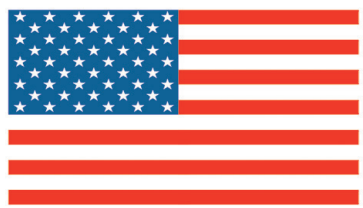

BSISD School Board to hear academic progress report Thursday

Report.

When they meet this evening, Big Spring ISD school board members will hear a report on how the district's students are progressing academically so far this school year.

The meeting will begin at 5:15 p.m. in the board room at Big Spring High School, 707 E. 11th Place.

Following the opening prayer and Pledge of Allegiance, a time will be provided for public commentary and a special recognition, after which the board will hear the Beginning of Year Academic

The board will also hear a report on the 2020-21 Annual Bilingual/English as a Second Language Program review and on the 2021 Texas English Language Proficiency Assessment System (TELPAS) assessment results. TELPAS is an assessment program for students in Texas public schools who are learning the English language.

Next, the board will consider the meeting's Consent Agenda, including approval of minutes of the regular school board meeting of Sept. 9, and monthly financial reports. Six action items are up for consider-

ation by the school board.

The board will consider action to approve a legal services agreement with the Underwood Law Firm for redistricting of the school district's single-member districts after the 2020 Federal Census.

The trustees will also consider nominating an individual to serve as a director on the Howard County Appraisal District's board of directors.

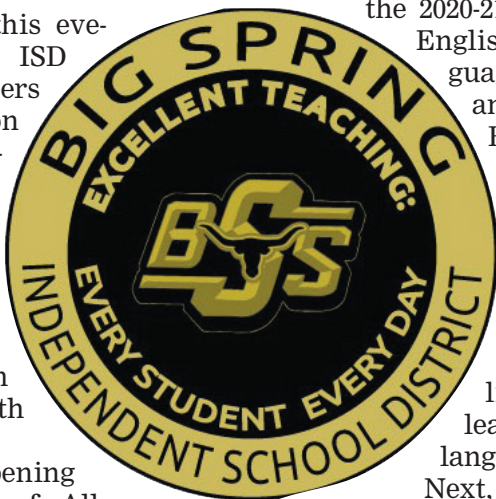
Next, an amendment to the district's budget will be up for consideration.

Employment recommendations will be discussed and voted on.

The school board will discuss and consider approval of personnel issues including employments, resignations, reassignments, duties, performance

Baeza named Mr. Texas Football

Big Spring Quarterback Gabriel Baeza is a superstar. There is no other way to put it.

Baeza is a senior for the Big Spring Steers, and he plays the most prominent position on the field; the quarterback. This week he received one of the most distinguished awards in high school football. Gabriel Baeza was elected Mr. Texas football player for his performance in week six of the 2021 football season.

On Oct. 1, Baeza led the Steers against the Littlefield Wildcats.

The game took place on the Steers home field, as Big Spring celebrated Senior Night. In addition to being recognized as a Senior player on the team Gabriel Baeza made history.

Gabriel wasted little time in the game getting started. On

the first drive of the game for the Steers, he easily ran the ball down the field, carving up the Wildcat defense both through the air and on the ground. He finished it off with a 10-yard touchdown run. His second touchdown was a 15-yard run in which he actually ran over a Littlefield defender. Baeza was just starting with his scoring, as he added a 15-yard touchdown pass to Eli Cobos. This marked his third touchdown of the game. For most, that is a game within itself. Not for Baeza, not on this night. His fourth touchdown of the night was a beautiful 49-yard bomb to Kaegen Mitchel. Touchdown number five came through the air when he connected with Isaiah Holloway for a 37-yard pass. His sixth touchdown, was another pass, but this time to Sa'Quan Fizer.

Baeza scored his seventh and final touchdown of the night with an eight-yard run in which, he ran over multiple Wildcat defenders. He led his team to a dominating victory of 45 to 29. This young man accounted for 532 yards of total offense, and seven touchdowns.

Baeza went 27 of 41 for 325 yards and four touchdowns through the air. He also had 18 carries for 207 yards and three more touchdowns on the ground.

