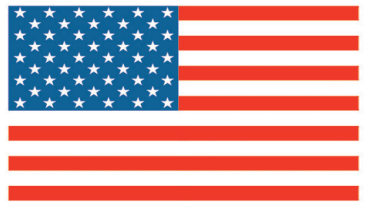

## DNA evidence spurred arrest of Adkins in connection to Dunn murder

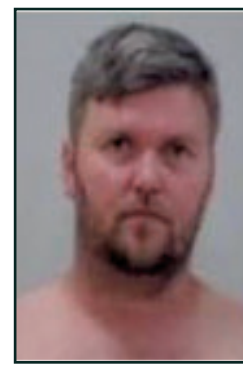

 AUSTIN – More than a decade after she was last seen alive, a person has been charged in the cold case slaying of Mitchell County eighth-grader Hailey Dunn. Shawn Casey Adkins, 35, of Big Spring, was arrested Monday, June 14, in Big Spring and charged with one count of murder in the

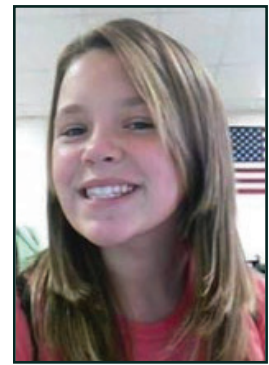
death of 13-year-old Dunn.

Dunn was last seen on Dec. 27, 2010. Her mother reported her missing the next day. Despite a search, there was no sign of Dunn until March 16, 2013, when her remains were found near Lake JB Thomas in Scurry County.

Adkins had been a suspect in the case, but was never charged. At the time of Dunn's death, he was the live-in boyfriend of

Dunn's mother. The circumstances surrounding Dunn's disappearance is what led authorities to Adkins initially. Ultimately, though, the investigation stalled for lack of new evidence.

In 2020, the district attorney for the 32nd Judicial District, Ricky Thompson, consulted with the Texas Rangers

## Veterans of Comedy Veterans honored with a special Quilt of Valor presentation

For their service, for their sacrifice, there truly is no way to give the thank you that is deserved. While there may not be enough words to express the gratitude so greatly deserved, a special presentation wrapping a veteran in love and gratitude is a start. Recently, two more veterans were honored in a Quilt of Valor Presentation.

Michael Shields – also known as Mikey Mike on the Mic – a Navy Veteran and Chris Crawford, a United States Air Force Veteran, were both presented with a Quilt of Valor following a Veterans of Comedy and Friends fundraiser event this past weekend. Shields entered the Navy

right out of high school and served from February 1979 until December 1982. He was discharged with a medical discharge under honorable conditions due to an injury.

“During my time I was stationed down in Pensacola, Florida on the training aircraft carrier the USS Lexington,” Shields said. “That was my only duty station; I had a serious injury to my foot when I got discharged.”

Crawford served from Nov. 21, 1996 until Dec. 1, 2016, as an intel soldier.

“The Veterans of Comedy and Friends” Show at VFW Post 2013 will be ingrained in my head forever,” Chris Crawford stated on a post on Facebook. “... This night went from funny and memorable to intensely emotional

and unforgettable.”

## Legends and Legacies honors The Slaughters: Rufus, Jess Sr. and Jess Jr.

*Editor's Note: Each year new members are added to the honorees of Legends and Legacies through the Heritage Museum. Over the next seven editions, the Big Spring Herald will feature this year's inductees. This is the first in a series of seven.*

The Slaughters: Rufus, Jess Sr. and Jess Jr.

R.E (Rufus or Rufe) Slaughter and his wife, Anna Lee, settled on one of the Slaughter ranches in 1899. He was hired to manage the Rattlesnake Ranch, near present day Vealmoor, for his double cousin, C.C. Slaughter. Their house was located on the north side of Rattlesnake Creek at the west end of Rattlesnake Tank, one of the largest watering places of the Slaughter Cattle Company. Jess Slaughter Sr. remembered when the family first arrived at the ranch. “We traveled by train to Big Spring and then by wagon to the ranch. Rolling through sand

up to the hubs of the wagon wheels while continuing on to Buzzard Wells. That was about eighteen miles north from Big Spring where the lunch stop was. The children helped their parents gather mesquite to build a fire to brew their black coffee. Rufe caught some jack rabbits and Anna Lee roasted them on the fire. Then they made jack rabbit sandwiches for the children.

