

contact," Jones said. "We have also asked parents to not enter the field, even after the games have concluded. This helps provide an added layer of distancing for the youth."

In addition to flag football, volleyball sign ups have been taking place over the past few weeks. Registration closed on Oct. 4 and and games are set to begin Oct. 24. Of course, in addition to volleyball season kicking off, registration for basketball will take place through Dec. 4, allowing parents a substantial amount of time to register. The basketball season will start in January.

"We want to make sure that parents have enough time to get their kids signed up and the extended registration period allows for a few more pay periods in and let's parents sign up when its more convenient for them," he said. "We want to make sure the youth that wants to play is able to play, so even those who are needing some financial support can reach out and ask about our scholarships."

In addition to social distancing practices, the YMCA has added extra cleanings throughout the building to limit the spread of coronavirus and other viruses. A new electrostatic spray is being utilized for an added coat of protection on high traffic surfaces. According to Jones, the spray helps sanitize surfaces for up to 60 days, and is being reapplied about every 30 days. The spray is in addition to ramped up cleaning that has been implemented. The additional cleaning practices are being paired with some alterations for volleyball and basketball seasons.

"During our sporting events we are asking that parents bring their own seating. We will not be bringing out bleachers due to the current pandemic. We will be cleaning in between games and we are requiring masks be worn while in the gym," he said.

The YMCA of Big Spring is taking measures to ensure the youth in the community are able to participate in annual sport seasons, for as long as possible. In addition to sports, swim classes are also being offered on a private basis. Those wanting to sign up for swim lessons can do so by contacting Amy Ogle, the aquatic director.

"At the beginning of the pandemic we were part of those who had to close our doors to help slow the spread, but we have since opened our doors and are back to normal schedules for the most part," Jones said. "We are back up to 75% capacity per the Governor's orders and we are offering all of our classes. We want the community to know we are still here and the entire staff is working every day to keep the facility clean and safe for all of our members and visitors."

In an effort to keep the community informed about different classes offered at the YMCA, Expo Nights will soon be ramping up. According to Jones, each Expo Night will highlight a different class to provide an opportunity for those thinking about taking the class to try it out. During the Expo Nights, childcare will be provided, which will allow for the new curriculum to be demonstrated as well.

"We offer a wide range of fitness classes for all ages and we want to make sure the community knows about all the options," he said. "Over the past year we have made several additions and advancements to what we offer and these Expo Nights will be an opportunity for those who haven't had the opportunity to check out our classes or our building to do so."

Called 'unashamedly pro-life,' Barrett faces senators anew

WASHINGTON (AP) — Supreme Court nominee Amy Coney Barrett reurned to Capitol Hill for a third day of confirmation hearings Wednesday, called "unashamedly pro-life" by her Republican Senate champion with Democrats running out of time to stop her quick confirmation.

Senators are trying to dig deeper into the conservative judge's outlook on abortion, health care and a potentially disputed presidential election, but Barrett has been batting away questions in long and lively exchanges, insisting she would bring no personal agenda to the court but decide cases "as they come."

Her nomination by President Donald Trump to replace the late Justice Ruth Bader Ginsburg has ground other legislative business to a halt as Republicans excited by the prospect of locking in a 6-3 conservative court majority race to confirm her over Democratic objections before Election Day.

"She's going to the court," Sen. Lindsey Graham, R-S.C., the committee chairman, said as the proceedings got under way Wednesday after a nearly 12-hour session the day before.

Graham said Trump had made history by nominating someone "who is unashamedly pro-life." But Graham said, as Barrett has, that she'd be able to set her personal views aside when deciding cases on abortion. Democrats worry that Barrett will vote to undermine abortion rights.

Barrett's nomination has been the focus at a Capitol mostly shut down by COVID-19 protocols, frustrating Democrats who are virtually powerless to stop a judge from confirmation. They warn she will be seated on the court in time to cast a vote to undo the Affordable Care Act next month, causing millions of Americans to lose coverage during a pandemic.