It has been said, Baeza has a howitzer for an arm and is a bulldozer when he tucks the ball and runs. He has also been marked as the best quarterback to play at Big Spring since the Tannehill brothers, and that's saying a lot considering Ryan Tannehill is the starting quarterback for the Tennes-

Goliad Elementary encouraging community involvement through local partnerships

Responsibility, good citizenship, investing back into the community ... these are only a few of the lessons Goliad students are learning this semester. While the value system is being taught on a day to day basis, the lessons and interactions are expanding beyond the walls of the school and are stretching into the community. Senate hopeful Herschel Walker cancels event over swastika

ATLANTA (AP) — Georgia Republican U.S. Senate candidate Herschel Walker has called off a fundraiser in Texas because an organizer was displaying a swastika made of syringes in her social media profile to protest mandatory COVID-19 vaccination.

The Walker campaign said Wednesday that it had canceled the event, which had been scheduled for Saturday in suburban Dallas at the home of Bettina Sofia Viviano-Langlais.

"Herschel is a strong friend of Israel and the Jewish community and opposes hatred and bigotry of all forms," campaign spokesperson Mallory Blount said. "Despite the fact that the apparent intent behind the graphic was to condemn government vaccine mandates, the symbol used is very offensive and does not reflect the values of Herschel Walker or his campaign."

The campaign had earlier denied that the symbol

was a swastika.

"Herschel Walker defended a swastika, and canceling a fundraiser does not change the fact that he failed to condemn a hateful, anti-Semitic symbol." Georgia Democratic Party spokesperson Dan Gottlieb said in a statement.

Former President Donald Trump urged the football great and his longtime friend to enter the race for the Republican nomination against Democratic Sen. Raphael Warnock in 2022. Walker is running against three other Republicans, including Georgia state Agriculture Commissioner Gary Black.

The fundraiser required a \$500 donation to get in and \$5,800 for a VIP private reception. The Walker campaign said Monday that it had raised \$3.7 million in the quarter that ended Sept. 30.

Viviano-Langlais has been a movie producer and outspoken opponent of mandatory mask and vaccines. Published accounts indicate Viviano-Langlais hosted a "Texas is Now Open" mask burning at her house in Parker, Texas, in conjunction

with the GOP-leaning Dallas Jewish Conservatives in March after Texas Gov. Greg Abbott lifted the state's mask mandate

The syringe swastika has appeared in protests against vaccine mandates in other parts of the United States and world. Jewish groups have condemned the symbol.

Allison Padilla-Goodman, vice president of the southern division of the Anti-Defamation League, said the comparison of vaccines to Nazism has become "a common and callous tool for political gain."

"Those linking the atrocities committed by the Nazis to modern day public health policies must retract their shameless comparisons, take responsibility, and cease their exploitation of Jewish suffering as a political tactic," Padilla-Goodman said in a statement. "We're glad to see the fundraiser was canceled, and the behaviors of the host were denounced as offensive."

During the trip, students were educated on proper training, handling and care for pets. One of the main topics was strays and the importance of not feeding them.

"Everyone has the stigma of a shelter ...our shelter is very clean. We are very blessed," McMahan said. "We had the opportunity to have the students tour the shelter, and then we got a few of the animals out while they were there."

Over the next couple of months, until school lets out for the Christmas holiday, Goliad students will be visited by the Happy Day Humane Society mascot and enjoy two more field trips. The next field trip on Oct. 28 will be for the top three homeroom classes who has the highest weight in dog treats and in December, the 25 students with the highest AR points will be going. In addition, Happy Day has purchased books for the classrooms to help the students and teachers learn more about the bond that can be created between a rescue.

"The goal is to have the students understand that they are a part of the community. What we say here is 'together we are better, stronger, unstoppable' and when we work together with other people, not just our campus, but with the whole community we are making better people and a better community," Rosie Lain, Principal at Goliad, said. "It's to improve citizenship and scholars in our community and hopefully grows from there."

Since the partnership started, a couple of adoptions have taken place and bonds are starting to be formed between families and rescues. There were even a few volunteers – students, teachers and fami-

lies – who have stepped up.