Colonel Slaughter furnished his early cowboys four horses of their choice from the headquarters corral, a saddle, \$25.00, bunkhouse privileges and “chuck.” Later he raised their wages to \$35.00 per month to compete with sheep herders. Sometimes, bunkhouse privileges meant campsites in open pastures under southern skies where cowboys often slept on army blankets with a rope encircled around them to prevent rattlesnake

Tarpley delivered a short speech with the history of Quilts of Valor before honoring the two men.

"I remember when I received a package in the mail one day and I couldn't figure out what the box was. I was fortunate my mom was still with us enough to know what was going on; it was a little emotional, and it was called the Quilt of Valor," Mike Tarpley, Vietnam Veteran and Quilt of Valor presenter, said. "I am honored, since then, to have been named as a presenter of these quilts."

Since the founding of the Quilts of Valor organization - founded by a Blue Star Mom, more than 140,000 quilts have been awarded in the United States, Germany, Iraq and Afghanistan. With each quilt the mission to honor service members and veterans is fulfilled - one human-being reaching out and touching another without judgement, reaching out with acceptance and with acknowledgement of service to our nation in very trying circumstances.

The quilts are made up of three layers: the top with its many colors, shapes and fabrics represent the community and the many individuals we are; the batting - filler - is the center of the quilt, its warmth.

"This second layer represents the hope that this quilt will bring warmth, comfort, peace and healing to the individual who receives it," Tarpley said during the presentation.

The backing is the final layer and it represents strength that supports the other layers. It represents the strength of the recipient, the support of

his or her family, communities and nation. Each of the stitches holding the layers together represent love, gratitude and sometimes the tears of the maker. Each quilt represents the three-part message from the givers to the recipient.

"We honor you for your service. We honor you for leaving all you hold dear and to stand in harm's way in a time of crisis, protecting us from the effects of war," Tarpley said. "Next, we know that freedom is not free. The cost of freedom is the dedication of lives of men and women like you, and this quilt is meant to say thank you for your sacrifice."

He continued, "Finally, this quilt is meant to offer comfort to you and to remind you that although your family and friends cannot be with you at all times, you are forever in our thoughts and hearts."

After Shields and Crawford were wrapped in the

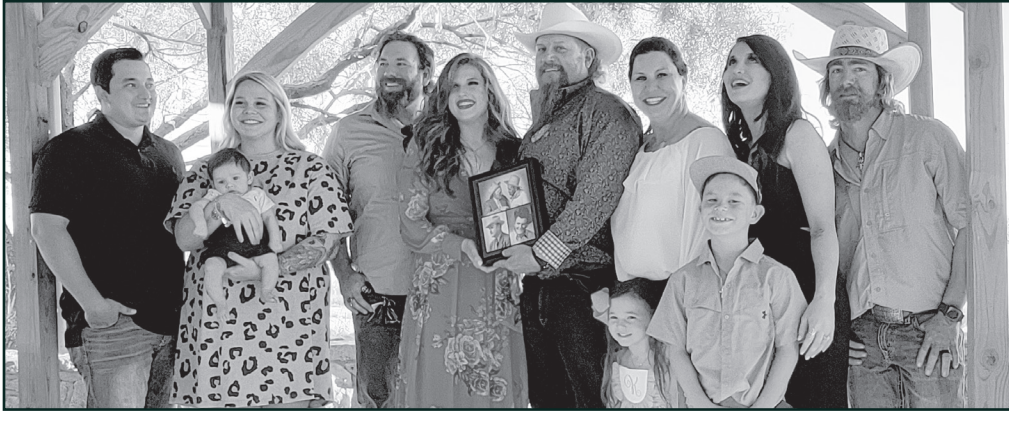


Michael Shields (left) and Chris Crawford (right) are presented with a Quilt of Valor following the comedy show fundraiser at the VFW Post 2013.

bite (so they believed.) Cowhands spent a whole week herding cattle from Old German Springs to Rattlesnake pastures for branding and then to Indian Canyon where they were sprayed to fatten them quicker, and then on to Lake Tahoka for watering. The yearlings were culled and left there in Lynn County where the grass was knee high, to ready them for market the next year. Then the herd was taken to Level-land to be dipped in the vats there and finally to Morton, Texas, for the Round-up. Branding was done both in Howard County and in Co-

chran County, near the New Mexico border.

