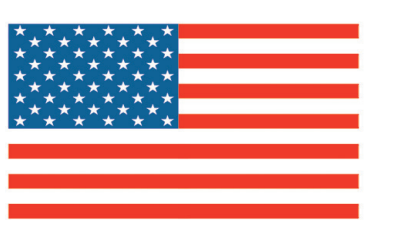

New virus variant emerges in Africa, stokes worldwide fears

BRUSSELS — The discovery of a new coronavirus variant sent a chill through much of the world Friday as nations raced to halt air travel, markets plunged and scientists held emergency meetings to weigh the exact risks, which were largely unknown.

Medical experts, including the World Health Organization, warned against any overreaction before the variant that originated in southern Africa was better understood. But a jittery world feared the worst nearly two years after COVID-19 emerged and triggered a pandemic that has killed more than 5 million people around the globe.

British Health Secretary Sajid Javid told lawmakers that the new version may be more transmissible than the delta variant and render vaccines less effective.

"We must move quickly and at the earliest possible moment," Javid said.

Some nations moved to stop air travel from southern Africa, and stocks plunged in Asia, Europe and the United States. The Dow Jones Industrial Average dropped 800 points at the start of trading. The price of oil plunged 7%.

"The last thing we need is to bring in a new variant that will cause even more problems," German Health Minister Jens Spahn said amid a massive spike in cases in the 27-nation European Union, which recommended a ban on flights from southern African nations.

EU Commission President Ursula von der Leyen said flights "should be suspended until we have a clear understanding about the danger posed by this new variant, and travelers returning from this region should respect strict quarantine rules."

She insisted on extreme caution, warning that "mutations could lead to the emergence and spread of even more concerning variants of the virus that could spread worldwide within a few months."

Belgium became the first European Union country to announce a case of the variant. It involved a person who came from abroad.

"It's a suspicious variant. We don't know if it's a very dangerous variant," Health Minister Frank Vandenbroucke said.

Israel, one of the world's most vaccinated countries, announced Friday that it also detected the country's first case of the new variant in a traveler who returned from Malawi. The traveler and two other suspected cases were placed in isolation. Israel said all three were vaccinated, but officials were looking into the travelers' exact vaccination status.

The new variant immediately stoked fears of more pandemic-related economic turmoil.

The Odessa District of TxDOT has scheduled a virtual public meeting regarding proposed improvements to Highway 176 in Andrews, Martin, and Howard counties. The virtual public meeting is scheduled to begin at 5 p.m. Wednesday, Dec. 1, 2021. Following the virtual public meeting, the presentation will remain available for viewing through Friday, Dec. 17, 2021.

The proposed project stretches along Highway 176 from FM 1788 east of the city of Andrews to Interstate 20 in Big Spring in Howard County.

The proposal consists of the following:

- Widen this portion of Highway 176 and make it a four-lane divided highway with two lanes in each direction as well as both inside and outside shoulders;
- Include a wide center median and/or barrier; and
- Provide median openings as needed based on traffic data.

The proposed project is approximately 53 miles long. It has not been determined how much additional right of way may be required or whether the project will involve construction in wetlands or floodplains.

pandemic in 2020 because travel restrictions reduced demand for fuel. Airlines shares were hammered, with Lufthansa off 12.4%, IAG, parent of British Airways and Iberia, off 14.4%, Air France-KLM down 8.9% and easyJet falling 10.9%.

Speaking before the EU announcement, Dr. Michael Ryan, the head of emergencies at the WHO, warned against "knee-jerk responses."

"We've seen in the past, the minute there's any kind of variation and everyone is closing borders and restricting travel. It's really important that we remain open and stay focused," Ryan said.

The Africa Centers for Disease Control and Prevention agreed and strongly discouraged any travel bans on countries that reported the new variant. In a statement, it said past pandemic experience has shown that such travel bans have "not yielded a meaningful outcome."

The U.K. banned flights from South Africa and five other southern African countries effective at noon on Friday and announced that anyone who had recently arrived from those countries would be asked to take a coronavirus test.

Germany said its flight ban could be enacted as soon as Friday night. Spahn said flights returning from South Africa will only be able to transport German citizens home, and travelers will need to go into quarantine for 14 days whether they are vaccinated or not.

Germany has seen record daily case numbers in recent days and on Thursday surpassed 100,000 deaths from COVID-19.

Italy's health ministry also announced measures to ban entry for anyone

who has been in seven southern African nations — South Africa, Lesotho, Botswana, Zimbabwe, Mozambique, Namibia and Eswatini — in the past 14 days due. The Netherlands and the Czech Republic planned similar measures.

The Japanese government announced that Japanese nationals traveling from Eswatini, Zimbabwe, Namibia, Botswana, South Africa and Lesotho will have to quarantine at government-dedicated accommodations for 10 days and take COVID-19 tests on the third, sixth and tenth days. Japan has not yet opened up to foreign nationals.

The South African government said that the U.K.'s decision to temporarily ban South Africans from entering "seems to have been rushed," citing the fact that the WHO has yet to recommend next steps.

The coronavirus evolves as it spreads and many new variants, including those with potentially risky mutations, often die out. Scientists monitor for possible changes that could be more transmissible or deadlier, but sorting out the exact dangers of new variants takes time.

The WHO's technical working group is to meet Friday to assess the new variant — currently identified as B.1.1.529 — and may decide whether to give it a name from the Greek alphabet. It says coronavirus infections jumped 11% in Europe in the past week, the only region in the world where COVID-19 continues to rise.

The WHO's Europe director, Dr. Hans Kluge, warned that without urgent measures, the continent could see another 700,000 deaths by the spring.

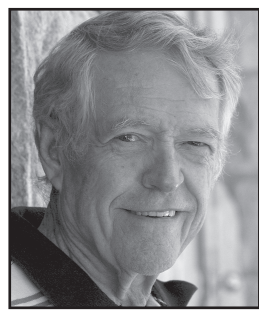

INTRODUCING TURKEY TO JAPAN

Chloe Steinhagen of Georgetown spent ten years in Japan singing on cruise ships and in clubs. She also did some work translating equipment instructions from Japanese to English. She lived in a small town not far from Tokyo.

"I was sharing a home with two other Americans and my two housemates and I decided that since it was around Thanksgiving we would have some of our Japanese friends over and introduce them to turkey, which is a rare bird in Japan. If anything it's sort of a novelty."

It took Chloe a bicycle ride, a train ride, two subway rides and a long walk to get to an American market in Tokyo. It took hours to get there. She bought a frozen turkey. It was placed in a paper bag.

"I rode my first subway and there was no problem and everything went swimmingly on the second subway ride and finally I got on the train headed for home. As I was sitting on the train I looked down and I see this little rivulet of pink, watery stuff running down the aisle of the train.

"I could see the bottom of the paper bag was wet and the turkey was beginning to thaw. I watched as the pink liquid was traveling down the middle of

the train, which was packed with Japanese passengers. I looked at them but they didn't look at me. They were looking at the pink stream. I wondered what must have been going through their minds. This was an awful situation.

"When the train got to my stop, very rapidly I picked up the bag so I could get off with my turkey and the bottom of the bag was soaking wet by now and my turkey fell out and landed right in the middle of the aisle. In America it would have been a comedy scene but on that train nobody laughed, nobody said a word. So I gathered up my cold wet turkey, got off the train and rode my bicycle to my house."

I thought that would be the end of a funny story. But it wasn't.

"In Japan they generally don't have ovens in their kitchens. They do most of their cooking on the top of the stove. And most of my Japanese friends had never tasted turkey. The home I was in was on the modern side and had a very small oven, perhaps the world's smallest.

"When we got the turkey to the house we couldn't get the turkey in the oven. It wasn't a very big turkey but it was a very small oven. It could have been in a dollhouse. We took everything out, all the shelves, everything we could find. And we literally stood there and shoved that turkey in the oven, shoving it in with our feet to get it to go in there. It finally went in and was cooked. Of course it was black in a few places on the outside but all together they turkey turned out pretty well. It was a tasty turkey and the Japanese if they didn't enjoy it they acted like they did. They are very polite."

Third Baseman on the Mound...

A dozen years before "Sir" was added to his name, Winston Churchill motivated Britons with his unforgettable "never give in" speech.

It lifted spirits for freedom as World War II raged, and frequently is quoted even now, 70 years later.

His message was to "never give in, never given in, never, never, never-in nothing great or small, large or petty-give in except to convictions of honour and good sense."...

Two dozen years after Churchill's speech, on a beautiful spring day in April, 1965, Sul Ross State University third baseman Billy Carthel saved the day for his team against the mighty Division I Wildcats of the University of Arizona in Tucson.

In comparison to the import of World War II, his pitching prowess is reasonably viewed as small, but Carthel wouldn't give in, either. His move to the pitching mound from his usual third base assignment seemed unlikely. A baseball lifer, he had already blasted a pair of doubles, giving the Lobos leads of up to eight runs before the home team started its ninth inning rally. Late Coach Ray Van Cleef had used his entire pitching roster as the game slipped away.

With his team leading 11-10 and

the Wildcats loading the bases with no one out, he yelled, "Has anyone here ever pitched, even in Little League?" Carthel, saying he had done so almost a decade earlier, was handed the ball. He retired the next three batters, striking out two and getting the third on an infield pop-up.

I was present as Sul Ross sports information director and remember the unlikely heroics of this college freshman as one of life's most memorable "never give in" sports moments.

His lifelong humility adds to the sweetness of the feat. He has an "awe shucks" view of his accomplishments, and there were many. One of note occurred when he played for the Memphis Blues in an exhibition game with the New York Mets. He played a different position every inning!

He's retired now with wife, Pat, on their ranch near Silverton in northwest Texas. He was a guide for hundreds of hunters (wild hogs, turkeys, aoudad sheep and mule deer) for 20+ years. At age 76, he's slowed by several illnesses, including COPD that sometimes makes communication difficult. Still, his personality sparkles. He remembers the big game in Tucson against a team that later had a win streak of 17 games, finishing the season in the NCAA's top 25 teams. He's fuzzy on the pitching part, however. Thankfully, Tom Cunningham, a teammate, remembers it keenly. He says Carthel's ninth

inning heroics dominated conversations at the team's reunion more than 25 years ago....