"The engagement is not just here in the school. We don't stop at the walls of the school. We want our kids to be engaged in the community," Lain said.

McMahan encourages the community to be proactive and get dogs spayed or neutered. Those who are in need of help with training their pets, taking care of their pets and other issues that may arise, are encouraged to reach out to Happy Day.

"We want to let people know we are there as a resource. If you are having trouble feeding your animal, if you have a problem training, let us know; let us help. We want to help families be able to keep their pets," Andi Cervantez, lead kennel tech, said. "If you need help, come to us ... let us help. The answer is not just opening the door and letting them go. Give us a chance and let us be a resource."

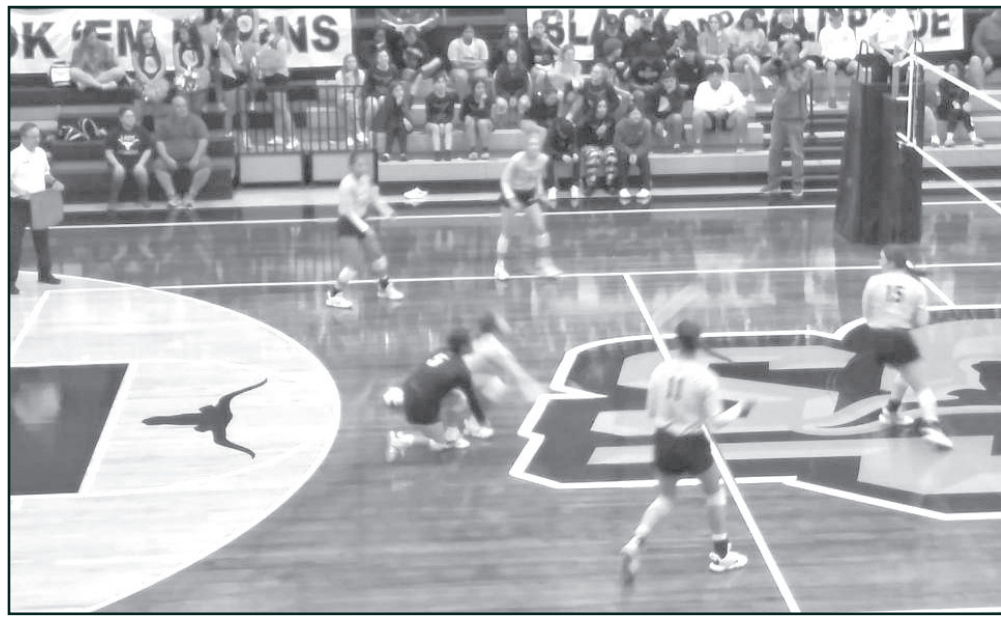

LEADING OFF: Dodgers-Giants in NLDS winner-take-all Game 5

A look at what's happening around the majors today:

A COAST TOASTY

Sooner than many baseball fans wanted, maybe, but the San Francisco Giants and the Los Angeles Dodgers will meet in a winner-take-all Game 5 of the NL Division Series at Oracle Park.

Logan Webb, who was dominant in winning the opener for the Giants, faces Julio Uriás, who led the majors with 20 victories and got the victory in Game 2.

At this point, both teams have posted 109 wins this season. Perhaps this matchup would've been even better in the NL Championship Series with a trip to the World Series at stake — no matter, Mookie Betts and the defending champion Dodgers are set to take on Buster Posey and the Giants.

"I think it's only fitting," Dodgers pitcher Walker Buehler said.

The longtime rivals who began playing each other in 1884 share a star-studded history of meeting in all-of-nothing games.

In the decisive Game 3 of a 1951 NL pennant tie-breaker, Bobby Thomson hit what many consider the most famous home run ever when he connected for the "Shot 'Heard Round the World," a three-run drive in the bottom of the ninth that lifted the New

York Giants over Jackie Robinson and the Brooklyn Dodgers 5-4 at the Polo Grounds.