"People are fed up," said Sen. Dick Durbin, D-Ill., criticizing GOP priorities in forcing the Senate action as the country suffers from the pandemic and Congress squabbles over approving additional economic aid.

The 48-year-old appellate court judge declared her conservative views in often colloquial language, but she refused many specifics Tuesday. She aligns with the late Justice Antonin Scalia, a conservative mentor, and declined to say whether she would recuse herself from any election-related cases involving Trump and Democratic nominee Joe Biden.

"Judges can't just wake up one day and say I have an agenda — I like guns, I hate guns, I like abortion, I hate abortion — and walk in like a royal queen and impose their will on the world," Barrett told the committee during its second day of hearings.

"It's not the law of Amy," she said. "It's the law of the American people."

Trump seemed pleased with her performance. "I think Amy's doing incredibly well," he said at the White House departing for a campaign rally.

Trump has said he wants a justice seated for any disputes arising from his heated campaign against Biden, but Barrett testified she has not spoken to Trump or his team about election cases. Pressed by Democrats, she skipped past questions about ensuring the date of the election or preventing voter intimidation, both set in federal law, and the peaceful transfer of presidential power. She declined to commit to recusing herself from any post-election cas es without first consulting the other justices.

"I can't offer an opinion on recusal without short-circuiting that entire pro cess," she said.

A frustrated Sen. Dianne Feinstein, the top Democrat on the panel, implored the nominee to be more specific about how she would handle landmark abortion cases, including Roe v. Wade and the follow-up Pennsylvania case Planned Parenthood v. Casey, which confirmed it in large part.

"It's distressing not to get a good answer," the U.S. senator from California told the judge.

Barrett was unmoved. "I don't have an agenda to try to overrule Casey," she said. "I have an agenda to stick to the rule of law and decide cases as they come.'

She later declined to characterize the Roe v. Wade decision that legalized abortion as a "super-precedent" that must not be overturned.

Democrats had no such reticence.

"Let's not make any mistake about it," said California Sen. Kamala Harris the Democratic vice presidential nominee, appearing remotely due to COVID concerns.

Allowing Trump to fill the seat with Barrett "poses a threat to safe and lega abortion in our country," Harris said.

The Senate, led by Trump's Republican allies, is pushing Barrett's nomina tion to a quick vote before Nov. 3, and ahead of the latest challenge to the Af fordable Care Act, which the Supreme Court is to hear a week after the elec tion. Democrats warn that she would be a vote to undo the "Obamacare" law.

"I'm not hostile to the ACA," Barrett told the senators.

The judge, accompanied by her family, described herself as taking a con servative, originalist approach to the Constitution. A former law professor she told the senators that while she admires Scalia, she would bring her own approach.

"You would not be getting Justice Scalia, you would be getting Justice Bar rett," she declared.

Overall, Barrett's conservative views are at odds with the late Ginsburg, liberal icon. She would be Trump's third justice.

Underscoring the Republicans' confidence, Graham set an initial committee vote on the nomination for Thursday, the last day of hearings, which would allow final approval by the full Senate by the end of the month.

Protesters rallied outside the Senate building, unable to come inside the hearing room.

Supreme Court halts census in latest twist of 2020 count

The Supreme Court on Tuesday ruled that the Trump administration can end census field operations early, in a blow to efforts to make sure minorities and hard-to-enumerate communities are properly counted in the crucial once-a-decade tally.

The decision was not a total loss for plaintiffs in a lawsuit challenging the administration's decision to end the count early. They managed to get nearly two extra weeks of counting people as the case made its way through the courts.

However, the ruling increased the chances of the Trump administration retaining control of the process that decides how many congressional seats each state gets — and by extension how much voting power each state has.