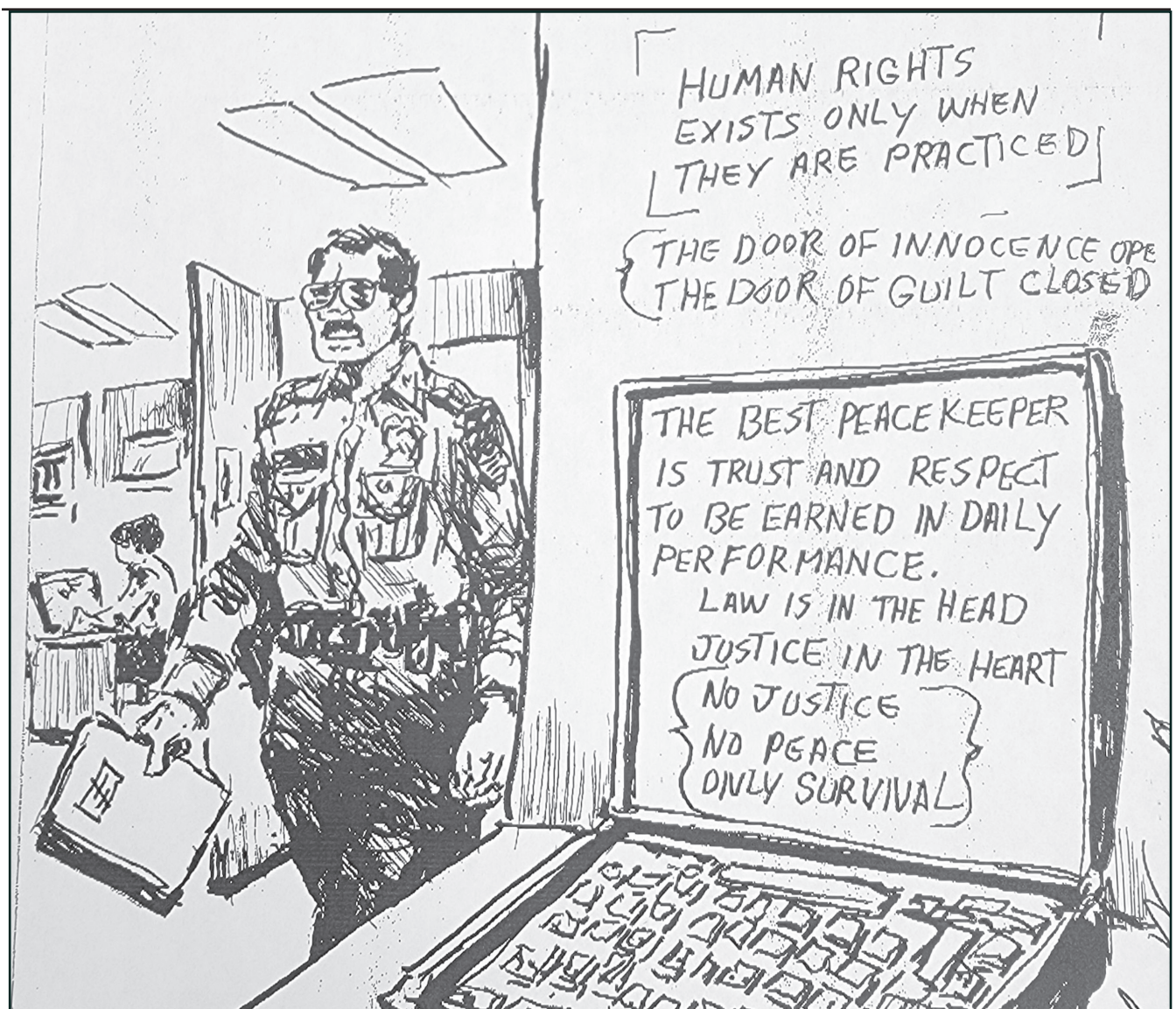
I remember phoning Plainview's Daily Herald and Radio Station KVOP concerning what the community's favorite son had accomplished that day in Tucson.

Carthel spent most of his adult life playing and coaching in professional baseball, including stints with the Montreal Expos and New York Mets.

He seemed destined for the majors, but a collision with Carlton Fisk at home plate in a minor league game caused serious injuries that took away that dream....

He's a realist, knowing that many others are sidetracked on their trails to the "big's."

The Carthels are happy living on their northwest Texas ranch. Friends say it doesn't take much to excite the couple. They're tickled pink that they have a Dollar General store nearby now, so they don't have to drive a dozen miles for milk or bread. They are heirs of many memories, not only of baseball, but also game hunts and ranch life that Billy loves so much. There also are crates of clippings, and they cherish phone calls from grandsons Billy, a freshman baseballer at Oklahoma Wesleyan University in Bartlesville, and Jeffrey, a high school junior player in Tulsa, OK. Their dad, Thad Carthel, has coached them in summer leagues over the years.

Raiders beat Cowboys 36-33 in OT on field goal after penalty

ARLINGTON, Texas — Derek Carr and the Las Vegas Raiders got the third-down help they needed from Dallas cornerback Anthony Brown.

Daniel Carlson kicked a 29-yard field goal in overtime after Brown's fourth pass-interference penalty kept the drive alive, and the Raiders ended a three-game losing streak by beating the Cowboys 36-33 on Thursday.

Carlson's career-best fifth field goal came after Brown was called for interference on Zay Jones on third-and-18. All four of Brown's interference penalties came on third-down incompletions.

"The penalties obviously helped," said Carr, whose 373 yards passing included a 56-yard touchdown to DeSean Jackson for the first points. "If they weren't holding, we probably would have hit those plays."

The Raiders had just two third-down conversions total the previous two games and were 3 of 13 in this one. But Brown topped that total all by himself.

"Just one of them days," Brown said. "I feel like I was in position for all of them, tried to turn my head. On some of them I did have my head turned. Just try to get better."

Both teams had season highs in penalties and yards, Dallas, the NFL leader in penalty yards coming in, had 14 for a franchise-record 166 yards and Las Vegas 14 for 110.

A holding call on perennial Pro Bowl left tackle Tyron Smith in his first game back after missing three with an ankle injury negated a Dallas touchdown early in the fourth quarter. The Cowboys settled for a field goal.

"Twenty-eight penalties, I don't know what the hell you want me to say," Dallas coach Mike McCarthy said. "Write what you want. I'm all for it."

The Raiders (6-5) won on Thanksgiving for the first time since 1968. It was their fourth appearance

on the holiday since then, with the previous two losses coming at the Cowboys.

"It kind of gave me goose bumps, I'm not going to lie," Carr said. "When that kick went through, I had a lot of memories as a kid."

Dak Prescott had 209 of his 375 yards passing in the fourth quarter. His 32-yard touchdown pass to Dalton Schultz and 2-point conversion toss to the tight end pulled the Cowboys (7-4) even at 30 with 2:54 remaining after they trailed almost from the start.

Carlson put Las Vegas ahead 33-30 with a career-long 56-yarder with 1:52 remaining. Greg Zuerlein, who missed an extra point after the first Dallas TD, answered with a 45-yarder with 19 seconds to go.

Tony Pollard had a 100-yard kickoff return for Dallas in the third quarter, but was stopped inside the 15 to start overtime. The Cowboys went three-and-out after a penalty pushed them back to the 7, and the Raiders finished off the third victory for the AFC West against the NFC East-leading Cowboys in the past four games.

Brown had his back to Jones when Carr threw the pass with Las Vegas at its 43. The penalty put the Raiders at the Dallas 24, and the winning kick came after the Cowboys were penalized twice for rushing past the line of scrimmage before the snap.

Carr was 24 of 39 without an interception, and Hunter Renfrow had career highs in catches (eight) and yards (134). Marcus Mariota scored from the 3 on a shotgun keeper.

The Dallas offense struggled early without top receivers Amari Cooper (COVID-19 protocols) and CeeDee Lamb (concussion) and running back Ezekiel Elliott nursing a right knee injury. The NFL's No. 1 offense bounced back to finish with 437 yards, but the Raiders had a season-high 509.

"We had some explosive plays and we gave up some explosive plays," said interim coach Rich Bisaccia, who left after five seasons with the Cow-

boys to join the Raiders in 2018.

Jackson tip-toed successfully on the sideline to open the scoring and drew one of the interference penalties against Brown in the end zone to set up Josh Jacobs' 1-yard TD.

Sean McKeon had his first career touchdown, a 10-yard catch for the Cowboys' first points. Elliott, who was limited to nine carries for 25 yards, had a 1-yard TD.

PAIR OF EJECTIONS

Kelvin Joseph of Dallas and Roderic Teamer of the Raiders were ejected after getting personal foul penalties at the end of a Las Vegas punt on the first possession of the second half. Field judge Tom Hill ended up with a small cut on his chin during the fracas on the Raiders' sideline.

It was the second consecutive week the Cowboys had a run-in with the opponent during a punt. And the rookie Joseph ended up with the rest of the game off a week after staying home for personal reasons.

GO LONG

Jackson, who spent the first six of his 14 years with Philadelphia, has six career TD catches against his former NFC East rival. Five of those have covered at least 56 yards, including a 91-yarder with the Eagles in 2010 and an 81-yarder in his second stint with Philadelphia last season.

INJURIES

Raiders TE Darren Waller was ruled out after leaving the game twice, first with a back injury and then a knee issue. ... DE Carl Nassib also injured a knee and didn't return, while CB Brandon Facyson was ruled out with a concussion.

UP NEXT

Raiders: Another NFC East opponent, this time at home against Washington on Dec. 5.

Cowboys: At New Orleans next Thursday. It's the sixth time in eight seasons Dallas has followed Thanksgiving with another Thursday game.

Allen throws for 4 TDs as Bills beat hobbled Saints, 31-6

NEW ORLEANS — Josh Allen and the mercurial Buffalo Bills swung back to a better version of themselves against the reeling New Orleans Saints.

Allen passed for 260 yards and four touchdowns, and the Bills throttled New Orleans' short-handed offense in a 31-6 victory Thursday night that sent the injury-ravaged Saints to their fourth straight loss.

"Coach always talks about playoff caliber and that's the team we want to be," Allen said. "We want to be the best versions of ourselves ... every time we step on the field."

