

# Realignment actions to affect military

WASHINGTON (AFNS)—Secretary of Defense James R. Schlesinger has announced approval of 111 base realignment actions. These actions are part of the continuing Defense effort to divert resources from support and overhead activities to combat capability and to realign Defense activities with today's lower force levels.

All actions will aid Air Force efforts to operate within the limits of appropriated funds. At present, plans are being prepared as follows: The Air Force will retire some reciprocating engine aircraft used for administrative and support flying and jet powered support aircraft will be consolidated at centralized locations under the Military Airlift Command.

**AFCS Moves to MAC**  
Headquarters Air Force

Communications Service, Richards-Gebaur AFB, Mo., will be disestablished and its management functions will be assigned to Headquarters, Military Airlift Command, Scott AFB, Ill.

The Air Force Systems Command laboratories will be consolidated and will include the disestablishment of the Special Weapons Center, Kirtland AFB, N.M. and the relocation of major functions of Rome Air Development Center, Griffiss AFB, Rome, N.Y., the reorientation of Cambridge Research Laboratories, L.G. Hanscom AFB, Mass., to include command, control, and communications effort; establishment of Wright Technology Center at Wright-Patterson AFB, Ohio, and the addition of an environmental research activity at Kirtland AFB, N.M.

Ellington AFB, Tex. will be closed to Air Force activities upon relocation of Air Force Reserve and Air National Guard activities. Some Strategic Air Command satellite alert activities will be inactivated. The 17th Bomb Wing at Wright-Patterson AFB, Ohio, will be inactivated and the B-52 and KC-135 aircraft will be redistributed to five locations.

## SAC Squadrons

Strategic Air Command KC-135 air refueling squadrons at Fairchild AFB, Wash., Pease AFB, N.H., and Rickenbacker AFB, Ohio, will be used to modernize ANG squadrons at Fairchild AFB, Wash., Rickenbacker AFB, Ohio, Little Rock AFB, Ark., and Bangor International Airport, Maine, subject to final arrangements with the states concerned.

Three tactical Air Force air division headquarters at Little Rock AFB, Ark., Pope AFB, N.C., and Cannon AFB, N.M., will be inactivated.

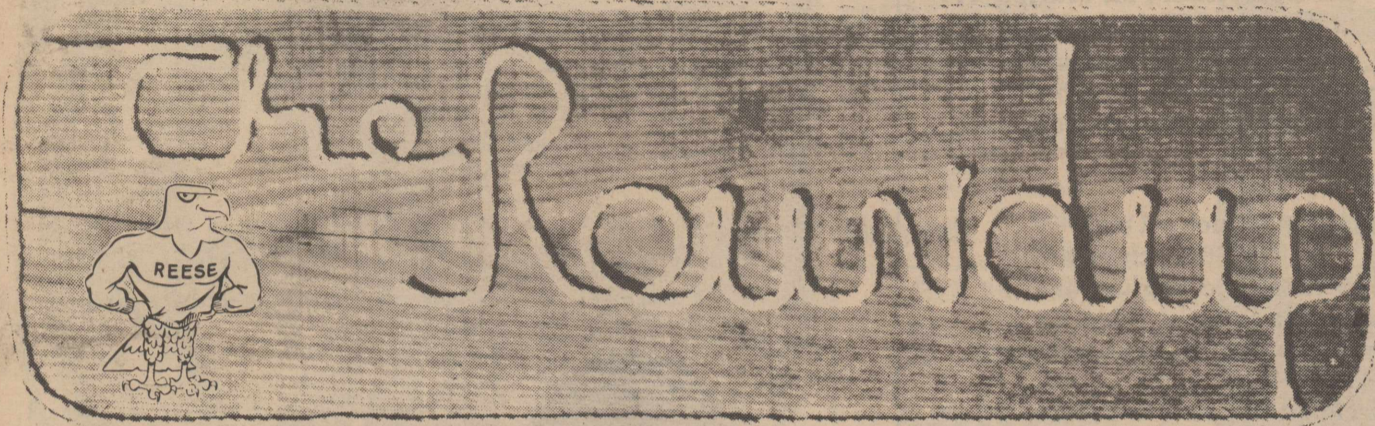
Some Air National Guard units will be modernized subject to final consent of the governors of the states concerned and Air Force Reserve units at one location will be modernized.

