

BROWNSVILLE, Texas (AP) - Four months after Hurricane Allen slammed into South Texas, officials of the stricken cities complain that they are hopelessly mired in a frustrating tangle of federal red tape.

Lower Rio Grande Valley mayors told a Texas Coastal and Marine Council hearing that they have been stonewalled and short-changed by the government agency set up to ease the flow of federal relief funds.

"We've spent \$10,000 picking up brush alone," Mayor Jeff Burke of Rio Hondo said at the Tuesday hearing. "They've offered us about that much for all our damage, including only

#### continuing voyage

After 360 years, the voyage of the Pilgrims on the Mayflower remains one of the outstanding epics in the human story: Though history has tended to romanticize the Pilgrims and exaggerate the role played by the tiny "Plimouth Plantation" in the subsequent history of New England and the United States, that migration is justly a proud part of the American

On this day, we ought to recall not only the story of that Thanksgiving held a year after the Pilgrims landed but also the perilous voyage itself. It is a tale of courage made all the more imposing when we remember that it was embarked on - at just about the worst time of year - by women and children as well

Today, in our modern, comfortable world, we are seldom called upon to exhibit the kind of raw physical courage that was necessary to sustain the Pilgrims for more than two months ina small, overcrowded boat on a frequently stormy ocean, headed for they knew not what in a hostile and unknown land.

Indeed, even the need for a little spiritual stamina in dealing with our daily problems is something most of us are strangers

Perhaps that is true for individuals. Perhaps it is possible to slide through life, conforming to the beliefs and opinions and morality of the majority, with no great harm done to anyone.

Not so far a nation, however. A nation is always confronted with the unknown of the future. A nation that coasts, that talks rather than lives greatness, that enshrines but does not practice the principles on which it was founded, is only existing on. suffrance until some stronger, more dedicated system comes

Just three weeks ago we elected a president, one lonely human being who must chart America's course in the years to come. It is he who must lead us, inspire us, perhaps drag us unwillingly to an unknown place called Destiny

There, even as did the Pilgrims, would we plant our ideals and our lives and fortunes that they may be a sign to coming generations of men who will say, "Brave voyage.

### not-so-good old days

If you've ever suspected that perhaps the old days weren't all that good, here's evidence to back you up.

FBI and other ominously upward-trending statistics to the contrary, the crime rate may not be all that different in the

typical American city today than it was a century or more past. The latest report in the long-run Middletown Study finds that the past had its full share of offenses that are the focus of concern today - assault and battery, murder, sex crimes and a long list of routine transgressions.


The Middletown Study, using Muncie, Ind., as its typical city, analyzes court records dating back to 1829 in charting the ups and downs of public order. Begun in 1924, it has been updated several times, the current report covering the half decade since

In releasing it, Ball State University sociologist Dr. John D. Hewitt noted that compared to periods in its past, Muncie today is notably law-abiding. What stands out in the long view of crime statistics is that varying attitudes toward law enforcement by officers and important segments of the community have a direct bearing on the numbers of arrests for

social offenses in any given period. One such period was immediately following the Civil War. when Muncie's crime rate rose sharply, according to Hewitt, in response to "an apparent attitudinal shift among residents, a new moralism inspired by religious ferver as churches and other groups attempted to capture the minds of Muncie

In other words, neither is there much new about the Moral. Majority.

Some naive women think you can judge the cooking time of a turkey by figuring out the poundage, the oven temperature, and allowing so many minutes per pound.

Wrong, raw turkey breath. It depends on the stubborness of the bird. I have seen 30pound birds cook in two terprises, Inc. hours...before the pies have cooled, before the potatoes and yams have cooked, before the cranberries are frozen. before the guests have left from St. Louis.

I have also seen ten-pound turkeys cook for eight hours and still look like you're Southwestern Bell Telephone carving a ham.

invented to keep cooks the company for 30 years. A humble. Even the best of them keep an anxious vigil at the oven door waiting for some sign that the 30 guests will indeed see the turkey served before the sun sets.