Dawson Knox caught two touchdown passes, giving him a franchise-best seven TDs in a single season by a tight end. His second score gave the Bills (7-4) a 24-0 lead.

Stefon Diggs had seven receptions for 74 yards and a touchdown, and running back Matt Breida turned a short pass into a 23-yard score in a dominant victory that came just four days after a 26-point home loss to Indianapolis.

"To come up short the way we did (last weekend), sometimes it can be demoralizing," said defensive end Mario Addison, who had one of Buffalo's two sacks of Trevor Siemian. "You've just got to flush that and do it all over again. Everybody had a great

mindset going into this game and we were just ready."

The Saints (5-6), playing without dynamic running back Alvin Kamara for a third straight game, were shut out for three quarters. They finally scored for Siemian's 11-yard pass to tight end Nick Vannett on the first play of the fourth.

Buffalo outgained New Orleans 361-190 and the Bills possessed the ball for 34:38 to the Saints' 25:22.

The game illustrated how limited the Saints' offense has become, in part because of injuries to Kamara and star receiver Michael Thomas, who has not played all season, and also due to significant changes at quarterback.

New Orleans went 5-2 in games started by QB Jameis Winston, who took over this season for the retired Drew Brees. But Winston went out for the season with a knee injury during New Orleans' most recent victory on Oct. 31 and the Saints have lost every game Siemian has started.

Saints coach Sean Payton's urgency to sustain drives was evident in his decision to call a running play on fourth-and-2 near midfield and to later run a fake punt. Both failed, with the run losing yards and punter Blake Gilikin's pass sailing high and wide of intended receiver Lil'Jordan Humphrey.

"Going in, we felt like we had to be a

little bit more aggressive," because of how capable the Bills are offensively, Payton said. "We weren't going to be able to win a game scoring 14 points or 17 points against a team like this."

Siemian finished 17-of-29 passing for 163 yards, one TD and one interception. Taysom Hill, who is coming off a foot injury, was active as New Orleans' backup quarterback but did not play.

Incidentally, Brees was working the game as a broadcaster and the raucous reception he received from the crowd when he was honored on the field at halftime contrasted sharply from the collective groans of frustration when one New Orleans drive after another stalled.

Most fans had filed out of the dome by early in the fourth quarter, leaving a solid traveling contingent of fans wearing Buffalo blue to close out Thanksgiving on a celebratory note.

The result left Payton foreshadowing changes as the Saints try to figure out how to end their worst losing streak in a season since 2015.

"We'll look at everything right now. Obviously, we have to," Payton said. "We've got to look closely at everything we're doing and who we're doing it with."

TURNOVER TREND

The result could have been more lopsided had the Saints not intercepted Allen twice — once deep in New Orleans territory when defensive

end Cameron Jordan hit Allen as he threw and linebacker Kwon Alexander made a diving catch of the fluttering ball.

It was Allen's third game in four in which he had multiple turnovers. The previous two were losses, but this time it only prevented the Bills from winning by even more.

Saints cornerback Bradley Roby had New Orleans' first interception near midfield in the first half.

Allen has thrown seven interceptions and lost a fumble in his past four games.

INJURIES

Bills: CB Tre'Davious White, a former LSU star playing in his home state for the first time as a pro, appeared to hurt his left knee in the second quarter. He was able to limp off the field on his own, but slammed his helmet down near the bench and then walked to the locker room with a towel over his head and did not return.

Saints: LB Kaden Ellis left the game with a hamstring injury. ... Rookie cornerback Paulson Adebo was helped to the sideline after a heavy collision in the fourth quarter.

UP NEXT

Bills: Host the New England Patriots in a Monday night showdown for first place in the AFC East on Dec. 6.

Saints: Host the Dallas Cowboys next Thursday night.

Saints honor Brees at halftime of Thanksgiving night game

NEW ORLEANS — Retired Saints quarterback Drew Brees finally got a send-off from a packed and loud Superdome.

With Brees calling Thursday night's game between New Orleans and Buffalo as part of the NBC broadcast team, the franchise chose to honor Brees on the field at halftime.

With the Southern University band spelling out "Brees #9" on the field, a montage of memorable moments from Brees' career played on Superdome video boards before Saints owner Gayle Benson introduced Brees. Cheers erupted, quickly followed by elongated howls of, "Dreeew!"

"We've experienced so many unbelievable moments on this field and in this city," Brees said. "Thank you so much for loving us, thank you for embracing me and my family. We will always love you and we will always work to make you proud."

Brees then raised his fist in the air while urging the crowd to belt out its traditional chant of "Who dat, who dat, who dat say they gonna beat them Saints!"

"The greatest fans in the world, let's blow the top off this dome and make the world feel it and hear it," Brees said as he brought down his arm, initiating the chant.

The crowd then cheered as Brees walked off the field to go back to work.

Brees, who played 20 NFL seasons and his last 15 in New Orleans, played his final season before mostly sparse crowds as the NFL operated under COVID-19 protocols significantly restricting the size of gatherings in stadiums.

He retired last offseason as the NFL's all-time leader in yards passing with 80,358, but has since been eclipsed this season by Tampa Bay's Tom Brady.

Brees' 571 career touchdown passes rank second behind Brady's 610.

Brees, who began his career with the then-San Diego Chargers in 2001, came in New Orleans at a time when the city was still coping with widespread devastation caused by Hurricane Katrina in August 2005. In his first season, the Saints — who'd gone 3-13 in 2005 — improved to 10-6 and advanced to the franchise's first NFC title game.

Lions find new ways of self-destructing in loss to Bears

DETROIT — When the Detroit Lions punted with 8:30 left against the Chicago Bears, quarterback Jared Goff was already planning what his offense would have to do next.

It ended up as a waste of time.

Trailing 14-13, the Bears put together an 18-play, 69-yard drive before ending the game with a 28-yard field goal as time expired in Detroit's 16-14 loss on Thursday.

As Goff watched in disbelief, his team fell to 0-10-1.

"When we came off the field with all that time left, it never crossed my mind that we'd never get back out there," he said. "I figured, at worse, we would be looking at a four-minute drive to win the game. Our defense had been fantastic all day."

That defense, which has held three straight opponents to 16 or fewer points, couldn't get one more stop.

Chicago picked up five first downs and only had to convert twice on third downs. On third-and-5 from their 37, Andy Dalton hit Damiere Byrd for 13 yards, although a Lions holding penalty would have given Chicago a first down either way.

With Dalton taking as much time as possible, the Bears were facing second-and-10 from the Detroit 17 coming out of the two-minute warning. Julian Okwara stopped David Montgomery for a yard and the Lions called their first timeout.

Then they called their second one. That's not allowed.

With 1:54 to play and Chicago lined up for the crucial third-and-9, Lions coach Dan Campbell realized there was a problem.

"Half of our defense had one play call and half had another," he said. "If I didn't do anything, they were going to score an easy touchdown."

So Campbell called his second timeout, despite knowing the rule against back-to-back timeouts.

The Lions were called for defensive delay of game and lost the timeout. The Bears easily converted the third-and-4 against Detroit's soft coverage, Dalton knelt three times and Cairo Santos kicked the short field goal as time expired.

It was the third time the Lions had lost

on a walk-off field goal, but this wasn't a record-setter like Justin Tucker's 66-yarder for the Ravens in Week 3 or even a long-range shot like Greg Joseph's 54-yarder for Minnesota in Week 5. This was a chip shot to end a game Detroit needed to win.

"We can look at these games as positives — we are staying competitive with some pretty good teams, but that actually makes it worse," Lions tackle Taylor Decker said. "When you lose a game like this, every guy can look at the tape and find one thing he could have done to change the game. That hurts."

For Decker and the offense, there were a lot of things they could have fixed. Goff went 6-for-6 for 64 yards on the Lions opening drive, finishing with a 39-yard touchdown pass to Josh Reynolds, but things went downhill in a hurry.

In the second quarter, with a first down at the Bears 29, the Lions were called for three straight penalties, making it first-and-30 from the 49. Goff completed two passes to running back Jamaal Williams, one for 4 yards and one for a 6-yard loss, and on third-and-32, Williams gained a yard on a draw.

"There aren't any plays set up for third-and-32," Goff said. "That's not a situation that comes up very often."

The Lions punted and the Bears only needed two plays to take a 10-7 lead on Dalton's 17-yard touchdown pass to Jimmy Graham.

The Bears kicked a field goal on the last play of the half to take a 13-7 lead, but Goff's touchdown pass to T.J. Hockenson put the Lions ahead by one late in the third quarter.

After the Bears punted, the Lions took over on their 10. They got the ball to their 47, but on second-and-7, they were called for a false start, followed by two holding penalties. Goff missed Reynolds on a deep ball leaving the Lions with, you guessed it, third-and-32.

This time, they called a screen pass, gained 7 yards, and never saw the ball again.

"This team isn't built to overcome third-and-32," Campbell said. "No team is, but we certainly don't have the margin of error to overcome that many penalties. Our defense gave us a chance to win, like they have done so many times before, and we just couldn't get out of our own way."

TALL GREEN STALKS

This past summer I was fortunate enough to see some of our country's great national parks. My friend and I began our travels through the Panhandle of Texas, then through Oklahoma, ventured into Kansas, then Nebraska on the way to Colorado, South Dakota, Montana, Wyoming, Utah, Arizona, New Mexico and back home. You might think we were going a-round-about way to our nation's natural treasures, but I had never been to many states. My father was in the Air Force and my mother did not like to travel, so I was envious of those "military kids" who got to see different lands when their parents were transferred around. My dad was assigned areas of the world to which my mother did not want to go, such as Korea, Japan, France (which I would have loved even though I was 5 years old), and Vietnam (during the war so that really wasn't an option). My siblings got to see different states but when I was born in Big Spring my parents loved Webb AFB and here we stayed. But back to my recent adventure. While on the road my friend and I were treated to the sight of rows and rows, acres and acres, miles and miles of the prettiest

green corn crops. I was amazed at the maize if you will pardon the pun. Our conversation was one of the vastness of the acres planted with corn. Then it was obvious to us that corn is one of the essential corps of our world. It is eaten in a myriad of ways from on the cob itself to canned and frozen. It is used in recipes and ground for meal. Corn is used in corn chips, tortillas, and other food products not to mention oil for cooking food. Corn shucks have been used to wrap tamales, make dolls, stuff mattresses, and even insulate houses. Corn stalks were used in earlier times to control erosion, fill in wagon ruts, and even create crude fences.

