## **BSISD students start the year off** well on benchmark tests

At their meeting Thursday evening, Big Spring ISD school board members heard reports on students' progress so far during the 2021-22 school year, and on the 2020-21 Annual Bilingual/English as a Second Language Program Review, as well as the Texas English Language Proficiency Assessment System results from 2021.

Assistant Thompson delivered the report on student progress. "We don't want to over-

test kids, but we do want

after being a year in a classroom with you?" Dr. Thompson said.

Thompsons said the startof-year test is used as a benchmark to measure how much students learn and improve their skills over the course of the school year.

"What you're seeing is September data," she said. "They staggered those, so fifth-grade reading just took theirs this week, because they've already taken fifthgrade math, and the next week fifth grade science, and then the next week fifthgrade reading. But what I wanted to talk about today was beginning-of-year data. I took all of them, all the templates that we have given, even though they're not

Dr. Thompson said she's compared benchmark tests from the beginning of this school year with old STAAR tests taken last school While overall year. fewer students are scoring in the "Approaches Grade Level" range on the tests this year, students are often scoring higher in the "Meets Grade Level" and "Masters Grade Level" ranges, she said.

The reports on the district's bilingual and ESL programs, and the TEL-PAS results, were given by Bilingual/ESL Coordinator Rosie Lopez.

Lopez reported that the Texas Education Agency has changed rules regarding the program, changing the classifications for students from EL (English Learner) or

Non-EL to "Emergent

Bilingual". "This year, we did not have any students that reclassified, which means exited the program," she said. "The reason is, TEA has set a new criteria. Now, the students have to rate 'Advanced - High' in all four domains, and our students are having difficulty passing the speaking part. The have to speak into a microphone, and a lot of them are not speaking enough. Last year we had one that met the classification, and in 2019 we had 42, because in '20, that's when TEA changed the criteria, 'Advanced – High' in all four domains, plus they have to pass the STA-

The board also unanimously accepted two donations: One anonymous donation to Big Spring Intermediate School for \$5,000 to be spent as the school sees fit; and \$3,400 to the Special Ed department from Mars Energy Company for specialized swings.

In his regular report, McWilliams announced one resignation from **Big Spring Intermediate** School; as well as a disenrollment



AN ORDER BY THE BOARD OF TRUSTEES OF THE GLASSCOCK COUNTY INDEPENDENT SCHOOL DISTRICT CALLING A BOND ELECTION TO BE HELD WITHIN THE DISTRICT; MAKING PROVISIONS FOR THE CONDUCT AND THE GIVING OF NOTICE OF THE ELECTION; AND CONTAINING OTHER PROVISIONS RELATING THERETO

WHEREAS, the Board of Trustees (the "Board") of Glasscock County Independent School District (the "District") finds that an election should be held to determine whether the Board shall be authorized to issue bonds of the District in the amounts and for the purposes hereinafter set forth; and

WHEREAS, the Board finds and determines that all facilities to be acquired, constructed, renovated, improved or equipped pursuant to Proposition A herein will be used predominantly for required classroom instruction and essential administrative operations for faculty and staff; and

WHEREAS, the Board finds and determines that the meeting at which this Order is considered is open to the public, and that the public notice of the time, place and purpose of the meeting was given, as required by Chapter 551, Texas Government Code, as amended;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDERED BY THE BOARD OF TRUSTEES OF GLASSCOCK COUNTY INDEPENDENT SCHOOL DISTRICT:

Section 1. <u>Findings.</u> The statements contained in the preamble of this Order are true and correct and are hereby adopted as findings of fact and as a part of the operative provisions hereof.

