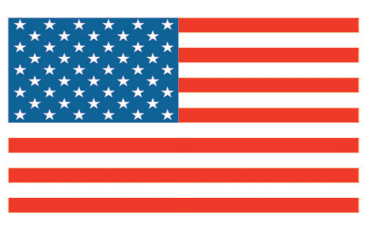

## A heart for the community Roland settling into new role as Head Chaplain with Emergency Services Chaplain Corps

In March, Joel Miller, longtime Head Chaplain with the local Emergency Services Chaplain Corps, retired, and left Chaplain Jacqueline Roland in charge of the non-profit organization. Since then, she's stayed the course while bringing her own touch to the role, but said her biggest need right now is more chaplains to serve the people of Howard County. "Other than needing chaplains, everything seems to be settling in. After Chaplain Miller retired - he was here 17 years - so for someone to try to step into his shoes is almost like trying to turn an aircraft carrier. People are just so used to him, and I'm not him," Roland said. "I am who I am. I'm doing everything according to the Chaplaincy, just trying to reach out." Helping the local community, and especially first responders, is all part of the job for Roland, she said. "My heart is for communities, and my heart is for our police officers and our fire department's first responders," she said.

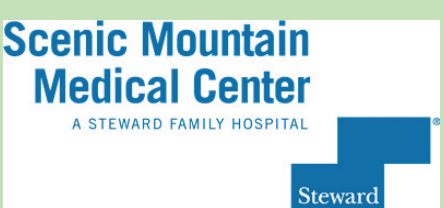

she said. "I don't think people realize what they go through. So my heart has really kind of grown an extra leg, so to speak, for them. Trying to communicate with them and meet their needs, as well as the community." In fact, Roland said she's taken supporting first responders as a big part of her job. "We did lunch for our police officers. I've been a chaplain for eight years, and this is the first time I stepped into this role. I've always wanted to feed our fire department. That would be an understatement," she said. "We served each station once a week. We went and we took a meal, and it was big enough for all three shifts, and everyone got their portion. From Station 1 all the way to Station 5 for five weeks, we got to see our fire department and spend time with them, and that was a blessing for us. Of course, then we also did our law officers. 

The holidays have arrived, and the mission of the DAV (Disabled American Veterans) of Big Spring Chapter 47 is still going strong. Each year, the local chapter provides holiday meals - Thanksgiving and Christmas - for the veterans housed at the VA Medical Center's domiciliary and CLC living center. This year, the DAV is extending that outreach support to Lamun Lusk Sanchez Texas State Veterans Home veterans.

"Our mission is to serve veterans throughout the year, but the mission grows stronger and hits deeper at the holiday season," Mike Tarpley, D.A.V. Chapter 47 Vice-Commander, said. "Many of these veterans may not have family or at least, be unable to see their family at the holiday, and we want to make sure that despite that, they are still able to have a joyful season."

While the pandemic may still impact the extent of the outreach, one thing is for sure; the veterans will receive a special meal for Thanksgiving and Christmas. Through a local partnership with Al's BBQ, the WTVA veterans will receive a BBQ Thanksgiving. "Due to the pandemic, we haven't been able to take the veterans in the CLC and Domiciliary out to eat, as we had in the past, but we want to make sure they get a special treat at the holidays. Al's has been a great partner over the years, and this year, we are extending the veterans we serve meals to by adding a Christmas meal at Lamun Lusk Sanchez," Tarpley said.

Of course, as the DAV chapter members know, the mission wouldn't be possible

without the community support. So once again, four new signs were presented to businesses in the community that have stepped up and supported serving veterans over the years. At a recent meeting, the DAV presented KBST, the Big Spring Herald, Cross Roads Young Marines, and King Fab with a sign to display outside their business.

"Over the years, these partners have supported us in many ways, on a consistent basis. help the Salvation Army out with its Angel Tree program this holiday season, she said.

Of course, the biggest part of the Chaplain job is supporting those who need a spiritual hand in times of crisis.

