But even before Zedillo's first full day on the job, some 10,000 protestors marched in downtown Mexico City to demand his ouster on the day of his inauguration The initially peaceful demon strators at the Monument of the Revolution on Thursday shouted "Out with Zedillo!" and called for an end to the 65 -year rule of his Institutional Revolutionary Party (PRI). About 80 people broke off from the main crowd and clashed with riot police, hurling rocks and chunks of concrete for more than an hour. Protesters also torched a police jeep and a trick painted police jeep and a trick painted with the PRI symbol, sending oily black smoke over the downtown area. area.
