Lawsuits begin as Texas GOP voting bill fight moves to court

AUSTIN, Texas (AP) — Opponents of a sweeping Republican elections overhaul in Texas sued Gov. Greg Abbott on Friday, going to court even before he had signed into law changes that would further tighten the state's already strict voting rules.

Two lawsuits, filed in separate federal courts in Texas, are believed to be the first to challenge the far-reaching measure known as Senate Bill 1, which the Legislature approved this week after Democrats ended months of protests over changes that include new limits on voting hours and criminal penalties for obstructing partisan poll watchers.

Abbott said he would sign it, which could happen within days.

The challenges were brought by a broad coalition of voting rights groups, including the American Civil Liberties Union, disability and minority rights organizations, and the elections administrator for Harris County, which includes Houston and was particularly targeted by the measure. Because

of the pandemic, Texas' largest county — which is a Democratic stronghold — last year offered 24-hour polling and drive-thru voting locations, and tried to send every registered voter a mail-in ballot application.

All of those options would be outlawed under the bill, which opponents say is a brazen attempt to disenfranchise minorities and other Democratic-leaning voters. The lawsuit argues that the bill would violate the federal Voting Right Act and intentionally discriminate against minority voters.

"We cannot allow our democracy to be undermined by these blatantly illegal voting restrictions aimed at disenfranchising communities of color and voters with disabilities," said Ryan Cox, senior attorney with the Texas Civil Rights Project.

Republicans say the bill provides safeguards against voter fraud. They also point out that it would increase the minimum number of hours during early voting and expand the number of counties where polls would have to stay open for 12 hours.

"Protecting the integrity of our elections is criti-

cal in the state of Texas, which is why Governor Abbott made election integrity an emergency item during the regular legislative session and worked to ensure its passage by calling special session after special session ensuring uniform statewide rules," Abbott spokeswoman Renae Eze said in a statement.

Texas is one of several Republican-led states that have pushed through new voting restrictions in the name of election security since the party lost the White House. The effort, which led to new restrictions in Georgia, Florida, Arizona and elsewhere, was spurred in part by former President Donald Trump's false claims that the election was stolen from him.

City Administration has been made aware of feral hogs that have been sighted in a residential area on the east side of Big Spring recently. The City has contacted the Game Warden and will work in conjunction with his efforts to trap these animals with permission from the landowner.

Citizens should avoid throwing any type of feed or food scraps in the alleys or around their home as this will attract animals, including feral hogs.

If you spot a feral hog on your property, the Game Warden advised the best action is to return to or remain inside your home and avoid any contact.

to instill a longer life.

"For the airport the biggest accomplishment was the reworking of the primary runway. It was converted from asphalt to concrete giving it many years of life for airplanes landing in Big Spring, bigger airplanes in our expansion. It carries into the fact that as we grow and increase the amount of traffic and the type of planes we would like to have land here we can be accommodating. It will add to the business and aspect of tourism in Big Spring," Col. Jim Little said.

The industry growth in Big Spring is connected closely to the airpark and the connection it brings for importing and exporting. The City of Big Spring has quality roadways, the interstate in and out — in all directions, along with the airpark. As Col. Little mentioned, for a town the size of Big Spring, the capability for transport with the inclusion of the airpark leads to a lot of development potential.

"The airport, in my opinion, still has a tremendous amount of potential," Col. Little said. "There is no end to the development I see it can do. There are some interesting challenges with the buildings on the airpark — built in the 40s."

Upon arriving in Big Spring, Col. Little had retired from two other career ventures, including his time in the United States Air Force. Serving his nation and serving his community is one of the foundations of his work.

"... I made a decision, based on the investment that the government had given to me with my training I decided I still had something I owed the country," Col. Little said. "I stayed in and got involved in a very interesting career field, and then when I came here a similar thing happened here ... they asked me if I wanted to run for the position, I said yes, and well, here we are 18 years later."

While serving as airpark director, Col. Jim Little was nominated for and was the recipient of the General Aviation Airport Manager of the Year award. The nomination highlighted the numerous accomplishments, in addition to the runway renovations, such as his contributions in the building of the McMahon/Wrinkle Airport Air Terminal — built in 2001, his maximizing the usage of the facilities located on the old Webb Air Force Base grounds bringing it to an occupancy rate of 95%, helping to establish the Hangar 25 Air Museum honoring the historic past of the Big Spring Bombardier Base/ Webb AFB. In addition to the physical additions and support of the airpark, Col. Little was also instrumental in drawing visitors to the airpark with the Prairie Dog Fly-in, the Hang Gliding and World Championship which brings hundreds of people to the airpark, as well as the Young Eagles Flights.

According to Darden, the Airpark Director position has been posted and is an active search. The goal is to have the position filled by the end of the year, but in the interim a team of city staff, including Darden, will be overseeing operations at the airpark.

"We are blessed to have Jim Little in this community. He chose to build his family and his life here ... without him there are some of these projects that may not have happened without him," Darden said. "We will miss him, and we wish him well."

As Col. Little steps into his next chapter, he is appreciative of all the support he has been given and is looking forward to having time to travel and make new memories with his family. While he is looking forward to taking more ad-

ventures, he is going to continue to reside in Big Spring. He even leaves a piece of advice for the one to follow after him:

"Take advantage of the opportunities that are there." I'm saying that from a lot of different perspectives. The fact that we have that out there ... if we let it sit dormant then it doesn't do anyone any good," Col. Little said. "We do have a lot of acreage to work with, intersection of major highways, rail spur ... there is no end to the opportunities that we have; it's just the matter of looking for them and taking advantage of them."

The 350 Cafe and Convenience Store

Highway 350 runs between Big Spring and Snyder. About midway between the two cities is a small place called Vincent, founded in 1892 and named for an early settler, Vincent Vinson.

Steve Wolf, whose family has ranches in the region for generations, built a fine café and convenience store a few years ago. It's easy to spot as you drive along. A big sign reads HIGHWAY 350 CAFÉ. Steve says it's 25 miles to Big Spring, 25 miles to Snyder. "We sit right in the middle. I still live on the old home place. I grew up about five miles north-east of the café."

When I visited the place the cooks were passing out samples of fresh peanut butter cookies. A customer had just been delivered his special sandwich. "It's just scrambled eggs," he said. "I get

one every Tuesday and Thursday." He said he drinks about 26 glasses of iced tea every day and is never thirsty.

I was there mid-morning so I missed the early morning round table discussion which draws a number of locals and a few curiosity seekers, truck drivers, oil field hands and cowboys. "This is the table of knowledge," says Steve. "We gather here at 7 o'clock every morning and solve all the world's problems. If you sit down here, you can expect to get smarter. We once had a rule that if you didn't know what you were talking about you didn't need to bring it up. We had to change the rule or we wouldn't have anything to talk about."

Steve built the facility because he felt the community needed a place like this. "My grandparents were the first ones that opened a store here, so it's kind of history repeating itself."

It's a busy place. Around mealtimes there are pickups and different kinds of rigs and vehicles parked nearly

all the way around the building. Steve says business is better than it has ever been. "The oil field is good to us out here. You would not believe how many people live in the Snyder and Ira area that travel all the way to Midland to work."

