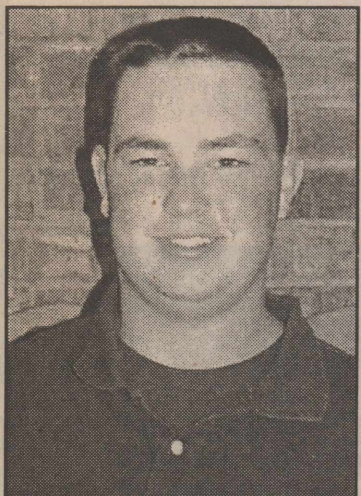

For your benefit, we will try to limit the number of vendors selling the same main food item. A limited number of spaces with electrical outlets are available. 3) The Committee reserves the right to ban any exhibitor for misconduct, obscene, or offensive behavior, and the right to approve or disapprove the sale, display, or distribution of all merchandise sold.

Courthouse will soon be closed on Fridays

In a 3-1 vote on Monday, Floyd County Commissioners moved to go to a four day work week in the Courthouse.

Effective August 1, 2008, the Floyd County Courthouse will be closed on Fridays and will only be open Monday through Thursday from 7:45 a.m. to 5:30 p.m.

Commissioners cited heating and cooling of the courthouse and fuel savings for county employees driving to and from work as reasons for the four day work week.

Judge Penny Golightly stated her office would be open for extended hours during the four day work week for the convenience of the community.

"My office will open at 7:45 a.m. and stay open during the lunch hour," said Golightly. "We will stay open until 5:30 p.m. This will allow people working until five to be able to conduct business after they get off work."

Commissioners can only set the hours the courthouse will be open but each elected official sets the hours their office will be open.

"We hope they will open extended hours and during the lunch hour for the convenience of the public," said Commissioner Gilroy.

The motion to go to a four day work week was made by Ray Nell Bearden and seconded by Commissioner Gilroy. Commissioner Quattlebaume voted in favor of

the motion and Jon Jones voted against. Commissioner Jones stated "I just feel we should stay open five days a week for the convenience of the Floyd County tax payers."

Floyd County is one of a number of Texas counties who have opted to go to a four day work week. Lubbock County is currently looking into going to a four day work week.

In other matters the commissioners court updated their employee manual to get into compliance with recent IRS findings.

County Treasurer, Elva Martinez, advised the court that audits by the IRS have found some counties in violation of Publication 15-B on Employee Responsibility Plans. County employees who are encouraged to have a cell phone for county business will no longer be furnished cell phones. They will be given a \$25 a month allowance to use their own cell phone. The IRS considers issuing cell phones as a benefit and would require taxes to be paid for that benefit. "By giving an allowance we will be in compliance with the IRS," stated Martinez.

Martinez also stated the IRS has "come down on" counties who allow Road and Bridge hands to drive county vehicles to and from work.

"To be in compliance with

the IRS we now must charge the Road and Bridge Employees tax on the use of driving county vehicles to and from work," said Martinez. "If we require the hands to pay tax on \$3 a day we will be in compliance with the IRS."

Commissioners unanimously approved the changes to the policy.

The commissioners court approved the following farm contracts: (1) Rebuild terraces for soil conservation by A.C. Pratt, 8 miles east of Floydada. (2) Clean out pits for cattle water by Louis Pyle, in the Harmony Community. (3) Level fenceline with grader to build fence by Southwest Cotton, 5 miles east of South Plains.

Floyd County Extension Agent Melissa Long gave a report on the activities of the Extension Office in June. They included the Walk Across Texas and training for Food Protection Management.

Long said there were 10 teams that participated in the Walk Across Texas. The teams walked a combined total of over 12,000 miles.

The 4-H'ers will also be participating in State Record Book Judging, the County Achievement Banquet, and Bob Benson Memorial Golf Tournament in August.

City of Floydada to pursue grant for new downtown sidewalks

The City of Floydada is pursuing a grant with the Texas Department of Agriculture for the replacement of the sidewalks in downtown Floydada.

