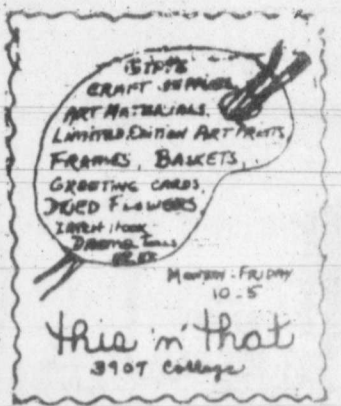
Jewelry Secrets Help Budget Blues

NEW YORK (NEA) — It's still possible to give fine jewelry gifts without breaking your budget. The secret is twofold: look for "gold-fill" and semi-precious gemstones. At Winard, specialists in 14 karat gold-fill, a two centuries-old process which bonds gold to another metal, such as copper, bronze or nickel, designing is given the same refinement as with the more expensive all-carat gold jewelry. All the so-called semi-precious stones are used, since many of these now replace "precious" stones that are too costly.

Two fashion trends appear in the Winard collection. One is the "craft" look, seen in a group of cameo jewelry. A true cameo comes from Italy, where for centuries, the art of carving on certain very hard shells has been practiced. Winard sets the cameos in frames of 14 karat gold-fill, for earrings, pendants and small sizes strung on fine double chains for bracelets. The entire set costs only about \$135.

The second trend is seen in Winard strings ovals of gold-fill framed jade on gold-fill links for a graceful bracelet. These days jade leads as a fashion favorite. Especially popular is the jade heart pendant, carved and polished, but unframed, hung on a gold-fill chain. To go with it, Winard recommends completing a set with their gold-fill love knot earrings. The three items total around \$125.

