ree green longer if you bring home the freshest fir or perkiest pine and keep the water flowing to
its thirsty needles, says Midwest Living magazine.
Many people deck their halls wjth Scotch pines. "They're the
most popular tree because they remost popular tree because they re-
tain their needles, and they're reatain their needles, and they 're rea-
sonably priced," explains Cindy Becker, spokesperson for the Na tional Christmas Tree Ass
tion, in Milwaukee, Wis.
White pines, a close relative of Scotch pines, rank as another big
favorite. Folks with a yen for trees with short needles tend to favor balsam and Douglas firs, as well as Colorado and Black Hills spruces. Fcazier firs, with their lustrous,
short needles and strong evergreen short needles and strong evergreen aroma, following.
Be sure to pick a fresh tree that will last through the holidays,
Becker advises. Two freshness hints: a forest-fresh fragrance and a rich green color. Beyond that Becker suggests an easy test:
Run your fingers along Runch, about six inches from the tip. Needles should stick to the branch and not fall off in your hand.
