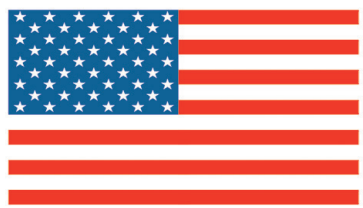

Health Fair and Information Expo setting up Downtown Saturday

Get on your walking shoes and head Downtown this Saturday. The Big Spring Area Chamber of Commerce annual health fair returns. Health care providers and businesses will be set up for four hours, 8 a.m. until Noon, offering health information, resources, and offering screenings and vaccines. The booths will be up and down the 200 block of Main Street and will offer something for all ages.



"The annual health fair is back. We may look a little different this year, but we are back," Debye ValVerde, Executive Director at the Big Spring Area Chamber of Commerce, said. "We have moved the health fair from the Dorothy Garrett Coliseum to Downtown Big Spring. We want to encourage the community to come out and join us as we flood the area with health information."

to a new location and new format to keep in line with COVID precautions. Booths will be set up along the street and scattered throughout the local boutiques and shops in the area. In addition to the health information, a little retail therapy can take place in the process.

"As always our health fair is a success because of the partnerships and team work that takes place to make it happen," ValVerde said. "This year is no different. We are excited to partner with our retail businesses in the Downtown Big Spring Area to be offering a Saturday morning focused around health."

Almost 40 health providers and related businesses will be ready to provide health education regarding ways to stay healthy, material on the proper time to take advantage of particular screenings, and resources to help locate those services in the community and surrounding area.

Rodeo, due to Covid precautions, however, Star Dodge will be sponsoring this year's Kid's Activity Fitness Course. There will be six stations for the youth to go through - those 15 and under are eligible to take part - and will have a card to be stamped. Once all the stations have been completed the card can be turned in to receive a chance to take home a new Nintendo Switch.

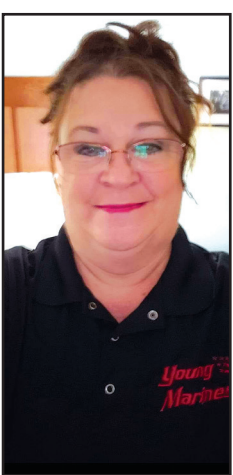
"This is something new this year aimed at getting the kids involved and active," ValVerde said. "It's a way for the kids to get up, move around and maintain social distancing while having a good time."

In addition to the information to be handed out, the West Texas VA Medical Center will have the mobile clinic on site to offer support services to veterans. Scenic Mountain Medical Center will be providing free Covid-19 vaccines, inside the Expedition Royalty building, for those wishing to receive the vaccine and have not had an opportunity to do so. Big Spring's Carrie Rodman is on a mission, and she's being recognized for doing a great job. Rodman is Executive Officer and Adjutant with the Cross Roads Young Marines in Big Spring, and that organization's Division 4 - which includes Arkansas, Colorado, Kansas, Louisiana, Nebraska, New Mexico, Oklahoma and Wyoming, in addition to Texas - recently named her its Adult Volunteer of the Year.

"Carrie's passion and determination really stand out in all she has done for her unit as well as for the organization," said Col. William P. Davis USMC (Ret.), the national executive director and CEO of the Young Marines. "It is especially meaningful to present this award during April, which is National

Volunteer Month. Carrie is a wonderful mentor and teacher, reflecting all the best traits of our volunteers.

Rodman said she was honored by the designation. "It makes me truly proud to give back to these kids and their parents, and to be recognized for the hours we put in as volunteers," she said.

Rodman has volunteered more than 3,500 community service hours through the Cross Roads Young Marines, where she serves with her husband Roger Rodman, the local unit commander. Rodman expressed her view of the Young Marines'

Stand Up Howard County - Raising awareness, focused on providing a voice for the voiceless

Stand Up Howard County - hosted by Scenic Mountain Medical Center - despite the cold temperatures and a little bit of moisture, went off for the seventh year and has been marked a success. More than 25 vendors joined forces to help raise awareness against child abuse.