In order to obtain the Downtown Revitalization Program (DRP) grant the City must show support from downtown businesses and property owners.

In an effort to show that support a meeting of the downtown property owners was held Thursday night, July 10.

City Manager Gary Brown discussed with the property owners in attendance what the grant money could be used for.

The purpose of the grant is to

replace deteriorated sidewalks with new sidewalks that meet the Americans with Disabilities Act. Brown reported there was probably more sidewalk that needed to be replaced than there would be funds to replace them.

The maximum amount of the grant is \$150,000.00 plus a matching monetary amount, from the City, of a minimum of \$15,000.00.

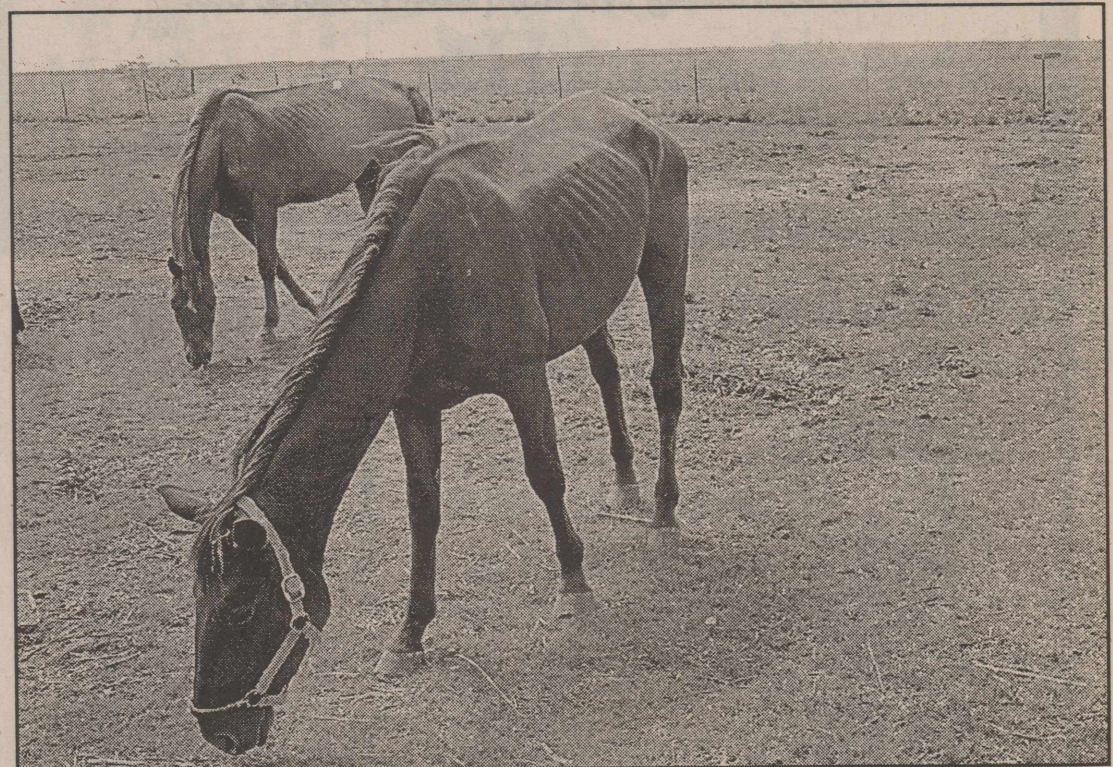
The city's part will include providing the equipment and labor to remove and dispose of the sidewalks. Brown says that he hopes local labor can be used to do the replacement part of the work.

Every property owner in the downtown area was asked to provide a letter of support for the city's application. The City will need to receive letters from 75% of the downtown businesses.

"We hope to replace the sidewalks from 5th Street to the east side of Wall Street and from Mississippi Street to Virginia Street," said Brown.

According to Brown the City should know around the first of October if they have been accepted to receive the grant.

Anyone with any questions about the grant should contact City Manager Brown for additional information.

City of Lockney looking for matching grants for pool

During department reports at the Lockney City Council meeting, July 15, Police Chief Wallace reported he has sent out 3 applications for a third police officer.

