was to have been executed for the 1977 killing of Abbe Rodgers Ha milton at her home in the Texas
Panhandle community of Borger Panhandle community of Borger In his appeals, Hawkins, who is black, contended his father in-
structed him when he was growing up that the way to retaliate against white men was to attack white women.

that as mitigating evidence when it came time to sentence him to death.
"When the U.S. Supreme Court says the constitution means that you've got to give juries an oppor-
tunity to consider this type of evidence, it means just that,"' attor-
ney Cliff Harrison said. 'I don't ney Cliff Harrison said. "I don't
think insisting on those constitutional rights applying to constitu is a delaying tactic." Harrison said the courts may

The 1992 Census of Agriculture hows that the United States had first census since 1850 with fewer than 2 million farms. The census counted the highest number of farms, 6.8 million, in 1935. The value of U.S. agricultural products
sold in 1992 reached $\$ 163$ billion. Even though the number of farms declined, overall farm production increased, thus continuing the trend towards more efficient agri-
cultural productivity. The 333,865 farms with sales of $\$ 100,000$ or more accounted for only 17 percent of all farms, but 83 percent of
total sales. There were 46,914 total sales. There were 46,914
farms with sales of $\$ 500,000$ or more in 1992, compared to 32,023 The increase in value of sales was largely due to increased crop production in 1992. Although total land in farms dropped from
965 to 946 million acres between 1987 and 1992, harvested cropland rose from 282 to 296 million acres, and crop sales rose by 28 percent in the same period. Farmer participation in federal annual
commodity programs has declined since 1987. Acres idled by those programs fell from 43 million acres in 1987 to 7 million acres in 1992.