Corn is used for livestock consumption. More than 96% of field corn grown in Texas is used to feed livestock with more than 1/3 of all corn grown in the United States used to

feed farm animals. Corn fed animals gain weight quickly from corn's high starch content. It also improves the yield from dairy cows and reduces the amount of land needed to support their feed requirements. A by-product called distillers grain is also used as livestock feed. Distillers grain is produced when corn is used to create Ethanol. Ethanol is a low-carbon fuel that is blended with gasoline and is considered an environmentally friendly renewable fuel.

Texas farmers plant more than 2 million acres of corn annually and average more than 285 million bushels annually. Planting corn is a balance of ensuring the soil is warm enough to germinate the seeds but not so early that the young plants are damaged in a late frost. Texas farmers normally begin planting the crop in January but depending on location it can be as late as July. Corn typically takes around 120 days to reach maturity and thus harvesting can occur as early as July to late November in Texas.

After I returned from my travels, I happened upon the PBS series "Native Americans". I guess it was fate as the second episode discussed corn and its connection with Native Americans. It has

been established (by Nobel Prize winning geneticist George Beadle) that corn was developed over 10,000 years ago from the Teosinte plant. The Native Americans in the Balsas River region of Mexico began transforming the Teosinte into corn and the evidence of the first "true" corn crop dating to some 9,000 years ago has been found in ancient ruins. Teosinte is a weed like plant with a tough nearly impossible to break seed covering or fruit case. So why would the early Native Americans think about using it as a food source. Some theorize they started developing maize once they found Teosinte seeds made popcorn! No matter why the Native Americans began developing the corn crop, it became one of their bedrock crops. Corn, beans, and squash were a staple of their diet. These were planted together by many Native Americans. The corn stalks helped to prevent soil erosion, the beans put back nutrients and the squash plants dense leaves protected the plants during growth. There are a great many stories past down through the generations of Native Americans based of the "Mother Corn" and the art works of many tribes have corn images.

Corn as we know it today is most commonly the Yellow Dent #2 variety or Field Corn. Up until the 1893 World's Fair, the types or varieties of corn were a bit of a problem for transporting to market. The crates had to be marked according to variety and some needed different care than others. However, when James Reid's Yellow Dent #2 won the blue ribbon at the World's Fair, it was such a success and the demand for it so large that shipment of corn became easier with the one variety. Today's market contains Sweet corn, White corn, and other specialty corns in addition to the Dent or Field corn. The Northern High Plains accounts for almost two thirds of Texas corn production.

I hope you will appreciate the importance of corn the next time you use a crayon, read a book (used in the binding), take some cough syrup or medicine, use a bandage, wash your hands (used in soap and cosmetics), or even watch fireworks (used as a binding compound). No matter whether I see the roasted ears of corn at our local fairs or the corn casserole at my Thanksgiving table, I know it will make me think of all those acres of tall green stalks.

Wall Street opens lower; Gap, Nordstrom sink on weak results

Stocks are opening lower on Wall Street as the market continues an unsettled period of trading ahead of the Thanksgiving holiday in the U.S. The S&P 500 gave back 0.3% in the early going Wednesday. The benchmark index, which set a record high last Thursday, was weighed down by losses in technology and consumer-focused companies. Tesla fell nearly 4%, while Gap sank 20% after reporting results that came in far below analysts' forecasts. Nordstrom gave up 25% after it also reported very weak results. European markets were lower and Asian markets closed mixed. Crude oil prices slipped.

TOKYO (AP) — Global shares were mixed Wednesday as worries about inflation set off expectations the U.S. Federal Reserve might move faster than anticipated to raise interest rates.

France's CAC 40 edged up 0.4% to 7,074.05 in early trading, while Germa-

ny's DAX rose 0.1% to 15,955.14. Britain's FTSE 100 added 0.5% to 7,303.68. The future for the Dow Jones Industrial Average edged 0.1% lower to 35,744.00. The S&P 500 future fell 0.1% to 4,685.00.

Stocks are likely to see more mixed trading this week, with U.S. markets closing on Thursday for Thanksgiving and then closing early on Friday.

In Asian trading, Japan's Nikkei 225 dropped 1.6% to finish at 29,302.66, following a national holiday Tuesday. Technology shares especially took a hit over the speculation about the Fed's moves. South Korea's Kospi slipped 0.1% to 2,994.29. In Australia, the S&P/ASX 200 edged down 0.2% to 7,399.40. Hong Kong's Hang Seng rose 0.1% to 24,685.50, while the Shanghai Composite edged up 0.1% to 3,592.70.

"Markets continue to shift their expectations toward a tighter Fed monetary policy," said Yeap Jun Rong, a market strategist at IG, adding that investors will be watching for U.S. data being released later in the day.

Wall Street will get a few pieces of economic data on Wednesday that

could give investors a better sense of the economic recovery's pace and breadth.

The Labor Department will release its weekly report on unemployment benefits. The Commerce Department releases data on third-quarter gross domestic product and its new home sales report for October.

The Fed will release minutes later in the day from its October policy meeting, potentially giving investors more details on the central bank's plan to start trimming bond purchases that have helped keep interest rates low.

Some Asian central banks have already begun to raise interest rates to tamp down inflation. New Zealand's raised its benchmark interest rate by 0.25% Wednesday to 0.75%.

In October the Reserve Bank raised it from a record low 0.25% to 0.5%, the first such hike in more than seven years, removing some support it put in place when the coronavirus pandemic began.

Investors have been watching to see if pressure from rising inflation will goad the Fed into speeding up its plans

for trimming bond purchases and raising its benchmark interest rate.

The price of U.S. crude oil rose extended gains after President Joe Biden ordered 50 million barrels of oil released from the nation's strategic reserve to help bring down energy costs. The move was made in concert with other big oil-consuming nations, including Japan, South Korea and India.

On Tuesday, benchmark U.S. crude jumped 2.3% and wholesale gasoline rose 3.4%.

The release of the oil reserves may not necessarily bring down oil prices, but analysts say it may serve as a message to OPEC. Biden has been urging other big oil producers to more quickly raise output to match higher demand as economies recover from earlier phases of the pandemic.

On Wednesday, benchmark U.S. crude rose 42 cents to \$78.92 a barrel. Brent crude, the international standard, added 45 cents to \$82.76 a barrel.

The U.S. dollar fell to 114.95 Japanese yen from 115.15 yen. The euro cost \$1.1238, down from \$1.1249.

US GDP slowed sharply in Q3 but big rebound expected in Q4

WASHINGTON — The U.S. economy slowed to a modest annual rate of 2.1% in the October-December quarter according to the government's second read of the data, slightly better than its first estimate. But economists are predicting a solid rebound in the current quarter as long as rising inflation and a recent uptick in COVID cases do not derail activity.

The increase in the gross domestic product, the economy's total output of goods and services, is up from an initial estimate of 2% for the third quarter, the Commerce Department reported Wednesday. But the revision was still well below the solid gains of 6.3% in the first quarter this year and 6.7% in the second.

The small increase from the initial GDP estimate a month ago reflected a slightly better performance for consumer spending, which grew at a still lackluster 1.7% rate in the third quarter, compared to a 12% surge in the April-June quarter. The contribution to GDP from business inventory restocking was also revised up.

The economy's weak summer performance reflected a big slowdown in consumer spending as a spike in COVID-19 cases from the delta variant caused consumers to grow more cautious and snarled supply chains made items such as new cars hard to get and also contributed to a burst of inflation to levels not seen in three decades.

While COVID cases in recent weeks have started to rise again in many parts of the country, economists do not think the latest increase will be enough to dampen consumer spending, which accounts for 70% of economic activity.

The expectation is that the economy in the current October-December quarter could grow at the strongest pace this year, with some economists forecast GDP could surge to an 8% rate in the fourth quarter.

For the whole year, the expectation is that the economy will grow by around 5.5%, which would be the best showing since 1984 and a big im-

provement from last year when the economy shrank by 3.4%. That was the biggest annual decline since an 11.6% plunge in 1946, when the nation was demobilized after World War II.

"After experiencing one of the most severe economic shocks of the past century in 2020, the U.S. economy has displayed one of the most rapid recoveries in modern history in 2021," Gregory Daco, chief U.S. economist for Oxford Economics, wrote in a note to clients. Daco predicted GDP in the current October-December period would rebound to a growth rate of 5.6%.

So far, the improving economy this year has not boosted the approval ratings of President Joe Biden because the U.S., with one of the most rapidly recovering economies, is also caught up in a global supply chain squeeze that is driving prices higher for everything from new cars and gasoline to the cost of food and airline tickets.

Biden this week nominated Federal Reserve Chairman Jerome Powell for a second four-year term to head the central bank. Powell and other Fed officials had earlier in the year insisted that the spoke in pries was being caused by temporary factors, such as those snarled supply chains.

However, recently the central bank has stressed that if the price increase persist it will be ready to start raising interest rates sooner than expected to slow growth as a way of dampening inflation pressures.

Mark Zandi, chief economist at Moody's Analytics, said he now expected the Fed to boost its benchmark interest twice next year in September and December. Those rate increases will translate into higher borrowing costs for consumers and businesses.

But analysts don't believe the expected two quarter-point rate hikes will be enough to derail the recovery. They are also optimistic that the global pandemic will be less of a drag next year.

"I think each new wave of COVID cases will be less disruptive to the economy because more people are getting vaccinated," Zandi said.

Public nuisance laws in opioid cases give hope to both sides

CLEVELAND — A jury's finding this week that three major pharmacy chains are responsible for contributing to the scourge of opioid addiction in two Ohio counties may be just the beginning of a protracted legal battle that ultimately could leave the communities no better off.

The reason is the central argument — that pharmacies created a "public nuisance" by dispensing an overwhelming quantity of prescription painkillers into each county.

Thousands of state and local governments have sued drugmakers, distributors and pharmacies over a crisis that has contributed to more than 500,000 overdose deaths in the U.S. over the past two decades. The lawsuits generally center on claims the companies created public nuisances by interfering with the rights of the public through the way they marketed, shipped and sold the drugs — feeding the addictions of some patients and providing pills later diverted to the black market.

