

## History and Purpose of COMA

Comerciantes Organizados Mexico Americanos or as it has grown to be known, COMA, is an organization of Chicano businesspersons and professionals which grew out of the organizational efforts of Bidal Aguero. It was in December of 1973, that a group of businessmen called together by Mr. Aguero gathered to organize COMA. This was the second effort to try to follow through with initial plans which were conceived almost one year prior and had failed to materialize into an organization.

The businessmen present at this organizational meeting in December were: Roy Montelongo, Gilbert Flores, Pete Alcorte, Ismael Hernandez, Gonzalo Ramirez, Bidal Aguero, Manuel Alaniz, and Agustin Medina. It was at the urging of Roy Montelongo to act without delay that the organization was officially chartered as a non-profit organization by the State of Texas in February of 1974.

Throughout the first year, Mr. Aguero, who had been appointed as temporary President, presided. A subsequent meeting was held where the following officers and directors were elected: Mr. Ismael Hernandez, Vice President; Mr. Tony Reyes, Secretary; Mr. Roy Montelongo Treasurer, along with directors, Mr. Marcos Garcia Ayala, Mr. Ramon Chapa, Mr. Jorge Moreno, Mr. Albert Perez, and Mr. Julio Ysasa. This steering body of successful businessmen and professionals provided the leadership which assured the initial success of the "Mexican American Chamber of Commerce — COMA" and provided twenty initial members.

During the second year, Gilbert Flores presided as President of the organization. It was a year of much success and outstanding recognition. It was during COMA's second year that a state organization, The Texas Association of Mexican American Chambers of Commerce, was chartered. At the first state convention, two members of COMA, Bidal Aguero and Tony Reyes, were elected Vice-President and Secretary, respectively, of the statewide organization, TAMACC. COMA grew to be recognized

and respected throughout the State and Nation. It was during this administration that members of COMA, Gilbert Flores and Bidal Aguero along with Executive Director, Hector DeLeon, traveled to Washington D.C. for a series of meetings sponsored by the U.S. Department of Commerce — Office of Minority Business Enterprise for TAMACC. Delegates to the Washington meeting met with top administrators of S.B.A., V.A., C.S.A., E.D.A., and the Under Secretary of Commerce. The highlight of the trip was an opportunity to attend a reception held for President Gerald Ford by the U.S. Chamber of Commerce at which delegates met and talked with the President.

In January of 1976, Roy Montelongo was elected President of COMA. It was Mr. Montelongo's goal to get 100 members in the organization. During an intensive membership drive that goal was met and surpassed. A major highlight was the publishing of the COMA Business and Professional Directory, a first in Texas, which contains more than 300 individual listings of Chicano business and professional persons.

In July of 1977, COMA once again distinguished itself in the State and elected Mario Perez as President of TAMACC which now boasts more than 20 Chamber members with a total membership of over 5000.

As COMA enters into its fourth year, the organization has established itself as a prominent and viable part of the City of Lubbock. Its individual members serve on almost every major board and committee in city government. Members are also beginning to be asked to serve on committees of the Lubbock Chamber of Commerce.

In having this major role, the main theme of the outgoing administration that of — COMA Means Business — has been accomplished. The main theme of the incoming administration, — Progressing With Lubbock, — cannot help but be accomplished.

Austin... Howard Hughes' death last year left Attorney General John Hill with an unprecedented history; he would have to penetrate one of the modern world's most successful conspiracies of secrecy. The amount at stake is anywhere from \$25 million to \$150 million in inheritance taxes. The issue at stake is whether Texas was Hughes' legal residence. A jury in Houston has been hearing evidence in the case since early December. Estimates of the duration of the trial before Probate Judge Pat Gregory range up to several months. The legal maneuvering in the courtroom gives little hint of the maze of crisscrossing disappearing and usually roadblocked trails followed by Hill's staff in 18 months of accumulating evidence.

for the trial. Hughes spent the last 30 years us," Hill said. The bottom line on the states of his life dedicated to obscuring the footprints a person in his position would normally leave in business and private activities Hill said. "When he died, we faced a blank wall!" Hill investment of the Hughes case began shortly after Hughes died April 5, 1976 information received by Hills office indicated Hughes had annually paid his personal income taxes to an IRS office in Texas and had paid poll taxes in Texas while he was living in other states. Those reports were quickly confirmed, and Hill placed an assistant on the case full-time. He gave notice to Judge Gregory in June, 1976 that he would seek to prove Texas was Hughes' legal residence, and that Texas' 16 percent inheritance tax could be applied to the Hughes estate. "Our

