda in "Here And Now And Then" (SF CHE M) By Mike Chen. But his current life is a far cry from his previous career as a timetraveling secret

agent from 2142. Stranded in suburban San Francisco since the 1990s after I a botched mis- I sion, Kin has I kept his past hidden from everyone around him, the increasing blackouts and memory loss affecting his time-traveler's brain. Until one afternoon, his "rescue" team arrives, eighteen years too late. Their mission: return Kin to 2142, where he's only been gone weeks, not years, and where another family is waiting for him. A family Kin can't remember. Torn between two lives, Kin is desperate for a way to stay connected to both. But when his best efforts threaten to destroy the agency and even history itself, his daughter's very existence is at risk. It'll take one final trip across time to save Miranda, even if it means breaking all the rules of time travel in the process.

Forsan Basketball beginning "30 Days of Toughness" to combat no team workouts

A few days ago, the Forsan basketball Twitter account - @BuffaloBallers - tweeted out something new. With the coronavirus still keeping a stranglehold on the world of sports, as it has done for the past two-and-a-half months, high school coaches have had to get creative with workout ideas and how to stay engaged with their players.

It has recently been reported that Big Spring's Eric Tuttle uses his social media platform to spread positivity to people throughout the city through videos and pictures. Steers Head Football Coach Cannon McWilliams uses his Twitter account to post daily workouts every morning for his student-athletes to do so that they can stay in shape and will not be too out of sorts when the team gets back together next month.

Forsan coach Cory Richardson had a different idea. After participating in the annual Texas As-

sociation of Basketball Coaches (TABC) coaching clinic last week, Richardson came up with an idea to keep his players sharp and active during this time they cannot be on the hardwood.

That idea was called "30 Days of Toughness" and was accompanied with the message that "toughness is a skill that you can practice and improve on." Richardson has now posted the first two days tasks and, while they may seem menial, they both contribute strongly to a student-athlete's toughness and are well-thought out by Richardson.

"I made a list of a few things that we needed to instill in our program and goals for next year," Richardson said. "I was thinking of things we could do with the kids not here. You can do a lot of things in practice to build toughness but when you're sitting at home, it becomes more mental and an accountability type of thing. I'm just taking things I've learned and factor that into what we're doing right now without being able to meet with the players."



Day One's task was to make your bed every day. Even though it seems like a task that does not take much effort or time, a recent study by the National Sleep Foundation found that only 7-of-10 Americans regularly make their bed everyday.

"If you can't do the little things right, you'll never be able to do the big things right. And if by chance you have a miserable day, you will come home to a bed that is made, that you made. And a made bed gives you encouragement that tomorrow will be better," former U.S. Navy Admiral William H. McRaven once said.

To follow-up on the first day's challenge, Richardson picked "embrace the suck" as the challenge for Day Two.

"Find something you don't love doing, that's good for you or your family and choose to do it. Mine will be clean the bathroom - what's yours?" Richardson asked his players.

Richardson also announced that each day you must complete that day's task along with all of the previous days tasks. The team and Richardson are working by an honor system and he is encouraging his players to share pictures of their completed tasks with teammates.

There will be 28 more tasks to come for the Buffalo Ballers and Richardson will be expecting each and every one of his players to participate. If the players are able to improve their day-to-day habits while stuck at home with no opportunity to practice, the thought is that when they get back on the court each student-athlete will be a new-and-improved version of themselves.

"Toughness is following through and being accountable," Richardson said. The Forsan players are ready to show just how tough they are.

No fans will be allowed, and Arum said fighters and everyone else will be tested at least twice during fight week for the new coronavirus. The fights are pending approval of the Nevada Athletic Commission, which meets next week to consider the events, along with two cards that the UFC plans to stage at its facility in Las Vegas. They are also pending the reopening of the MGM and other Las Vegas hotels, something that is widely expected to happen the first week of June, though no dates





East took the ace, cashed the ace of spades (on which West played low) and returned the jack of diamonds.

South, Sam Lev, took the jack with the king and led a low trump to the king, on which West produced the ten. Had declarer next continued with the ace, he would have gone down. But Lev felt there was a strong possibility that East had started with the Q-J-x-x of trump.

Accordingly, he embarked on a line of play designed to limit East to one trump winner instead of two. At trick five, he cashed the queen of diamonds, then continued with the king of spades and ruffed a spade in dummy. Next came the Q-K-A of clubs, reducing dummy to the A-9 of hearts and seven of clubs. East to the Q-J-5 of hearts and South to the 8-7-6 of hearts.