Similar arguments were used in two other cases — in California and Oklahoma — that went in favor of the industry in the weeks before the Ohio jury's decision. Given those decisions, there is no guarantee that Tuesday's verdict in the case brought by Lake and Trumbull counties against CVS, Walgreens and Walmart will hold up on appeal or lead to similar decisions elsewhere.

"There's been a variety of different decisions lately that should give us reason to be cautious about what this really means in the grand scheme," said Kevin Roy, chief public policy officer at Shatterproof, which advocates for solutions to the nation's ad-

diction and overdose crisis.

The industry argues it did nothing illegal and that public nuisance laws simply don't apply to prescribing and distributing prescription painkillers.

"As we have said throughout this process, we never manufactured or marketed opioids nor did we distribute them to the 'pill mills' and internet pharmacies that fueled this crisis," Walgreens spokesperson Fraser Engerman said in a statement. "The plaintiffs' attempt to resolve the opioid crisis with an unprecedented expansion of public nuisance law is misguided and unsustainable."

Public nuisance claims are typically used to address local concerns like blighted homes, illegal drug-dealing or dangerous animals. Such claims were used in lawsuits states brought against tobacco companies in the 1990s, but those led to settlements rather than trials.

Lawyers representing the counties and other local governments involved in the broader universe of opioid lawsuits said the companies have been complicit in creating local public health emergencies by opening more locations, flooding communities with pills and facilitating the flow of opioids into a secondary market.

In Trumbull County alone, roughly 80 million prescription painkillers were dispensed between 2012 and 2016 — equivalent to 400 for every resident. In Lake County, it was some 61 million pills.

Rev. Barbara Holzhauser has seen the flood of opioids tear the seams of her community. She has been on the receiving end of too many calls telling her of another overdose death and has officiated at many of those funerals.

"In almost every situation the person, just like my nephew, has tried to get well and has fallen back into it," said Holzhauser, whose nephew died

from an overdose eight years ago.

An assistant minister at Mentor United Methodist Church, she said the crisis has been devastating across Lake County, a mix of blue collar and affluent suburban neighborhoods just east of Cleveland. Holzhauser said she was glad the county was doing something to hold the drug industry accountable.

"I can't think of anyone that I know that hasn't been affected by it somehow," she said.

The attorneys representing local governments in the national opioid litigation cited impacts like those on Lake County in defending the use of public nuisance statutes, asserting companies were negligent or careless. Attorney Mark Lanier said the pharmacies should have exercised greater responsibility in dispensing opioids.

"These are drugs that are highly addictive," Lanier said. "And through this trial, the jury was able to assess those national measures that have been put in place by these pharmaceutical chains and shout out from the rooftops: 'Inadequate.'"

Yet the pharmacy chains have vowed to keep fighting and see reason for optimism.

An Oklahoma judge ruled in 2019 that drugmaker Johnson & Johnson created a nuisance and ordered the company to pay the state \$465 million. This month, the state Supreme Court rejected the verdict, saying Oklahoma's public nuisance law didn't apply to the opioid maker.

Also this month, a California judge ruled in favor of a group of drugmakers being sued under a public nuisance statute by county and city governments.

Tuesday's ruling bucked that trend. The Ohio case also is unique because it was the first of the U.S. opioid trials

to be decided by a jury rather than a court, and the first on claims against pharmacies.

Elizabeth Burch, a University of Georgia law professor, said pursuing the cases on public nuisance grounds makes sense because the pharmacies were uniquely positioned to watch the addiction crisis develop.

"These are the folks that are on the front lines," she said. "They're seeing the same people coming in and they're seeing the same doctors writing prescriptions."

But she also noted that public nuisance statutes and case law vary by state and that factors such as a compelling lawyer can be enough to swing a verdict. That makes it uncertain whether a consensus will develop around the legal theory.

More tests of the public nuisance laws are on the horizon.

A federal judge in West Virginia heard a case against drug distributors earlier this year but has not yet ruled. Trials are ongoing against distributors in Washington state and manufacturers in New York.

Unlike companies in other segments of the drug industry, no pharmacy has entered into a nationwide settlement deal over the crisis. Joe Rice, one of the lead attorneys representing local governments in the cases, said he hopes the ruling prompts pharmacy chains to start reaching those settlements.

If they don't, it could cost them even more. The two Ohio counties, for instance, are each seeking more than \$1 billion in damages in a second phase of the trial that is expected to be held next April or May.

"We're going to try a lot of cases and we're going to lose some," Rice said. "But we're going to win this war."

NASA launches spacecraft to test asteroid defense concept

LOS ANGELES — NASA launched a spacecraft Tuesday night on a mission to smash into an asteroid and test whether it would be possible to knock a speeding space rock off course if one were to threaten Earth.

The DART spacecraft, short for Double Asteroid Redirection Test, lifted off from Vandenberg Space Force Base atop a SpaceX Falcon 9 rocket in a \$330 million project with echoes of the Bruce Willis movie "Armageddon."

If all goes well, the boxy, 1,200-pound (540-kilogram) craft will slam head-on into Dimorphos, an asteroid 525 feet (160 meters) across, at 15,000 mph (24,139 kph) next September.

"This isn't going to destroy the asteroid. It's just going to give it a small nudge," said mission official Nancy Chabot of Johns Hopkins Applied Physics Laboratory, which is managing the project.

Dimorphos orbits a much larger asteroid called Didymos. The pair are no danger to Earth but offer scientists a better way to measure the effectiveness of a collision than a single asteroid flying through space.

Dimorphos completes one orbit of Didymos every 11 hours, 55 minutes. DART's goal is a crash that will slow Dimorphos down and cause it to fall closer toward the bigger asteroid, shaving 10 minutes off its orbit.

The change in the orbital period will be measured by telescopes on Earth. The minimum change for the mission to be considered a success is 73 seconds.

The DART technique could prove useful for altering the course of an asteroid years or decades before it bears down on Earth with the potential for catastrophe.

A small nudge "would add up to a big change in its future position, and then the asteroid and the Earth wouldn't be on a collision course," Chabot said.

Scientists constantly search for asteroids and plot their courses to determine whether they could hit the planet.

"Although there isn't a currently known asteroid that's on an impact course with the Earth, we do know that there is a large population of near-Earth asteroids out there," said Lindley Johnson, planetary defense officer at NASA. "The key to planetary defense is finding them well before they are an impact threat."

DART will take 10 months to reach the asteroid pair. The collision will occur about 6.8 million miles (11 million kilometers) from Earth.

Ten days beforehand, DART will release a tiny observation spacecraft supplied by the Italian space agency that will follow it.

DART will stream video until it is destroyed on impact. Three minutes later, the trailing craft will make images of the impact site and material that is ejected.

On the road again: Travelers emerge in time for Thanksgiving

DALLAS — Determined to reclaim Thanksgiving traditions that were put on pause last year by the pandemic, millions of Americans will be loading up their cars or piling onto planes to gather again with friends and family.

The number of air travelers this week is expected to approach or even exceed pre-pandemic levels, and auto club AAA predicts that 48.3 million people will travel at least 50 miles from home over the holiday period, an increase of nearly 4 million over last year despite sharply higher gasoline prices.

Many feel emboldened by the fact that nearly 200 million Americans are now fully vaccinated. But it also means brushing aside concerns about a resurgent virus at a time when the U.S. is now averaging nearly 100,000 new infections a day and hospitals in Michigan, Minnesota, Colorado and Arizona are seeing alarming increases in patients.

The seven-day daily average of new reported cases up nearly 30% in the last two weeks through Tuesday, according to figures from Johns Hopkins University. The U.S. Centers for Disease Control and Prevention says unvaccinated people should not travel, although it is unclear whether that recommendation is having any effect.

More than 2.2 million travelers streamed through airport checkpoints last Friday, the busiest day since the pandemic devastated travel early last year. From Friday through Monday, the number of people flying in the U.S. was more than double the same days last year and only 8% lower than the same days in 2019.

At Newark Liberty International Airport in New Jersey, Peter Titus, an engineer at the Princeton University plasma physics lab, was heading to visit extended family in Canada with his wife and adult son. He carried a folder with printouts of their vaccination cards and negative COVID-19

tests needed to fly into Canada.

His son, Christian Titus, who works as a voice actor, says he's spent much of the pandemic inside but is willing to risk flying on a crowded airplane because he misses being around his family. He got a booster shot to increase his protection.

"My mental health does better by being around my family during these times," he said. "Yeah, it's dangerous. But you love these people, so you do what you can to stay safe around them."

Meka Starling and her husband were excited for many members of their extended family to meet their 2-year-old son, Kaiden, for the first time at a big Thanksgiving gathering in Linden, New Jersey.

"We've put pictures on Facebook so a lot of them have seen pictures of him, but to get to actually touch him and talk to him, I'm excited about it," said Starling, 44, of West Point, Mississippi, who will gather with nearly 40 family members, all of whom agreed to be vaccinated.

For their part, airlines are hoping to avoid a repeat of the massive flight cancellations — more than 2,300 apiece — that dogged Southwest and American Airlines at different times last month.

The breakdowns started with bad weather in one part of the country and spun out of control. In the past, airlines had enough pilots, flight attendants and other workers to recover from many disruptions within a day or two. They are finding it harder to bounce back now, however, because they are stretched thin after pushing thousands of employees to quit when travel collapsed last year.

American, Southwest, Delta and United have all been hiring lately, which gives the airlines and industry observers hope that flights will stay on track this week.

"The airlines are prepared for the holidays," said Helene Becker, an airlines analyst for financial-services firm Cowen. "They cut back the number of flights, the industry has enough pilots, they

are putting more flight attendants through their (training) academies, and they are paying flight attendants a premium — what I'm going to call hazardous-duty pay — to encourage people not to blow off work."

The airlines have little margin for error right now. American expected to fill more than 90% of its seats with paying customers on Tuesday. That's a throwback to holiday travel before the pandemic.

"There is not a lot of room to put people on another flight if something goes wrong," said Dennis Tajer, a pilot for the airline and a spokesman for the American pilots' union.