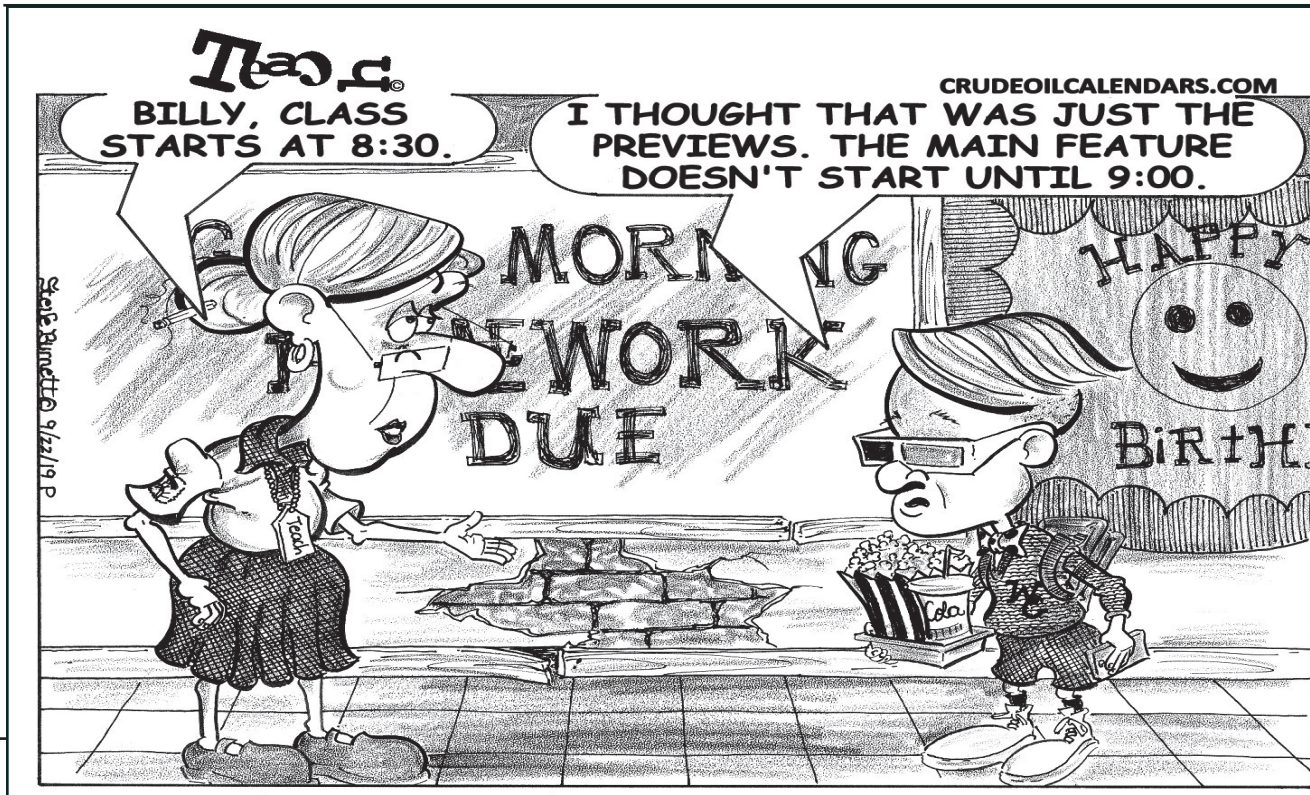
Customers appreciate the quality of the food served at the café. "When we set this up we wanted to try to make everything ourselves. We cut our steaks and tenderize them in the back; nothing is pre-breaded until we get ready to cook it. One of our favorite menu items is chicken fried steak."

Sometimes on Wednesdays we have Mexican chicken fried steak. Chicken strips are good and all our desserts are homemade."

I could not resist. I had to have a piece of the millionaire pie. Delicious.

Steve opened his café and store five years ago.

"There's a lot of stuff that goes on here that I had to learn about. But one thing for sure, I've met a lot of good people and they become family, so we now have a larger family."

Big Spring Steers roll in Home Opener against Lubbock High cruise to 49-10 victory

On what they could only describe as a perfect night, the Big Spring Steers had their home opener for this 2021 football season this Friday night. The Steers were looking to keep the momentum rolling after a week one victory over the Vernon Lions. On this Friday night, they took on the Lubbock Westerners. The Steers were looking for what they may call a payback game as the Lubbock Westerners beat the Steers last year handily. Well, the Steers did just that as they put a beating on the Lubbock High Westerners 49 to 10.

This Friday night was all about the Steers. This team played a perfect game on both the offensive side and the defensive side of the ball. The Steers started this game out on fire. On the very first drive of the game, they forced a fumble on the Westerner's offense. Once the Steers got the ball, they wasted little time as it was only two plays before it was then, in my mind, the best QB in the entire district that scored on his first TD run of the game. If you're not sure who I'm referring to, that would be one Gabriel Baeza, who scored the first TD of the game as he carried the ball across the goal line, making this an early

7-0 lead for Big Spring. The Lubbock High Westerners would fight back as they drove down and scored to tie this game up 7-7. The Lubbock defense stepped up again as they would hold the Steers to a punt. After the punt, the team from Lubbock drove down the field and put up a goal to take the lead 10-7 with 2:07 left in the first quarter. It would be the Lubbock High Westerners that took that had the lead after one-quarter of play 10-7.

The Steers started the onslaught in this quarter of play. It began when Baeza scored a TD with 8:46 left in the second quarter, making this a 14-10 game. The Steers' defense would then step up in the second quarter as they controlled the Lubbock offense, never allowing them to get into a groove. After getting the ball back, the Steers wanted to add on to their lead. The Steers' offense needed plays in bunches to work down the field with only a couple of minutes left in half. That is just what they did; they steadily worked the ball down the field until they lined up at their 12-yard line with only 7 seconds left in the first half. Baeza found Eli Cobos to score again, making this a 21-10 game at halftime.

When the Steers went into halftime, enjoying a 21-10 lead. While for some teams, this may be a comfortable lead, it was not for Big Spring. The

Steers kept the pressure on. On Lubbock's second drive of the quarter, the Steers forced a massive fumble in which they recovered. They took that fumble recovery and scored relatively quickly. Baeza had another TD pass to his favorite WR, Keagan Mitchell. Mitchell jumped up and made a fantastic catch for this TD that turned the game into a 28-10 lead with 5:47 to play in the third quarter. The Steers' defense came up once again as they stopped the Westerners and forced another punt. Once again, the Big Spring offense methodically moved the ball down the field, again picking this Lubbock defense apart. It would be the Steers that tacked on another TD as superstar QB Gabriel Baeza punched in another rushing TD from 1 yard away, making this a 35-20 lead with only 1:19 left in the third quarter. The third quarter of play ended with your Big Spring Steers in control of the action by leading 35-10.