Some Aerospace Defense Command radar activities will be inactivated.

## Eliminate Positions

The realignment will eliminate DOD positions involving approximately 11,500 military and 11,600 civilian positions. Generally, the military personnel concerned will be assigned to combat and combat support activities.

After both Army and Air Force actions are completed by 1977, it is estimated that DOD support costs will be reduced by over \$300 million per year. A review of the U.S. overseas support structure is nearing completion. Decisions of these actions will not be announced pending completion of a Defense/State review and consultations with the host countries involved. Under the Department of Defense program for stability of civilian employment, every effort will be made to assist displaced civilian employees in obtaining other acceptable employment. Close liaison will be maintained by the Department of Defense civilian personnel offices with the Department of Labor, state employment offices and private industry to help employees desiring placement assistance or retraining for positions in the private sector.

## 'I'm dreaming of a light Christmas'

Some people have been singing "I'm dreaming of a lighted Christmas" but it looks like the Christmas spirits won't be in the dark this year, as the go ahead has been placed on indoor decorative lights.

## Women soon may have male guests

Women in the Air Force stationed at Reese will soon have a place where they can entertain male guests in their dormitory, Price Hall, thanks to a recommendation made by the Human Relations Council.

The first floor dayroom of the dorm, located in Bldg. 320, will be modified by several of the women to serve as the coed dayroom. The dayroom will be open to male visitors from 10 a.m. to 11 p.m. Sundays through Thursdays. On Fridays, Saturdays and days before holidays, the coed room will be open from 10 a.m. to 1 a.m. the next day. The visitation is expected to begin later this month.

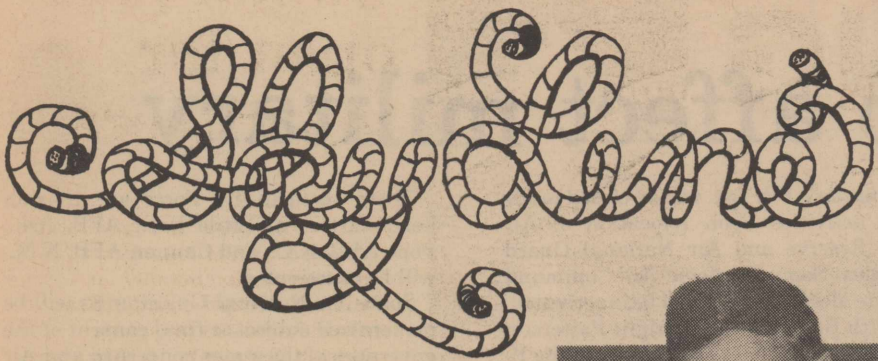
Col. Schuyler Bissell, wing commander, commented "I think this is a good move; at the same time I will not tolerate abuses and will take strong action against those who do abuse the rules."

One of the rules Col. Bissell was referring to was clothing. Male guests must wear shoes and shirts. That also means they may wear sandals and athletic shoes. Other than athletic shoes, no other athletic clothing may be worn, such as swimming suits, gym shorts or sweatsuits.

Any casual wear, such as jeans and T-shirts, may also be worn, as long as they are clean and in good repair. Any article of clothing which may possibly be considered profane or obscene may not be worn.

Other standards governing visits by men will be:

- No profane language or gestures.
- Sponsors will be responsible for their guest's conduct.
- Users of the dayroom must clean up their own trash and bottles.
- No men will be allowed in the women's living quarters.
- Sponsors having trouble enforcing the standards should call the Security Police.

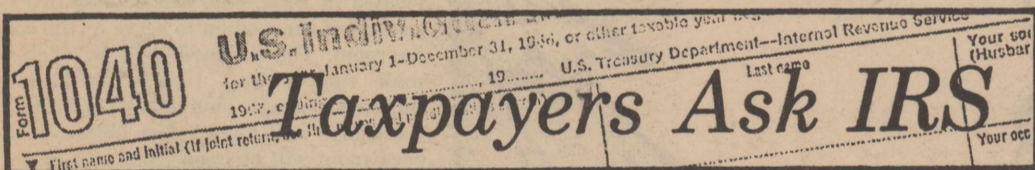

(Editor's note: This column of questions and answers on federal tax matters is provided by the local office of the U.S. Internal Revenue Service and is published as a public service to taxpayers. The column answers questions most frequently asked by taxpayers.)

