

El dia 25 del presente mes, durante una de las juntas de la bien reconocida organización "League of United Latin American Citizens", o mas bien conocida por sus siglos.. L.U.L.A.C., las riendas de la presidencia pasaron de mano.

MARCHA

Gilberto Herrera, presidente de los Brown Berets de Lubbock y una delegación de miembros de los Brown Berets viajaron a Lovington este fin de semana para participar en una marcha en protesta de las injusticias que están sufriendo los ciudadanos de Lovington. Mas de 300 personas participaron en la marcha que se llevó a cabo el domingo pasado y cubrió más de dos millas de distancia. Una de las principales cosas que estaban protestando los miembros de los Brown Berets de Lovington fue eso de el tratamiento de prisioneros en las cárceles de Lovington. Se logró una junta después de la marcha donde el líder de los Brown Berets Bolo Soto y Gilbert Herrera se juntaron con el Sheriff del condado. Durante la junta con el Sheriff también se logró una inspección de las facilidades de la cárcel. Dijo Gilbert Herrera que había muchas personas incluyendo personas de raza negra y anglo quienes estaban sufriendo injusticias y que se expresaron durante la inspección de la cárcel. Dio un ejemplo de una persona que no le habían dado un cambio de ropa por 52 días y otras personas que necesitaban ayuda médica y no se les había dado.

Political opinion ranging from conservative approaches to strict Lenin-Marxist philosophies were among concepts analyzed Saturday by Chicanos ending a three-day congress here entitled "Education is Liberation."

But, noted Chicano poets, folkloric dancers, musicians, artists, teatro members and writers set the tone for the Congreso Estudiantil Chicano de Aztlán, sponsored by Chicanos Unidos For Action (CUFA) and held at the University of Southern Colorado Student Center.

Frank Arteaga, CUFA president, said the Denver Chicano Lenin-Marxists participating in the congreso were allowed as much freedom of expression as were the nearly 3,000 persons who participated in the congreso.

However, working through the existing system seemed to be the over-all approach of congreso participants who advocated wider Chicano expression in art, the media, folklore, civic and governmental affairs and in the corrections system.

Poets, writers and composers Abelardo Delgado, Ricardo Mora, Jesus Martinez and Ricardo Sanchez—representing Chicano

artistic expression from Colorado, New Mexico and Texas—held a lively session on song and poetry.

Although differing somewhat as to what constitutes true Chicano poetic expression, the Chicano poets and composers agreed on one point—"Liberty is creativity."

Controversy ruffled proceedings slightly when Joaquin "Jake" LeFebre, CUFA vice president, was escorted from the USC Belmont Campus by Pueblo County Sheriff's deputies Thursday, the first day of the congreso.

LeFebre apparently had his appeal bond revoked while still a parolee from the Colorado State Penitentiary, where he was serving a term on an arson charge. Major activities, including a Friday cultural event, were dedicated to LeFebre.

Lorenzo Trujillo, director of Mexican and Southwest dance at the Sangre de Cristo Arts and Conference Center who performed with his folkloric dance group at the congreso, took a stand in defense of his group, which was challenged by another community group.

The critics accused Trujillo of allegedly accepting Centennial-Bicentennial funds, but Trujillo pointed out that his group never has received such funds.

Trujillo prepared a written

resolution for presentation to the general congreso expressing his concern about the need for a unified Chicano voice in favor of increased cultural expression.

"We challenge each of you to recognize the difference between politics and art—that an artist who mixes his work with politics is no longer an artist but a politician who can be bought and appeased and can be sold for political reasons," Trujillo said.

The congreso rejected the resolution on the general consensus that art and politics cannot be separated.

Other workshops resulted in resolutions for action in areas of minority hiring and employment and toward the formation of a national working staff of Chicano writers and producers.

The congreso concluded with the Chicano music of Al "Hurricane" Sanchez of Albuquerque, N.M.

Participants represented all major Colorado university and college campuses as well as the states of Colorado, Texas, California, Utah, Minnesota and New Mexico.

Carlos Alcala, California director of all affirmative action (minority hiring) programs, addressed the Saturday closing session.

Dear Editor:

Recently Senator Lloyd Bentsen was in Lubbock campaigning for his second term to Congress. After he gave his platform, etc., there was the usual handshaking and mingling with the candidate. A Mexican-American politician (a Democrat of course) stated that Raza Unida Party was endorsing Senator Bentsen for re-election.

As a committeeman on the Raza Unida State Executive Committee, I would like to refute that statement. Raza Unida Party does not endorse or corroborate with candidates running under the banner of other parties. To do so would be contrary to the principles that we stand and believe in.

If this political novice would stay home long enough to do his homework, he would realize that it is because of the Democratic Party's failure that we Chicanos are in the condition that we are now in. If the Democratic Party was indeed "el partido de nuestra gente" may I ask why is it that we are always underemployed or unemployed, miseducated, and always lowest on the economic ladder? Too many times we fail to see the ocean because of the water.

Texas has been a one-party state since 1876. Since that time all rules, regulations, and statutes which have our lives have been passed by a Democrat controlled legislature. In the political arena, for example, laws such as those that follow have been passed which have been detrimental to Chicanos participation in the political process:

1. The Democratic Party was at one time a "club". You could not participate in the primaries unless you were a member of the club. (Overruled by U.S. Supreme Court.)
2. One had to pay a poll tax to exercise your right to vote. (Overruled by U.S. Supreme Court.)
3. The requirement to register by January to be able to vote in May (recently changed)

4. Primaries being held in May when most Chicanos have gone North to work the fields, thus not having a choice in the General Election in November. (Still exists)

5. The requirement (aimed primarily at Raza Unida since third parties have always existed in Texas) that a party has to acquire at least 20% of the gubernatorial votes to be eligible to have its primaries financed by the state. (Overruled by U.S. Supreme Court.)

6. With the emergence of Raza Unida, the legislature has passed two laws which affected the re-registration voters.

To add insult to injury, the testimony that Secretary of State Mark White gave before Congress in his attempt to keep the Civil Rights Act from being extended to Texas because it was not needed is beyond reproach.

Yet, despite what history has recorded (its there to read), there are Chicanos Democrats who will not criticize Democrat officials whom have been exposed for corruption and scandals but very quickly point the finger at Chicanos trying to form their own party.

An organization serves those who create it. Chicanos did not give life to the Democratic Party and thus, it never has and probably never will serve the needs of Chicanos. To surmise otherwise, is neglecting the last 100 years of our history.

Finally, if a Mexican American wants to affiliate himself with the Democratic Party, that is, indeed, his privilege and prerogative. We, as Chicanos, will compete with him in the political arena (and anywhere else) where the burden of defending the accomplishments for Chicanos by the Democratic Party will be with the individual.

A QUESTION OF REHABILITATION

According to the experts, if you put more men in prison for committing crimes, it is only natural that the crime rate will decrease right? Wrong! Statistic recently released by Washington shows an increase in prisons population of over 1% in the last year. By the same token, the increase in crime was almost double. It is evident here that prison is not the answer. So Mr. expert, what do you do now? You have over 200,000 men in prisons in America and if the present rate of recidivism continues, by the end of the year there will be an increase to approximately 300,000.

To continue the practice of warehousing men in prison can only mean the continued waste of Tax payers MONEY. Then too, the experts do not have the answers either, but they won't admit it. They just keep thinking up new excuses to cover up for their fumbling ineffectiveness and using up tax payers money.