WASHINGTON (NEA)-Ronald Reagan's intention to proceed with the tax cut that he promised during his presidential campaign is worrying many traditional liberal economists, who

Reagan has embraced the spending at the same time. proposal put forward by Rep. Jack Kemp, R-N.Y., and Sen. William Roth, R-Del., to cut tax rates 10 percent a year for three years. The theory behind Kemp-Roth is that lowering tax rates

will provide a greater incentive to work, causing Americans to earn significantly more money. This expansion of the tax base is expected to increase rather than decrease - the revenues taken in by the federal goverment.

Reagan has also spoken favorably of another conservative-backed proposal: limiting federal spending to a fixed percentage of the gross national product. Thus, the federal budget could increase only at the rate at which the national economy expanded.

The NTLC is not without formidable allies, especially among the newly elected Republican senators. So, when the Reagan administration finally sends its tax-cutting proposals to Capitol Hill, the ensuing debate is likely to pit not only liberal against conservative but conservative against conservative. #### Aids to a vegetarian diet

By Lawrence Lamb, M.D.

DEAR DR. LAMB - My daughter, 18, has been a vegetarian for about five 'years. She does not eat meat, fish or eggs. What is a good diet for her and how about vitamins?

DEAR READER - It depends on what her vegetarian diet includes. You can have a reasonably satisfactory diet and still omit meat, fish and eggs. The complete protein in this instance must come from milk and milk products such as cottage cheese. The other alternative is to have a sufficient variety of vegetable proteins that complement each other. Mature bean seeds, particularly soybeans, are often very helpful in this regard.

As a young woman she could have an iron deficiency unless she's very careful. Women in the childbearing age tend to require about twice as much iron as men do anyway. The other possible deficiency would be vitamin B-12. She can avoid both of these problems by taking one of the general purpose, daily vitamin tablets that also contain iron.

The U.S. government announced it was sending 1,000 tents from military stockpiles in Europe, but Zamberlette said tent cities were only a partial answer. He said with winter at hand, they could not be used for "the old, the weak and the sick" and also were unsuitable for mountain villages above 3,000 feet.

thanksgiving and gratitude," said Rose Briggs, an 87-yearold Plymouth historian and direct descendant of some of the Pilgrims, including Gov. William Bradford.

"And also they had a good time," she said. "An amusing aspect is that one of the Indians' great games was football. So our present rash of football games on Thanksgiving is part of 1621 precedent. Apparently they ran up and down the seashore kicking a ball and gambling very heavily on the results."

By the next generation, however, the Indian and English oultures were in sharp conflict. By 1675, 50,000 colonists had settled here. Prince Philip, son of Massasoit, had declared war and Thanksgiving was no longer a holiday for all.

#### **State Wants** Shoe Polish Sales Halted

HOUSTON (AP) - A Dec. 1 hearing has been scheduled on the state's petition for a temporary injunction barring the sale of a shoe polish until it is properly labeled.

The suit filed by the consumer protection division of the Texas attorney general's office alleges Super Coat is being sold without advising purchasers it contains toluene, a toxic substance that can cause someone to get "high" or cause physical and mental harm if inhaled.

State District Judge Peter Solito granted a temporary restraining order last week prohibiting sales without proper labeling and specifying the spray cannot be sold to persons under 18.

**AP Science Writer** Middle America has its own monsoon season, much like the seasonal wind that brings heavy rains in Asia.

"We have a true monsoonal characteristic here in the middle part of America," says Jack Villmow, climatologist at Northern Illinois University, De Kalb, Ill. "I think the term "mid-American mon-'soon,' or 'MAM' for short, is quite appropriate.

'We think of the monsoon as an Asiatic phenomenon but it's really just more pronounced there. It's a situation that occurs frequently enough in North America so that we notice an increase in precipitation during summer as Gulf air moves very easly northward into the heart of the continent."