**Q.** Are any of the campaign expenses of those running for our city council or the state legislature tax deductible?

**A.** No. Campaign expenses of a candidate for any office are not deductible. Registration fees for primary elections are also nondeductible, even for incumbents seeking to remain in office.

**Q.** I formed a partnership with two other people this summer to paint houses for a living. How do we report our earnings to the IRS?

**S.** Partnerships pay no income tax, but they must submit an information return using Form 2065, U.S. Partnership Return of Income, showing the results of the partnership's operations for its tax year. As a partner, you must include as income on the Supplemental Income Schedule (Schedule E) of Form 1040 (U. S. Individual Income

Tax Return) your distributive share, based on your partnership agreement, of earnings, gains, and losses. You have to report these items whether or not they have been distributed to you. Detailed information on partnership income is available in the IRS free Publication 541, "Tax Information on Partnership Income and Losses."

**Q.** I had a casualty loss recently when a thunderstorm caused a tree to fall on the roof of my garage at home. I know the damage to the garage is deductible but what about loss of the tree?

**A.** If ornamental trees and shrubs on residential property are damaged or destroyed by a casualty, you may have a deductible loss subject to the \$100 limitation on personal casualty loss deductions. To deduct this loss, you must establish that there has been a decrease in the total value of your real estate. When you have the damage appraised, remember that the fee you pay for establishing the amount of the loss is tax deductible also.

## Colonel Bissell speaks at HOMESAFE Kickoff

During the Wing Commander's HOMESAFE Kickoff Breakfast held Tuesday, Col. Schuyler Bissell spoke to Reese and Lubbock dignitaries about the base's holiday safety program. The following are excerpts from his address.

"It is extremely hard to predict traffic trends during the Christmas holiday period. However, despite the high cost of fuel and the effect of inflation, many people will travel long distances to be home for the holidays. Although we encourage everyone to travel by commercial means, many will choose to drive.

"Our HOMESAFE campaign has as its main goal a safe and enjoyable Christmas season for everyone—whether they travel long distances or stay in the local area. The theme of our campaign, "Our Holiday Prayer—HOMESAFE With Care," may be a little misleading. With all due respect to our Chaplain, the emphasis must be placed on the last two words—"With Care."

"With these things in mind, our HOMESAFE program is, in fact, a massive educational program designed to assure that our people know what to do to prevent mishaps on the highway, in the home, at play and, for the less fortunate, at work. Each driver already knows the common accident causes: fatigue, alcohol, speed too fast for conditions, distraction and inattention.

"But, each of us must be continually reminded that only we can control our actions behind the wheel. Our only recourse against someone else's error is being alert and practicing defensive driving—starting with a properly-fastened seat belt and shoulder harness.

"I hope that the Citizens' Traffic Commission and the local news media will repeatedly emphasize the need for mature actions on the part of each and every traveler so that our holiday prayer will be answered and the New Year will find us HOMESAFE. It will—if we truly CARE."

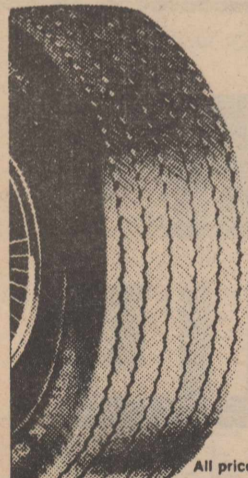

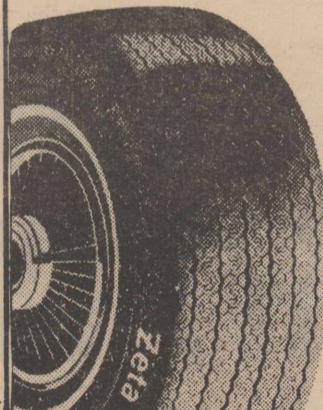

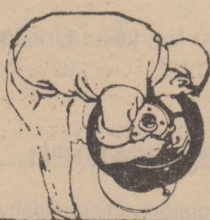

## Comm jobs open for volunteers

The Air Force Communications Service has announced that it needs volunteers for the command's NCO Detachment Commander and Air National Guard and Reserve technical advisors programs.