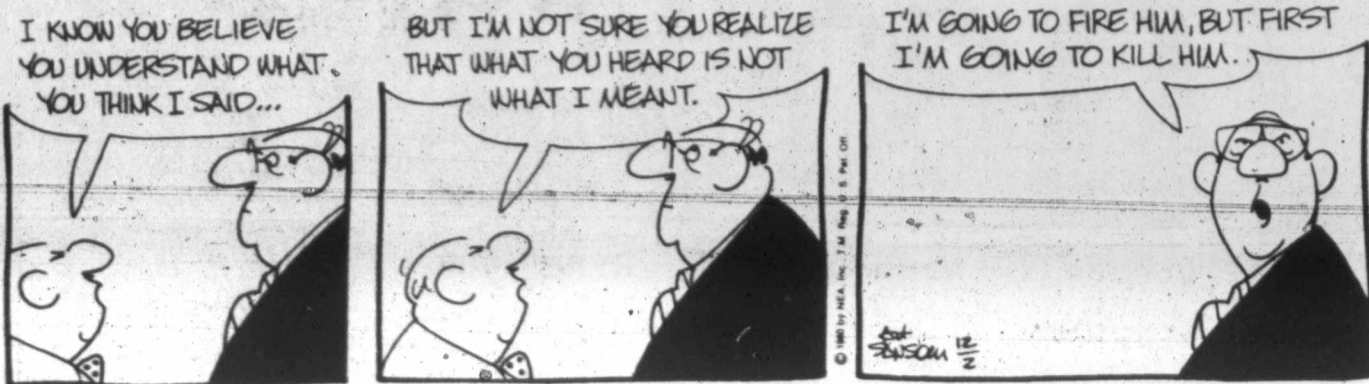

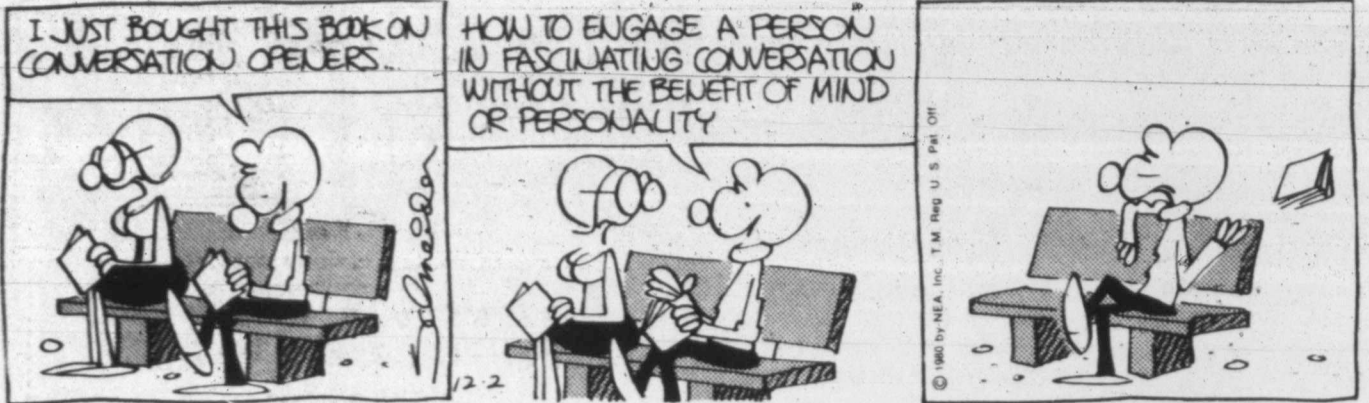

Good bowel management

DEAR DR. LAMB — I'd appreciate any information you can send me about hemorrhoids and fissures. I had a procto but at this point I would do anything to avoid surgery. I'm going to try a diet of fresh fruits and fresh green vegetables to see if that helps any. I've tried bran, with no luck.

I've been constipated most of my life except during my pregnancy. Since my pregnancy I have had my problems. I'm in my 20s and I'd like to avoid surgery. I'm hoping my diet will improve my bowel habits and I won't have to strain to have a movement. I'd like to know what causes hemorrhoids and fissures and if they will return if I have surgery.

Will they return if I have another child? Does pregnancy have anything to do with hemorrhoids?

DEAR READER — Remember that hemorrhoids are just varicose veins of the rectum. Those veins will pop out and dilate if they are under pressure. A good way to put pressure on the rectal veins is by straining and by passing hard stools. So poor bowel habits do contribute to some cases of hemorrhoids.

You are right about pregnancy. As the baby grows and the heavy uterus presses on the deep veins which drain the pelvis, that stretches the rectal veins because they can't drain as easily. Then during the passage of the baby a lot of pressure is placed on all the pelvic structures so hemorrhoids are a common post-pregnancy complication.

A fissure is a crack. Usually the skin is cracked superficially. And the most common cause is difficult bowel movements. A tight anal sphincter contributes to the problem. Often a fissure can be managed without resorting to surgery.

There are many different approaches to treating hemorrhoids. In any case, good bowel management is important to both hemorrhoids and fissures.

The different procedures that are done to treat hemorrhoids, injections, rubber bands or surgery, are discussed in The Health Letter number 13-12, Hemorrhoids: New Treatments for an Old Affliction, which I am sending you. Other readers who want this issue can send 75 cents with a long, stamped, self-addressed envelope for it to me, in care of this newspaper, P.O. Box 1551, Radio City Station, New York, NY 10019.

Internal hemorrhoids often don't cause symptoms, only bleeding. External hemorrhoids cause symptoms. The treatment of the two is often different so I don't know what needs to be done in your case.

You are using the right approach by following a good

diet plan. Be sure to include sufficient bulk in your diet and drink plenty of liquids. A bulk laxative may be useful.

Despite TV ads, most hemorrhoid preparations you can buy yourself are of little value. They will not correct the underlying condition. Suppositories inserted into the rectum are above the area where the external hemorrhoids which cause symptoms are located so they don't help much. The Federal Trade Commission has cracked down on some of these products and made the manufacturers quit claiming any benefits except temporary symptomatic relief. The Health Letter I am sending you discusses what you can do for yourself but actual correction of hemorrhoids will require one of the procedures discussed.

San Salvador Teens Take Up Arms

SAN SALVADOR, El Salvador (AP) — Thousands of teen-agers have given up basketball, dances and other games for rifles and the civil war that has taken more than 8,500 lives in El Salvador this year.

"Dances and games are

hallucinogens and keep us from realizing the exploitation and the massacre that victimizes our people," said one 15-year-old identifying herself as Yesenia.

"My parents agree with me. My father says, 'Go ahead, daughter. The struggle should

be constant,'" said 13-year-old Blanca.

With red and black bandanas masking their faces, they were two of the dozens of teen-agers among leftist occupiers of the Metropolitan Cathedral since Friday, keeping vigil beside the bodies

of six leaders of the Democratic Revolutionary Front who were kidnapped and murdered by right-wing terrorists last week.

Many other youths have joined the guerrilla bands fighting the military-civilian government and ultra-rightist armed groups.

Yesenia and Blanca said they have been members of leftist groups for more than a year. They said they hope to become guerrilla fighters soon.

"My mother is a worker," said Yesenia, who is a member of MERS, the Salvadoran Revolutionary Student Movement, made up of high-school students. "I have seen her exploited. She works and works and our situation never improves. I used to feel angry, but I forgot my anger playing basketball, in dances and other games."

