The primary in March will choose one man from each ticket to face off against each other in the November election.



The Lady Winds record now stands at 9-6.





Foreign investors must report U.S. agricultural land holdings

investors with an interest in agricultural lands in the United States are required to report their holdings and any transactions to the U.S. Secretary of Agriculture, according to Michael McDonald, Executive Director of the Floyd County Farm Service Agency.

"Any foreign person who acquires or transfers any interest, other than a security interest, in agricultural land in the United States is required by law to report the transaction no later than 90 days after the date of the transaction," said McDonald.

Foreign investors must file Agricultural Foreign Investment Disclosure Act (AFIDA) reports with the Farm Service Agency County Office that maintains reports for the county where the

For AFIDA purposes, agricultural land is defined as any land used for farming, ranching or