As the fourth quarter of play began, the Steers had a healthy lead and just looked to control the clock and get out of this game healthy and with a win. It was the Steers' defense that shined in this quarter, as on Lubbock's first drive of the last quarter, it would be Keagan Mitchell who came up with an interception. The do-everything player would return the INT for a TD only to have it called back for hold-

ing during the return. The Steers then turned that INT into points, any way. It was Baeza finding WR Keagan Mitchell for a 39-yard TD pass, making this officially a blowout at a score of 42-10. However, the Steers would not be done. It would be the defense that accounts for the last TD of the night when LB Rickey Escovedo intercepted a pass and returned it for a 62-yard touchdown, officially putting the nail in the coffin as the score was now 49-10.

The Steers played a complete game from start to finish and on both sides of the ball this Friday. They showed off for the home crowd. It was a magnificent performance by QB Gabriel Baeza. He had 15 carries for 72 yards and 3 TD, 30/46 passing for 361 yards, and another 3 TD. That means the QB accounted for six total TD on the night. It was indeed a fantastic performance from the young man. Eli Cobos had an excellent game as he had eight catches for 119 yards with a TD, and he also kicked all seven extra points in the night. This was a fantastic performance by the young Steers. They are now 2-0 and in the young season and will travel to Monahan's next week to take on a dangerous Lubbock team who is also 2-0. This will be a big test for the Steers, a test I feel they are ready

Miles must be thinking what it has to do to score on Coahoma. For the second consecutive year in this battle of the Bulldogs, Coahoma pitched a shut-out, hammering Miles 54-0 in the home-opener for Coahoma. Last season Coahoma won the contest 49-0.

Coming off a 35-14 loss to Forsan last week, Coahoma made improvements by leaps and bounds. For one thing, none of their drives stalled in scoring position. Another thing the Coahoma special teams played much better.

Coahoma scored on all six of its possessions in the first half, taking a 40-0 lead into the half. Sophomore quarterback Billy Bailey tossed four touchdown passes in the half, two to Arian Emerson and one each to Rance Redden and Austin Perkins. Ky Kemper threw another touchdown pass to Perkins and Brysen Kerby scored the other first half touchdown on a 33-yard run.

The Coahoma offense offense outgained Miles 308-65 in the first half. Kerby was the workhorse on the ground gaining 121 on 11 carries in the half.

Bailey completed 6 of 11 passes for 133 yards. Perkins had a monster game. In addition to catching three passes for 91 yards, he also intercepted two passes.

The Coahoma defense controlled things by stopping the run and applying heavy pressure on Miles quarterback Hayden Johnson. Nose guard Bryan Martinez, defensive tackle Kobe Cervantes and linebacker Nick Tuttle constantly harassed Johnson and fellow linebacker Isaiah Eleda recorded Coahoma's only sack of the game to go along with a blocked punt. In the second half Eleda was all the offense Coahoma needed, running for touchdowns of 55 and 41 yards.

The kicking game was much better than last week. Perkins, who wasn't the punter last week, averaged 35 yards on his punts and place kicker Reagan Chapman was successful on six of eight extra point attempts.

Coahoma, 1-1 for the season, will be on the road Friday against Eldorado at 7 p.m.

This week's reviews are large-print Western and non-fiction books.

Walt Hodge had delivered 80 horses to Whipple Barracks for the Army and he wasn't in a big hurry to get home in *Showdown in Gun Town* (LP W PAI L) by Lauran Paine. He traveled down the Saginaw Mountains and into the upland cow country of Sunflower, Arizona, seeking only a cold glass of beer, food, and a bed for himself, along with feed for his horse.

He should have listened and turned around when he asked the hostler what was going on and was told: "Trouble, mister. Bad trouble."

After he had a drink, surrounded by silent cowmen, he discovered why the town of Sunflower was so unusually quiet and empty. He had walked into the middle of an emerging range war over water rights in the middle of a blistering summer. Being mistaken as one of Jim Bricker's B-Back-to-Back men annoyed Walt, but being knocked out by a Bricker rider, who said Walt was a Mike Weedon man, was just more than he could take.

Then he met Bricker's daughter. It doesn't take long for Hodge to find himself in the middle of

things once he is blamed for the killing of a Bricker man. By the time the war is over, three men are dead, the town of Sunflower finds its self-respect, and a jailhouse is full of demoralized cowmen.

The town marshal of Beaumont in *Black Bonanza* (LP W SCO L) by Leslie Scott, was in the habit of advising its citizens: "After dark, walk in the middle of the street and tote guns. And tote 'em in your hands, not on your hips, so everybody can see you're loaded." It was advice worth heeding, for Beaumont was a wild and woolly town.

Spindletop was in; and roughs, toughs, petty thieves, gamblers, soldiers of fortune and professional gunslingers rubbed elbows and took advantage of the oil strike.

When he signed up to be sheriff of this dirty little boomtown, Aaron Mackey knew he was asking for trouble in *Get out of Town* (LP W MCC T) by Terrance McCauley. Once, when Mackey was the U.S. marshal for the whole Montana Territory, he swore no job could get any harder. But that was before he took down a few of the bank-robbing Hancock and incurred the wrath of the gang's maniacal matriarch, Mad Nellie Hancock.

And that was before every avenging outlaw and hired henchmen came crawling out of the woodwork to kill him in the meanest, bloodiest showdown the town had ever seen. Aaron Mackey knows you can't fight city hall, but you can flush out every kill-crazy outlaw, greedy grifter, and boomtown rat.

Jesus and History: How We Know His Life and Claims (232.9 WAT S) by Steven Waterhouse examines the historical background of the four Gospels. Can we identify their authors and dates, or were they later forgeries? Are the people and

places in the Gospels historical or mythological? Did Jesus do the miracles and make the claims attributed to him, or did early Christians exaggerate his life? Who is he?

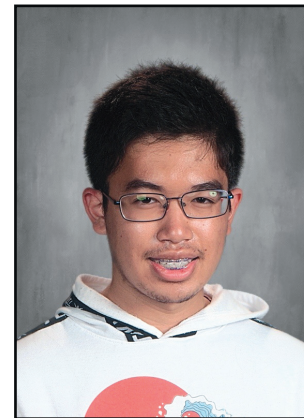

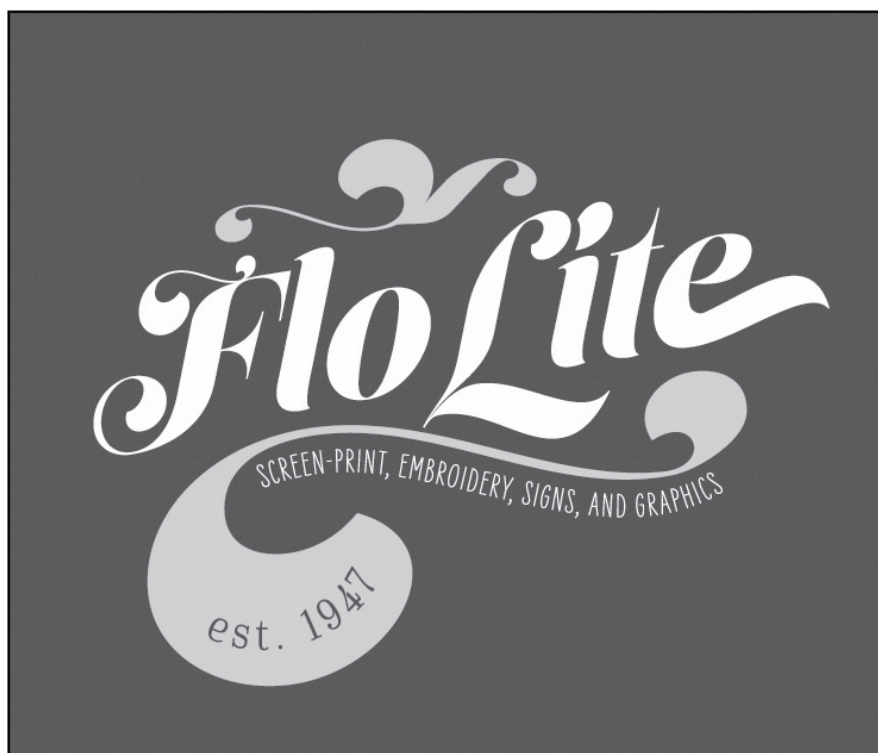
Business ownership may not be easy, but if it is a passion that one has, Kelter encourages you to step out and take the leap.