Rattlesnake Ranch was located two miles east of the old Soash Community. During Soash's development in 1909, Rufe operated a mercantile in the fledging town. He had said that he couldn't keep merchandise in his store it was selling so quickly. Soash went under as quickly as it started developing. W.P. Soash had wired C.C. Slaughter for \$75,000 to "keep from going under." Slaughter's return telegraph read, "Go Under."

Rufe acquired his own piece of land but sold his holdings in 1917 and moved his family to Big Spring in 1920. Rufe and

Anna Lee had four children, two girls and two boys, Tom, and Jess Sr.

Before he died, Rufe was one of the few remaining Long S cowboys, J.W. Barnett, J.W. Carpenter, John Wolcott, J.H. Heffley and Jim Graves. Rufe died on March 30, 1948.

Jess Slaughter Sr. was born on February 28, 1894, in Hico, Texas. As a young man, Jess became a cow puncher on the Slaughter ranch, alongside his dad, Rufe and brother Tom in Dawson County. Tom said by the time he was 11 they were wrangling horses from the Slaughter remuda. When the boys reached their teens, they became full-fledged cowboys, riding

the range from March till Christmas, working the roundups and looking over fences. In 1918, Jess and Tom went to serve in France during WWI. Once Jess returned to Dawson County, he married a young schoolteacher in 1922, Elinor Paxton. They moved to Big Spring to help Jess' brother operate one of Big Spring's first gas stations, located at First and Main Streets.

Jess was elected Sheriff of Howard County from 1929-1941, then again from 1952-1956. In 1958, after serving as Sheriff, he was elected as Justice of the Peace. He held that office until his death in 1972. Jess and Elinor had a daughter, Janice, and son, Jess Jr. Jess Sr. served on the Big Spring Rodeo Board and was one of the first organizers of the rodeo in Big Spring. In 1932, Jess and Marion Edwards purchased bucking bulls and roping stock right off the range. They located "outlaw" horses and purchased them right off the ranches of Big Spring.

He was involved in the

Howard/Glasscock Old Settlers Reunion, American Legion Post, and World War I Barracks. Jess was a faithful Baptist and a faithful BSHS football fan, rarely ever missing a game. Jess Sr. died in 1972 at the age of 78.

Jess Slaughter Jr. was often referred to as "a chip off the old block." Jr. was born July 12, 1925, in Big Spring. Jess roped at rodeos during his youth until he was called to duty during the Korean Conflict. Once he returned to Big Spring, he started roping again.

Jess was an excellent calf roper and held his own with some of Big Spring's finest ropers, Sunny Edwards and Toots Mansfield. He followed his father's footsteps and stayed involved in the rodeo and on the board and was a member of the Pro Rodeo Cowboy Association.

Jess Jr. married Eva Marie "Mikey" Mikels and they had three sons, Jess Slaughter III., John Ray Slaughter (deceased) and Jay Slaughter. After Mikey passed away, Jess then

married Mae Dell Eggemeyer in 1979 and they moved to Midkiff. Jess died on August 21, 2006, at the age of 81.

These three generations of Slaughter men knew the back of the horse well and they knew what hard work, integrity, faithfulness, and endurance meant.

across, you know you've got a partner with Pete and his crew and their ability to overcome any obstacle," said Driver, a long-time member of the volunteer committee that organizes the event. "Last year, whether we were going to push through or cancel, he was very understanding and ready if we had pushed through. We knew he had the capabilities of helping us out.

"Pete was just staying on the sidelines waiting for us to say what direction we needed to go. It was never whether he could handle it. It was always: 'Tell me what you need.'"

That still rings true in 2021, where the obstacles are fewer and life's a lot more normal than it was a dozen months ago. One main difference for this year's rodeo is the inclusion of ladies breakaway roping. That hasn't happened in Big Spring before, but the popularity of the event has increased rapidly in the last few years. That drew the attention of organizers.

"It looks like we've got some enthusiasm for our addition of breakaway roping," Driver said. "I know these girls are going to have to cover lots of miles to make it work, but they're really looking to make it work. I was very glad to see the number of

contestants we've got.

"I think that event alone is going to be a big attribute for our rodeo."

Breakaway roping was more of a stand-alone event and wasn't part of ProRodeo. That changed just three years ago, and there has been an explosion in its interest. This past December, the first National Finals Breakaway Roping took place in conjunction with the National Finals Rodeo, and it looks to continue. Jackie Crawford of Stephenville, Texas, was the first Pro-Rodeo world champion.