Master Sergeants in Air Force Specialty Code (AFSC) 29170 are needed for 12-month unaccompanied assignments consideration in detachments of the 1931st Communications Group in Alaska. The locations for the assignments are Indian Mountain (Det. 6), Cape Newenham (Det. 9), Cape Lisburne (Det. 10), Fort Yukon (Det. 13) and Cold Bay (Det. 7).

NCOs volunteering for the assignments must have completed an NCO academy before they depart for the detachment. They must also meet prerequisites given in Air Force Regulation 39-11, Chapter 8, Table 8-1, Item 18.

AFSC is also looking for applicants from any command in AFSC 36170 or 30770 to serve as technical advisors to the Air National Guard in various locations. NCOs selected for this "unique and rewarding duty" will serve a four-year stabilized tour.

AFSC 30770 staff, technical, and master sergeants are needed at Martin Comm in Alabama and Paine Air Force Station, Wash., as soon as possible. Those grades in AFSC 36170 are needed at Roslyn Air National Guard Station, N.Y., and Laporte, Tex. by March 1975.

For these assignments, the needs stated in AFR 39-11 are waived. Applications should contain two copies of AF Form 109 indorsed by the member's commander, a copy of his last five Airman Performance Reports and a family photograph.

Further requirements will be given interested members at the Assignments Section of the Personnel Division. A1C Gene Gatzert, Ext. 2402, can also answer questions about the assignments.

A new telephone service is now available for Air Force personnel enrolled in courses with the Extension Course Institute (ECI), Gunter AFS, Ala. The service will provide after-duty-hour callers a means of recording inquiries which will be answered the next duty day.

Operating from 4:15 p.m. to 7:30 a.m. weekdays and all day on weekends, the recording device can be reached by calling Autovon 921-4592, or the commercial number, Area Code 205+279-4592.

According to ECI sources, virtually any question can be handled by the phone device. However, if the question concerns a complex matter, it is still best to make a written request.

Making the call is simple. When connected with the phone extension,

you will hear a message outlining instructions. A tone will then sound. Give your name, social security number, address and course number. The device will continue to record until the phone circuit is broken. (An AFNS Feature)

# Latin American Club fills Reese-community void

The Reese Latin American Club was set up in January, 1972. The club resulted from the concern of many Reese people that there was a real lack of community involvement.

After being recognized as a base organization, the Latin American Club began its mission. Since that time, many projects have been

undertaken to benefit people across racial and ethnic lines.

**For All Needy**

I'd like to tell you of some of our projects. They aren't just for Americans of Mexican descent, but for anyone in need. One program we support is a scholarship fund for two deserving but financially needing people each year.

Summer this year saw us working to raise money to support Little League teams. A total of \$2,500 was collected to help the Northeast Little League in Lubbock. Donations also came from several other groups at Reese to aid the league. The Junior Officers' Council worked with us as did both flying training squadrons.

The point is — teamwork gets results.

In the past two years the Latin American Club has donated more than \$200 to the Jerry Lewis Muscular Dystrophy telethons. Several food and clothing drives have also been held to aid local needy families.

**Promotes Tradition**

Part of our club's mission is keeping alive Latin American cultures and traditions. More than \$600 has been raised for the local Mexican communities to honor Mexican Independence Days held each year on Sept. 14, 15 and 16. The event draws more than 10,000 people each year and is greatly significant to all the Mexican-American people in this area.

We matched our undefeated softball team recently against two

undefeated teams in Slaton, Tex. The purpose was to raise funds for the building of a new church. Not only did we win, but we helped raise more than \$2,000 for the fund. Our club believes strongly in the spirit of teamwork. Working with the Black Culture Club, we raised \$50 for a Sickie Cell Anemia drive.

**Benefits**

At Christmas time for past years, we have held benefit toy drive functions. A dance was held in 1973 with the price of admission set at one toy. We played the first annual Toy Bowl game last year against the team from KCB-D-TV in Lubbock. The hard-fought game resulted in a win by the Channel 11 squad, but we gathered a large group of toys that were distributed to children in Carlisle, Tex., Christmas Day.

In order to increase awareness of education opportunities, we have helped set up seminars at Texas Tech University. Students within a 250-mile radius were invited to these seminars. The purpose was to increase enrollment in colleges by Mexican-Americans. This year, more than 500 high school students came to these seminars. As a result, the Mexican-American population at Tech now is more than 500 students. Nearly \$500 has been raised by the club to support these programs.