"Now I have learned that dancing and music are hallucinogens because it makes us forget the reality that surrounds us. That is why my mother agrees that I should be organized. She is afraid sometimes, but she knows our struggle is a just

one."

TI Theft Investigated

DALLAS (AP) — Authorities today questioned employees who entered Texas Instruments' plant over the holiday weekend to determine who might have had access to \$350,000 worth of gold and platinum that vanished from a safe.

The metals, used in defense projects, were discovered missing late Sunday when employees found the safe lock broken, a company spokesman said Monday.

Norman Neureiter, corporate relations manager for the electronics company, said "several thousand people" could obtain entrance to the building by showing proper credentials.

But "there is some

speculation that the person who did it knew where to go," he added. "I work here and I don't even know where it (the safe) exactly is."

Neureiter said the safe was located on the ground floor of TI's main building — a security-oriented structure with "double doors monitored by TV and controlled by a guard."

The FBI and police were called in to investigate the theft, and TI is offering a \$10,000 reward for information leading to recovery of the metals, Neureiter said.

"An investigation is being made of people who entered the building during that time," he added.

The metals, mounted on a

stainless steel base, were accounted for when the plant shut down late Wednesday for Thanksgiving, he said.

The gold and platinum were used in manufacturing electronic components in government defense projects, said Dick Perdue, TI public relations manager.

But officials declined to elaborate on the projects, handled under a Department of Defense contract.

"I guess I'd better not say too much about military equipment," Perdue said.

The company uses gold and platinum in a process known as "sputtering," in which electronic parts are coated for better contact, Neureiter said.

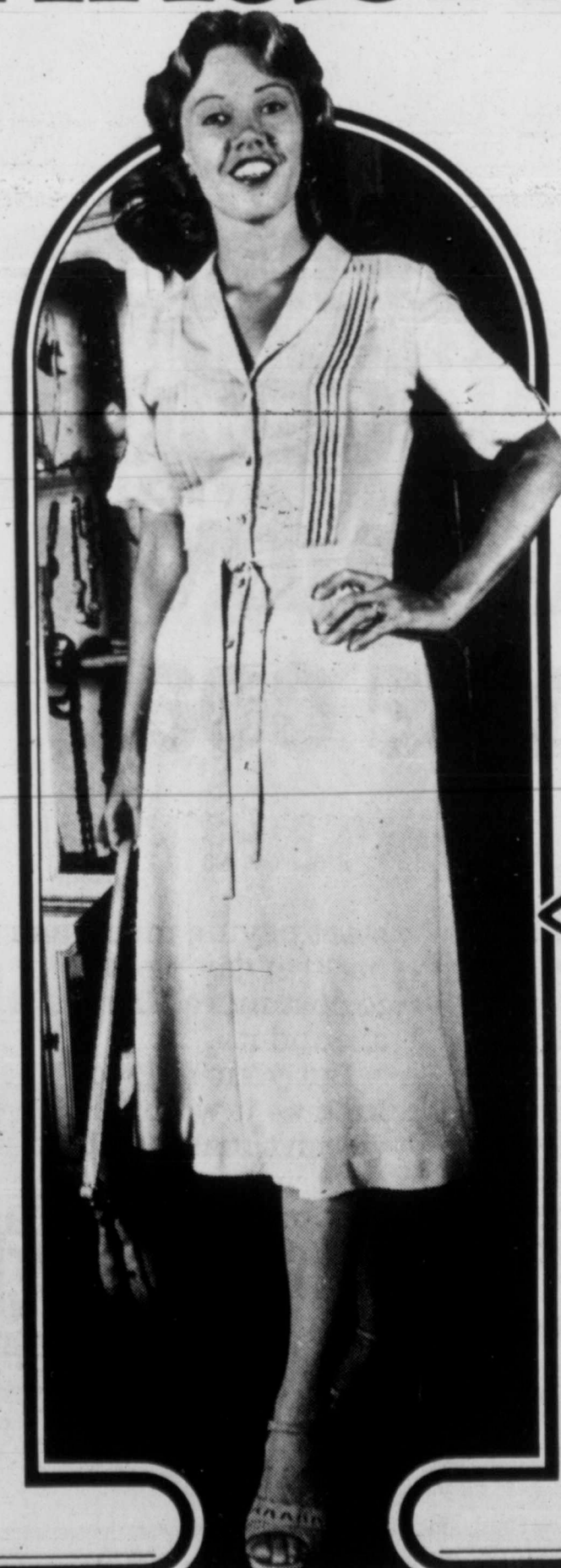

Horticulture Short Course Scheduled

A horticulture short course for adults will be held, Dec. 8, 9, 10, 11 under the sponsorship of the Snyder High School Vocational Agriculture Department, according to Bill J. Hood, superintendent, and Floyd Collins and Billy Bob McMullan, teachers of vocational agriculture.