The franchises had shifted to the West Coast when they played a best-of-three matchup for the 1962 NL pennant. After topping Los Angeles ace Sandy Koufax in the opener, San Francisco lost the next day. Mays then keyed a four-run rally in the ninth inning to win 6-4 in Game 3 at Dodger Stadium.

ON DECK

The wild-card Red Sox and the AL West champ Astros each ended their Division Series matchups in four games. Jose Altuve, Carlos Correa and their Houston teammates beat Boston 5-2 in the season series.

Neither team has announced its rotation for the best-of-seven series.

Boston manager Alex Cora will certainly draw a lot of attention in the lead-up to Game 1 Friday night.

Cora was Houston's bench coach when it won the 2017 World Series, then became the Red Sox manager and guided them to the 2018 championship. Cora was fired by the team and suspended by Major

League Baseball in 2020 for his role in the Astros' sign-stealing scandal and rehired for this season.

TOGETHER AGAIN

Fresh off a middle-of-the-pack performance at the plate, the Phillies hired Kevin Long as their hitting coach. The move reunites him with both manager Joe Girardi and star slugger Bryce Harper.

Philadelphia fired hitting coach Joe Dillon on the final day of the regular season. The Phillies finished second in the NL East at 82-80 and ranked seventh in the NL in runs and ninth in batting average.

The 54-year-old Long worked with Harper on the Nationals in 2018. Long was under Phillies manager Joe Girardi for seven years when they were with the Yankees and won the World Series in 2009.

"I have had a long-standing relationship with Kevin and have seen his work up close and in person for years," Girardi said. "I truly believe he is the best in the business and will have a huge impact on our offense."

Girardi and Long weren't quite so cordial during a game at Citizens Bank Park in late June. After then-Nationals star Max Scherzer was checked by umpires for sticky substances, Girardi and Long got into a shouting match.

Red Sox ride home run laundry cart to ALCS against Astros

BOSTON — It was the middle of the pandemic, the Boston Red Sox stunk, and with major league ballparks empty in 2020, they couldn't even count on the crowd to get them going. During one especially humdrum road game at the Rays' Tropicana Field, coach Jason Varitek suggested they needed to put some fun back into the game.

The words had barely left his lips when Christian Vázquez hit a homer. So backup catcher Kevin Plawecki grabbed a nearby laundry cart, waited for Vázquez to return to the dugout, and told him, "Hey, hop in."

"We hadn't talked about it — nothing," Plawecki said on Wednesday. "He sat right in, and I pushed him. And ever since it's been our thing, I guess."

The 2004 Red Sox were "The Idiots." In '13 they grew bushy beards. And if the 2021 team performs like its predecessors and wins the World Series, the lingering image could be "Tunnel Time" — the home run laundry cart drive through the dugout.

Started on a lark in a last-place season, the Red Sox have continued the celebration this year and ridden it all the way to a spot in the AL Championship Series, which begins Friday night in Houston.

"It looked great in a difficult season for them to be able to find something that's fun, and be able to celebrate something in the game," manager Alex Cora said. "It means a lot for them. For them to have fun with that, that's great."

Sports teams have long found unique ways to celebrate their wins and other milestones, from the now routine post-victory Gatorade bath to jackets or jewelry awarded for big plays.

Even in baseball, where traditionalists sneer at anything that might seem disrespectful or undignified, teams haven't been afraid to show some personality.

The Phillies have a straw Home Run Hat, the Rockies have "homer shades," and the Blue Jays have a blue blazer for members of their "HR Club." The New York Mets ride a stuffed pony through the dugout to celebrate homers; the San Diego Padres pass around a seven-pound bejeweled necklace dubbed the "Swagg Chain."

During their 2019 World Series run, Washington Nationals car buffs Adam Eaton and Howie Kendrick celebrated by pretending to drive in the dugout — stepping on an imaginary clutch, shifting fake gears and making loud revving engine noises with their mouths.

"Everybody's got their own way of having fun. That's what it's all about," Plawecki said in an on-field interview during batting practice at Fenway Park. "It's not an 'In your face' to anybody. It's just a way for us to have fun, keep it light."

Boston's cart is now a new, customized model that may never have been touched by actual laundry; it even had its own bobble head day (though the Red Sox will tell you that the giveaway honored J.D. Martinez, who was riding in it).