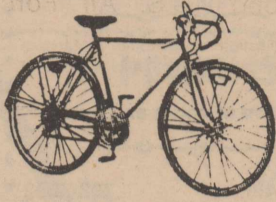
In April, we held a benefit dance to raise funds to sponsor an Easter egg hunt. More than 200 children from Reese participated.

Mohammad, a very quiet young man, told us of the courting and marriage customs in his country and how they differ from those in the United States. I think some of our ways surprised him.

On occasion, we advise them of which movies to attend, what food is good to us and what shows on TV are good. My husband has taught

them many things about football and golf, two sports they had never tried before. They are eager and quick to learn.

### Sugared Potatoes?

On Thanksgiving day we ate turkey and for the first time they had what we call candied yams. When I called them sweet potatoes, Mohammad thought I meant sugared potatoes. But after I explained what they were, he ate one and loved it.

For my husband and I, being sponsors to the foreign students here at Reese has been both rewarding and educational. For them to have somewhere to go on those days when the Visiting Officers Quarters become dull provides them a "home away from home." We have enjoyed having them over and will continue to do so until they complete their training here and return to Iran.

A good motto to follow is "GET INVOLVED," and I can say that my family has brought a little happiness to two lonely, overworked foreign students. It sure made us feel good!

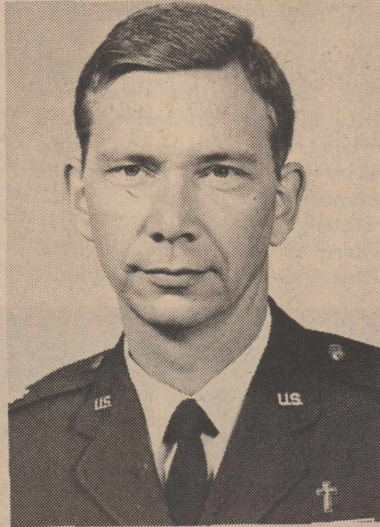

## Pay system cuts costs, problems

Beginning with the Nov. 29 pay date, the Air Force Accounting and Finance Center (AFAFC) began the transfer of funds between financial institutions by computer.

AFAFC was the first government agency to use the new system, called the Electronic Fund Transfer System (EFTS). The new Air Force concept credits the accounts of members whose pay goes to their financial organizations through electronic means instead of being mailed.

AFAFC provides computer tapes and a single Treasury check to the Denver branch of the Federal Reserve Bank. The Federal Reserve then sends the data through its computer network to the proper areas of the country.

Fifty thousand Air Force member accounts were paid in this first effort. The payments went to savings banks, savings and loan associations and credit unions located in California, Georgia, Colorado, Wyoming and parts of New Mexico.

Two tests of the EFTS were made by AFAFC and the Federal Reserve in the fall of 1973. The results showed the system will greatly reduce the risk of lost or stolen pay. Also, a savings of \$2 million a month would be made if the system was used government-wide, according to AFAFC spokesmen.

The Air Force and the Federal Reserve plan to implement EFTS throughout the United States by the end of 1975. Plans are also being made to bring retired pay and allotment payments into the system. (AFNS)

There are approximately 1,100 military and civilian personnel

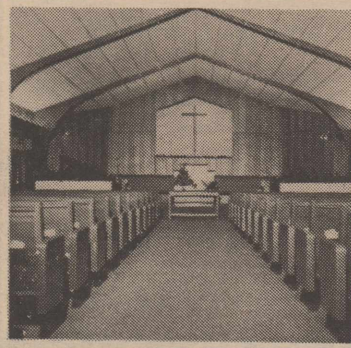
working in accounting and finance offices throughout the command and it was through their efforts that ATC won the FY 74 award.

# Red Cross offers tips for safe Christmas tree

"Keep the home fires burning at Yuletide, but only in the right places," The Reese Chapter of the American Red Cross advises.

One locale where fire hazards are the greatest is the Christmas tree. This hazard can turn holiday merrymaking into tragedy. Following are some tips that can help to keep your tree from becoming a flaming mess:

- When buying a tree, make sure it is fresh. If the needles fall off at a touch, the tree is too dry. Keep the tree fresh by making a new diagonal cut in the trunk about two inches

from the bottom and placing the tree in a water filled stand. Replace the water as soon as it evaporates. This will make the tree more fire resistant.