Section 2. <u>Election Ordered; Date; Propositions.</u> A bond election (the "Election") shall be held in the District on Tuesday, November 2, 2021 ("Election Day"), a uniform election date as established by Section 41.001(a) of the Texas Election Code, as amended (the "Code"). At the Election, the following propositions (individually, the "Proposition" and collectively the "Propositions") shall be submitted to the qualified voters of the District in accordance with law:

#### GLASSCOCK COUNTY ISD - PROPOSITION A

Shall the board of trustees of Glasscock County Independent School District be authorized to issue and sell bonds of the District in the principal amount of \$10,000,000 for the purpose of acquiring, constructing, renovating, improving and equipping school buildings of the District, for the purchase of necessary sites for school buildings.; and shall there be levied, assessed and collected annually ad valorem taxes on all taxable property in the District sufficient, without limit as to rate or amount, to pay the principal of and interest on said bonds as the same become due and to pay the costs of any credit agreements executed or authorized in anticipation of, in relation to or in connection with the bonds; said bonds to be issued in one or more series or issues, to mature serially or otherwise not more than 40 years from their date, and to bear interest at such rate or rates not to exceed the limit prescribed by law at the time of issuance, as the board of trustees in its discretion shall determine?

Section 3. Official Ballot. The official ballots for the Election shall be prepared in accordance with the Code so as to permit the electors to vote "FOR" or "AGAINST" each Proposition which shall be set forth on the ballots substantially in the following form:

#### GLASSCOCK ISD - PROPOSITION A

FOR ) "THE ISSUANCE OF \$10,000,000 OF SCHOOL BUILDING BONDS FOR ACQUIRING, CONSTRUCTING, RENOVATING, IMPROVING AND EQUIPPING SCHOOL

AGAINST ) BUILDINGS, FOR THE PURCHASE OF NECESSARY SITES FOR SCHOOL BUILDINGS, AND THE LEVYING OF A TAX SUFFICIENT, WITHOUT LIMIT AS TO RATE OR AMOUNT, TO PAY THE PRINCIPAL OF AND INTEREST ON THE BONDS AND TO PAY THE COSTS OF ANY CREDIT AGREEMENTS EXECUTED OR AUTHORIZED IN ANTICIPATION OF, IN RELATION TO OR IN CONNECTION WITH THE BONDS. Section 4. <u>Bilingual Election Materials.</u> All notices, instructions, and ballots pertaining to the Election shall be furnished to voters in both English and Spanish and persons capable of acting as translators in both English and Spanish shall be made available to assist Spanish language speaking voters in understanding and participating in the election process.

Section 5. <u>Persons Qualified to Vote.</u> All resident, qualified electors of the District shall be eligible to vote at the Election.

Section 6. <u>Election Precincts, Voting Locations and Voting Hours on Election Day.</u> The polling places for the Election are hereby designated to be those locations identified by the Elections Administrator (as defined herein). Such locations are listed on <u>Exhibit A</u> attached hereto, which is incorporated herein by reference and made a part hereof for all purposes; provided, however, such locations may be changed if so directed by the Elections Administrator without further action of the District. Glasscock County or its Elections Administrator is hereby authorized and directed to make such changes in polling locations as may be necessary for the proper conduct of the Election, without further action by the District, and the President of the Board or his/her designee is hereby authorized to update <u>Exhibit A</u> to reflect the locations designated by Glasscock County or the Elections Administrator, which locations are hereby approved. Each polling place shall be open from 7:00 A.M. to 7:00 P.M. on Election Day.

Section 7. <u>Early Voting Locations Dates and Times.</u> (a) The Glasscock County Elections Department (the "Elections Administrator") is appointed as the Early Voting Clerk for purposes of this Election (the "Early Voting Clerk"). The early voting places and the addresses for early voting by mail for the Election are hereby designated as set forth in <u>Exhibit B</u>; provided, however, such locations may be changed if so directed by the Elections Administrator without further action of the District. The Elections Administrator is hereby authorized and directed to make such changes in locations as may be necessary for the proper conduct of the Elections. The President of the Board or his designee is hereby authorized to update <u>Exhibit B</u> to reflect the locations designated by the Elections Administrator, and such locations are hereby approved. The Elections Administrator and/or Early Voting Clerk are hereby authorized to appoint the members of the Early Voting Ballot board and the presiding judges and alternate judges for each polling location in accordance with the requirements of the Code. Each of the presiding judges shall be authorized to approve the necessary election clerks to assist in conducting the Elections.