The Supreme Court justices' ruling came as the nation's largest association of statisticians, and even the U.S. Census Bureau's own census takers and partners, have been raising questions about the quality of the data being gathered — numbers that are used to determine how much federal funding and how many congressional seats are allotted to states. After the Supreme Court's decision, the Census Bureau said field operations would end on Thursday. At issue was a request by the Trump administration that the Supreme Court suspend a lower court's order extending the 2020 census through the end of October following delays caused by the pandemic. The Trump administration argued that the head count needed to end immediately to give the bureau time to meet a year-end deadline. Congress requires the bureau to turn in by Dec. 31 the figures used to decide the states' congressional seats - a process known as apportionment.

numbers used for apportionment.

Opponents of the order said it followed the strategy of the late Republican redistricting guru, Thomas Hofeller, who had advocated using votingage citizens instead of the total population when it came to drawing legislative seats since that would favor Republicans and non-Hispanic whites.

Last month, U.S. District Judge Lucy Koh in San Jose, California sided with the plaintiffs and issued an injunction suspending a Sept. 30 deadline for finishing the 2020 census and a Dec. 31 deadline for submitting the apportionment numbers. That caused the deadlines to revert back to a previous Census Bureau plan that had field operations ending Oct. 31 and the reporting of apportionment figures at the end of April 2021.

When the Census Bureau, and the Commerce Department, which oversees the statistical agency, picked an Oct. 5 end date, Koh struck that down too, accusing officials of "lurching from one hasty, unexplained plan to the next ... and undermining the credibility of the Census Bureau and the 2020 Census."

An appellate court panel upheld Koh's order allowing the census to continue through October but struck down the part that suspended the Dec. 31 deadline for turning in apportionment numbers. The panel of three appellate judges said that just because the year-end deadline is impossible to meet doesn't mean the court should require the Census Bureau to miss it. The plaintiffs said the ruling against them was not a total loss, as millions more people were counted during the extra two weeks. "Every day has mattered, and the Supreme Court's order staying the preliminary injunction does not erase the tremendous progress that has been made as a result of the district court's rulings," said Melissa Sherry, one of the attorneys for the coalition.

Besides deciding how many congressional seats each state gets, the census helps determine how \$1.5 trillion in federal funding is distributed each vear.

San Jose Mayor Sam Liccardo said that his city lost \$200 million in federal funding over the decade following the 2010 census, and he feared it would lose more this time around. The California city was one of the plaintiffs in the lawsuit.

"A census count delayed is justice denied," Licca rdo said.

With plans for the count hampered by the pan demic, the Census Bureau in April had proposed extending the deadline for finishing the count from the end of July to the end of October, and pushing the apportionment deadline from Dec. 31 to next April. The proposal to extend the apportionment deadline passed the Democratic-controlled House. but the Republican-controlled Senate didn't take up the request. Then, in late July and early August, bureau officials shortened the count schedule by a month so that it would finish at the end of September.

The Senate Republicans' inaction coincided with Trump's order directing the Census Bureau to have

By sticking to the deadline, the Trump administration would end up controlling the numbers used for the apportionment, no matter who wins next month's presidential election.

In a statement, House Speaker Nancy Pelosi called the Supreme Court's decision "regrettable and disappointing," and said the administration's actions "threaten to politically and financially exclude many in America's most vulnerable communities from our democracy."

Associate Justice Sonia Sotomayor dissented from the high court's decision, saying "respondents will suffer substantial injury if the Bureau is permitted to sacrifice accuracy for expediency."

The Supreme Court ruling came in response to a lawsuit by a coalition of local governments and civil rights groups, arguing that minorities and others in hard-to-count communities would be missed if the census ended early. They said the schedule was cut short to accommodate a July order from President Donald Trump that would exclude people in the country illegally from being counted in the

the apportionment count exclude people who are in the country illegally. The order was later ruled unlawful by a panel of three district judges in New York, but the Trump administration appealed that case to the Supreme Court.



Addicted to Love

Dear Annie: I am depressed and deeply heartbroken over the final breakup with a man whom I have loved for eight years. I went to endless therapy and even went to a wellness center in Germany to help me get over him. Nothing has worked. Here's the backstory.

"Steve" has hurt me deeply many times, and after a few weeks or months of my begging him to come back, he always did. He's broken up with me so many times, ruined my birthdays and holidays, and he's excluded me from family functions when his ex-wife and adult kids would attend.

