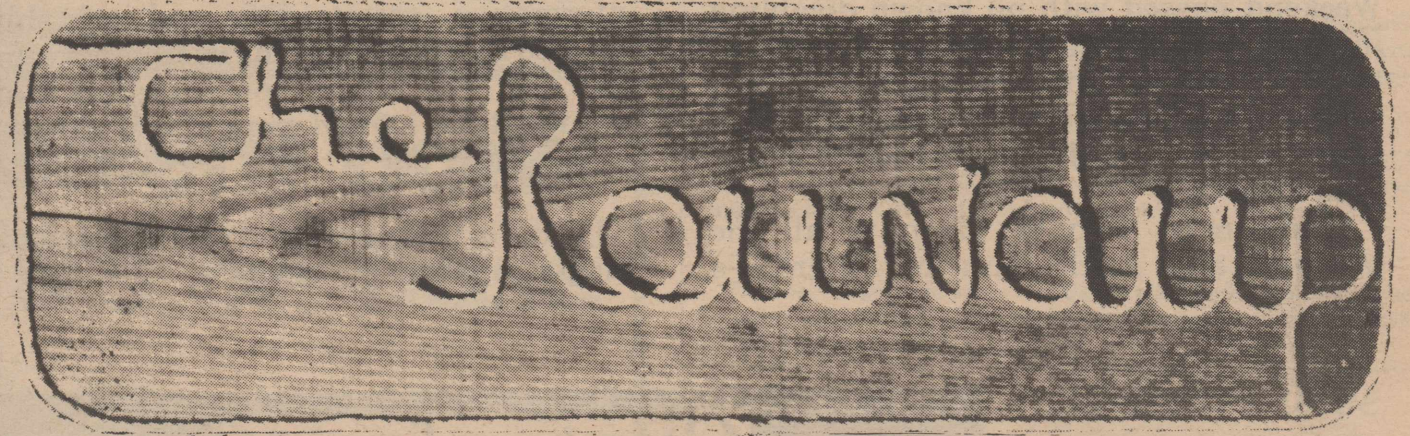

'Tops in Blue' performs here Wednesday

Simler Theater will be the site of the two "Tops in Blue '74" shows at 7 and 9 p.m. Wednesday, a more traditional site than some of the group's past performances.

Last year, in shows in the United States, the Pacific area and the Far East, the troupe played to audiences in briefing rooms, elementary school gymnasiums, school lunch rooms and even on an ocean beach.

The show combines comedy, vocal and instrumental rock, soul, gospel and folk music from some of the best Air Force talent selected from the 1974 Air Force Worldwide Talent Contest. The two 90-minute performances are fast-paced and are expected to be filled to capacity, so the audience is urged to come a little early to be seated before showtime.

The performances can be attended by ticket only and the tickets are free, but there aren't many left, so get yours soon. Tickets are available at the Special Services Division, Bldg. 832, the Mathis Recreation Center, Bldg. 310, the Arts and Crafts Center, Bldg. 340 and the Reese Golf Course Clubhouse, Bldg. 2020. Children under 12 years of age must be accompanied by an adult sponsor.

The two shows prior to this year's traveled more than 85,000 miles to present entertainment at nearly 200 locations. This year the cast, all Air Force members, will play 105 performances during the 16-week tour.

JAG office announces punishments

Punitive actions resulted from trials during August, according to the Staff Judge Advocate Office.

One sergeant was found guilty by a special court-martial for the offense of larceny and breaking and entering. The court sentenced the man to be reduced to the grade of airman. The following day, an airman first class was found guilty for the offense of being absent without leave. The court-martial sentenced this airman to be reduced to the grade of airman basic and additionally fined him four month's forfeiture of pay.

One sergeant, four airmen first class and two airmen received Article 15s of the Uniformed Code of Military Justice for the offense of failure to go to their appointed places of duty. The sergeant was reduced to the grade of airman first class and the remaining six men received suspended reductions and pay forfeitures.

Additionally, one airman received punishment for the offense of possession of marijuana. He received a suspended reduction and forfeiture of pay.

