

FHS Trustees vote in new girls Softball Program

By Darwin Robinson Floydada ISD Board of Trust-

ees met Tuesday, May 15, and unanimously voted to add Girls Softball to the FISD sports program as a UIL competition to begin in the 2007-2008 school year.

Superintendent Jerry Vaughn, FHS Principal Wayne Morren and FHS Head Coach/Athletic Director Rusty Purser all spoke positive to the board and highly endorsed the addition of a Girls Softball program to FISD's athletic agenda.

FHS Principal Morren told the board, "I have been approached

by some parents and some high would be the only major change school girls who would like to have a Girls Softball team at FHS. By just talking to a few girls, we are only five girls short of having enough for two teams. We need 20 girls for two teams. Lockney just added it to their program and asked us to consider it,

Superintendent Vaughn added, "I have talked to City Manager Gary Brown and he said we could work together and share the Little League baseball park with a little effort from both sides. Lowering the pitching mound

we would need to make when we used it.'

Head Coach/AD Rusty Purser handed out an information chart to the board. Purser told the trustees, "We would only have a Varsity team and not a JV team. The start-up cost will run about \$15,000 for needed supplies, such as, uniforms, shoes, bats, balls and gloves. We would probably compete twice weekly, one game at home and one away. There would be some travel expense in whatever district we are




An unusual situation occurred when the board began to vote on new officer positions on the school board. The first order of business was to elect a Presiding President for the board.





Taken by his mother from the



Morales. Castillo, Morales and Dean voted in favor of the nomination, while Miller, Pratt and Greer voted against it, causing a tie vote of 3 to 3.

Greer then nominated Pratt to be the new Board President. It was seconded by Miller. Greer, Miller and Pratt voted in favor of the nomination and Castillo, Morales and Dean voted against it, thus causing another tie vote of 3 to 3.

The board meeting was halted for about 20 minutes until legal council could be consulted by phone by Superintendent Jerry Vaughn. It was finally determined that the new Board Officers' election could be delayed "until another time", or until the next regular board meeting, when hopefully all the trustees will be present to vote and break the tie. The meeting continued with Dean presiding as president.

Superintendent Vaughn discussed with the board the several possible locations for the five new portable buildings coming to the R.C. Andrews Elementary campus beginning on June 4th.

The five 32' X 64' buildings, with one bathroom each, will be placed on the south side of the existing R.C. Andrews Elementary School. "Sewer drainage will determine exactly where the buildings will be placed," said Vaughn.

The five portable buildings will be rented for 18 months at \$750 per month per building for a total 18 month rental cost of \$67,500. It will cost \$25,000 for delivery and setup of all five buildings when they arrive and another \$25,000 at the end of the 18 months for disassembly and transportation back, according to Vaughn.

The board unanimously approved and authorized Superintendent Vaughn to continue the

installation of the portable buildings at R.C. Andrews Elemen-

In a related matter, the board approved a \$48,000 amendment to the budget in order to cover some of the cost of the portable buildings' rental expenses.

The board unanimously approved First National Bank of Floydada as their Bank Depository for 2008-2010 and the board approved the Floyd County CAD (appraisal district) 2007-2008 Budget of \$241,660.

The sale of a lot located at 607 E. Lee, Original Town, Floydada and the demolition of a house at 523 E. Missouri were both approved by the board.

The board also approved seeking bids on selling three used backup school buses. "The oldest bus is a 1991 model and we will still have two backup buses left. We will start now to add a new bus to our fleet after September for next year," said

Business Manager Sharon Rainwater presented an April, 2007 Tax Statement and a Cash Flow Report. The Tax Statement Collected, which is 94.27 percent. The Cash Flow Report showed a Current Cash Balance of \$7,956,656.17 and a Fund Balance of \$5,683,880.17.

The board accepted the resignations of Bianey Saucedo, Karen Quebe, Susan Kirk and Doris Wilcox. The board hired:

Tyler Helms, coach/social studies FHS; Shelly Miller, coach/ science, FJHS; James K. Hester, coach/history, FHS; and Katherine Hester, teacher.