"I think it will really grow," Driver said. "For our fans, it's something different and something exciting. They've seen it on national television, and now they can see it locally and maybe see why it might set our rodeo apart from other rodeos.

"We're going to do what we can to make it a destination rodeo for breakaway ropers."

The behind-the-scenes work will be conducted by Pete Carr and his crew. From loading and sorting livestock to handling many duties throughout each performance, the production of every rodeo is important to Carr and his team.

"Pete trusts his people to handle so many things," Driver said.

"There is a good team at every corner, and there is a level of professionalism that we know to trust."

The relationship from committee to contractor is important, and the hope is the fans and contestants are the biggest beneficiaries of it.

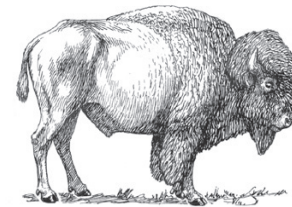

## The Dugout: Breaking down the NL West

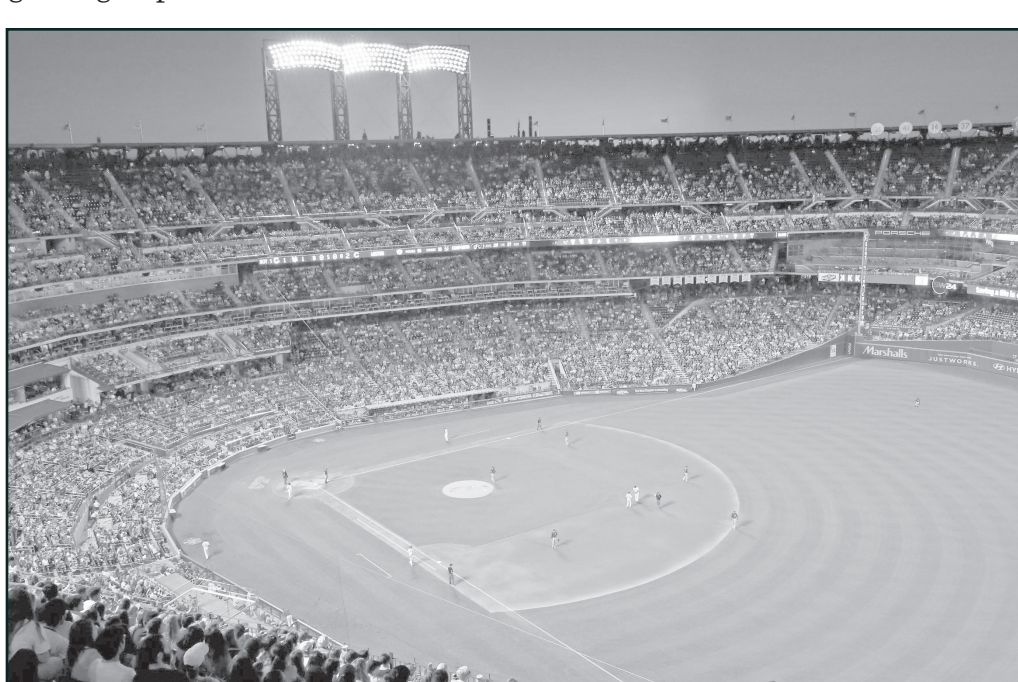
Welcome to the Dugout. In today's volume and part four of our six-part series, we push onto the National League; specifically, the National League West. The NL West includes the San Francisco Giants, Los Angeles Dodgers, San Diego Padres, Colorado Rockies, and the Arizona Diamondbacks. This year the NL West is packed with talented teams, which should come as no surprise as the defending World Champs, the Los Angeles Dodgers, are in this division. So without further ado, let's break down what I've learned so far this season from this division.