Meanwhile, the Transportation Security Administration is dismissing concern that it might have staffing shortages at airport checkpoints this week because of a requirement that federal employees be vaccinated against COVID-19. White House officials said 93% of TSA employees are in compliance with the mandate, and they don't expect any disruptions.

For holiday travelers going by car, the biggest pain is likely to be higher prices at the pump. The nationwide average for gasoline on Tuesday was \$3.40 a gallon, according to AAA, up more than 60% from last Thanksgiving.

Those prices could be one of several factors that will discourage some holiday travelers. In a survey conducted by Gasbuddy, which tracks pump prices, about half of the app users who responded said high prices will affect their travel plans this week. About two in five said they aren't making as many trips for a variety of reasons.

President Joe Biden on Tuesday ordered 50 million barrels of oil released from America's strategic reserve to help bring down energy costs, in coordination with other major energy consuming nations. The U.S. action is aimed at global energy markets, but also at helping Americans coping with higher inflation and rising prices ahead of Thanksgiving and winter holiday travel.

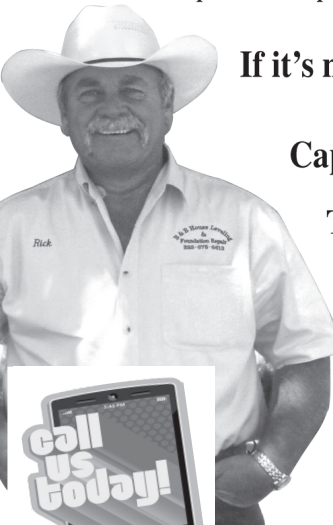

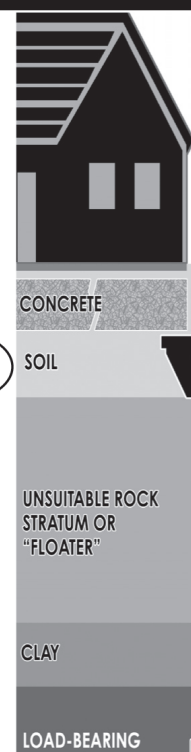

Enhance appetizer selections with mini pizzas

Appetizers come in all types and flavors. When those flavors include the classic tomato, mozzarella and basil combination of pizza, appetizers are sure to fly off of the serving tray. During peak entertaining seasons, having a bevy of appetizer options at the ready helps ensure successful celebrations.

This recipe for "Pizze Fritte" from Daniel Paterna's "Feast of the Seven Fishes: A Brooklyn Italian's Recipes Celebrating Food & Family" (Powerhouse Books) makes for tasty appetizers or even a fast Friday night dinner.

Cooks can decide if they want to make homemade dough and sauce or use prepared options. Also, consider making mini calzones to accompany these

handheld pizzas.

Pizze Fritte
Serves 8 to 10

Dough:

- 1 packet active dry yeast
- 1 cup warm water
- 1 teaspoon sugar
- 1 tablespoon sugar

- 1 tablespoon extra virgin olive oil, plus more for the bowl to drizzle
- 3 1/2 cups all-purpose flour, plus more as needed

- 1 teaspoon kosher salt
- 3 tablespoons olive oil

Combine the yeast, sugar, warm water (just warm to the touch) in a large bowl. Whisk to mix and let sit about 3 minutes until bubbly.

Coat the bowl of a standing mixer with olive oil. Arm the mixer with a dough hook, then place 2 cups of flour and the salt in the bowl.

Pour in the yeast mixture and mix at medium speed about 1 to 2 minutes until a rough, sticky ball of dough comes together, adding a little more flour or water as necessary.

Let the dough rest for 5 minutes in the mixer. Then mix on low about 1 minute until the dough is no longer sticky.

Oil your hands, transfer the dough to a lightly floured board or the dough to an oiled bowl and cover the surface of the bowl with plastic wrap.

Refrigerate for at least 1 hour or overnight. When the dough has doubled in size, remove it from the refrigerator and bring to room temperature. (A less labor-intensive alternative to the above would be to buy some pizza dough from your corner pizzeria.)

Toppings (maintain at

room temperature):

- 1 pound of fresh mozzarella cheese, cut into small, thin slices

- 1/2 cup grated Romano cheese

- 2 tablespoons dry Italian oregano and 1/2 cup torn fresh basil

Freshly made sauce, or Don Pepino All-Natural Pizza Sauce is a good alternative if you are pressed for time.

Working on a lightly floured board or the kitchen counter, pinch off enough dough to make a 4-inch-round mini pizza. Place it on the floured baking sheet.

Continue in this manner until all of the dough has been used. Set the mini pizza crusts aside to rise for at least 30 minutes.

Add canola oil with a drop of extra virgin olive oil to a 10-inch skillet, over medium heat. When the oil reaches 350 F on a deep-fry thermometer, add two to three pizzas to the oil. They cook very quickly.

Fry for approximately 2 minutes, or until they are puffed and golden.

At this point, turn the pizzas over and very carefully top each one with a slice of mozzarella. The moisture in the cheese will cause the oil to splatter, so it's best if you keep it from sipping off the crust.

Remove the pizzas from the oil when the bottoms are brown and place them on a platter. Add sauce, grated cheese, oregano, and basil, if using, and a drizzle of extra virgin olive oil. Serve.

Alternative: Take the risen dough rounds, add a teaspoon of ricotta cheese and a slice of mozzarella cheese. Fold in half and pinch the edges to make mini calzones. Fry until golden.

Bridge is mostly a game of reasoning and logic. Of course, there are other factors, such as psychology, temperament, imagination, deception and so on, but basically the player who reasons well is the one who will wind up a winner.

For this reason, very few plays in bridge can legitimately be termed "brilliant." If a play is the correct

play, how can it be brilliant? A hand might be bid or played well, but from the standpoint of par, that's to be expected. A player who meets that expectation is therefore only doing what he is supposed to do.

Consider today's deal where West led the four of spades against South's five-heart contract. East won with the ace, on which declarer played the king! East naturally thought the king was a singleton and so shifted to a club. South gratefully discarded his three of spades, gave up a trump trick and so made the contract.

Had declarer followed with the spade three at trick one, East would surely have returned a spade for West to ruff, and South would have gone down one.

South's play of the king is certainly to be commended, but all it proves is that he was alert. He realized from the bidding that East had to have six spades and that a ruff was imminent. He also realized that by dropping the king, he might talk East out of returning a spade, which is exactly what happened.

But brilliant? Absolutely not. South simply made the right play, that's all.

Richard Thomas has a 'Waltons' homecoming in new CW movie

Richard Thomas not only played eldest son John-Boy on "The Waltons," he also wanted to do the show's opening and closing narration.

Now, a half-century later, he's getting that chance.

The actor returns to the franchise that made him an Emmy-winning star as The CW debuts the new movie "The Waltons' Homecoming" Sunday, Nov. 28. A remake of the film that became the pilot for the beloved 1972-81 series about a close-knit Depression-era mountain family, it lets Thomas reprise the part of John-Boy, but as the adult narrator ... the spot initially filled by "The Waltons" creator and executive producer Earl Hamner Jr.

"When I first read the script," the amiable Thomas recalls of the original production, "and there were these beautiful narrations at the beginning and the end, I was so excited. I thought, 'I can't wait to read these.' And then I was told, 'Actually, because he's the older John-Boy, Earl Hamner is going to read those.' But finally, it's come full-circle, and I'm really happy to have been invited to the party."

In "The Waltons' Homecoming," John-Boy is portrayed by Logan Shroyer, alias the teenage incarnation of Kevin Pearson on NBC's "This Is Us." He happens to be a friend of Thomas' grandson, fortifying the bond between the two actors as they share an iconic role. "I knew what The Waltons' was because I knew he was still recognized as John-Boy," Shroyer explains. "I hadn't really seen any of the series, which I actually don't think is a bad thing. I think that kind of helped me."

While Shroyer arguably is the best-known of the actors playing the younger family members, the snowstorm-involving "The Waltons' Homecoming" also features Ben Lawson and Bellamy Young ("Scandal") as parents John and Olivia, Rebecca Koon and Alpha Trivette as the Walton grandparents, and music veterans Marilyn McCoo and Billy Davis Jr. as church personnel.

"If you've done a show or a movie that they're remaking, there's always that first moment of, 'Oh, no, we're history now,'" Thomas reflects. "And then immediately after that, there's the feeling of, 'Well, of course. It makes perfect sense.' And how wonderful, because this is a classic, and classics are destined to be reinvented and done again for a new time. It's kind of the ultimate compliment."

"The Homecoming: A Christmas Story" was made as a one-shot 1971 film, but CBS chief William S. Paley was impressed enough by it to order the "Waltons" series (still shown regularly on the Hallmark Drama channel) from it. Thomas is gratified to revisit it now in a different way, noting the job "was easy for me to do, because I have such profound feelings about that show."

National Geographic re-enters 'The Hot Zone' with new 'Anthrax' drama

Almost immediately after the 9/11 terrorist attacks, America faced another threat: anthrax.

For several weeks in the fall of 2001, envelopes containing hazardous powder were received at offices of media figures and politicians, resulting in five deaths and 17 other infections. The story of how the sources were traced and the crisis eventually contained is dramatized in National Geographic's new sequel to its earlier miniseries "The Hot Zone," as "The Hot Zone: Anthrax" runs over three consecutive nights starting Sunday, Nov. 28.

Daniel Dae Kim ("Lost," "Hawaii Five-0") and Tony Goldwyn ("Scandal") star respectively as FBI Special Agent Matthew Ryker and microbiologist Bruce Ivins. The real-life Ivins, who took his own life in 2008, came to be a suspect in the attacks during an investigation by multiple government agencies.

"My character is an amalgamation of a number of different people involved with the investigation," Dae Kim explains, adding that (while continuing as an executive producer of ABC's "The Good Doctor") he appreciates having the role. "I think it's a sign of progress, and it's a testament to our producers - and everyone associated with the show who are making decisions - that they thought an Asian-American face could represent the face of the FBI."

Goldwyn says an "extremely helpful" component of his research was "Mirage Man," a biography about Ivins: "It had lots of details about his life and his psyche and the investigation itself. And then (I read) a number of other books about the investigation and really just tried to steep myself in it. And then I spoke to different experts in different fields, related to both

microbiology and psychiatry and some of the issues that impacted Bruce's life."