Gauging the situation perfectly, Lev now led the seven of clubs from dummy, whereupon poor East saw one of his two "certain" trump tricks go up in smoke. It didn't matter whether East ruffed high or low; either way, South was sure to win two of the last three tricks.

The Swedish North-South pair at the other table also got to four hearts, but went down when declarer, playing for a normal 3-2 trump division, led a diamond against four hearts. lost two heart tricks instead of one.





Today is Monday, May 25, the 146th day of 2020. There are 220 days left in the year. This is Memorial Day.

Today's Highlight in History: On May 25, 1961, President John F. Kennedy told Congress: "I believe that this nation should commit itself to achieving the goal, before this decade is out, of landing a man on the moon and returning him safely to the earth." On this date:

and fraud for the company's downfall. (Lay died in July 2006 from heart disease and his convictions were vacated; Skilling was resentenced to 14 years in prison after his original 24-year sentence was overturned.)

In 2008, NASA's Phoenix Mars Lander arrived on the Red Planet to begin searching for evidence of water; the spacecraft confirmed the presence of water ice at its landing site. In 2018, Harvey Weinstein was charged in New York with rape and another sex felony in the first prosecution to result from the wave of allegations against him; the once-powerful movie producer turned himself in to the charges and was re leased on \$1 million bail after a court appearance. (Weinstein was convicted of rape and sexual assault; he is serving a 23-year prison sentence.) Ten years ago: President Barack Obama ordered 1,200 National Guard troops to boost security along the U.S.-Mexico border. NFL owners voted to hold the 2014 Super Bowl at Meadowlands Stadium in East Rutherford, New Jersey. Nicole Scherzinger of The Pussycat Dolls and her professional dance partner, Derek Hough, won the 10th season of ABC's "Dancing with the Stars." Five years ago: On Memorial Day, President Barack Obama saluted Americans who had died in battle, telling listeners at Arlington National Cemetery the country must "never stop trying to fully repay them" for their sacrifices. Former Israeli Prime Minister Ehud Olmert was sentenced to eight months in prison for unlawfully accepting money from a U.S. supporter. One year ago: President Donald Trump opened a state visit to Japan by needling the American ally over its trade imbalance with the United States. The Toronto Raptors reached the NBA finals for the first time in the team's history after beating the Milwaukee Bucks 100-94 in Game 6 of the Eastern Conference finals. The raucous social satire "Parasite," a South Korean film about a poor family of hustlers who find jobs with a wealthy family, won the top award at the Cannes Film Festival. Danish-born socialite Claus von

Bulow, who was convicted but later acquitted of trying to kill his wealthy wife in two closely-watched trials, died in London; he was 92.

PLANTING TIME by Brad Wilber

In 1787, the Constitutional Convention began at the Pennsylvania State House (Independence Hall) in Philadelphia after enough delegates had shown up for a quorum.

In 1810, Argentina began its revolt against Spanish rule with the forming of the Primera Junta in Buenos Aires.

In 1935, Babe Ruth hit his last three career home runs -Nos. 712, 713 and 714 - for the Boston Braves in a game against the Pittsburgh Pirates. (The Pirates won, 11-7.)

In 1946, Transjordan (now Jordan) became a kingdom as it proclaimed its new monarch, Abdullah I.

In 1959, the U.S. Supreme Court, in State Athletic Commission v. Dorsey, struck down a Louisiana law prohibiting interracial boxing matches. (The case had been brought by Joseph Dorsey Jr., a black professional boxer.)

In 1964, the U.S. Supreme Court, in Griffin v. County School Board of Prince Edward County, ordered the Virginia county to reopen its public schools, which officials had closed in an attempt to circumvent the Supreme Court's 1954 Brown v. Board of Education of Topeka desegregation ruling.

In 1965, Muhammad Ali knocked out Sonny Liston in the first round of their world heavyweight title rematch in Lewiston, Maine. (Ali's victory generated controversy over whether he'd truly connected when he sent Liston crashing to the canvas with a right to the head, or whether it was a "phantom punch," implying that the fight had been fixed.) In 1992, Jay Leno made his debut as host of NBC's "Tonight succeeding Johnny Show," Carson.

In 2005, Texas Supreme Court Iustice Priscilla Owen won Senate confirmation as a federal appeals judge after a ferocious four-year battle.

In 2006, former Enron Corp. chiefs Kenneth Lay and Jeffrey Skilling were convicted in Houston of conspiracy
