The fire spread rapidly toward the front of the stage, causing the members of the chorus, who were then engaged in the performance to flee to fire in uself up to this time was not ailed to work.

As soon as the fire was discovered Eddie Foy, the chief comedian of the company shouted to lower the curtain and this was done. It descended about halfway and then stuck. The fire thus was given practically a flue through the strong draught, aided by the doors which had been thrown open in the front of the theater.

With a roar and a bound the flames shot through the opening over the heads of the people on the first floor, end reaching clear up to those in the first balcony caught them and burned sem to death.

Immediately following the rush of the flaces there came an explosion heater from its walls shattering it to fragments.