- Set the tree up well away from fireplace, stove, radiator or wall.

- Use fire proof decorations on the tree and all through the house. Never use lighted candles on the trees.

- Before decorating the tree, check all electric decorations for frayed, cracked or worn insulation. Inspect plugs for possible damage. Electric fixtures should carry the

Underwriters' Laboratory (UL) "approved" symbol. Be sure not to overload circuits. With an eye to energy conservation as well as safety, be sure trees are unplugged when you retire or leave the house.

The Red Cross also has words of advice about living Christmas decorations. Roger Colunga, Red Cross field director, added, "Berries from holly, mistletoe and Jerusalem cherry as well as Poinsetta leaves can cause serious illness if chewed or swallowed. In a home with small children, artificial greenery is suggested."

## VOLVO LAUNCHES FIRST NEW CARS IN EIGHT YEARS

Backed by two all-time record sales months this fall, Volvo today introduced a new series of cars to the United States for the first time in eight years.

Called the 240 Series, the new cars replace the 140 Series which the Swedish auto maker launched here in 1967.

According to OVERSEAS MOTORS CORP. of Lubbock, Inc., there are five models in the new 240 Series which join Volvo's improved luxury 164 to complete the company's line-up for 1975. The five 240 Series cars are the 242 and 242 GL two-door sedans, the 244 and 244 GL four-door sedans and the 245 station wagon.

While retaining the best styling and engineering achievements of the 140 Series, the 240 Series has more than 30 major engineering changes including totally new front suspension and steering as well as a new front end design derived from Volvo's experimental safety car.

The powerplant for the 240 Series, Volvo's 121 cubic-inch fuel-injected four-cylinder engine, contains many improvements for 1975 including a 10% more powerful starter motor, hardened valve seats for lead-free fuel and a solid state electronic ignition system.

Electronic ignition also has been added to the 182 cubic-inch six-cylinder engine that powers the 1975 model 164, the luxury four-door sedan that remains at the top of the company's product line.

Noted for making many features standard equipment which are extra cost options on domestic cars, Volvo lists only one factory option for the 164 — a sliding steel sunroof. Standard equipment includes air conditioning, a choice of power disc brakes, leather upholstery, heated driver's seat, electronic fuel injection, steel belted radial tires and — new this year — front power windows.

The great majority of new domestic cars demand unleaded fuel because they use catalysts to meet federal exhaust emission standards. Most 1975 Volvo owners, however, will be free to use their choice of fuels because catalysts are fitted to only one model — the manual transmission 164 — and to all cars sold in California which has more stringent emission standards.

Fuel economy figures recently released by the Environmental Protection Agency for city driving show that Volvos tested showed improved mileage over last year's models. The city average for all 1975 Volvos tested ranged between 15 and 17 miles per gallon. Volvo's all-model average for highway driving in a new government test this year was between 22 and 26 miles per gallon.

Mr. J.R. Hickman predicts that Americans will buy about 65,000 Volvos in 1975, a figure which will assure the company of the highest sales for any year since the first Volvo was sold here 20 years ago.

Volvo also plans to mark its 20th anniversary in this country by becoming the first imported car maker to build an assembly plant in the United States. Mr. J.R. Hickman noted. Construction of the \$150 million plant will begin in Chesapeake, Virginia during 1975 with the first production cars scheduled to roll off the assembly line late in 1976. (Pd. Adv.)