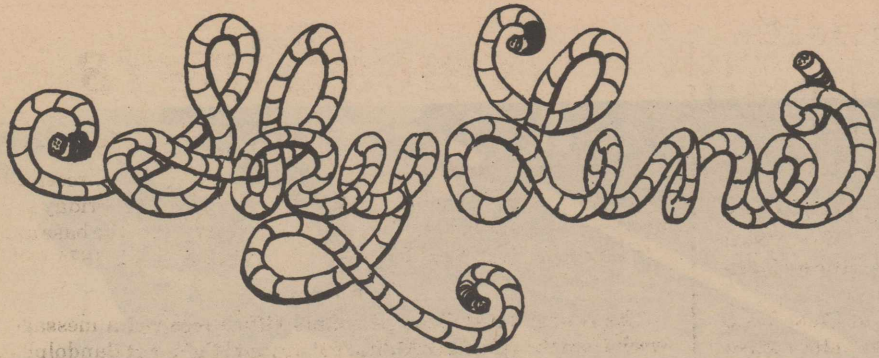
HIGH FLIGHT

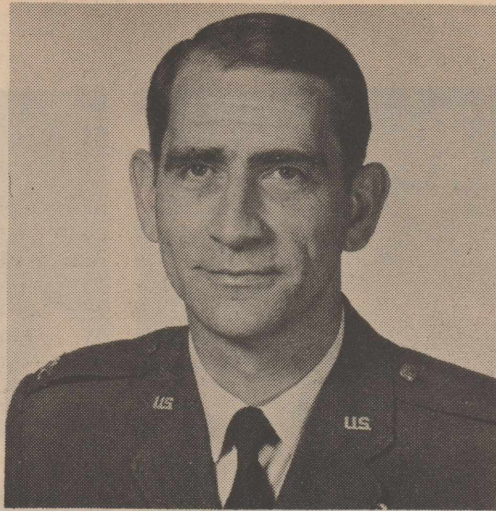
Oh, I have slipped the surly bonds of earth

‘Could haves’ won't help this sergeant

It's too bad the report of a motor vehicle fatality can't be written before the accident happens. It would be so easy for the commander, supervisor, and friends to read it and take the necessary action to save the person's life.

If that had been possible, one young sergeant might be alive today. If the accident report could have been written before this young man's death, someone might have paid more attention to his casual remarks about personal problems; someone might have discouraged him from drinking the night of the accident; someone might have at least talked him out of driving that night; someone might have

Unfortunately, the Air Force does not have a supply source for crystal balls, so the “might haves” didn't happen — the accident, involving high speed and driving after drinking, did happen.

The Air Force does have an effective driving safety program. Effective, that is, if commanders, supervisors, and everyone else backs up the training and briefings with conviction and concern.

The concern should be strong enough to detect trouble signs (such as depression, prolonged drinking) and strong enough to take action, even though it may seem disagreeable, to prevent someone in that condition from driving.

The best driving safety program in the world is worthless unless commanders, supervisors, coworkers, friends — in other words, EVERYONE — gets into the act.

A lot of responsibility? Sure it is, but it's worth it in terms of lives saved.