City Secretary Charlotte Hooten also gave an update on the swimming pool. Hooten said she had inquired with SPAG about a grant for the pool and

found out there are pool grants available through Texas Parks and Wildlife.

"There are 50/50 match grants," said Hooten, "so we are

looking for more donations toward the pool fund to help with this match. At this time we do not know how much the grant will be. Lesca Durham is in the pro-

cess of getting bids for the repairs on the pool."

The application deadline for this grant is January 31, 2009.

Ever heard of H.R. 6458? Probably not, but you should.

H.R. 6458 was introduced by U.S. Rep. Jackie Speier [D-CA] on July 10 and would change the national maximum speed limit to 60 miles per hour on highways, and 65 miles per hour on portions of the National Highway System located outside of an urbanized area.

All the time, at the local, state and federal levels, there are items introduced which can effect you directly.

Unless you are paying attention, many just slip by unnoticed until it is too late.

In recent months, T. Boone Pickens has been in the media

regarding his giant wind farm in the Panhandle and the fact he wants to claim eminent domain on across a very large section of Texas. He is able to claim such because of two items placed in legislation during the most recent session of the Texas Congress.

Despite the countless watchdog groups keeping an eye on various pieces of legislation in Austin and Washington, items are occasionally "snuck" in. It's not right, but it's the truth.

Other items recently introduced at the national level include:

Senate Bill 3227, introduced July 7, is titled Iran Sanctions Act of 2008 and would impose sanc-

tions on Iran.

House Bill 6453, introduced July 10, is titled Schoolchildren's Health Protection Act and would amend the General Education Provisions Act to prohibit Federal education funding for elementary or secondary schools that provide access to emergency postcoital contraception.

In the perfect world, it would be nice to be able to trust our elected officials to look out for the best interests of the vast majority. Sadly, many are looking out for a very small minority and are nothing more than agenda-driven puppets.

Next time you have a few minutes, go online and check new bills which have been intro-

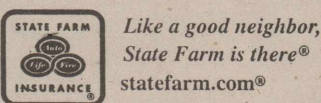
duced. A good place to start is <http://thomas.loc.gov/>. It is a bipartisan site and provides a load of information about the goings on in both the House and Senate.

Lockney Council sells some city property

Van Breedlove from Mackenzie Municipal Water Authority met with the Council to present next year's budget. The monthly increase will be \$219.33 and was approved by the council.

The Council unanimously approved selling Lot 40 Block 2, Tuttle Addition to Domingo Hernandez for \$200, and tabled compensation for Municipal Court Clerk until they could talk to Judge Kelly Dunbar at the next meeting.

The Council discussed giving a variance to Saul Rodriguez for

a business on N.E. 7th Street but no action was taken.

After a recommendation from City Attorney Lanny Voss the council voted to take no action on bids for the Sechrist house on West Locust Street. Voss recommended the Council start the bid process over based on providing a contract with terms and conditions.

The Council discussed passing an ordinance banning skate-

boards, bicycles, roller blades, etc., on the Main Street sidewalks. The item will be discussed at the next meeting after Voss prepares an ordinance.

The Council unanimously passed the motion for Southwestern Public Service Company to implement interim rates.

The Council also voted unanimously to sell a portion of the old dump ground (lake bottom) to Feller Hughes.



During the month of June the FVFD had a relatively slow month with only five total incidents. One vehicle fire, two grass fires, one wild land fire as result of lightning and one medical assist call. June may have been the slowest month to date this year which is surprising considering the lack of moisture. The Floydada Volunteer Fire Department would like to remind everyone that we are still under a fire ban and any unlawful burning of trash or other materials could result in a fine of up to \$500.