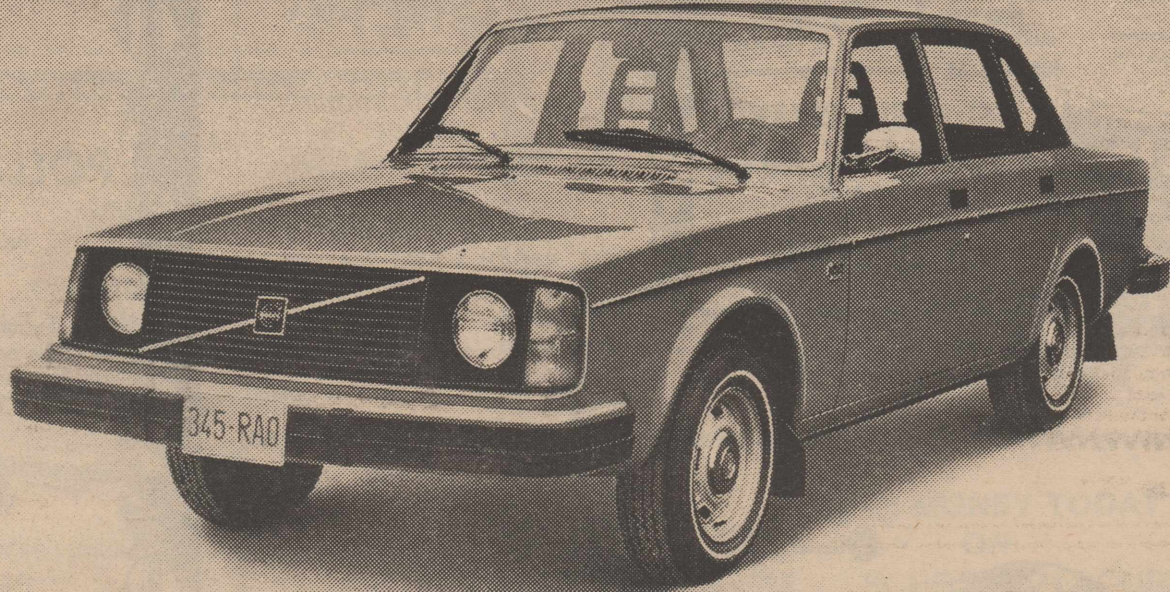

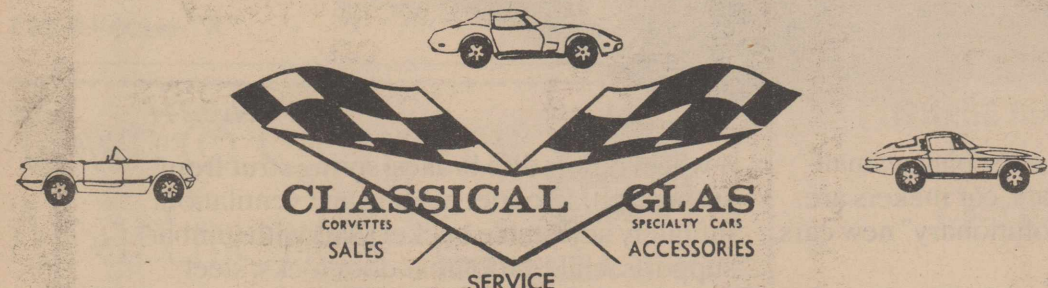

# Flying officer shuffle keeps career men up

Randolph AFB, Tex. (ATCPS) - Recent reductions in aircraft inventories and flying hours have resulted in insufficient flying time for some rated officers assigned to flying positions.

To make additional required flying hours available for career rated officers, authority has been given to major commands to move rated officers who are scheduled or intend to separate within 24 months to nonrated or nonflying operational positions.

The changes will be made consistent with operational requirements, and not necessarily all officers planning to leave will be excused from flying.

Rated officers whose duties are changed under this authority will

not be required or authorized to fly.

Entitlement to aviation career incentive pay does not change, provided the individuals will be eligible for flying status element "P" in accordance with AFM 60-352, Attachment 8.

Because of several recent cases of vandalism to the base post office, new hours have been set that are now in force.