(b) Early voting by personal appearance shall be conducted on the days and during the hours set forth in <u>Exhibit B</u>, as may be adjusted by the Elections Administrator without further Board action.

(c) Applications for early voting by mail shall be submitted to the Elections Administrator at the locations identified in Exhibit B.

(d) Voting times may be changed if so directed by the Elections Administrator without further action of the District. The Elections Administrator is hereby authorized and directed to make such changes in voting hours as may be necessary for the proper conduct of the Election.

Section 8. Appointment of Election Officers. The Election shall be conducted under the jurisdiction of the Glasscock County Elections Department (the "Election Administrator") pursuant to the direction of the Board of Trustees and may be pursuant to a Joint Election Contract (the "Contract") by and among the District and other participating entities, if any, described in the Contract. The Contract providing for the joint election and the conduct of the Election by the Elections Administrator, if any, shall be presented to the Board for consideration and approval. The Superintendent's designee is authorized to amend or supplement any such Contract to the extent required for the Election to be conducted in an efficient and legal manner as determined by the Elections Administrator.

Section 9. Notice of Election. Notice of the Election shall be given by: (i) publishing a substantial copy of this Order, in English and Spanish, one time not earlier than the thirtieth (30th) day nor later than the tenth (10th) day prior to the date set for the Election, in a newspaper published in the District, (ii) posting a copy of this Order, in English and Spanish on the bulletin board used for posting notices of meetings of the Board and in at least three (3) other public places within the boundaries of the District, not later than the twenty-first (21st) day prior to the date set for the Election and (iii) posting a copy of this Order, in English and Spanish, on the District's website, prominently and together with the notice of the Election and the contents of the Proposition, not later than the twentyfirst (21st) day prior to the date set for the Election through Election Day. Additionally, on Election Day and during early voting by personal appearance, this Order shall be posted in a prominent location at each polling place. Notice of the Election bshall also be provided to the county clerks and voter registrars of Glasscock County not later than the 60th day before the Election Day; which notice the County is hereby authorized and directed to post to its website not later than the twenty-first (21st) day prior to the date set for the Election.

Section 11. <u>District's Outstanding Debt.</u> As of the effective date of this Order, the District's aggregate principal amount of outstanding of tax-supported debt was \$9,460,000 and the aggregate amount of outstanding interest on such tax-supported debt was \$2,785,000. The District's total ad valorem tax rate for the current fiscal year was \$1.0700, which is comprised of a maintenance and operations tax rate component of \$0.9664 per \$100 of taxable assessed valuation and a debt service tax rate of \$0.1036 per \$100 of assessed valuation. The District's taxable assessed valuation for calendar year 2021, as of the date that the current tax rate was established, was \$3,925,904,682 for maintenance and operations tax purposes and \$4,461,590,782 for debt service tax purposes.

Section 12. Issuance of New Debt. The District intends to issue the bonds authorized by the Propositions over a period of years in a manner and in accordance with a schedule to be determined by the Board based upon a number of factors, including, but not limited to, the then current needs of the District, demographic changes, prevailing market conditions, assessed valuations of property in the District and management of the District's short-term and long-term interest rate exposure. Market conditions, demographics and assessed valuations of property vary based upon a number of factors beyond the District's control, and therefore, the District cannot and does not guarantee a particular interest rate or tax rate associated with the bonds authorized by the Proposition. As such, the information contained in this paragraph is provided solely for illustrative purposes and does not establish any limitations or restrictions or create a contract with the voters. The District estimates that, based on the District's current taxable assessed valuation, current market conditions and estimated future growth in the District's current project finance plan, the maximum interest rate on the bonds is not expected to exceed 2.75%.