"The weather caused us to move the event indoors, but it didn't stop us from completing our purpose; we set out to raise awareness and offer a voice for those who feel that they don't have one, and once again we were able to do that," April Arms, Scenic Mountain Medical Center Executive Assistant and Event Organizer, said.

Scenic Mountain Medical Center's partnership with area agencies and local business to help keep child abuse awareness top of mind is a vital step in reaching a day where there may be no more child abuse. The Big Spring Police Department, Howard County Sheriff's Department, along with the Big Spring Fire Department were on hand again this year. The Cross Roads Young Marines provided opening ceremonies before presentations were made by SMMC President Stacey Brown and Big Spring Mayor Shannon Thomason. Other health care agencies, such as Parkview, Interim, and

Kindred were at the event handing out information regarding resources in the community. The Midland Rape Crisis representatives along with CASA, Victim Services, and CPS were on hand with information regarding child abuse identifiers and community resources.

According to the CDC, 1 in 7 children have experienced child abuse and/or neglect in the past year, and that is only the reported instances. According to statistics, more than 1,800 children succumbed to injuries which resulted from child abuse in 2019, in the United States.

"This event allowed us the opportunity to create a unified front as a community, against an issue many would hope does not exist in our own backyard, but the sad reality is that it does," Arms said. "The more we educate the community about available resources and shine a light on it, the more power we give to the victims and show the offenders that we won't sit by quietly."

She continued, "We are thankful for our community partners who support us in our endeavours and see the importance of events like this. Every voice matters, but together we can be heard louder and further."

According to Children's Advocacy Centers of Texas — one of which is based in Howard County

now, directly behind the hospital in the Specialty Clinic — 175 children will fall victim to child abuse per day. The amount of families and number of children affected by child abuse in our county is rather high compared to larger communities, according to representatives from Victim Services and CASA of West Texas. One victim is too many, and the only way we can lower the number is to have more people stand up and help provide a voice. Over the years, the event has gained traction and grown in participation from local businesses and agencies and this year, the trend can once again continue.

"Ending child abuse is a community responsibility. It takes each and every one of us standing together and choosing to say something when we see something," Arms said.

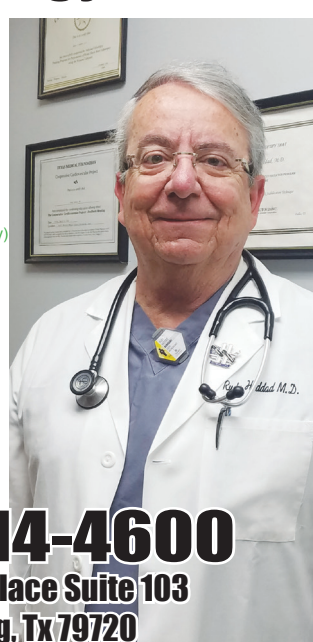

García's 3-run homer in 8th sends Rangers past Angels 7-4

ANAHEIM, Calif. — When Adolis García came up in the eighth with two runners on and the Rangers down two runs, Texas manager Chris Woodward leaned over to his coaches.

"I said, 'It's a pretty easy way to become an instant fan favorite if he hits a home run right here,'" Woodward recalled with a big grin. "And he hit a home run on the next pitch."

García's big league career, but the Rangers already think they've got something special in the Cuban slugger who propelled them to yet another dramatic win in Anaheim.

García hit a go-ahead, three-run homer in the eighth inning, and the Texas Rangers rallied from a late two-run deficit for a 7-4 victory over the Los Angeles Angels on Wednesday.

García has only been up in the majors for a little over a week, but he's already putting together an incredible collection of big hits in key situations. The 28-year-old designated hitter has five extra-base hits in the last eight games, including the first three homers of his major league career — all of them in clutch situations.

His 411-foot homer off Mike Mayers (1-1), punctuated by a bat flip and a joyous run to first, tops his impressive list of accomplishments during

his first significant big league action since 2018.

"It's an amazing feeling," García said through a translator. "Coming off the bat, I knew. It's uncontrollable to feel that when I knew it would put us ahead. ... I'm just trying to live my dream and enjoy it. As long as it goes, that's all I'm really thinking about."