The short course is being sponsored by the Vocational Agriculture Department of SHS.

John Williamson, horticulture specialist with the vocational agriculture division of the Texas Education Agency and the Department of Horticulture at Texas A&M University, will do the instructing in the course. He is headquartered at Texas A&M University.

Williamson holds B.S. and M.S. degrees in agriculture education. He is qualified as a certified teacher of horticulture in the Vocational Agriculture Program in Texas.

The short course is scheduled to begin at 6:30 p.m. in the Vocational Agriculture Building. Other meetings in the series of four will be held at a time preferred by participants. During the dates the short course is in progress, Williamson will be available to assist enrollees with individual problems and to provide on-the-farm and in-the-home instruction, according to McMullan.

Persons interested in attending the short course should write or call Hood, Collins, or McMullan. An entry fee of \$5 will be charged. Horticulture short course certificates will be presented to enrollees who attend all of the training sessions.

Williamson says that the course can be adjusted to wishes and interests of the people enrolled, but that he expects to cover such subjects as plant growth and

development, propagating media, plant propagation, vegetable gardening, developing and maintaining the landscape, establishing and caring for lawns, house plants, and green house production, operation and management. Demonstrations will be given and class enrollees will have the opportunity to perform the skills demonstrated.

Short courses in horticulture, as well as in other subject matter, are now available to adults throughout the state under a cooperative program between the Texas Education Agency and Texas A&M University.

Specialists are now available in the fields of beef cattle, farm electric wiring, horticulture, farm arc welding, swine production, tractor maintenance, oxy-acetylene welding, and pasture management.

Had Deadly Surprise For Kids...

Man Murders Family Then Killed By Police

DALLAS (AP) — A man who allegedly killed his wife and executed his four children after promising them surprises was slain by officers as he described the grisly slayings over the telephone, police said.

Thomas Ray Walker Jr. died Monday night at Presbyterian Hospital, about an hour after he stepped from a phone booth screaming, "Shoot me! Shoot Me! Shoot Me!" and was gunned down

by police.

Police had converged on the phone booth shortly after the man's call to KDFW-TV was traced, police spokesman Bob Shaw said.

Kenny Boles, executive producer at KDFW-TV, said a male caller told a switchboard operator that he "had a good story."

"I've done something terribly wrong," Boles said the man told him. "Then he described in graphic detail

how he murdered his wife and children. Basically he said he had murdered his wife in the shower while his children were outside.

"One by one, he brought the children inside, telling them he had a surprise for them," Boles said. "As to why, he simply said he was depressed, that he did not feel his family could live through his suicide."

After Walker, 36, was shot, officers located his address and kicked in the front door of his southeast Dallas home, police said.

Inside the bloodied home they discovered the body of Linda Jo Walker, 35, sprawled in the bathroom, and Traci, 14, Tammi, 11, Tommy, 9, and Nicholas, 7, dead on the floor, Shaw said.

Mrs. Walker had been shot twice in the face while she was in the shower. All were shot in the face, except for Nicholas, who was shot behind the right ear, he said.

"At least three of the children were shot on the pretext of 'I've got a surprise for you,'" Shaw said.

Lt. Roger Duncan and Sgt. Bill Parker went to the television station Monday

evening after receiving a call from reporter Tom Steyer, who talked to the man on several occasions through the afternoon, Shaw said.

The man called again shortly after the officers arrived at the station, Shaw said, and they were able to trace his location to a phone booth outside a northeast Dallas grocery store.

Duncan said the man pulled a pistol.

Duncan fired twice and two other officers fired five times, Shaw said.