US hiring slows to just 235,000 jobs after 2 strong months

WASHINGTON (AP) — America's employers added just 235,000 jobs in August, a surprisingly weak gain after two months of robust hiring at a time when the delta variant's spread has discouraged some people from flying, shopping and eating out.

The August job gains the government reported Friday fell far short of the big gains in June and July of roughly 1 million a month. Those

increases were revised higher by a combined 134,000. The gains in June and July followed widespread vaccinations that allowed the economy to reopen from pandemic restrictions.

Still, the number of job openings remains at record levels, and hiring is expected to stay solid in the coming months. Although hiring was relatively tepid in August, the unemployment rate dropped to 5.2% from 5.4% in July.

Friday's report provided numerous

signs that the delta variant depressed job growth last month. The sectors of the economy where hiring was weakest were mainly those that require face-to-face contact with the public.

Hiring in a category that includes restaurants, bars and hotels, for example, sank to zero after those sectors added roughly 400,000 jobs in June and July. With COVID cases having spiked this summer, Americans have been buying fewer plane tickets and reducing hotel stays. Restaurant din-

ing, after having fully recovered in late June, has declined to about 10% below pre-pandemic levels.

The slowdowns in travel and dining out meant that employers had less reason to add jobs in those areas. And many job hunters were likely reluctant to take public-facing jobs as the delta variant has spread.

Health care and government employers also cut jobs in August. Construction companies lost 3,000 jobs despite strong demand for new homes.

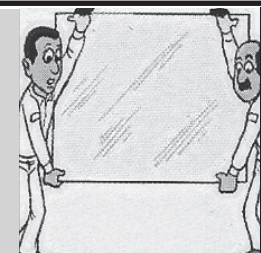

When West discards a diamond at trick two, South realizes that trying to establish dummy's clubs is sure to lead nowhere, and he therefore opts for a crossruff. Accordingly, he trumps a diamond in dummy at trick three, then ruffs a club, a diamond, a club and another diamond, producing this position with the lead in dummy:

Declarer now leads a low club from dummy, ruffing with the heart eight after East discards a spade. Next comes a spade to dummy's ace, followed by another club. There is no way East can prevent South from scoring his now-singleton king of hearts, and the contract is home. Observe that adopting the crossruff allows South to get the maximum mileage out of his trump suit. He scores the ace of spades, the ace of clubs and eight separate trump tricks!

Greens and grains are the recipe for a healthy salad

Quinoa has long been a mainstay of healthy cooking and is an important component of vegan cuisine. Quinoa is rich in protein and fiber and has various

vitamins and B minerals. Quinoa also is a complete protein, which means it has all of the essential amino acids in the amounts the body needs.

While quinoa is technically not a grain (its grains are the seeds or fruits of cereal grasses), it often is treated as a grain and classified as a "pseudo-cereal." Encyclopedia Britannica utilizes that term to describe non-grasses that people consume as if they were traditional grains.

The Whole Grains Council even classifies quinoa as a whole grain due to its method of preparation and nutrient profile.

Quinoa can be delicious in many forms and be an alternative to rice, pasta, couscous and other grains in cooking.

Try this "Green Quinoa Salad" from "Plant-Based Gourmet: Vegan Cuisine for the Home Chef" (Apollo) by Frances Gordon.

Green Quinoa Salad

Makes 6 to 8 servings as a side, or 4 lunch portions

Quinoa mix: 12 ounces white quinoa, rinsed and dried

1 tablespoon coconut oil

1 teaspoon whole coriander seeds
Pinch sea salt

Salad: 3 cups spinach, hand torn

3 stalks celery, diced

1 stalk from a fennel bulb, diced

1 green bell pepper, diced

1 large cucumber, diced with skin left on

1 1/2 avocados, diced
1 medium parsnip, peeled and diced

1/2 white onion, thinly sliced and chopped

1/2 cup chopped fresh cilantro

1/4 cup chopped fresh Italian parsley

1/4 cup chopped fresh dill

1 jalapeño, diced (with seeds if more heat desired)

2 garlic cloves, crushed and minced

10 basil leaves, chopped

2 tablespoons sesame seeds, toasted

1 tablespoon freshly ground black pepper

Dressing: 1/2 avocado

2 tablespoons extra virgin olive oil

1 tablespoon fresh lime juice

1/2 teaspoon salt

1/4 teaspoon ginger powder

1. Combine the quinoa and coconut oil in a saucepan over medium-low heat and cook, stirring, to gently toast until the color of the grain darkens slightly, about 2 to 3 minutes.

2. Add the coriander seeds, sea salt, and 4 cups room temperature water and bring

to a boil, then reduce the heat, cover, and simmer for 10 minutes. Uncover and simmer for another 5 minutes.

3. Combine all the salad ingredients in a large bowl. Let the quinoa cool for 15 minutes, then add to the bowl and toss to help wilt the salad greens. Mix well.

4. Combine all the dressing ingredients in a blender and pulse to combine. Then transfer to a small mason jar or salad dressing bottle with a tight-fitting lid. Shake vigorously until it looks creamy, then toss with the salad.

5. Let cool at room temperature, then chill for at least 1 hour before serving.

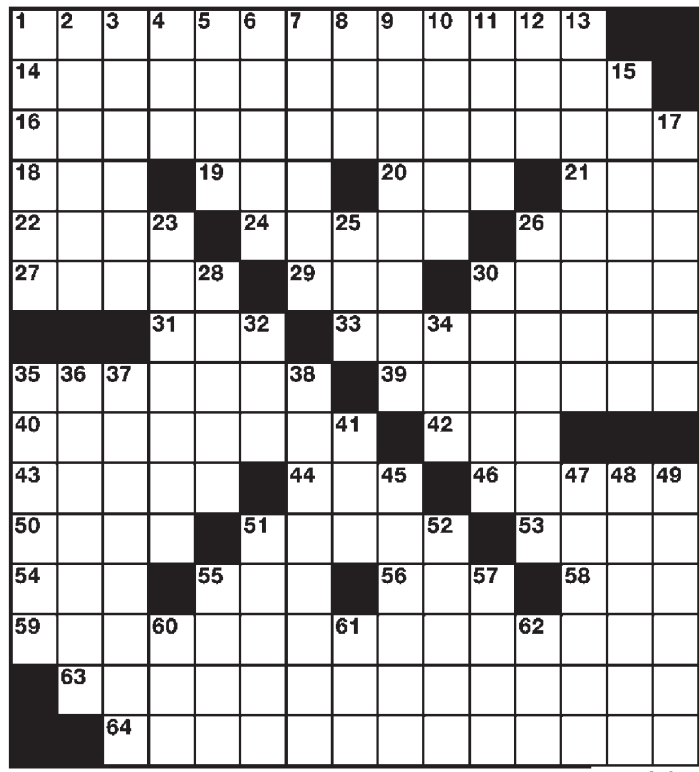

For the third of Lifetime's drama movies about Prince Harry and wife Meghan Markle, it helped that the two stars had worked together before.