In what could be one of the biggest shocks, the San Francisco Giants sit atop the standings with a 41-25 record so far on the season. The performance is good enough for the best in all the National League. After a not-so-great season last year, they finished third in the division with a 29-31 record. So what's the story of the sudden turnaround? The Giants have a group of veteran players who are having vintage seasons. The vets are playing good ball right now and have pushed this team to be one of the strongest so far. Let's lead with the pitching. The group sits third in the NL with a team ERA (Earned Run Average) of 3.18. They are led by veteran Kevin Gausman, one of those players who has had a resurrection so far this year. Gausman has an incredible 1.43 ERA and has been remarkably valuable to open the year. His strikeout percentage (K%) rests at 31.4, which is the second-best of his career. The pitcher relies on his slider and split. Whatever he is doing seems to work. Anthony DeSclafani has been another surprise this season as the veteran pitcher has rolled back the clock as well. He came over from a career with the Cincinnati Reds, where he was a decent but not great pitcher. This year he has been remarkable; he has an ERA of 3.09. DeSclafani is more of a contact pitcher relying on ground balls and good defense to get outs. He has a ground ball rate (GB%) of 48.1%. He primarily relies on his slider, which has excellent movement and mixes in a sinker and fastball. His slider gets him swings and misses, and he uses the slider to set up his sinker, which generates a lot of ground balls. Now let's move on to the bats, where like the pitchers, two names stick out to me, both having throwback years. Those are Brandon Crawford and the great Buster Posey. Let's start with Crawford, and man, is this guy hot this year. He is experiencing a great year up to this point. Crawford is batting .268, possesses an SLG% of .545, and 15 home runs on the year. He seems locked in at the plate and is hitting to all areas of the field this year. Buster Posey is having a career resurgence of sorts, as the long-time vet is batting .329, SLG .571, with 11 HR so far this year. Now, it is still only June, and these guys could melt down the stretch, but if this team stays hot, the NL West race could be an entertaining one to watch.

Sitting in second are the defending World Champions, the Los Angeles Dodgers. What can I say nice about the Dodgers? Well, not much not a fan of this team. Mostly because I have some friends like Big Spring Steers Head Baseball Coach Daniel Carrillo, who is an immense Dodgers fan. Naturally, we have a rivalry, so I don't like them as a team. But I'll be as fair as I can about them for the purpose of this article. The Dodgers come in with a record of 40-26, which places them just one game back of the Giants. I don't think it's necessarily a case of the Dodgers not being good as much as it is of the Giants just playing way above expectations to this point so far. The Dodgers won their first Championship since the 1988 World Series. The Dodgers are one of the most storied franchises in all baseball, and there is no doubt. They have won seven World Series titles, including last year's. They came into this season as the favorite to repeat, especially after adding last season's NL Cy Young winner Trevor Bauer to the pitching rotation. The Dodgers have one of the most stout lineups in the whole MLB. They have power up and down the lineup and do an exceptional job at establishing contact. They have a team batting average of .242, which is good enough to place them third-best in the NL. Max Muncy has a career year to this point, as the slugger is batting .264, has an SLG of .528, and has 14 HR on the year. Justin Turner re-signed with the Dodgers this off season and picked up right where he left

off. Turner has consistently been a powerful player, but now he seems poised to take the next step. He is batting .278, SLG of .485, and has chipped in 12 HR on the year. The Dodgers are also outstanding on their pitching end and have one of the best pitching staffs in baseball. They took a gigantic blow losing Carrot Top look-alike Dustin May for the season with an elbow injury. Los Angeles is full of dominant pitchers, but let's lead off with reigning Cy Young winner Trevor Bauer. Bauer signed a three-year \$102 million deal with the Dodgers this off-season. Bauer is one of the most outspoken players in all the league but has the stuff to back up his mouth. He has an ERA of 2.64, a K% of 31.6, and a BB% of 8.3. Bauer has an arsenal of pitches at his disposal. Bauer throws at least six different pitches. His four-seam sits anywhere from 93 to 97; it has some arm-side movement and has good backspin. His cutter has a heavy sink to it and has an excellent cut to it, which causes many swings and misses. Bauer's slider sweeps across the zone and possesses remarkable depth to the pitch. His curve is simply one of the best in all of baseball, and it has impressive break and depth. Bauer is the new breed of pitchers; he relies on analytics and data to

ing a lot of ground balls and swings and misses. His curveball has a marvelous break to it, and he can bury it in the zone. Musgrove also works in a lovely cutter with some excellent arm-side movement and has some sink to it. He has consistently been a good pitcher; he established his big league career in Houston in 2016 and later went to the Pittsburgh Pirates in 2018 before coming over to San Diego. Another big-time pitcher the Padres have is Yu Darvish, who came over in a trade with the Chicago Cubs this off-season. Darvish was coming off a great year as a Cub, where he finished second in the National League Cy Young voting. He is having another good year for the Padres as he has an ERA of 2.57 and a K% of 29.3. Darvish has a ridiculous pitch mix as he can throw up to eight different pitches. Mostly, Darvish relies on his slider and a fabulous four-seam fastball. He will also incorporate in a sinker, curveball, and split-finger. We have constantly known Darvish as one of the toughest pitchers in baseball because everything he throws has good movement. The starting rotation isn't the only part of the pitching staff who has been doing good. Mark Melancon is undergoing a marvelous year as the Padres closer; he has an