Among well-known personalities portrayed in "The Hot Zone: Anthrax," Enrico Colantoni ("Veronica Mars") appears as then-New York City Mayor Rudolph Giuliani, and Harry Hamlin appears as NBC News' Tom Brokaw. Ridley Scott, Lynda Obst and "Smallville" alumni Kelly Souder and Brian Peterson return from the 2019 "The Hot Zone" (which was about the Ebola outbreak) as executive producers, joined this time by David W. Zucker ("The Good Wife").

Noting that this year marks the 20th anniversary of the anthrax attacks as well as 9/11, Zucker believes now is appropriate for the new miniseries.

Bennett and Gaga team up 'One Last Time'

Tony Bennett's son is invested in the twilight of his father's career not only as his child, but also as his manager.

Danny Bennett has had a pivotal role in his music-icon father's professional life for four decades, encompassing the period when the elder Bennett and Lady Gaga became a surprising and hugely successful team. It was Danny's idea to reunite them for two concerts staged last August at New York's Radio City Music Hall, marking Tony's 95th birthday and his retirement from live performing. Those sold-out shows form the CBS special "One Last Time: An Evening With Tony Bennett and Lady Gaga," airing Sunday, Nov. 28.

The program's song list draws from the duo's latest tandem release, "Love for Sale," as well as their earlier album "Cheek to Cheek." Individually, they perform such tunes as "Luck Be a Lady," "New York, New York" and the Bennett standards "Steppin' Out With My Baby" and "I Left My Heart in San Francisco." Then together, they offer selections including "The Lady Is a Tramp" and "Anything Goes."

Tony's ability to retain his music memory while dealing with Alzheimer's disease was a recent "60 Minutes" subject. "Even though we'd been dealing with the Alzheimer's for a number of years," Danny says, "when he was performing, it was clear that the synapses were still firing. When that audience is out there, he gives 100 percent and it all comes back. It's amazing."

Danny also deems Lady Gaga "amazing, in terms of being supportive. Honestly, we wouldn't have been able to do this without her. I'm hugely respectful of

her position in this, so I let her lead the way. If at any point she felt uncomfortable and was like, 'I don't want to do this,' we would have not done it. But this is how I envisioned Tony in the final chapter. It embodies everything he is about, and she understands that. It's the greatest gift she could give to him."

A deal Danny struck with the ViacomCBS group of networks involves not only the CBS "One Last Time" special, but related programs to run on MTV and Paramount+ in 2022. "My whole career is about optimizing the sum of the parts," Danny reasons, "so I just kind of pitched the idea. Viacom was a major part of Tony's resurgence, with 'MTV Unplugged' and taking those chances in the '90s, so I love bringing the story full-circle."

"For Tony to still be performing the way he does, it's pretty miraculous, so let's go out swinging," Danny concludes. "As he has said, 'If you don't take risks, you're relegated to a life of mediocrity.' You just have to trust that twinkle in his eye."

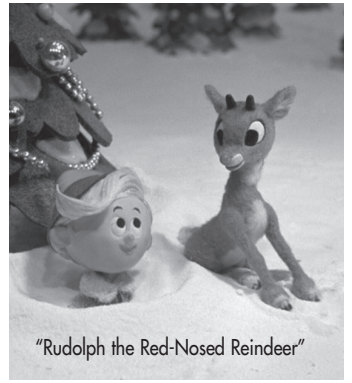

Though Henry Fonda (who eventually would work with the trilogy's director, Sergio Leone, on "Once Upon a Time in the West") was considered to introduce the character of The Man With No Name in 1964's "A Fistful of Dollars," his fee was too high for the production, so the offer went out to Charles Bronson ... who turned it down, also working with Leone later in the same movie with Fonda.

'Buddy vs. Duff' decks the halls with Christmas-themed cakes

The competition gets more festive but no less fervent when pals and rivals Buddy Valastro and Duff Goldman square off in a four-part bake-off upcoming on Food Network and discovery+.

In Season 4 of "Buddy vs. Duff," premiering Sunday, Nov. 28, the two master pastry chefs and their teams come together for a special competition to celebrate the holidays. Each group selects a theme and then has 20 hours to bring their vision to cake reality, with the final products being judged by Gesine Prado and Elizabeth Falkner at Valastro's bakery in New Jersey and Stephanie Boswell and Valerie Gordon at Goldman's bakery in Los Angeles. The overall winner receives \$25,000 to be donated to the charity of their choice.

It's a scene certain to be filled with Santas, reindeers, trees and of course, lots of snow, which Goldman says is particularly tricky for a baker to create.

"If I was going to do a miniature of say like a snow-covered village," he explains, "I would probably make it smooth because when you're flying and you're flying over an area that has been snowed on, it looks like a smooth, white blanket. But if something's going to be life-size, then you want to put texture on there because if you don't then your eye kind of tricks you into thinking that it's much, much, much bigger than it actually is."

And there were other skills that Goldman had to call on. He had to pull his ice sculpting talents out of mothballs to create a sculpture for a cake. And to make Christmas ornaments, he had to reacquire himself with the fine art of blowing sugar.

"For really good Christmas ornaments you need to blow it out of sugar just like you're blowing glass," Goldman explains. "That was another thing that I hadn't done probably since culinary school, and I was like, 'Man, I gotta figure out how to do this.' I watched a video on YouTube of how to blow sugar and then made a bunch of Christmas ornaments for this tree and it was really, really cool."

Of course, at the heart of the show are Goldman and Valastro, two world-class pastry chefs who have great respect for their craft and each other. That they also get along on camera and off is the (pardon the pun) icing on the cake.

"I feel like for the scale, there's not many people that can do what we do," Goldman says, "And I think that that's really exciting, is that we are combining so many different disciplines into what we create. You know, the engineering, the building, the design, the color theory, the actual baking, the stuff we're doing with food. There's so many sort of different components it's almost like we created this like - I don't even know what to call it - genre."

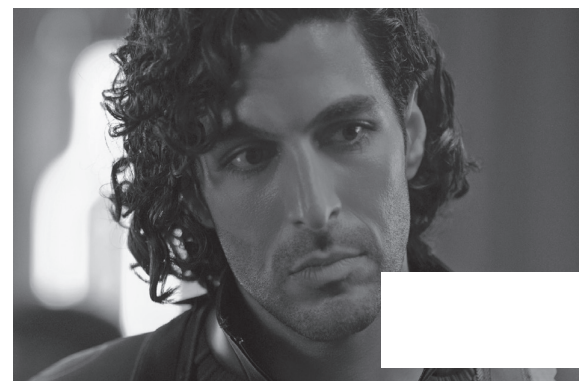

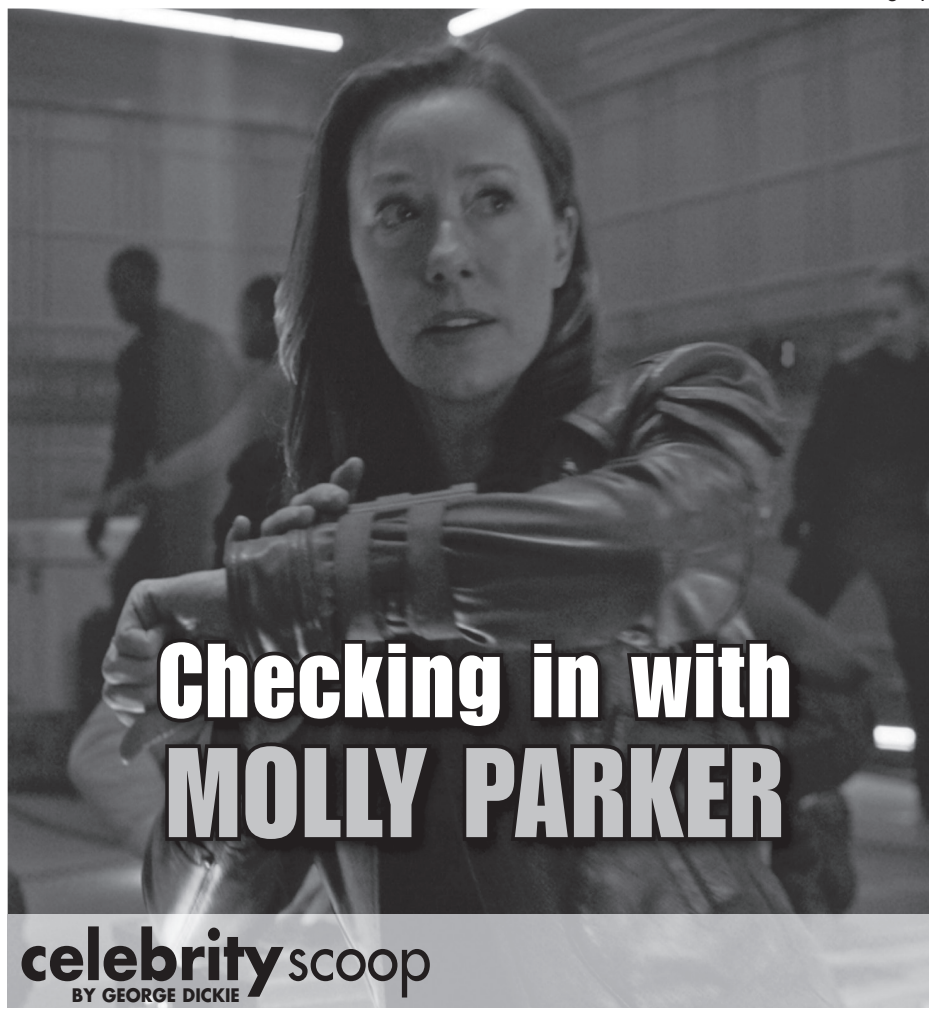

Molly Parker says one of the most amazing aspects of filming Netflix's "Lost in Space" over three seasons was watching the three young actors who play her children on the Netflix sci-fi adventure series grow and mature.

That was driven home for her in a scene that was shot in Season 1, rescued from the cutting room floor and used in a flashback sequence in Season 3, between her character Maureen Robinson and son Will, played by now-16-year-old Maxwell Jenkins.

"He was just a little boy," the Canadian actress and mother of a 15-year-old son exclaims. "He was like 11 when we started and now he's taller than everybody and a young man and it really had that bittersweet quality of watching boyhood or something like that where you just really go, 'Oh my God!' You know, you see time pass when you have children. It's like you see it in real time and we get to have that experience."