Section 13. <u>Voter Information Document</u>. The President of the Board, the Superintendent of the District, or their designee, acting on behalf of the Board, in consultation with the District's General Counsel and bond counsel, is hereby authorized and directed to provide a voter information document, in the form prescribed by Section 1252.052(b), Texas Government Code (the "Information Document").

The President of the Board, the Superintendent of the District, or their designee, acting on behalf of the Board, is further authorized and directed to post the Information Document in the same manner as provided for notice of the Election under Section 9 of this Order, and additionally on the District's website in an easily accessible manner beginning not later than the twenty-first (21st) day before the date set for the Election and ending on the day after Election Day.

Section 14. <u>Necessary Actions.</u> The President of the Board, the Superintendent of the District, or their designee, acting on behalf of the Board, in consultation with the District's General Counsel and bond counsel, is hereby authorized and directed to take any and all actions necessary to comply with the provisions of the Code and the Federal Voting Rights Act in carrying out and conducting the Election, whether or not expressly authorized herein, including making changes or additions to polling places or procedures to the extent required or desirable or as may become necessary due to circumstances arising after the date of this Order.

Section 15. <u>Severability.</u> If any provision, section, subsection, sentence, clause or phrase of this Order, or the application of same to any person or set of circumstances is for any reason held to be unconstitutional, void, invalid, or unenforceable, neither the remaining portions of this Order nor their application to other persons or sets of circumstances shall be affected thereby, it being the intent of the Board in adopting this Order that no portion hereof or provision or regulation contained herein shall become inoperative or fail by reason of any unconstitutionality, voidness, invalidity or unenforceability of any other portion hereof, and all provisions of this Order are declared to be severable for that purpose.

Section 16. <u>Appointment of Election Administrator</u>. The Elections Administrator of Dallas County is hereby appointed Election Administrator for the District and agent for the custodian of voted ballots in the respective jurisdictions.

Section 17. Effective Date. This Order shall take effect immediately upon its approval.

1. Three hearts. First, let's consider the meaning of partner's threeclub bid. He presumably is trying to get to game (or possibly a slam), has some length in clubs and wants to know whether you have a minimum or maximum for your raise to two hearts. The normal range of that bid is six to 10 points, and it's now up to you to indicate how good or bad your raise was.

Here, with eight high-card points but no distributional values, you are in the middle of the range. The deciding factor is that you have no help for partner in clubs, so you sign off by retreating to three hearts.

2. Four hearts. The difference between this hand and the preceding one is that here you have the queen of clubs instead of the queen of spades. The club queen is almost certain to be

You are South, and the bidding has one: useful to partner, and you might miss a sound game if you bid only three hearts and partner passes.

3. Four clubs. You have the wherewithal for a jump to four hearts, but it is better to pinpoint your values by raising clubs. This might enable part-

ner to bid a slam with a hand such as:
◆ 5 ♥ AQ10753 ♦ AK ♣ AJ84
4. Three diamonds. All three of your high cards are "working," so your hand is now worth far more than it was when you initially bid two hearts.

As before, the queen of clubs has grown from a card of indeterminate value to a card that's worth three or four points, so you can now count your hand as being worth about 12 points. To let partner know that you have accepted his invitation to game and could be interested in even more, you cuebid the ace of diamonds on the way to four hearts. You hope this will encourage partner get to slam if he is so inclined

5. Three notrump. Here you accept partner's invitation by bidding three notrump, indicating a balanced maximum with only three-card trump support and scattered values. Partner can, of course, retreat to four hearts if he prefers a suit contract, but at the same time your bid suggests the possibility that notrump might be better.

have often risen before dawn to sit outside under the stars listening as the birds announce the coming day. It starts with a tweet or a chirp and then, as a crimson glow



streaks the gray sky, their songs rise to a chorus as the sun breaks above the horizon. But lately, there have been no songs. The pre-dawn darkness is shrouded in an eery silence. The first shadows stretch across the landscape where there is no movement. The birds are absent. Where have they gone?