During the playoffs, infielder José Iglesias has taken responsibility for the "carrito," and declared

himself the official chauffeur. Acquired too late in the season to be eligible for the playoff roster, Iglesias said he was happy to contribute in the dugout, since he can't on the field.

"It's a good way for him to stay involved with the guys," Plawecki said. "I know it kills him to not actually be out there with us. He's such a help for all of us."

Plawecki did he had no regrets about giving up his cart-driving duties. After all, the way the Red Sox are going, he needs to save his energy: Boston hit two homers in an AL wild-card victory over the rival Yankees and nine more in the four-game Division Series win over Tampa Bay — a franchise postseason record five of them in Game 2 alone.

Coahoma Bulldogs show heart battle strong but fall to Idalou

The Coahoma Bulldogs opened up district play last Friday when they hosted the Idalou Wildcats. Coahoma came into district play with a 2-3 record. The Bulldogs have played some up and down football in the year, but were coming off of a bye week. They had the unfortunate task of facing one of the top teams in 3A as they took on the then 5-0 Idalou Wildcats.

Coahoma came to play tonight as they knew they had their hands full and were going against a very tough Idalou team. The first quarter started off with Idalou striking first. With 9:00 to go in the very first quarter of play, the Wildcats struck pay dirt when they scored from seven yards out on a run from Malakhi Brisco. The point after was good, making this an early 7-0 lead for the Wildcats. Coahoma then answered right back only :45 seconds later when quarterback Billy Bailey found wide receiver Ky Kemper from 43 yards out. The point after was good to tie this game up at 7 to 7. The Wildcats then got the ball back and worked down the field. Eventually scoring on another five yard run from Brisco giving the lead back to Idalou. The extra point was good at making this a 14 to 7 lead for the Wildcats. Idalou wound up scoring one ,more time in the first quarter with 2:04 on the clock when they had a 36 yard touchdown pass. Making this a 20-7 lead after one quarter of play.

In the second quarter of play the Bulldogs showed their fight. They came out swinging and got on the board on a nice Billy Bailey seven yard touchdown run, cutting the lead to 14-20. Coahoma crept even closer to the top-ranked team in the state when they tacked on a 18 yard field goal to make this a three point game at 17-20. The Wildcats answered back and stop the momentum that Coahoma was building when they had a very good drive that ended when they scored from the one yard line pushing the lead to 27-17. Right before the end of the third quarter, the Idalou Wildcats scored once again, this time on a 12 yard run by Chase Hill, making this a 34 to 17 game at the half.

Having shown glimpses they could hang with one of the better teams in Texas, Coahoma came into the second half of play with hope. Unfortunately, Idalou put the game away as they took the ball down the field and score on another one-yard touchdown run with 6:18 left in the third quarter. After the score, the Idalou lead was now 17-41. Idalou continued to pour on the pressure and pulled away in the third quarter of play when they could score again when Brisco scored for three yards out, putting this game to rest, making the

another three and out. The Big Spring punter had the unenviable task of putting from the shadows of his own goal posts. The Pampa offense once again took over the ball deep in Steers territory as they got the ball at the 23 yards line. This was the second drive in a row that they put the pressure on the Steers defense to step up and make a stop. The Steers defense stepped up once again and this time because of some excellent coverage by cornerback Maverick Yanez, the Steers help Pampa to a 25-yard field goal attempt. Pampa had a remarkably efficient field goal kicker who was making field goal in pregame from about 35-40 yards out, so this should have been a chip shot. Like with everything with special teams, nothing is ever certain, and the Pampa field goal was no good. This was yet another amazing stand from a Steers defense that was playing its tail off. The Steers forced the Harvesters to a fourth down, but this time Pampas kicker connected on a 37-yard field goal. Making this a 3-0 score for the Pampa Harvesters with 2:37 left in the first quarter. After the field goal, the Steers would get the ball back after the kickoff. As I remarked before, field position played a big part in this first quarter of play. As Pampa had not had a drive that started on their side of the 50 yard line. This drive, the Steers finally found a little momentum as they could get a couple of first downs moving the ball down the field. As they moved down the field sophomore quarter back Gavin Padron dropped back at was looking to hit Kaegen Mitchell on a pass, but the Pampa defender intercepted it. This gave the ball back to the Harvesters at the 47 yard line. This drive Pampa scored quickly on a fake reverse that bust open for a nice 47 yard touchdown pass. The point after would be good making this a 10-0 game after one quarter of play.