The third and final season, which begins streaming Wednesday, Dec. 1, finds Maureen and husband John (Toby Stephens) separated from offspring Will, Penny (Mina Sundwall) and Judy (Taylor Russell) after they sacrificed the Resolute to save them at the end of Season 2. The couple are stranded on a Jupiter with no way of contacting their children or even knowing if they're alive.

For Maureen, that means a lot of guilt for having taken her kids away from the safety of Earth and placed them in danger, as well as alienation between her and John.

It's yet another chapter in the life of the Space Family Robinson.

"What I have always loved about this show," Parker says, "is that at its heart it is about these sort of real family dynamics, and then we get to explore them in this really fun, adventuresome, fantastical way."

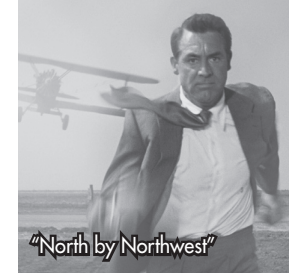

John Wayne shows 'True Grit' in Oscar-winning Western

Rooster Cogburn was the right role at the right time for John Wayne. The screen icon said in his Oscar acceptance speech that he would have done the part long before if he'd known that award would result for him, but 1969 was ideal for the classic Western "True Grit" – now streaming on Paramount+ – since it came when the movie industry was making a major thematic shift. Tales of the Old West were being phased out for more modern stories, in both plotting and execution, and "True Grit" turned out to be a sort of victory lap for an actor and a category that had served audiences well for decades.

Wayne would continue working for several more years until his death, but he didn't really get another part that fully equaled the impact of Cogburn (though he reprised the character in a sequel). In the Henry Hathaway-directed adaptation of Charles Portis' novel, the eyepatched lawman is enlisted by spirited young Mattie Ross (Kim Darby, a bit older than needed here, but still enjoyable) to help find her father's killer.

The murderer is known to be one of the victim's employees (played by Jeff Corey, among the many familiar and great character actors in the cast), but locating and capturing him proves tricky because of his alliances with other criminals. Some of them are quite familiar with Cogburn and vice versa, and their showdowns prove to be threatening and amusing at the same time.



"True Grit" also is notable for the presence of music star Glen Campbell, who had acted a couple of times previously, but this was his first major screen credit. He plays La Boeuf, a Texas Ranger with his own reasons for wanting to apprehend the man who killed Mattie's dad; logically, Campbell also is given a chance to sing, though that happens offscreen as he croons the Oscar-nominated title tune.

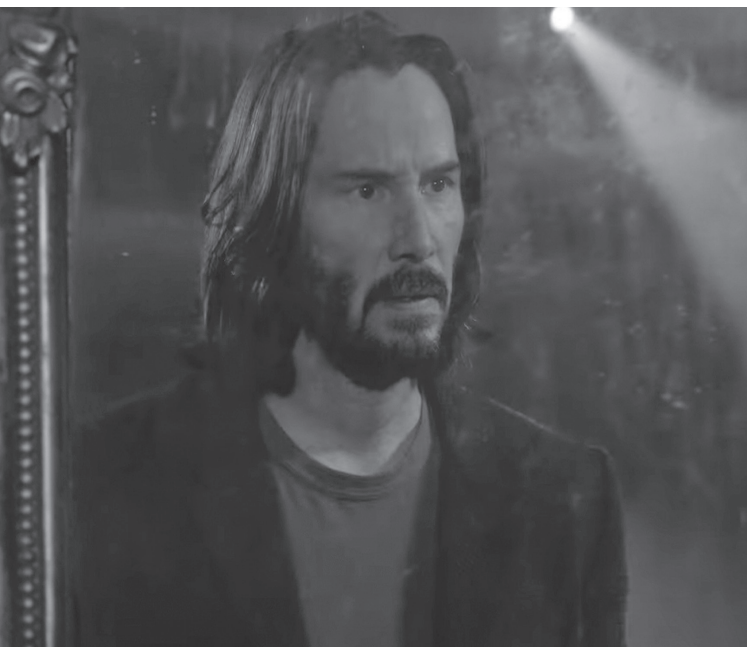
As for that roster of "True Grit" co-stars, anyone who knows their actors has to appreciate a group that also includes Robert Duvall, Dennis Hopper, Jeremy Slate, Strother Martin, John Fiedler, John Doucette and two uncredited players: Jay Silverheels, who was Tonto to "The Lone Ranger" on television, and Wilford Brimley.

While the Coen brothers made an even grittier, widely praised remake of "True Grit" in 2010, the original picture holds a special place with many film-lovers. A huge reason has to be Wayne, seen in his full movie-star glory right down to the picture's final image ... and since it's the one and only John Wayne we're talking about here, that is reason enough.

The eldest of five children, she is said to have been greatly inspired by the Dale Carnegie book “How to Win Friends and Influence People,” which a high school teacher gave her. While attending college in Los Angeles, Mullenger appeared in stage productions, and several studios invited her to do screen tests. She ultimately signed with MGM, beginning employment after completing her education, and that studio renamed her Donna Reed. There, she worked with such stars as John Wayne, Mickey Rooney and Wallace Beery and directors including John Ford and Fred Zinnemann. On loan to RKO from MGM, Reed made one of her most enduring films: the Frank Capra-directed 1946 classic “It’s a Wonderful Life,” playing wife Mary to James Stewart’s George Bailey. The movie

It’s a new day for Tony Dokoupil on ‘CBS Mornings’

Tony Dokoupil felt an immediate kinship with his new “CBS Mornings” co-host Nate Burleson. The two men are the same age, both come from sports backgrounds and thus have similar cultural points of reference, and so Dokoupil felt he knew Burleson from the get-go. Consequently, he reports the chemistry has been solid among them and co-host Gayle King since the show switched from “CBS This Morning” in September. “I love having him on set,” Dokoupil says of Burleson. “I know that similar to Gayle, he can go in any direction at any time and so you don’t have to feel constrained. And if there’s a wobble, he’ll help you and vice versa. And that’s what you need. It’s a high-wire act, live television, and he’s a good acrobat. ... He knows how to stay on the wire but also keep people interested and that’s a terrific talent.” Since joining CBS News in 2016, the versatile Dokoupil has exhibited his expertise in many areas, reporting on topics ranging from pop culture and entertainment, to food, politics and current events. He co-anchored the morning broadcast from Capitol Hill following the Jan. 6 assault on the Capitol. reported from the Caribbean

Kevin Durant scoring at will for Nets



For a guy who suffered what would ordinarily be a career-ending injury not that long ago, Kevin Durant has certainly looked every bit his old self. Maybe even better. Indeed, in the season’s first few weeks, while his Brooklyn Nets struggled on court and with the controversial absence of point guard Kyrie Irving, their 33-year-old power forward has been playing arguably the best basketball of his career, scoring over 25 points in each of his first five games and ranking among the league leaders in points and rebounds. This comes nearly six months after his virtuoso performance in the Eastern Conference Semifinals, when he put the Nets on his back and nearly willed them past the Milwaukee Bucks. In that series, he averaged 35.4 points, 10.6 rebounds and 5.4 assists in the Nets’ seven-game loss to the eventual NBA champs.

And he’s about to become historically great. As of late October, he stood 26th on the NBA’s all-time scoring list with just over 24,000 career points, within easy range of passing No. 25 Allen Iverson (24,368), No. 24 Ray Allen (24,505) and No. 23 Patrick Ewing (24,815) this season.

No one could have foreseen his prolific performance when he went down with a torn Achilles tendon in the NBA Finals in June 2019. But here he is, continuing on his path to the Naismith Basketball Hall of Fame – and what the talented Nets and their faithful hope, is a league title.

Durant and the Nets can be seen in action Tuesday, Nov. 30, when they play host to the crosstown rival New York Knicks in a game airing on TNT.

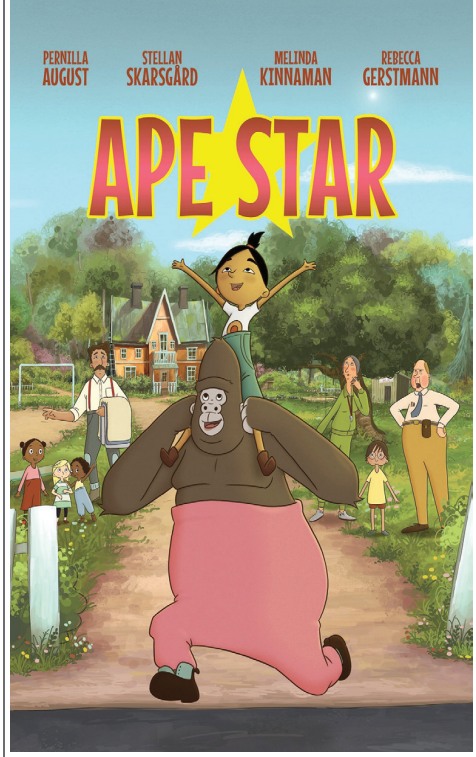

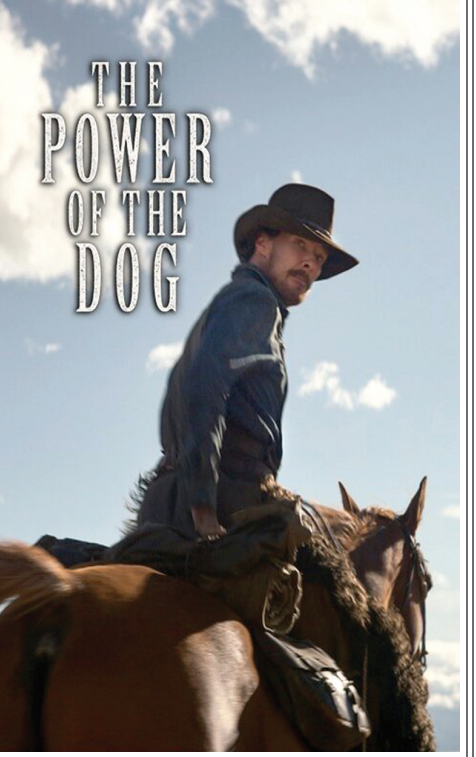