ERA of 0.64, a K% of 21.8, but a ground ball rate of 64.0%. He has converted 19 of his 21 save opportunities to start the year. Pitching isn't the only thing this organization has working for them; they also have one of, if not the finest young stars in the game. Fernando Tatis Jr., The young superstar, is entertaining to follow as he plays the sport with enthusiasm and swagger. He is batting .273, SLG .647, bears a WRC+ of 162, and has 20 HR on the year, second-most in all baseball. Tatis Jr. will be a superstar for years to come. The Padres have the team to challenge the Dodgers and the Giants for this division. If they can grow together as a youthful club, the sky will be the limit.

The Colorado Rockies are in fourth place in the division with a 27-41, which makes them 15.5 games back of the first-place Giants. As you can determine from the record, the Rockies have struggled so far this season. As you would assume, the bats have been pretty good, playing half of their games in Colorado as they have a team batting average of .243, which is the fourth-best in the NL. It's the pitching that has been killing this team. They have a team ERA of 4.97, which is second-worst in the National League. While this team has talented players like Trevor Story and Ryan McMahon, the pitching will repeatedly be a dilemma for the Rockies. Siting 15.5 games back, this season is lost for them, so it's on to next year for the Rockies.

The Arizona Diamondbacks brings up the rear of the NL West with a dismal record of 20-48, which leaves them 22.5 games back. What can I say good about the Diamondbacks? Well, not much. The pitching has been pretty ugly outside of a few starts from Madison Bumgarner. Hitting has been little better. This team is just having a lousy year, plain and simple. Eduardo Escobar has shown some flashes of being decent, and he has some pop in his bat, which is clear by his 15 HR on the year. But other than that, it's just been a poor year for the D-Backs.

The NL West will come down to a race between the Dodgers and the Padres, in my mind, while I don't think the Giants can keep up this kind of play all season long. I believe that talent will always prevail, and the Dodgers and the Padres are loaded with talent. I do unfortunately think it will be the Dodgers that will pull it out. If I'm honest, they will have a significant chance at winning another championship as much as that hurts to say, but facts are facts; the Dodgers are good.

# Today in History

Today is Thursday, June 17, the 168th day of 2021. There are 197 days left in the year.

**Today's Highlight in History:**

On June 17, 1994, after leading police on a slow-speed chase on Southern California freeways, O.J. Simpson was arrested and charged with murder in the slayings of his ex-wife, Nicole, and her friend, Ronald Goldman. (Simpson was later acquitted in a criminal trial but held liable in a civil trial.)

On this date:

In 1775, the Revolutionary War Battle of Bunker Hill resulted in a costly victory for the British, who suffered heavy losses.

In 1885, the Statue of Liberty arrived in New York Harbor aboard the French ship *Isere* (ee-SEHR).

In 1933, the "Kansas City Massacre" took place outside Union Station in Kansas City, Mo., as a group of gunmen attacked law enforcement officers escorting federal prisoner Frank Nash; four of the officers were killed, along with Nash.

In 1963, the U.S. Supreme Court, in *Abington (Pa.) School District v. Schempp*, struck down, 8-1, rules requiring the recitation of the Lord's Prayer or reading of Biblical verses in public schools.

In 1967, China successfully tested its first thermonuclear (hydrogen) bomb.

In 1972, President Richard Nixon's eventual downfall began with the arrest of five burglars inside the Democratic headquarters in Washington, D.C.'s Watergate complex.

In 1986, President Ronald Reagan announced the retirement of Chief Justice Warren Burger, who was succeeded by William Rehnquist.

In 2009, President Barack Obama extended some benefits to same-sex partners of federal employees. Nevada Sen. John Ensign resigned from the GOP leadership a day after admitting an affair with a former campaign staffer.

In 2012, Rodney King, 47, whose

1991 videotaped beating by Los Angeles police sparked widespread outrage and who struggled with addiction and repeated arrests, died in Rialto, California, in an apparent accidental drowning.