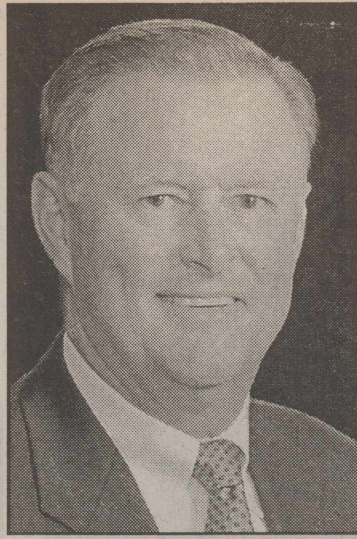
Flower girl was Katie Long of Lubbock, cousin of the bride.

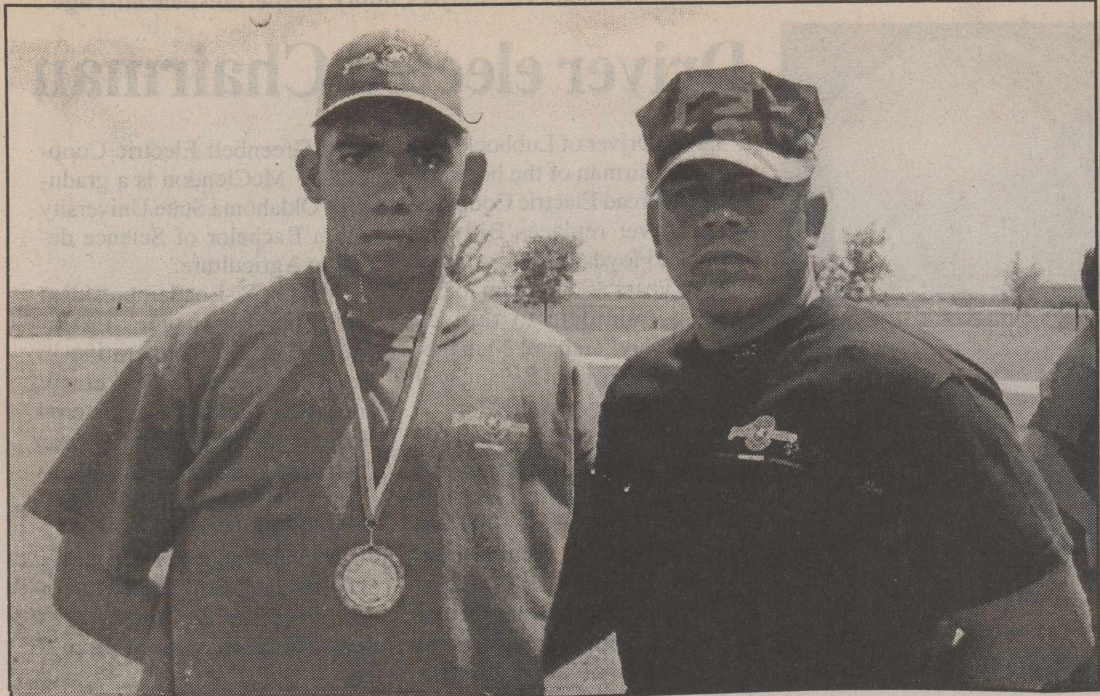

South Plains 4-H to host golf tournament on August 14th

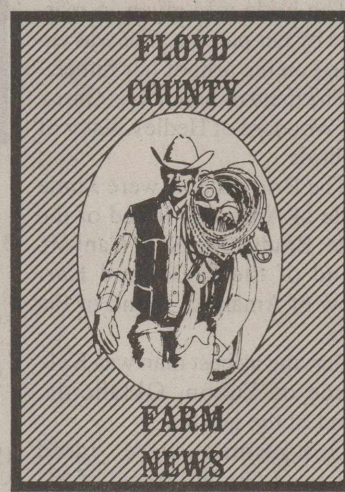

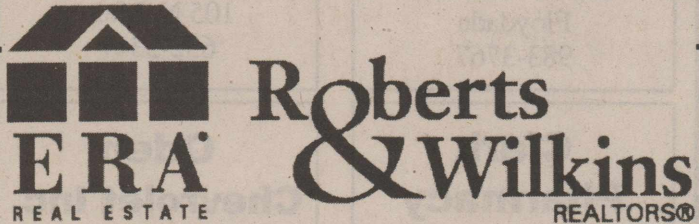