Jordan Dean and Sydney Morton appeared in a stage-musical version of "American Psycho," but they clearly have much different roles in "Harry & Meghan: Escaping the Palace," which the cable network debuts Monday, Sept. 6. The film recounts the massively reported split by the Duke and Duchess of Sussex from their family, encompassing their candid, much-watched interview with Oprah Winfrey ... in which Meghan revealed that her strong feeling of isolation drove her to suicidal thoughts during her first pregnancy. (The couple welcomed their second child in June.)

Previously seen in the series "Manifest" and "She's Gotta Have It," pleasant actress Morton allows that she "never really got those comments, and I never thought it about myself" regarding any resemblance to Meghan. "Then, a friend of mine said to me, 'You know, you kind of look like Meghan Markle. Has anyone ever told you that?' And I said, 'No!' And a week later, I got this audition, so I have to believe my friends manifested it for me."

Morton, who spent time in England as a Royal Academy of Dramatic Art student, credits the movie's "incredible hair and makeup team, and the wardrobe

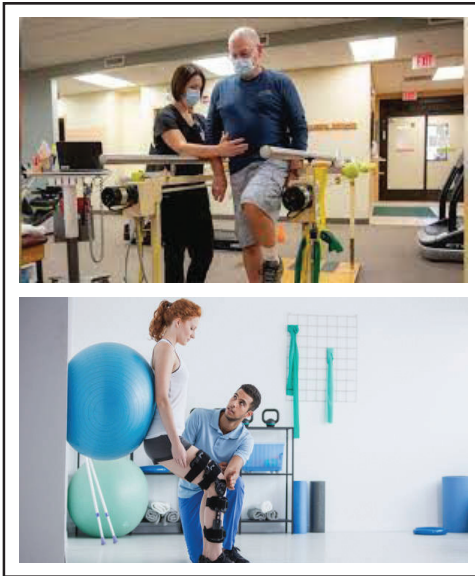
people" with giving her even more of Meghan's look. She notes she also "had so much material to help me get her body language and mannerisms down."

Having another friend play Harry to her Meghan proved to be an immense help to Morton, also a singer-dancer who starred in a touring production of "Flashdance." She laughs, "What are the odds?," about being cast again opposite Dean. "You hope that you'll connect with your scene partner, and I already knew that I could, so we were very excited that we got to do this together."

Lifetime will repeat its first two movies in the franchise, "Harry & Meghan: A Royal Romance" and "Harry & Meghan: Becoming Royal," as well as "William & Kate" immediately before "Escaping the Palace" premieres. Morton realizes that with Meghan having been an actress - notably on the series "Suits" - there's an extra challenge to being a performer playing someone who also is a performer.

"There is professional Meghan giving a statement, then there are those moments where you can tell she's more vulnerable or caught off-guard," Morton reasons. "I definitely think that as her time in the palace went on, we got to see more and more of her vulnerability coming out in interviews. I could identify with her presenting the version of herself that she wanted to, and also the version that is the 'real' Meghan."

It's the Bucs vs. the 'Boys on Kickoff Thursday on NBC

Nothing gets the adrenaline flowing like the beginning of football season.

The good teams can't wait to get another shot at a Super Bowl ring, the not-so-good teams are hoping an offseason influx of talent can change their fortunes and fans are just psyched to have their NFL Sundays back.

Broadcasters are getting on their game faces, too. That includes NBC's Michele Tafoya, who will be reporting from the sidelines on Thursday, Sept. 9, when Tom Brady and the Tampa Bay Buccaneers begin defense of their Super Bowl LV crown when they usher in the 2021 season against Dak Prescott and the Dallas Cowboys. Al Michaels and Cris Collinsworth will call the action from Raymond James Stadium in Tampa, Fla., on what has become known as "Kickoff Thursday."

"That Thursday opener is special," Tafoya says. "It's a day during the week when there isn't normally football and it's that very first game and it's prime time and it's, you know, the Super Bowl champs. So yes, it feels like a special edition game for us."

It will be special for the teams on the field as well. For the Bucs, they're returning all 22 starters from the team that defeated the Kansas City Chiefs in February for the franchise's second league title. They also have a deep roster, a relatively easy 2021 schedule and of course, Brady, the seemingly ageless

44-year-old quarterback with seven Super Bowl titles on his resume.

"This one in particular was the cherry on top," Tafoya says, "and that's why it kind of seems like he's just got this attitude of, you know, 'What have I got to lose? I'm playing at a high level. I continue to play at a high level. I continue to outperform every expectation and I feel great. So why stop now?' And ... he's got (tight end) Rob Gronkowski back into his usual mode of playing,

and it's just been really fascinating to watch and something we've never seen before, which makes it historic."

For the talented Cowboys, they're just looking to put a dreadful 6-10 2020 season behind them, one that saw them lose quarterback Prescott for the season after he suffered a fractured ankle in Week 5.

"That loss of Dak Prescott last year was not just, 'OK, our quarterback's out,'" Tafoya explains. "You know, he's really the face of the franchise ... and it hurt kind of the soul of that football team to see him leave the field so emotionally the way he did. And so I think they're just so ready to start this season and do what they believe they can do.

"And they're Dallas," she continues. "You know, whether you love them or hate them, everyone's interested and it's always a blast to cover the Cowboys. Always."

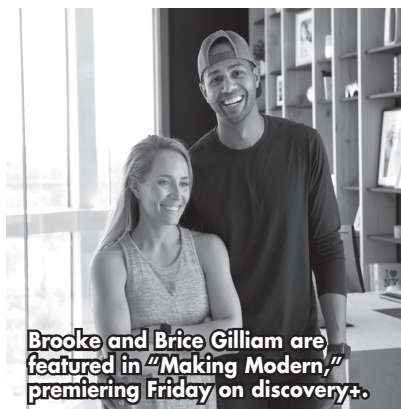
A couple moonlight as home designers in 'Making Modern'

He's into form. She's about function. Together they're a husband-and-wife team that's "Making Modern" in a home design series upcoming on discovery+.

Premiering Friday, Sept. 10, the half-hour streaming series follows Brooke and Brice Gilliam as they create beautiful and functional living spaces for their Nashville clientele, who typically are looking to add a little panache to a newly purchased home, be it with a new bathroom, a remodeled living area or just better-configured storage spaces.