"June, July and August — a quarter of the year - account for a third to a half of the annual rainfall in the mid-American monsoon belt, Villmow says. This zone extends from Denver to Chicago and from Kentucky to the southern portions of Canada's prairie provinces.

The term monsoon can be useful in understanding weather patterns, Villmow says. It derives from the Arabic word mawsim, meaning season.

### Lighting of the Yule log is a long-standing Christmas custom

Of the many Christmas traditions that have survived through the ages, one of the most ancient is the ceremonious lighting of the Yule log on Christmas eve.

It is a tradition that is more strongly rooted in European culture than in our own, yet it is not uncommon for an American family to gather round the hearth on Christmas eve, sipping eggnog and watching the

#### Ancient tradition

This ceremony dates back to the time of the Saxons and Goths, as well as the early Germanic tribes, who burned such a log at their festival of the winter

The log was often a stump or root of a tree that had been obtained from one's own land or a neighboring wood, and which was brought into the house not before sundown on Christmas

With the entire household gathered in front of the fireplace, the log was lighted with a piece of wood that had carefully been saved from the previous year's Yule log.

Should the log not ignite on the first attempt, superstition held that ill luck would follow.

To further ward off ill fortune in the coming year, the log had to burn for at least 12 hours. A portion of the extinguished log was then saved for the following Christmas, often stored in the house as a protection against lightning

The ashes of the Yule log were later mixed with the earth at the base of the fruit trees on the land, with the belief that this would make them more fruitful.

Perhaps the most interesting abstraction of the Yule log tradition exists in France today. where the French Christmas cake, a buche de Noel, is one of the most obvious symbols of the holiday season.

It is actually a chocolate roll covered with chocolate icing, meant to resemble a log of



## Dreamy intimate apparel doubles as holiday attire

Question. If you have just-slipped into a glamorous, flattering, slinky nightgown, are you getting ready for bed? Answer. Not necessarily. You could actually be getting ready for a dinner party, a holiday dance or a night on the town.

Gary Bryan, nightwear buyer for JCPenney, suggests the use of nightgowns, lounging pajamas, caftans and robes for this double purpose.

'It's one way to beat inflation," he points out, "since almost always the things you buy in the intimate apparel department cost less than a garment from one of the ready-to-wear departments.

Actually the concept of twopurpose gowns and robes is a practical way to fight inflation.

However it's a concept that has

At least five years ago, John Kloss came out with a collection of nightwear that could make it glamorously out of the bedroom into the social whirl.

Other designers quickly followed his lead and today many of the things sold in intimate apparel departments look as though they have been created with this dual purpose in mind.

#### Color important

Penney's expert suggests several criteria in deciding whether a nightgown can be worn as an evening gown. 'First, the fabric. It should be fairly opaque. Look for things

like matte-surfaced jersey or other fabrics with a dress look.

Next, consider the color. Pastel colors may look too much like a nightgown. Deep tones, such as wine or black, or brights, such as red or persian blue, will look more dress-like. Finally, he cautions, examine the way the garment is cut.

. If it is cut high enough to lef you wear a strapless bra or has a bodice of lycra spandex that fits as firmly as a swimsuit (so that a bra is unnecessary) the gown is apt to be more successful in its social usefulness.

In creating an outfit from the intimate apparel department, Bryan suggests that, besides nightgowns as evening gowns, you weigh the possibilities of lounging pajamas for disco-ing

or other holiday activities. Even when there is lace present, he states, it can still look right since there is so much lace shown on dresses this year.

#### Accessories the key

Choosing the right accessories can be the key to the whole success of socializing a nightgown. Make sure that your shoes, your jewelry and your evening bag are definitely meant for partying. Then, no one will question your gown unless you choose to turn-it into a topic of conversation.

If you like being the center of attention-tell all. If you don't-let it be your secret.

To wrap your outfit up luxuriously and inexpensively, Penney's buyer suggests a fulllength pile-fabric robe in white, black or a deep tone.

"It really can look like an expensive fake-fur evening wrap and your whole outfit will cost a third or a fourth of the price of a comparable outfit from ready-