staff asked themselves who Hughes was, where had he gone and what had he done. Once they answered these questions and the answers were not always available they could look at his tax return, his draft board registration, his passport applications, his pilot's licenses and his radio licence from the FCC for evidence of Hughes' bond with Texas. The list of possible sources mushroomed, Hill said. Despite his staff's success in trying to Texas through numerous documents, Hill knew his case could be weakened by an favorable testimony from Hughes' former aides with Neveda's tax laws providing no inheritance tax it was obvious the Hughes family and aides would prefer a finding that his legal residence was Neveda instead of Texas. Hughes had employed dozen of lawyers during the last 30 years to fend off law suits. Every lawyer who had ever sued Hughes had come away empty handed because they didn't know enough about Hughes' operations to ask the right questions. We were about to find ourselves in the same boat," Hill said. However, an unexpected key to the Hughes inner sanctum surface shortly after he died. It was learned that Mexican government officers had raided Hughes' apartment in Acapulco the day he died. They walked in on Hughes' aides busily shredding Hughes' personal papers which had carted with him for 10 years from California to Boston, Las Vegas, the Bahamas, Canada, back to Nicaragua, Florida, England, back to the Bahamas and finally to Mexico. The Mexicans allowed the IRS to microfilm the 10,000 documents confiscated in the Hughes raid, and turned to the IRS for access. With the help of U.S. Treasury Secretary William Simon, the IRS' reluctance was overcome in December 1976 after months of touch-and-go negotiations. The information in that microfilm was dynamite. It broke the dam for

CUTTING FAMILY FOOD BILLS - I

Today we're going to start discussing some ways of keeping down the cost of family food bills. It is important that you plan shopping for food. Studies reveal about \$15 saved per week by those who plan their shopping and make price comparisons in more than one store. The following are tips to help you save money on groceries.

1. Plan meals for a week in advance; limit shopping trips to once or twice a week for items like milk.
2. Never shop when hungry, with children, or when in a rush. If you must shop with children, do it after a meal.
3. Keep a shopping list handy, taped to the inside door of the pantry or kitchen cabinet where you can write down items as soon as they run low.
4. Shop at more than one store if necessary. Check newspaper ads and store bulletins for specials. Stock up on canned goods or staples you use when they go on sale.
5. Read labels carefully. Ingredients must be listed in decreasing order of weight. If a label lists potatoes first then meat, it has more potatoes than meat.
6. Large cuts of meat may cost less per pound and make several meals. You can get three different cuts from an 8-10 lb. butt of smoked ham. Use a large boneless piece for baking; slices from the larger end for pan-frying or broiling; cubes from the smaller end for casseroles.
7. Freeze leftovers in individual or family-size portions to use for beef stew, pot roast, sliced turkey, etc.
8. Low cost and less tender meat cuts should usually be braised for best flavor and tenderness.
9. When entertaining use less expensive cuts of meat. Serve beef stroganoff, lamb shanks or swiss steak, etc.
10. Keep knives sharp for carving meat or poultry into thin even slices. Try to get all the meat off the bone to avoid waste.

11. Stretch meat, fish, poultry by serving it in casseroles; top with a milk or cheese sauce. A can of cheddar cheese is better than starting a sauce from scratch.
12. Liver is rich in iron, costs less than most meat cuts and has no waste. Chicken livers can be pan-fried, but braise beef or pork livers.
13. Luncheon meats in bulk packages usually costs less than pre-slices or prepacked. Serve it thinly sliced and pan-fried for breakfast instead of bacon or sausage.
14. Cheese souffles or omelettes make inexpensive main dishes.
15. Save money by cutting up whole chickens yourself. Freeze leftovers or uncooked poultry (necks, wings) until you have enough for sauces and soups.
16. Turkey is a good buy all year. The larger the bird, the more meat in relation to bone and the more servings per pound.
17. Frozen fish usually costs less than fresh and the quality is the same; fillets have no waste.
18. Select frozen foods, meat, and other perishables last when shopping to keep at their peak. Never let food sit in the car while you do other errands.

7. **Store employees**—According to a 1976 survey conducted by the Institute, as much as 40 percent of all store employees may steal from employers.

To put a stop to losses from shoplifting, our Consumer Protection Division attorneys and law enforcement officials recommend several ways to guard against shoplifters:

- Store employees should be adequately trained in security measures that can prevent or discourage shoplifters. They should be instructed to be alert and observant, since employees constitute business' first line of defense.

- Employers should look for customers who wear heavy, out-of-season clothes or who carry numerous large bundles or sacks.

- They should watch argumentative customers who may use such tactics to divert attention from a partner who is stealing.

- They should wait on each

customer as promptly as possible to prevent excessive browsing.

- Items such as shoes should not be displayed in pairs.

- Price marking equipment should not be left unattended.

Business persons should report incidents of shoplifting to police immediately. Customers who observe persons shoplifting should report them to store personnel, and should remember that any unreported cases may only encourage the shoplifter to continue such actions. Our lawyers point out that shoplifters cost not only a store but all of its customers a great deal of money.