And this is a couple with complementary skills, as Brice, who by day is an orthodontist, has an eye for design, while Brooke, who holds down a job as a pharmaceutical rep, has the construction know-how. "He has to visualize what someone's smile will be as a final result before he ever starts," she says, "and that's how he has to learn to – you know, where to place the brackets and what to do with the wires and all that stuff that I don't understand. And so he says it's similar. It seems like it's very different but he says it's similar and so I guess he has it. So he's not formally trained but it definitely comes naturally to him."

'NCIS' makes the move to a new night

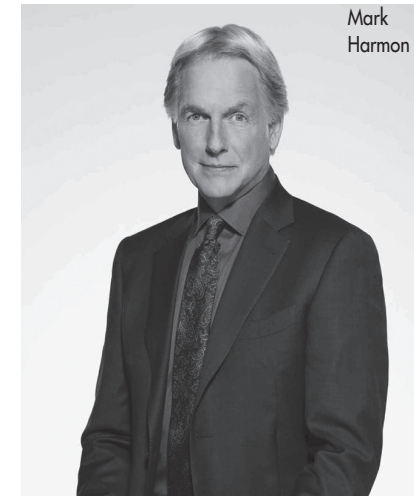
As for "NCIS," which reportedly will feature Harmon on a limited basis in its upcoming 19th year, it moves to Mondays on CBS starting Sept. 20 – as the logical lead-in to "NCIS: Hawai'i," which debuts that night with Vanessa Lachey as the leader of that investigative unit. However, "NCIS: Los Angeles" will remain on Sundays, where it will start its 13th season Oct. 10.

Q: I enjoy Caterina Scorsone on "Grey's Anatomy," and I know she played a psychic detective on another series. What was that show called? – Sandy Bain, Buffalo, N.Y.

A: It was "Missing," which was filmed in the actress' native Canada and ran on Lifetime from 2003 to 2006. Scorsone played Jess Mastriani, whose visions of missing people – acquired after she literally was struck by lightning – proved very helpful to FBI agents seeking the individuals in question.

"ER" alum Gloria Reuben played Jess' partner during the show's first season, then Vivica A. Fox succeeded her for the remainder of the series' run. Other cast members included Justina Machado (later of the "One Day at a Time" reboot) in Season 1 and Mark Consuelos, current "Riverdale" co-star and husband of Kelly Ripa, in the second and third "Missing" rounds.

Was the move of "My Life Is Murder" from Australia to Auckland, New Zealand, for Season 2 a product of the pandemic?

Yes, and a product of me wanting to show off my hometown. Part of the promise to the audience is that we will take you somewhere beautiful. You know, drop you into a new environment and we'll solve crimes together. And I have always wanted to, A, play someone like myself and B, show people my hometown. I'm so in love with it and I think it's just beautiful and I think this is the right show because the city is a character in our show. It's a delightful place.

Among the guest stars this season is William Shatner. How did you like working with him?

Ah, he's a delight. He's super quirky and unapologetic. He's a little bit like a male Alexa and he's really, really adventurous – you know, creatively adventurous and adventurous in his real life and vital. I just heard he's swimming with sharks for Shark Week, so that's Bill, that does not surprise me a bit. He's 90 and I cannot believe he's 90.

What kind of character does he play on your show?

A flirty one, definitely. Nothing new (laughs).

How much room do you have for improv within scenes?

You can't mess around with the scenes too much because a murder has to – you have to lay out the close-up and the audience could – could – figure it out for themselves if they're observant enough. That's part of the deal. You know, you're not throwing the MacGuffin at the end Whatever, the fans have to have all the pieces available to figure it out themselves. And to do that in 45 minutes and to throw them all the personal story and bread-baking and stuff is quite tricky. You know, you have to pare it right down to make it satisfying and doable and just to honor your audience.

Send summer out in style with a clambake

For the seafood lover, there is nothing quite as satisfying as a clambake.

Be it with lobster, shrimp, mussels, various filets of fish or, of course, everyone's favorite mollusk, the sight of a pile of seafood steaming over a large pot of water and its accompanying aromas are enough to get the taste buds at attention and the mouth watering. It truly is a feast for the senses.

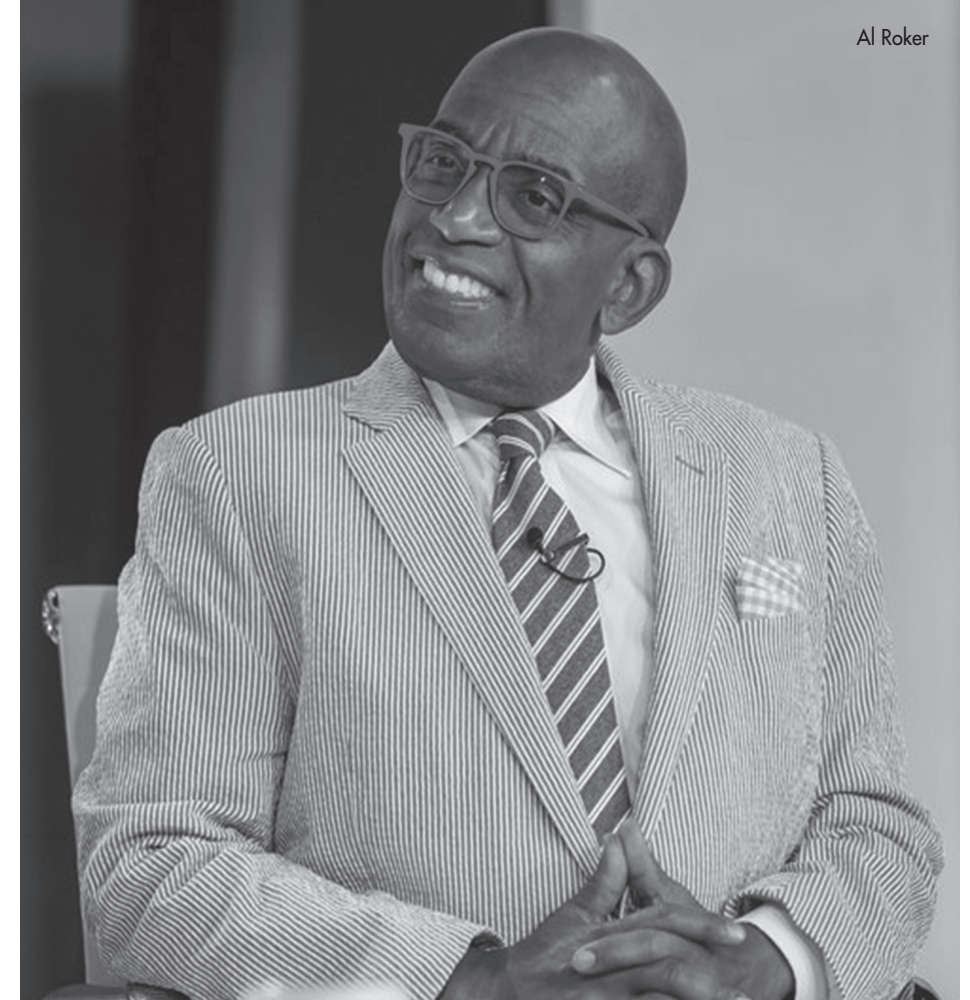
So if you're at a loss for what to do for your next dinner party in the coming weeks, try out a clambake, outdoors or in. It's easier than you think, especially with the guidance of the following online videos.