"Just trying to reach out and be there for people. We've had several calls to the ER and several calls to ICU," she said. "That's where it comes in, being present and being on the spiritual side of things. You can listen with your heart and be able to help people, even without saying anything. It's pretty intense sometimes, but it's so rewarding."

So are you interested in becoming a chaplain? There are a few job requirements for the position, Roland said.

"Basically, of course, have a relationship with the Lord Jesus. There's a lot of spiritual counseling and prayer that goes into what we do, and if you don't have any idea how to do that, then we may have a problem," she said. "Besides that, a heart

for the community, a heart for law enforcement. That's first and foremost."

Having time to perform the unpaid, volunteer duty – and the training – is required as well.

"Semi-retired. Or, they have a business of their own that they can leave if they are called out. Or retired," Roland said. "If you're not available, it's kind of hard. And be available for the 32 hours of training. That's set up in the morning time between 9 and 11:30. They can come in one day, two days, up to five days a week. It depends on how fast they want to become a chaplain. It doesn't matter, male or female, yellow, black or white."

Roland has lived in the Big Spring area since 1990, she said.

"I moved here in 1990 from Sweetwater, then I moved to Tulsa, Okla., and went to Bible School for three years," she said. "On the fourth year, I moved back and that was from 2000-2004. I am a member, have been a member for 25+ years, to Life Church. It used to be the Miracle Revival Center."

The Emergency Services Chaplain Corps is a local non-profit organization made up of ordained

It was created in 2004 by the recently retired Chaplain Joel Miller. Since then, the organization has grown to also serve county employees, Victim Services, Scenic Mountain Medical Center personnel, and families and citizens of Big Spring and Howard County. They also offer their services to stranded motorists passing through the area.

A surprisingly large number of players show a lack of respect for safety plays. What is particularly annoying about this attitude is that their casual disrespect usually doesn't cost them a blessed farthing because the remote situation that they should be trying to protect against seldom occurs.

However, lightning sometimes does strike, and when that happens, these players often wind up bemoaning their fate. For example, consider this deal where South gets to six spades and sees — or should see — that the only way the slam can be lost is if he loses two trump tricks.

So, instead of dismissing this "remote" possibility, South should instead concentrate all his thoughts on how to overcome a 4-0 trump division, if that unlikely distribution happens to exist.

Accordingly, he should win the diamond lead in dummy and return a low trump. When East follows with the six, South should play the seven, being perfectly willing to lose the trick to the nine, ten or queen in order to assure the slam beyond the shadow of a doubt.

In the actual deal, the safety play pays off, and South avoids going down one. Playing the ace on the first trump lead would be correct if East produced the nine, ten or queen at trick two, or if East showed out on the first trump lead. In all of these cases, South could then limit himself to either one trump loser or none with proper play. (In the actual case, if East played the nine or ten, South would next lead a spade to the jack and later finesse against East to hold himself to one trump loser.)

This frame of mind — where declarer hopes for the best but prepares for the worst — is often crucial to achieving a favorable result. There is no good reason to incur an unfavorable outcome that could have been avoided.

The Howard College by Hawks snapped a two game losing streak in fine form Wednesday night by whipping the Loyalty Prep Mustangs 94-26 at Dorothy Garrett Coliseum.

The Hawks, 7-2 for the season, returned to the confines of home after going 1-2 on a three game road trip, dropping a 67-59 decision to Panola and losing to Weatherford College 66-54. This night however belonged to Hawks. Using a tight man-to-man defense coupled with occasional full court pressure, Howard simply overwhelmed Loyalty Tech, who appeared fatigued from the start. Tech had dropped a 79-60 decision to Western Texas Tuesday night.

Mustangs coach Enriue Juarez said he was totally disgusted with his team's effort. "What you saw tonight was a team not willing to play," he said. "These kids didn't want to play tonight and it showed. These kids now days want everything handed to them on a plate. They have to learn to work for it."