García defected in 2016, and he never really got a sustained chance in the majors during three seasons with St. Louis. After getting his shot with Texas this month, he has joined Jurickson Profar and Billy Sample as the only players in Rangers history to put the team ahead with each of their first three big-league homers.

"He's just different," Woodward said of García. "He's physically just more gifted than everybody else on that field sometimes. He is built like a superstar. He looks like a superstar. He's playing like a superstar. Maybe it's just an opportunity this kid needs."

Nate Lowe also homered immediately after García's drive for the Rangers, who have won six of nine after jumping on Los Angeles' bullpen for six late runs to take two of three at Angel Stadium.

Joey Gallo drew a bases-loaded walk in the ninth from Junior Guerra, who barked in another run.

Mike Trout, Shohei Ohtani, Justin Upton and José Iglesias hit solo hom-

ers for the Angels, who have lost four of six after their bullpen had a meltdown evoking memories of last season's terrible relief group.

"Overall, I thought it was a pretty good day," Angels manager Joe Maddon said. "I thought we had good at-bats against a pretty good staff."

John King (2-0) got Trout to ground out with the bases loaded to end the seventh before the Angels' bullpen misadventures began.

José Quintana pitched five innings of two-hit ball with eight strikeouts in a marked improvement on his previous starts for the Angels. The left-hander walked four, but allowed just one run and mostly avoided the trouble that left him with a 16.20 ERA after his first two appearances.

"Felt way better than last time," Quintana said. "I felt more competitive inning by inning. It was a good outing. I needed it."

HALO HOMERS

Mike Foltyniewicz yielded three runs and seven hits over six innings for Texas, striking out six. Although he was mostly happy with his first career start against the Angels, Foltyniewicz lamented the Halos' long balls.

Trout hit his sixth homer this season in the first inning, clobbering a first-pitch sinker with his new aggression at the plate. The blast was the three-time AL MVP's 40th in 163 career games against the Rangers.

Ohtani added a 402-foot shot in the third inning, and Upton connected in the fourth after breaking his bat over his knee in frustration after his first at-bat.

"It's just like, 'Hey, welcome to Anaheim,'" Foltyniewicz said.

TRAINER'S ROOM

Rangers: The medical staff came out to talk to Foltyniewicz after he struck out Upton in the sixth. Foltyniewicz swung his arm in circles, but finished the inning.

Angels: 3B Anthony Rendon (groin) took grounders before the game. He could return this weekend in Houston. ... Upton's legs began cramping in the eighth, and Jose Rojas replaced him in left field in the ninth. Maddon said the veteran felt fine afterward.

Rangers: After an off day, Dane Dunning (1-0, 0.60 ERA) faces his former team when Texas opens a three-game series at the White Sox on Friday. Dunning moved to the Rangers in the trade that sent Lance Lynn to Chicago. "It's going to be exciting," Dunning said. "I know practically every person on that team. It's going to be really cool being able to throw (to) my old buddies, old teammates."

Gomber lifts Rockies 6-3, Astros' 9th loss in 10 games

DENVER — Austin Gomber got his first victory for the Colorado Rockies, allowing two hits over six innings to beat the Astros 6-3 on a wintry Wednesday afternoon and send Houston to its ninth loss in 10 games.

It was 34 degrees at first pitch and a light snow fell throughout the game, gaining in intensity.

The weather didn't bother Gomber (1-2), among five players acquired from St. Louis in the Feb. 1 trade that sent star third baseman Nolan Arenado to the Cardinals.

"You try to block it out the best you can. It's cold, there's no way around that," said Gomber, who grew up in Florida. "It's not something ideally I'd love to do every five days but they had to go through the same conditions on the other side. It was an experience, for sure. It's the first time I've ever pitched in snow like that, but no real issues gripping the ball."

Gomber allowed Yuli Gurriel's two-run homer in the second but just one hit and a walk after. The 27-year-old left-hander walked two and struck out six, including the side in order in the fifth, and retired 14 of his last 16 batters.

Houston starter José Urquidy (0-2) gave up four runs and six hits in five innings.