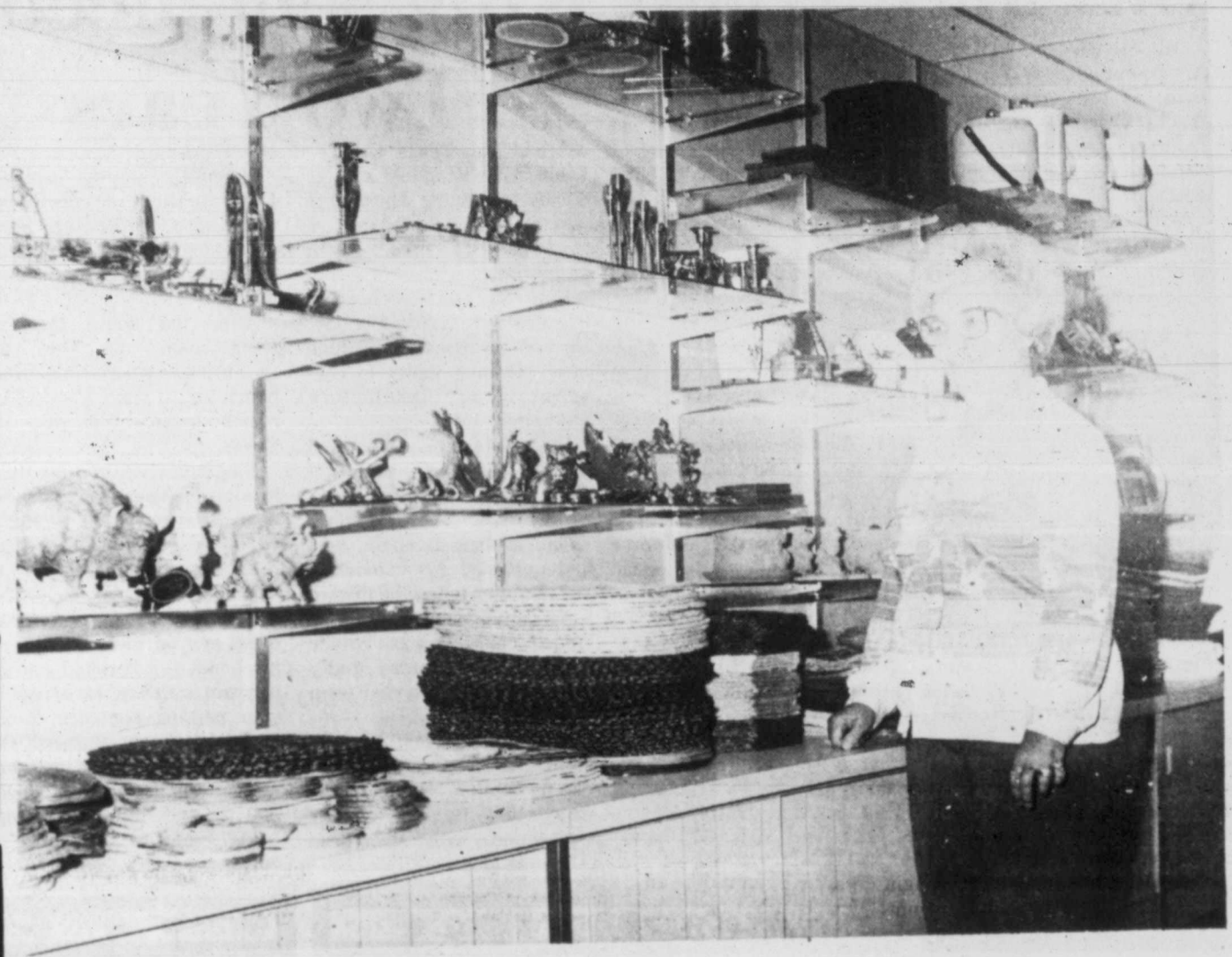

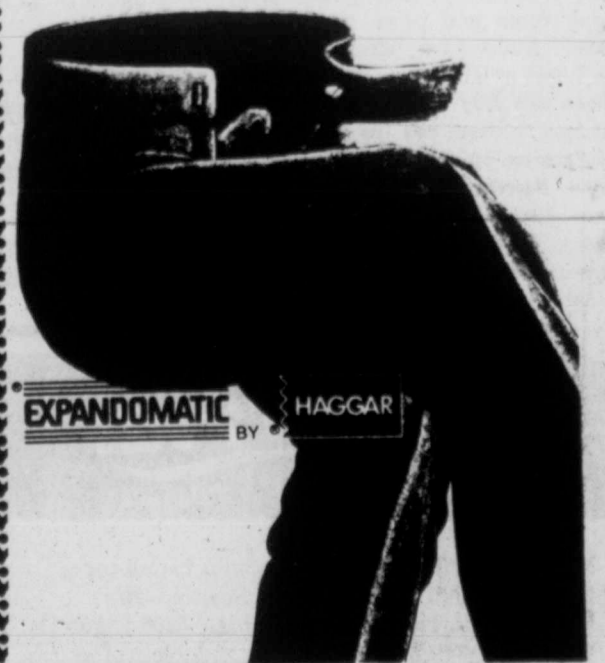