The second quarter started with the Steers in a very foreign place they were trailing. Now, having shaken off the jitters of his first career varsity start, Gavin Padron grasped this offense and move the ball down the field. The Steers went to an up tempo style and Padron was finding his groove. Padron and the running game picked this defense apart. The Steers had now worked the ball all the way down the field. On a third and three from their own four yard line, they had a running play to Kavien Ford. Ford was running the ball hard and fumbled the ball on the four yard line. This was a very questionable call because Ford looked to be down on the play, but the referees get the last call and they ruled it a fumble. Now that the Steers had finally flipped field position. It was time for the Steers defense to do what they had been doing all game and come up with a big stop. On a third and seven from the seven yard line, the Big Spring defense came up with a big stop to hold Pampa to a punt. After the punt, the Steers had the ball in great field position for the first time in this game. This drive was wee. The Steers went to work as the sophomore QB showed how good this kid will be as he carved up the Pampa defense, working the ball down

the field. The pleasant drive came down to a very critical fourth and nine. Padron looked like he had been playing all season long as he avoided the rush and found WR Kaegen Mitchell for the big first down. After the new set of downs. Padron dropped back again, and this time could find Devin Manning on a wonderful four yard touchdown pass to put the Steers on the board. Cobos booted the ball through the uprights for the extra point and now the score was 7 to 10 in favor of the Harvesters. Pampa got the ball back after the TD by the Steers and this time they could work the ball down the field on what was a tired Big Spring defense. The Steers D fought hard, and they got Pampa to a crucial fourth and thirteen. The Harvesters could convert the fourth down play and get a huge first down to get the ball down to the eight yard line. Pampa punched the ball in on a fourth yard touchdown run. They missed the extra point, making this a 16 to 7 game. With 6:05 left in the first half of play, the Steers got the ball back. Padron once again was getting into a groove, and Ford was running the ball with authority. After a few more questionable calls from the refs, they gave the ball back to the Pampa Harvesters with 1:34 left in the second quarter. Pampa hit some big plays to move the ball down the field rather swiftly. With only :19 seconds left they scored on a ten yard touchdown run, advancing the lead to 23-7 at halftime.

The second half began and the Pampa Harvesters were in command of this game and they received the ball to begin the third quarter. It did not take long for Pampa to strike again as they scored on a 41 yard run to kick off the third quarter. After the long run, the score was now 30-7, with 11:03 left in the third quarter. After the quick score, the Steers struggled to find any pulse on the offensive side of the ball. They once again had to give the ball back to the Harvesters. Pampa broke free on another long run, this time from 21 yards out, making this a 37-7 game with 3:35 left in the third quarter. The Harvesters would tack on another touchdown before the end of the third quarter when they connected on a 70 yards touchdown pass. Making this a 44-7 game and essentially sealing the Steers fate. Pampa scored two more touchdowns in the last quarter of play, making the final score of this game 58 to 7 in favor of Pampa.

While this score may look bad, the performance for this Steers team is not emblematic of the final total. Let's look at the facts. They had a four-hour drive. They find out that their star quarterback could not play on the day of the game. The Steers had serious obstacles mounted against them from the very start. That's not even getting into the controversial calls by the referees that played a part in this game. 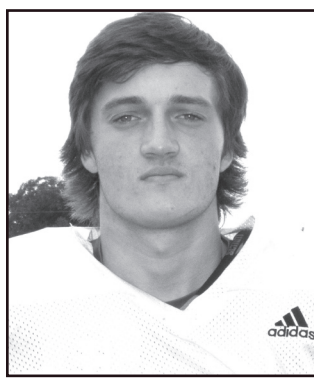