BILL Probably it is a matter of seasonal migration. But this is the first year I remember watching the sun rise

TINSLEY Without a single bird to signal the day. There are no Sparrows, no Juncos, no Finches, no Blackbirds, no

Geese. Where are they? According to a study out of Cornell University, birds are, in fact, disappearing. Since 1970 the bird population in North America has plummeted by 29%, from

Sunday morning Social Time - pre-Worship Service - starts approximate10 billion to 7.1 billion. Almost 3 billion birds are gone. Scientists point toward climate change and the destruction of natural habitats as the primary reasons for the decline. Imagine a world without birds to greet the sunrise, geese to fill the skies, trees without songs. Imagine the natural world replaced with concrete, steel, plastic and virtual reality.

Years ago, I visited the abandoned coal mines near Birmingham, England, an area known as the "Black Country" due to its early industrial pollution. We toured the caverns where men labored to extract the coal. As we descended the guide pointed out the cage where they placed a canary to detect the build-up of dangerous gases. As long as the air was good, the canary sang. But when the canary stopped singing, and eventually dropped dead, the miners knew it was imperative they evacuate the shafts. Perhaps the birds are sending us a warning. Perhaps like the canary in the coal mine, the silence of their song signals the imperative that we take climate change seriously. Birds play an important role in the Bible's redemption story. When Noah emerged from the catastrophic flood he sent out a dove that returned with an olive leaf, the first sign the waters were receding, (Genesis 8). When Elijah hid from Ahab by the brook Cherith, God sent ravens to feed him bread and flesh in the morning and evening, (1 Kings 17). When Jesus was baptized by John in the Jordan the Holy Spirit descended upon Him in the bodily form of a dove, (Luke 3:22). Jesus urged us to consider the birds as an example of God's provision and care.

Our planet is a marvelous, mysterious and miraculous place. There is nothing else like it in the known universe. We share our space with the myriad of other living species. At the dawn of creation God gave his first commandment, "Be fruitful and multiply and replenish the earth," (Genesis 1:28).



1. Three hearts. First, let's consider the meaning of partner's threeclub bid. He presumably is trying to get to game (or possibly a slam), has some length in clubs and wants to know whether you have a minimum or maximum for your raise to two hearts. The normal range of that bid is six to 10 points, and it's now up to you to indicate how good or bad your raise was.

Here, with eight high-card points but no distributional values, you are in the middle of the range. The deciding factor is that you have no help for partner in clubs, so you sign off by retreating to three hearts.

2. Four hearts. The difference between this hand and the preceding one is that here you have the queen of clubs instead of the queen of spades. The club queen is almost certain to be

You are South, and the bidding has useful to partner, and you might miss a sound game if you bid only three hearts and partner passes.

3. Four clubs. You have the wherewithal for a jump to four hearts, but it is better to pinpoint your values by raising clubs. This might enable partner to bid a slam with a hand such as: ◆ 5 ♥ AQ10753 ◆ AK ♣ AJ84

4. Three diamonds. All three of your high cards are "working," so your hand is now worth far more than it was when you initially bid two hearts.

As before, the queen of clubs has grown from a card of indeterminate value to a card that's worth three or four points, so you can now count your hand as being worth about 12 points. To let partner know that you have accepted his invitation to game and could be interested in even more, you cuebid the ace of diamonds on the way to four hearts. You hope this will encourage partner get to slam if he is so inclined.

5. Three notrump. Here you accept partner's invitation by bidding three notrump, indicating a balanced maximum with only three-card trump support and scattered values. Partner can, of course, retreat to four hearts if he prefers a suit contract, but at the same time your bid suggests the possibility that notrump might be better.





Biden has met with Pope Francis three times before — first, when Francis was inaugurated as pope, in 2013, later during the pope's 2015 visit to the U.S., and again in 2016, when Biden visited the Vatican for a conference on regenerative medicine, where he spoke on cancer prevention.

## **Cowboys poised to beat Belichick**led Patriots for 1st time

FOXBOROUGH, Mass. — Ezekiel Elliott didn't have to think long this week about what he remembered most about Dallas' last visit to New England in 2019.