In 2013, the U.S. Supreme Court ruled 7-2 that states can't demand proof of citizenship from people registering to vote in federal elections unless they get federal or court approval to do so.

In 2015, nine people were shot to death in a historic African-American church in Charleston, South Carolina; suspect Dylann Roof was arrested the following morning. (Roof was convicted of federal hate crimes and sentenced to death; he later pleaded guilty to state murder charges and was sentenced to life in prison without parole.)

In 2019, Iran announced that it was breaking compliance with the international accord that kept it from making nuclear weapons; the announcement meant that Iran could soon start to enrich uranium to just a step away from weapons-grade levels. The Trump administration followed Iran's announcement by ordering 1,000 more troops to the Middle East.

Ten years ago: The United Nations endorsed the rights of gay, lesbian and transgender people for the first time ever, passing a resolution hailed as historic by the U.S. and other backers and decried by some African and Muslim countries. A Saudi woman defiantly drove through Riyadh while others brazenly cruised past police patrols in the first forays of a challenge to Saudi Arabia's male-only driving rules. Rory McIlroy became the first player in the 111-year history of the U.S. Open to reach 13-under par.

Five years ago: President Barack Obama, his wife and their daughters traveled to Carlsbad Caverns National Park in New Mexico as part of a long Father's Day weekend that was also designed to draw attention to America's natural wonders. Thousands of friends and fans said farewell to "The Voice" singer Christina Grimmie at services in Medford, New Jersey, a week after the 22-year-old was shot to death while signing autographs in Orlando, Florida, by a man who

then killed himself.

One year ago: Prosecutors in Atlanta brought murder charges against white police officer Garrett Rolfe in the fatal shooting of a Black man, Rayshard Brooks, following a struggle; a second officer, Devin Brosnan, was charged with aggravated assault and violating his oath. Quaker Oats announced that it would retire the Aunt Jemima brand, saying the company recognized that the character's origins were "based on a racial stereotype." City commissioners in Portland, Oregon, voted to cut \$16 million from the police budget in response to concerns about use of force and racial injustice. Jean Kennedy Smith, the last surviving sibling of President John F. Kennedy, died at her New York home at the age of 92. Prosecutors in Los Angeles said actor Danny Masterson of "That '70s Show" was arrested and charged with raping three women in the early 2000s; the actor has denied the charges. (A judge has ordered Masterson to stand trial on three counts of rape.)

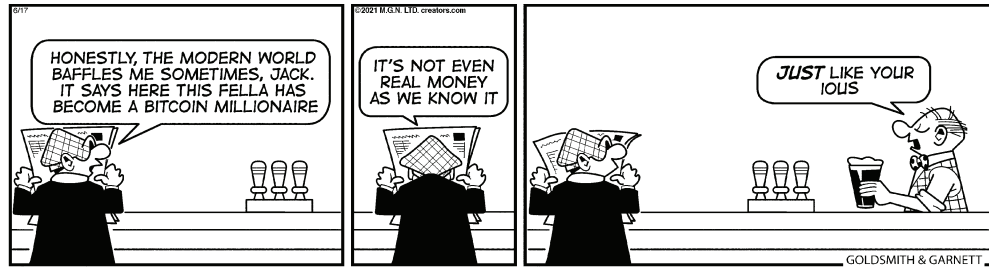

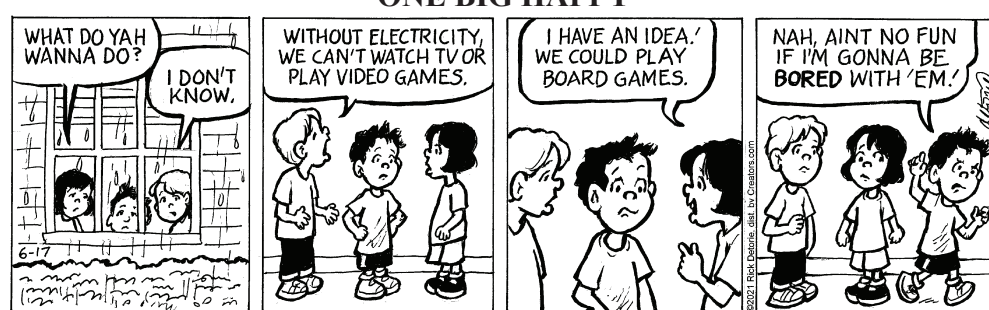