In a clip from NBC's "Today" (www.youtube.com/watch?vlXY2KDrGmpc), Al Roker departs from his usual weather beat to show how to do a traditional New England clambake with clams, lobster, shrimp, corn, potatoes, kielbasa, onions, white wine and various seasonings in a large pot. He also demonstrates the critical prep work that needs to be done (rinsing the sand from the clams; removing the beards from the mussels) before they go in the water.

On the "Cooking Everything Outdoors Show" (www.youtube.com/watch?vW1A7uGhk9Qw), Greg from Ballistic BBQ proves you don't need to live near a beach to produce an authentic clambake. Here, he employs his Weber Kettle in which he alternates layers of charcoal and rocks to produce radiant heat. On top of that goes seaweed, which serves as the bed on which the clams, mussels, lobster, corn and other ingredients will roast, covered by another layer of seaweed. Remove from heat and serve. It looks impressive and likely tastes even more so.

If the weather outside isn't so great, New England chef Jasper White shows how you can take the production indoors in this video from Epicurious (www.youtube.com/watch?vvQFGehieNF8), in which he adapts a traditional clambake for the kitchen stove. Here, he puts his seafood, potatoes, chorizo, corn and other ingredients in a bag with his own secret ingredient, an egg, and steams in a pot of water. Fifteen minutes later, you have a New England clambake for four. Dining at its finest.

For sheer volume, you can't beat the Maine clambake in this video from Mark Wiens (www.youtube.com/watch?vZTHGlfvqf4). Here, hops a boat to Cabbage Island in Booth Bay to partake in a clambake consisting of 298 lobsters, plus piles of clams, corn, potatoes, onions, eggs and other ingredients, cooked in traditional seaweed. It's an experience that's open to anyone willing to pay the \$69 charge for the meal and boat ride but make sure you make reservations early as there is a waiting list.

Brec Bassinger admits she's more comfortable in the skin, and costume, of "DC's Stargirl" now.

The young title star of the Tuesday adventure series - now in its second season on The CW - allows, "Going into Season 1, I was definitely intimidated, just walking onto such a big set and a role that I had never played before ... and specifically when it came to the physical stuff. I was a gymnast growing up, so I could do some of it."

However, when it came to the Cosmic Staff enabling teen Courtney Whitmore to become Stargirl, it was a different story for Bassinger: "I felt like I had two left feet. I was so uncoordinated with that thing. I'm 5'2" and that is 6', so I was always tripping over it. The amount of cameras and the amount of people I hit with it the first season ... it was not my brightest moment."

Others noticed a change when Bassinger began the show's second season. She reflects, "I would have hair and makeup people come up to me and say, 'Brec, your walk is different when you're Stargirl this year. I felt like I not only had a bigger confidence in Courtney, but more so in Stargirl - just how a superhero would walk, how to hold a six-foot staff, how to twist it around when we were doing fight scenes."

Still, that doesn't mean things always go smoothly for Stargirl, as Bassinger well knows. "She is so looking for villains, looking for trouble, because she just loves being a superhero so freaking much," the actress notes. "And it's fun to have that."

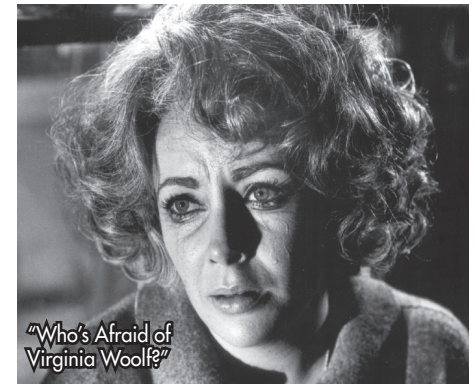

'Guardians' take offbeat approach to saving the galaxy

If you like your Avengers – as in “Marvel’s The Avengers” – rough around the edges, with more than a dash of genre-spoofing irony, welcome to “Guardians of the Galaxy.”

Since the Marvel machine was having such a grand time at the box office lately by holding true to its traditions, via such characters as Spider-Man and Captain America, it’s great that the company was willing in 2014 to have some fun with itself by bringing perhaps its least-traditional franchise to the screen. If Marvel’s other characters are the Cadillacs of superheroes, these are the DeLoreans. TNT shows the result Tuesday, Sept. 7, and Wednesday, Sept. 8.

Comprised of various species with a variety of skills, the Guardians are led by the roguish Peter Quill (Chris Pratt, in a neat variation on the not-as-cool-as-he-thinks-he-is image that the actor had perfected in such television ventures as “Parks and Recreation”).

Those under his lead include a green-hued killer (Zoe Saldana), a literal muscle man (Dave Bautista, of wrestling fame), a raccoon (with the voice of Bradley Cooper) and a single-minded walking tree (voiced by Vin Diesel).

The gang’s mission is to keep a power-granting orb away from a warlord (Lee Pace, “Pushing Daisies”) who wants to use it against a planet. The action never gets too slick for the film’s purposes, though the special effects are right on par with other genre entries.

Ultimately, it’s the attitude of “Guardians of the Galaxy” that makes all the difference. Pratt joked in interviews about his amazement that he was playing a commander of otherworldly beings, and that sensibility infuses his performance, always reinforcing that this is meant to be an offbeat Marvel.

This picture was such a success, it was inevitable that a sequel would follow, and that arrived in 2017. There’s been a bit of a wait for the third edition, but that’s expected to be on screens in 2023 (subject to change, of course, depending on how production may be affected by health circumstances).

One can anticipate that continuing franchise director James Gunn again will achieve the neat trick of keeping Round 3 part of a genre while also sending it up. There’s always a wink to the audience with anything that occurs in “Guardians of the Galaxy,” and that inclusiveness is key to its success ... and the reason that it was certain from the outset that the Guardians wouldn’t be making a one-time-only visit.