"It was a like a hurricane," Elliott recalled of the game played in wet, windy conditions and included temperatures that dipped into the 30s. "I had the big beach towel in my pants, so I could keep my hands dry. I remember wearing like five or six different pairs of gloves."

New England slogged out a 13-9 win that day in a matchup of the Patriots' top-ranked defense and Cowboys' top-ranked offense, holding Dallas without a touchdown for the first time that season.

It was the start of a three-game losing streak for the Cowboys, who lost four of their final six on the way to missing the playoffs at 8-8. New England finished 12-4, but were knocked out in the wild-card round in what turned out to be Tom Brady's final game with the Patriots.

Much has changed two years later.

Aside from Brady being gone, New England (2-3) is also in the unfamiliar role of underdog as it tries to avoid its first 0-4 start at home under Bill Belichick. The Cowboys (4-1) have the NFL's second-ranked offense this time, are armed with a rejuvenated Dak Prescott and look as equipped as they've ever been to beat the Patriots for the first time during the Belichick era.

Patriots linebacker Dont'a Hightower said the three pillars of their defense are to be physical, get after the quarterback and stop the run.

All three come with added challenges this week opposite a big Cowboys offensive line, a quarterback in Prescott who has one of the quickest releases in the league and a two-pronged attack at running back with Elliott and Tony Pollard.

Hightower said he hasn't seen any hesitancy in Prescott coming off last season's ankle injury.

"I think he'll do whatever it takes," Hightower said. "If he needs to run for a first down, I think he'll do it. I think he's very confident in where he's at and I think his play definitely shows that"

New England has won the last six matchups overall, with Dallas' last victory in the series coming in 1996. The Cowboys haven't won in New England since 1987.

Record aside, Dallas coach Mike McCarthy expects to face another well-prepared Patriots team.

"There is no punches pulled when you play these guys," said McCarthy, who is 1-3 against Belichick. "This is a style of play our guys will embrace, but they do an excellent job of trying to scheme against the things you do best."

### STEADY GREGORY

Dallas defensive end Randy Gregory is on the best three-game stretch of his off-and-on career with four QB pressures in each of the past three games, according to Sportradar. His previous best total over three games was 10. Both his sacks came in the second of the three games.

While Gregory trails one Dallas rookie in sacks (Micah Parsons leads the team with  $2^{1\!/_{\!\!2}}$ ) and is tied with another 2021 draft pick in Osa Odighizuwa, his impact is clear with the Cowboys waiting for big-money pass rusher DeMarcus Lawrence to return from a broken foot.

This is just the third time in Gregory's seven seasons he has been available at the start of the season. Substance-abuse suspensions sidelined him the other four times. And it's the first time he has played through five games without missing any time for injuries.

There's part of my body that don't feel right. But my play on the field, I'm not really surprised about it. I think I'm going to trend upward."

### DALLAS AND THE 201


The Cowboys averaged 201 yards rushing per game for three weeks before beating the Giants 44-20. They hit that number exactly against New York as Elliott put together consecutive 100-yard games for the first time since three straight in 2019.

Dallas is second in the NFL in rushing at 173 yards per game after getting just 60 in the opener, a 31-29 loss to Super Bowl champion Tampa Bay when Prescott threw for 403 yards.

"The O-line, they're mauling guys up front," said Elliott, who is third in the NFL with 452 yards and averaging 5.3 yards per carry, the best through five games in the two-time rushing champion's career. "You got the receivers mauling DBs, too. Everyone is doing their part, and we're reaping the benefits."

### KICK IT

Patriots kicker Nick Folk enters the week one field goal shy of becoming the 35th player in NFL history to reach 300 for his career. He would be the fifth active kicker to hit the milestone, joining Robbie Gould (403), Mason Crosby (355), Matt Prater (329) and Justin Tucker (302).

The Forsan Buffaloes are perfect so far this season. They are 6-0 and have been playing great football.
