



Section 4. Permissable Worden . Structures Within Fire Limits: -No wooden structures shall here after be built within the fire limits as given herein or as they may hereafter be established, cx cept the following: an all roofs placed upon such buildings or structures shall have an incombustible covering.

(a) Temporary one story building for use of builders.

(b) One story sheds open on the long side, not over 15 feet high, with sides covered with incombustible material, and with an area not exceeding 500 square feet. A wooden fence shall not be used to form the back or side of such sheds.

(c) Wooden fences not over 10 feet high.

(d) Piazzas or balconies not exceeding 10 feet in width, extending more than 3 feet above the second-story floor beams. No such structure shall extend beyond the lot line, or be joined to any similar structure of another building.

(e) Small out houses not exceeking 150 square feet in area. and 8 feet in height. Wooden sheds or out houses shall not be located within 5 feet of any lot line, nor less than 30 feet from any other building over onestory high.