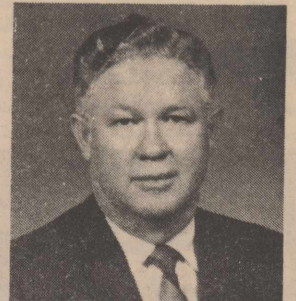

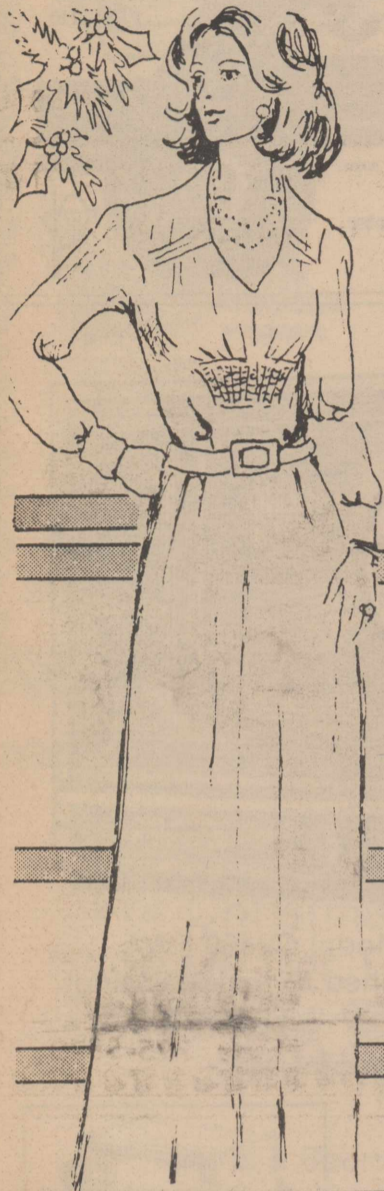

# F-4 serves as AF's primary operational craft

The F-4C/D/E is the U.S. Air Force's primary operational tactical fighter. Originally a Navy aircraft, it has been modified with larger wheels, brakes, tires, and cartridge starters to meet Air Force requirements.

## CSC gives grading standards

WASHINGTON (AFNS) - The Civil Service Commission (CSC) has announced a basic set of 117 standards for grading nearly 525,000 Federal blue-collar workers. While these standards apply directly to 90 per cent of the blue-collar work force, they also provide the guidance needed by classifiers to determine appropriate grade levels for the remaining 10 per cent.

The completion of these standards constitutes a major advance toward the goal of equal pay for equal work in the Federal service.

Some grade-level changes will result as the remainder of the new standards are adopted, but the grades of approximately 90 per cent of the blue-collar work force will not be changed. For the remaining 10 per cent, the numbers of upgradings and downgradings are expected to be about equal.

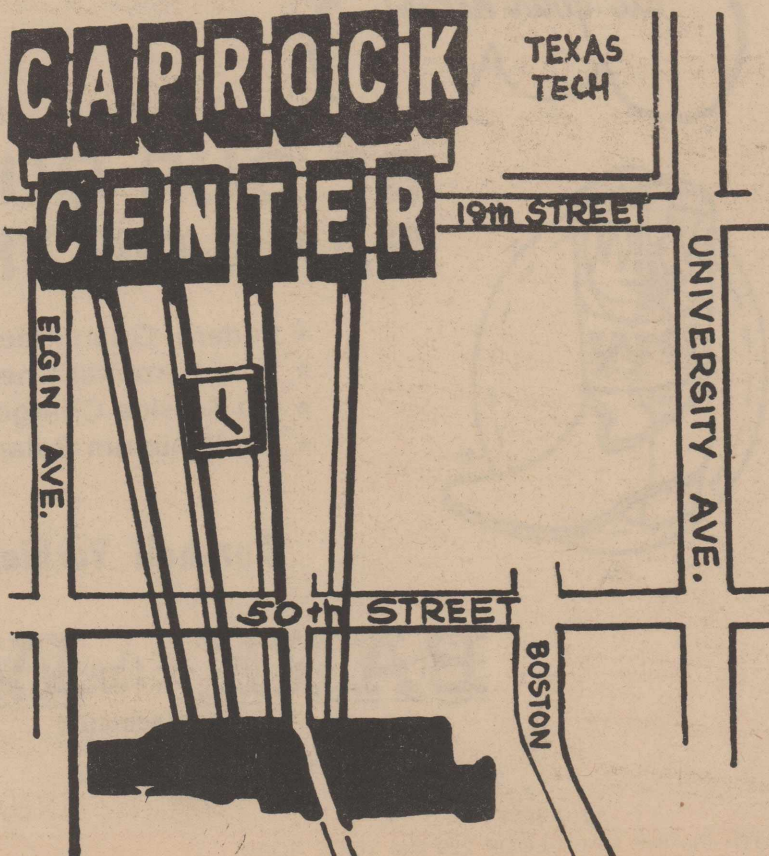
Employees whose jobs are downgraded as the final group of new standards are applied will receive benefit of "saved pay," provided they are converted within six months of the time the new standard covering their particular occupation is published.

Under the "saved pay" provisions, an employee whose job is downgraded by application of a new standard retains his current rate of pay indefinitely, and receives one-half of each future pay increase until the regularly scheduled rate of pay for his grade catches up with the saved rate.