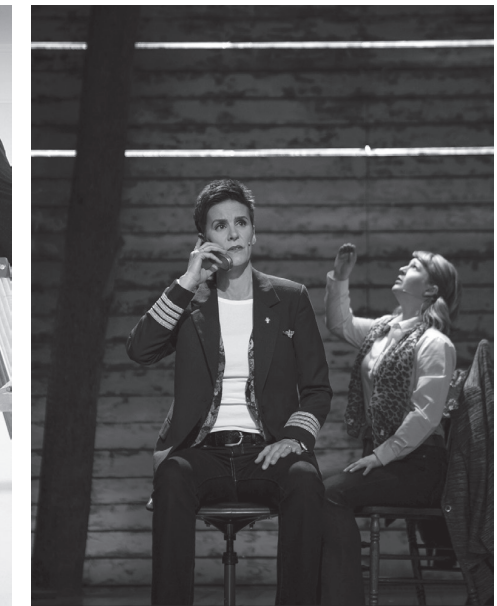

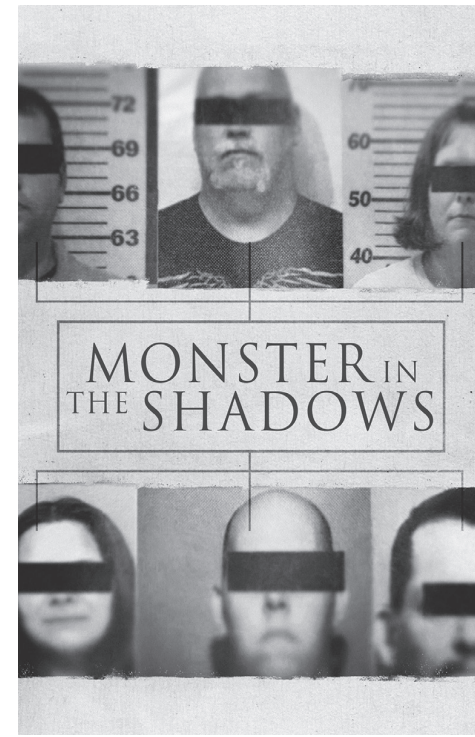

SARAH PAULSON

Sarah Catharine Paulson was born on Dec. 17, 1974, in Tampa, Fla. After her parents' divorce, she moved at a young age with her mother and sister to Maine, and then to New York. Almost immediately upon her graduation from high school, Paulson began her acting career, with an episode of "Law & Order" and the series "American Gothic" among her earliest credits.

"Levitation," "The Other Sister," "Held Up" and "What Women Want" were some of Paulson's first movies, and her association with producer Ryan Murphy began with a role on his series "Nip/Tuck." "Deadwood," "Leap of Faith" and "Studio 60 on the Sunset Strip" were other shows to feature Paulson during the same period, and she also appeared opposite Jessica Lange in a Broadway revival of "The Glass Menagerie."

After starring in a reboot of the series "Cupid" and playing roles on "Grey's Anatomy" and in such projects as the cable movie "Game Change" and the feature film "Martha Marcy May Marlene," Paulson did a guest role in the first season of the Murphy-produced anthology "American Horror Story" (which starred Lange). She then became part of the series' repertory company, featured in every season since (except Season 9, due to other commitments she had at the time).

In 2016, Paulson portrayed prosecutor Marcia Clark in the first season of Murphy's "American Crime Story," titled "The People v O.J. Simpson." She earned numerous honors including a Primetime



Emmy for the performance, then appeared for Murphy as actress Geraldine Page in the series "Feud: Bette vs. Joan." Paulson also was in the cast of the limited series "Mrs. America" and "Ratched," and her more-recent movies have included "Ocean's 8," "Bird Box," "Glass," "The Goldfinch" and "Run."

NASCAR revs up Cup playoffs at 'Track Too Tough to Tame'

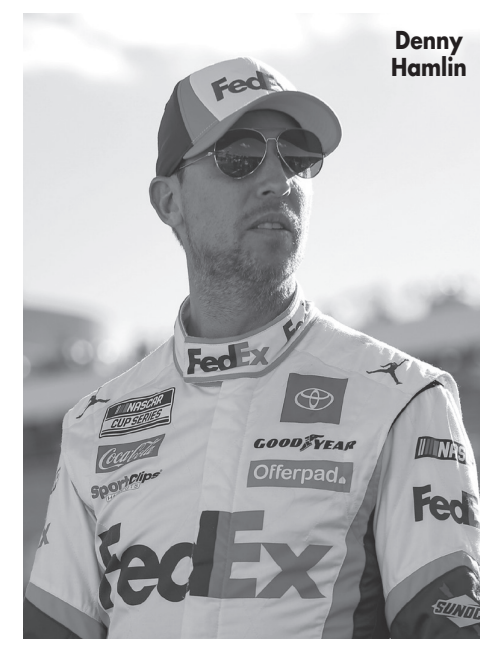
It's been dubbed "The Track Too Tough to Tame" and for the second year in a row Darlington Raceway will host the kickoff to the NASCAR Cup Series playoffs.

Sunday, Sept. 5, on NBC Sports Network, the Cook Out Southern 500 opens the stock car racing series' 10-race postseason on the 1.366-mile egg-shaped oval, so nicknamed because its ends have very different configurations that make effective car set-up (and thus handling) very challenging.

If past history is a guide, Denny Hamlin and Kevin Harvick are the drivers to watch in this race as each has three wins here. Hamlin's last victory came in May of last year in the Toyota 500, after holding off the field in a rain-shortened night affair. Harvick's last Darlington triumph came four months later in the Southern 500, starting off his playoff run with his eighth victory of 2020.

Hamlin, at this writing, was a lock for the playoffs while Harvick's status was still to be determined. Both are postseason regulars with a number of wins under their belt and Harvick won the Cup championship in 2014.

Looking ahead to the rest of the playoffs, Kyle Larson is in as good a position as anybody. As of mid-August, he had five wins in 2021 and was about 30 points ahead of the rest of the Cup field. The 2014 Cup Series Rookie of the Year has also been in the title mix in years past,

on the postseason schedule – Phoenix, Martinsville and Darlington. He also won the Cup title in 2017.

Never to be ignored is Kyle Busch. The tenacious Las Vegas native always finds a way to win, as proven by his 2015 and 2019 Cup titles, his 59 career Cup victories and his regular presence in the Series playoffs. This time of year is when he is usually at his best.

And don't sleep on Chase Elliott. He's the defending Cup champ and has

Muncy hefts a big stick for playoff-bound Dodgers



In the category of reclamation projects that became stars for the Los Angeles Dodgers, we present for your consideration Max Muncy.

Indeed in their All-Star first baseman, the Angelenos have a legitimate middle-of-the-order force who has gone from the proverbial outhouse to the penthouse in the space of five years and is now a big reason why the team is likely headed for another postseason appearance.

Selected in the fifth round by the Oakland A's in the 2012 MLB Draft, the Dallas-area native put up solid numbers in the A's system before being called up to the bigs in 2015. There, he floundered, hitting a combined .195 in 2015-16 with five home runs, 17 RBIs, a .290 on-base percentage and an unsightly .611 OPS in 96 games. After being designated for assignment just before the 2017 season, he was eventually released.

Signing a minor league deal with the Dodgers that year, he spent the season at Oklahoma City in the Pacific Coast League, retooled

his swing and surfaced with the Dodgers in 2018 a different hitter. He hit 35 homers in his first full year in Chavez Ravine in only 395 at-bats, to go along with a .263 average, a .391 on-base percentage and an OPS of .973.

A similar output followed in 2019, when he made his first All-Star appearance. His numbers fell off precipitously in the pandemic-abbreviated year of 2020, one that hurt a lot of players. But he's returned to his customary level of play this season, through mid-August hitting .272 with 25 homers, 69 RBIs, a .402 on-base percentage and a .952 OPS. He also earned his second All-Star berth.

Muncy and the Dodgers can be seen in action Sunday, Sept. 5, when they conclude a three-game series in San Francisco against the NL West rival Giants in a game airing on ESPN.

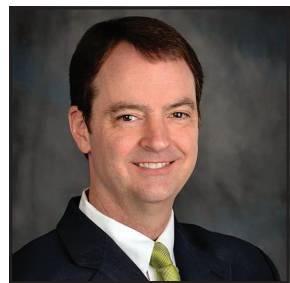