"Urquidy kept us in the ballgame," manager Dusty Baker said. "In the bullpen, he was spot on. He threw everything where he wanted. I don't know if the mound's any different or the conditions or if he was just feeling a little anxious. I've never seen Urquidy throw a ball consistently like that. He's usually down in the zone, he's usually around the plate."

Gurriel drove in all three runs for the Astros. Houston also was 7-10 last year before winning eight in a row.

"We're 3 1/2 games back, 17 games into a season that's 162 games long, just get to work, get back into rhythm," Alex Bregman said.

Yonathan Daza hit his first major league home run in his 58th big league game. Dom Nunez doubled, singled and drove in two runs for Colorado, which swept the two-game interleague series.

"It felt incredible. Just a dream come true," Daza said through an interpreter. "I just remember one of my favorite players Miguel Cabrera hit one in the snow. I just kind of had that feeling going into the game today."

Trevor Story hit a two-run double in the first. Gurriel's homer tied the score and Daza put Colorado ahead for good when he homered leading off the bottom half. Nunez doubled in a run later in the inning, and boosted the margin to 6-2 in the sixth against Brandon Bielak when Nunez hit an RBI double and scored on Raimel Tapia's sacrifice fly.

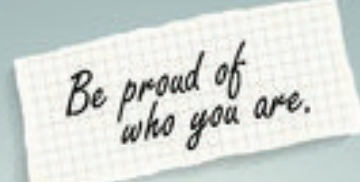

Husband Is COVID-Shaming

Dear Annie: I have friends and family who have traveled for vacations during the COVID-19 pandemic. My husband and I have taken trips during the pandemic, too, but only road trips, and we stay at Airbnb rentals (by ourselves). Some of my relatives, meanwhile, went to Hawaii, justifying it as helping Hawaii's economy. Some have flown upwards of five times during the pandemic. Many even traveled during the holidays and got together with people outside their household for multiple days.

These friends and relatives are not anti-maskers. They proudly tout all the extra safety precautions they take when traveling, and they get tested beforehand. But my husband is sickened by their behavior, and he's begun opting out of our weekly family Zoom calls. He says he's lost all respect for them.

I'm disappointed in their actions, too -- but not enough to cut them out of my life.

to travel and take unnecessary risks, they say that our vacations have been just as risky; flying is safe (this is a big one); it's their prerogative; and they're not endangering anyone. They feel as though my husband is harshly judging and shaming them. And to be honest, he is.

I'm trying to support all parties involved. I'll never force my husband to be friends with people whom he doesn't respect -- but at the same time, I'm grieving the loss of the unity between everyone. Thankfully, we live far away from these friends and relatives, and they're not really part of our regular daily lives. How to execute a squeeze

North dealer. Neither side vulnerable.

The bidding:

Opening lead — king of diamonds.

The chief components of a squeeze, the most dramatic play in bridge, are three in number:

1. The declarer must have all the remaining tricks but one (except in rare cases).
2. One of the defenders must have to guard two (or more) suits.
3. Declarer must have communication with the opposite hand when the squeeze card is played.

There are other factors that may pertain to a squeeze situation, but the three given cover the great majority

of cases. The question of how to recognize a potential squeeze is best answered by training oneself to think in terms of a squeeze whenever there is only one loser left.

In today's deal, after West leads the king of diamonds and shifts to the queen of hearts, declarer notes (No. 1) that his only remaining loser is a heart. He also observes (No. 2) that West, having bid hearts, will be forced to guard that suit as well as the ace of diamonds. Declarer also sees (No. 3) that the ace of hearts is an entry to dummy.

South therefore wins the queen of hearts with the king, plays five rounds of trump and cashes three clubs. At this point, his hand consists of a trump and two hearts, while dummy has the A-2 of hearts and queen of diamonds. West has the J-10 of hearts and ace of diamonds.

South now leads his last trump, and West is a goner. Whether he discards a heart or a diamond, declarer scores the last two tricks.

The necessity for all three components to exist can be seen if we change West's opening lead to the queen of hearts. As soon as he regains the lead with a diamond, West returns a heart to remove dummy's entry, and the squeeze position then cannot be developed because West's two heart leads have severed South's communication with dummy.