I met "Steve" while he was separated from his wife. He said that he was essentially divorced, though they hadn't gone through the formal process yet. A year in, I learned that he didn't even have a lawyer. It took him five years to get divorced. I was promised that once he was divorced, I'll be allowed to attend family functions. We even got engaged. However, after he told his four older sisters about the engagement and they were angry, he broke it off.

We got back together again after that, only for him to break up with me the day after we got back from my birthday trip on which he told me he loved me and promised no more breakups.

This year, I had no contact with him from February until the end of May, when his dad died.

We got back together for three weeks. But at the end of June, he told me that he'd made a mistake. He is almost 62 years old; I am 54.

When I told him that he'd used me and treated me as a friend with benefits, his reply was, "I thought our feelings were mutual." I told him that he knew I loved him, but he insisted he thought we could just hang out. He said that he's not in love with me. I feel so used and dirty; it almost feels like I was violated. The

thought of our intimacy during those three weeks nauseates me. I feel unloved, and I miss how he used to love me.

How can a human being act so kind, caring and loving, and then say, "I'm not in love with you"?

This has been a pattern, and I cannot get over it. My head knows; my heart, however, is bleeding. How do I stop hurting and missing him? -- Depressed, Heartbroken and Missing Him

Dear Depressed:

You can get hooked on a person in a way that is not dissimilar from getting hooked on a drug. That's not just

a figure of speech: A 2017 report published in the journal "Philosophy, Psychiatry, & Psychology" explains that "so numerous are the superficial similarities between addictive substance use and loveand sex-based interpersonal attachments, from exhilaration, ecstasy, and craving, to irregular physiological responses and obsessive patterns of thought, that a number of scientific theorists have begun to argue that both sorts of phenomena may rely upon similar or even identical psychological, chemical, and neuroanatomical" substances. In toxic or tumultuous relationships such as yours, these addictive effects could be even more pronounced.

Just as the vast majority of people cannot simply will themselves out of addiction, you're going to need more than just logic to get over Steve. You're going to need time and support. Cut off all contact. Block his number and email address, and block him on social media. Join a support group such as Co-Dependents Anonymous (https://coda.org), and return to therapy. It won't be quick or easy, but it will be so worth it. And remember, (SET ITAL)you(END ITAL) are worth it.





Big Spring preparing for district opener against first-place Andrews on Friday

The long wait is over.

After a three week hiatus from the field, the Big Spring Steers will take the field for their first district game of the year against Andrews at Memorial Stadium this Friday night at 7:00 p.m.

Big Spring will be looking to redeem themselves against Andrews when they go for their first win over the Mustangs since 2013. Andrews defeated Big Spring 48-14 last fall, but this group of Steers is ready to start a streak of their own as they look to begin 1-0 in district play.

The last few weeks have thrown some adversity Big Spring's way and they have had to deal with off-field health issues and quarantining since the loss to Lubbock High on Sept. 24. The Steers have now been practicing for a weekand-a-half and the group is itching to get back on the field.

"It's just been an interesting time," Head Coach Cannon McWilliams said. "I think everybody's had to go through it at some point. If not, they're really lucky. Our kids that have been able to show up have been good and we've just been working on the fundamental things. We are excited to get back to some sort of normalcy this week and open up district."

Andrews (5-2) is coming off their second loss of the season, a 45-14 drubbing at the hands of the powerhouse Canyon Eagles. Their only other loss of the season was to Midland Greenwood (36-29). They have grabbed wins over Levelland, Monahans, Seminole, Estacado, and Hereford where they have scored over 40 points in each contest.

Overall, the Mustangs are averaging 41.6 points per game on offense and are led by sophomore quarterback EJ Lopez. McWilliams knows that his team will not be able to stop Andrews the entire night, but hopes that his defense can make enough stops to be able to pull out the win.





That is exactly where every football team wants to be at this time of year and there does not seem to be much rust for Forsan to knock off.