The Howard defense was relentless forcing 25 Tech turnovers, resulting in 37 Howard points. Howard scored the first 13 points of the game, Tech's first basket came with 14:40 left in the half. By halftime Howard held a commanding 47-8 lead.

After those three road games Howard coach Scott Raines said he was glad his team had some pep in its step. "We played really flat last night (against Weatherford) and we didn't get back home until 2 a.m. We played well tonight, really good defense and I loved the way we shared the ball. We had 24 assists and that's always good. We made this team look worse than they are. They played Western Texas a pretty good game in double figures."

The Hawks placed five people in double figures, led by Rahkiem Patterson with 15 points. Jacoby Bishop was next with 14. Guards Blaize Sagna and D'Mari Wiltz each dished seven assists in the win.

The Hawks will be on the road Sunday in Levelland against Monroe College at 1 p.m. Their next home game will be Tuesday at 7 p.m. against Ranger, the second game of a doubleheader. The Lady Hawks play Ranger in the opening game.

### Bulldogettes drop a game to Post, win thriller over Ozona

The Coahoma Bulldogettes suffered their first loss of the season against the Lady Lopes at Post on Tuesday night after winning a nail-biter against the Ozona Lady Lions at home on Saturday.

The Lady Lopes second-half onslaught overpowered the young Bulldogette varsity basketball team, who lost the match 39-55. Post's pressure defense continued to increasingly force Coahoma off balance in the last half of play. On Saturday, basketball fans got their money's worth at the Bulldogettes-Lady Lions match up, which came down to a pair of shots at the charity stripe by Cayhill Lewis in the dwindling seconds of the game. She buried both and gave Coahoma back a 32-31 lead.

Lewis got on the free throw line once more with three seconds left and sank another basket to move the Dawgettes ahead 33-31. It was enough to stop Ozona's second half rally and earn the win.

"We stressed that throughout practice and the game to be smart and not foul," said Joe Mireles, Bulldogette girls basketball head coach. "Let them create their mistakes, and we did that. Our girls were able to hold their composure through the end, and they came through big."

It was also an exciting finish that came after Ozona capped off an eleven-point, fourth quarter drive with a three-point basket by Vale Garza at the 25.6 second mark. The score pushed the Lady Lions into the lead for the first time since the opening quarter.

The game also provided an opportunity to shine a spotlight on the depth of Coahoma's bench and after Saturday's performance, Mireles has reason to smile.

All but one of Mireles' starters for Saturday's match were benched because of illness or injury

and at the tipoff, the team's inexperience showed.

Within the first two minutes of the game, the Lady Lions had forced a number of turnovers, and scored five points until the Dawgettes settled into the flow of the game.

"They figured they needed to go into the next gear," Mireles said. "If they didn't, it was going to be a long day. They were able to find that gear, and they took off."

Lang, who had a game high of 15 points, got Coahoma on the board with a 2-point basket. Kaedyn Lee closed the gap to one (5-6) when she nailed a basket from behind the arc. And thanks to Baylor Wright, Coahoma ended the quarter behind 7-8 after the freshman sank one in with 11.5 seconds

left on the clock.

Ozona struck first to begin the next quarter, but Coahoma quickly flipped the momentum with a 13-point onslaught led by Analyse Mendoza, who had a six-point individual gain. Merick Alvarez along with Lewis and Lang contributed seven more by the time the buzzer sounded to end the half, and Coahoma headed to the locker room up 20-12.

The Lady Lions returned for the third quarter on fire and pulled within one point, 20-19, of the Bulldogettes, who were able to stay in the game thanks to the stellar effort of Lang. The two-season varsity veteran accounted for all six of Coahoma's points.

Ozona continued the rally until Coahoma shut them down in the last seconds of the game.

"You saw a lot of growth from these players just

within the game," Mireles said. "They are able to see the speed of the game. They learned from their mistakes. You could see the first possession to the very end they were learning. I was proud of them."

In sub-varsity action, the Coahoma JV team fell to both Post on Tuesday and Ozona on Saturday.