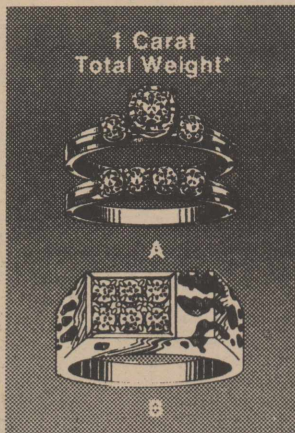

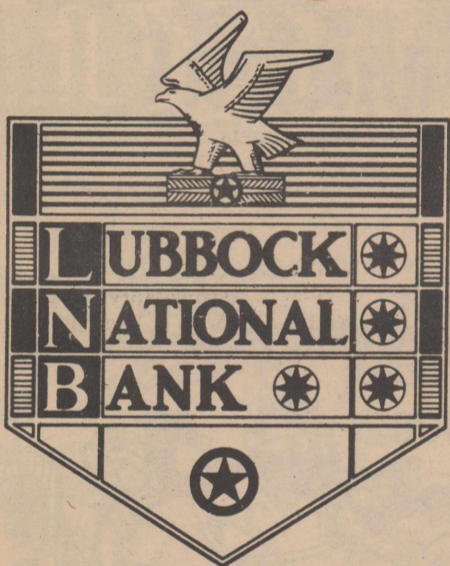

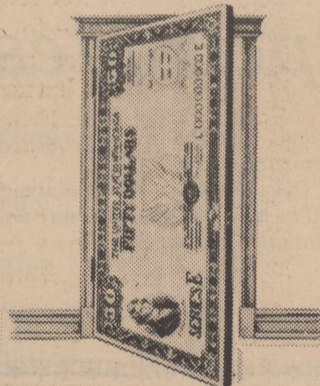

**Rains hit
all at once**

Well, what can I say? Our long-awaited rains finally came. Don't get mad at me, I just report it as I see it.

Rainfall for August at Reese officially measured 5.25 inches. However, some of the surrounding areas received considerably more. This August will go on record as one of the wetter ones for Lubbock.

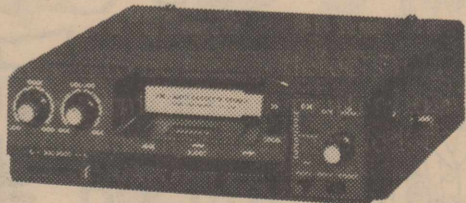
In addition to being unusually wet, it was also unseasonably cool. Several record cool daily maximum temperatures occurred.

September is usually a "battle of the seasons" month. Which season will win out, summer or fall? One day will be very hot and humid and the next day will bring out the old jackets and caps. The average daily high temperature for September is 84 degrees, while the average low is 59. The record high is 103 degrees and the record low is 38, so it can be a month for great extremes.

Rainfall for September should be about two inches with about five or six days of rain. There will also be an increase of cloudy mornings and foggy days over August.

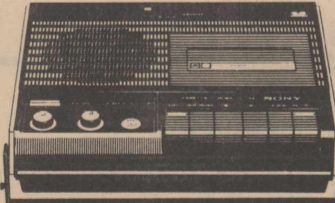

Possible appropriation slice may mean early SPPP cut

WASHINGTON (AFNS) - Superior performance proficiency pay (SPPP) will no longer be authorized for anyone after June 30, 1975. However, even before that date, those E-6s, and E-7s originally scheduled to receive the special pay as a result of testing during the fiscal year 1975-A promotion cycle may not get it. The problem is that Congress may reduce the fiscal year appropriation for that pay. Until congressional action is definite, one way or the other, the payments will not be made.

If the appropriation is reduced, those due to start getting paid on

Sept. 1 will be paid and all subsequent selection cycles to determine who qualifies will be cancelled. A chief of staff message has been sent to all consolidated base personnel offices.

If Congress does not reduce the appropriation, pay will be retroactive to Sept. 1.

In the meantime, airmen getting SPPP as of August 1974 will continue to be paid until their payment

period ends or until June 30, 1975, whichever is earlier.

All calendar year 1975 selection actions for chief master sergeants who would become eligible for the pay have been cancelled. The E-6s and E-7s selected in the fiscal year 75-A cycle and of the upcoming E-4 and E-5 fiscal year 75-B cycle will be announced as soon as possible.

Final action is expected by Sept. 20.

It has come and gone, and everyone had a really good time, if happy faces and a crowded Reese picnic area are any indication.

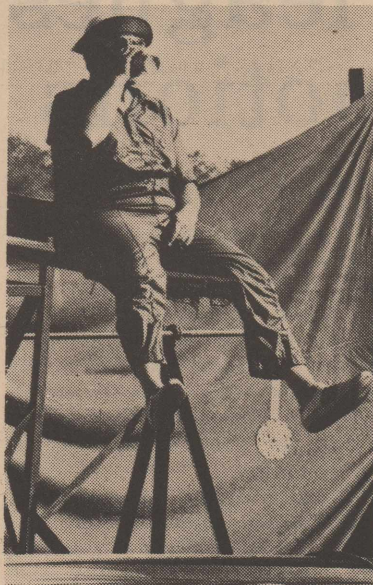
